ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

1. M.Phil. Programmes

A candidate must normally have obtained an appropriate first degree with at least a Second Class (Upper Division) Honours or its equivalent. A graduate of the University of Ife (or in special cases a graduate of another approved University) with a Lower class may be considered for admission on probation and required to take additional courses if necessary.

Applicants for the M.Phil. Programme in International Relations must have a First class degree or Second Class (Upper Division) in Social Sciences of the University of Ife or any other approved University.

Applications for M.Phil. Programme in the Faculty of Pharmacy must hold a recognised degree in Pharmacy, or Chemistry or Biology, or Agriculture or Medicine for those who wish to be considered for Pharmacognosy.

For the M.Phil. Programme in Electronic and Electrical Engineering an applicant with a good degree in Electronic and Electrical Engineering or Physics is eligible. Applicants with a degree in Chemistry or Mathematics may be registered where such people wish to specialise in Materials Science and Devices Technology and/or Radio and Telecommunication.

An applicant who has completed the requirements of the M.Sc. or equivalent and who shows high promise as a research student may also be considered for admission.

2. M.A.; M.Sc.; LL.M.; M.P.A.; and M.B.A. Programmes

The minimum admission requirement is a Second Class Honours Lower Division in the relevant discipline.

The following are however special requirements:

(i) M.Sc. Programme in Human Biology, Human Pathology and Immunology.—Candidates must hold a B.Sc. Health Sciences or B.Pharmacy degree or B.Sc. degree in Medical Sciences, Anatomy, Physiology, Microbiology, Parasitology or any related field of either Human Biology or Pathology. Such degrees must have been obtained in the First Class or Second Class Upper Division. Candidates with Second Class Lower may be admitted with a strong recommendation of their Deans or referees and the Faculty's Postgraduate Board of Studies. Candidates holding an AIMLT qualification with at least two years post-graduate qualification experience may be admitted into the M.Sc. programme in Pathology on the recommendation of the Faculty Board of Post-graduate Studies.

In the case of candidates with registrable Medical qualification, admission shall be as stated above. Where a candidate registered for the M.Sc. has

shown exceptional ability within a period of not less than two Semesters and the ensuring long vacation, his candidature may be transferred to that for Ph.D.

(ii) M.Sc. Programme in Electronics and Electrical Engineering.—A candidate with a degree in Electronic and Electrical Engineering or Physics is eligible. However, irrspecial cases a candidate with a degree in Chemistry may be acceptable for the programme in Materials Science and Devices Technology and similarly, candidates with a degree in Mathematics may be acceptable for the programme in Radio and Telecommunications or Materials Science and Devices Technology.

Candidates with professional qualifications in Electronics and Electrical Engineering or in Physics (e.g. H.N.D./H.N.C. types) may after subsequently proceeding to satisfy the CEI or the Institute of Physics graduateship requirements be registered for the M.Sc. Course, especially when such candidates are sponsored by their employers in order to improve their knowledge and skill.

- (iii) M.Sc. Programme in Applied Geology.—For the M.Sc. in Applied Geology, candidates must have a Second Class Honours degree in Geology, Engineering Geology, or Mining Geology, but candidates with relevant professional experience and a lower class of degree may be considered.
- (iv) M.Sc. Programme in Extension Education and Rural Sociology.—The M.Sc. degree in Extension Education and Rural Sociology is a terminal degree. It is designed for the professionals who want to enhance their work capability on the job. Candidates should hold a good honours degree in Agriculture, Agricultural Sciences, Biological Sciences, Home Economics, Sociology and other related disciplines, plus several years of on-the-job experience which will enrich the applicants' learning experiences and also enable them to relate theory to practical problems in a work situation.
- (v) M.Sc. (International Relations).—Candidates should hold a Second Class Lower (Honours) degree in Social Sciences or related field of studies of the University of Ife of its equivalent in any approved University.
- (vi) M.Sc. (Pharmaceutical Chemistry).—Candidates for the M.Sc. Pharm Chem. in addition to the University requirement must hold a recognised degree in Pharmacy, Chemistry or Biochemistry.
 - (b) M.Sc. (Pharmaceutics).—Candidates must hold a recognised degree in Pharmacy.
 - (c) M.Sc. (Pharmacology).—Candidates must hold a recognised degree in Pharmacy, Medicine/Veterinary Medicine, Pharmacology, Physiology or Biochemistry.
- (vii) Master in Public Administration.—Candidates must be graduates who (a) have completed a minimum of four years relevant experience at an appropriate administrative/managerial level in public service; or (b) possess one of the Postgraduate diplomas awarded by the University of Ife in relevant fields or by any other recognised University. Such candidates must have acquired at least two years' post-diploma experience in relevant fields at an appropriate administrative or managerial level in the public service.

(viii) M.A. and Ph.D. Programmes in Linguistic.—
For admission to the M.A. programme, applicants must have a good degree in or involving any one of the following: Mathematics, Computer Science, the Biological Sciences, Psychology or related Medical Sciences, Philosophy, Sociology, Anthropology, Religion, History, Linguistics, Literary and/or Linguistics study of a particular language. Earlier formal study of Linguistics or any particular language is not required and that training in subjects like Sociology, Philosophy, Mathematics or Computer Science may indeed be a greater advantage.

Applicants for the Ph.D. programme are normally required to have obtained a Master's degree in any aspect of Linguistics. Preparation for Ph.D. research will normally involve coursework particularly in the area of specialisation.

- (ix) Master in Business Administration.—Candidates must have a good honours degree in the relevant field or equivalent professional qualifications. Holders of degrees in Social and Natural Sciences and Technology are also eligible. A good ground in Mathematics is essential.
- (x) M.A. and Ph.D. Programme in Yoruba.—
 For admission to the M.A. Programme, applicants must have a good degree in Language or Literature preferably in Yoruba. Applicants for the Ph.D. programme must normally have obtained the M.A. degree (or its equivalent) in Yoruba and must show evidence of research potential.

Such candidates should however note that they will be awarded the Ordinary Diploma and not the Post-graduate Diploma in the relevant courses. Holders of a University degree who intend to follow a career in the Public Service (Home or Foreign) are also eligible for admission.

- (ii) Advanced Diploma in Local Government Studies
 - A. Requirements for Admission (Advanced Diploma in Local Government Studies)

Applicants for the ADLG are required to hold a University degree or the Nigerian National Diploma (NND). Preference will be given to candidates with degrees or diplomas in the Social Sciences and Law. In exceptional cases, experienced local government officers sponsored by state or local governments who do not possess a degree or the NND may be accepted, but such officers must satisfy the University by written examination and/or interview that they are capable of undertaking satisfactorily the post-graduate level of work of the Diploma Course.

Duration.—Two semesters from September of one year to July of the following year.

B. Requirements for Admission (Diploma in Local Government Studies)

Applicants for the DLG are required to be serving Local Government Officers on Grade Level 06 or 07 with relevant administrative experience. Other candidates can be admitted after satisfying the University by written examination and/or interview that they are capable of undertaking satisfactorily the level of work of the Diploma Course.

Duration.—The programme lasts for four semesters.

(iii) Diploma in Public Financial Management for a Duration of Four Semesters and Ensuing Long Vacation.

Candidates are required to hold a relevant degree or its equivalent preferably in Accounting, or a related subject, or a pass at the final examination of a professional Secretariat or Accountancy body such as A.C.I.S.; A.S.C.A. In exceptional cases, admission may be granted to candidates who have not less than five years' experience in the administrative level in any appropriate examination and who satisfy the Faculty that they are capable of satisfactorily completing a Course at this level.

(iv) Long Vacation Post-graduate Diploma in Education.—Long Vacation courses leading to the award of Post-graduate Diploma in Education (PGDE) of the Faculty of Education of the University of Ife will begin by the middle of July 1980 and last till August 31st, 1980.

Eligibility for the Course

(a) Graduate teachers previously registered for the course for 1978 and 1979 vacations; (b) Intending graduate teachers without teaching qualification, teaching in any part of the Federation and who possess a good degree in a teaching subject from an approved University.

Objectives and Duration of Course.—This is normally a three long-vacation programme designed to improve the theoretical and professional skills of practising classroom secondary school teachers in the areas of historical, social, psychological and philosophical foundations of education; curriculum development, innovation and renewal; modern techniques of instruction and educational technology classroom management school administration and educational; policies and administration. The Long Vacation Course extends over six weeks during the month of July and August of each year.

- 1. Method of application.—Candidates already admitted and registered for the course for the 1978 and 1979 Long Vacation Courses respectively are requested to signify their intention to register for the 1980 continuation of their PGDE Programmes by a letter addressed to the Head, Department of Educational Foundations and Counselling, University of Ife, Ile-Ife not later than 31st May, 1980.
