(dependant rate) and a *child allowance* of US \$450 per year and child, except for the first child if the dependant rate of salary is paid in respect of that child. Further benefits are : *installation allowance, education grant, repatriation grant, 30 working days, annual leave, home leave travel* with eligible dependants every two years or, alternatively, *annual travel to visit dependants* if unaccompanied at the duty station, *rest and recuperation leave* for certain duty stations, participation in *pension and health insurance* schemes.

General Information.—In most countries of Asia, co-operatives fulfil essential services in the fields of supply, production and internal marketing of consumer goods, agricultural inputs and produce. For this purpose, the co-operative movements have established purchase and marketing organisations of various kinds up to the national level. However, only a few co-operative organisations have succeeded in establishing service-oriented export/import trading organisations which would allow these co-operative organisations to plough back possible trading profits accrued from international trade to their producer/consumer members.

ILO is already assisting the co-operative organisations of the Asian Region in the establishment and development of trade relations between various co-operative organisations at the international level. An adviser on international co-operative trade, who will work together with the present project team, will be appointed.

During the first phase of the project the following activities are among those which have been conducted : Survey of potential export products from co-operatives in selected Asian countries ; a regional workshop ; national workshops in Sri Lanka, India, Philippines, Bangladesh, Malaysia, Thailand and Indonesia : fact finding missions ; a fellowship programme to Western Europe ; and, trade contacts. Trade agreements between co-operatives have been made as a direct result of the project.

Description of Duties.—The Expert on International Co-operative Trade will render short term advice and assistance to co-operatives of the region which have been identified by the project team with a view to further strengthening their trade capacity and trade links.

Under the supervision of the Team Leader, the adviser will render short term advice and assistance to co-operative organisations in the region, which have been identified by the project team with a view to establishing international trade relations to improve marketing operations and management capacity, introduce suitable and modern marketing techniques and product standards, and thus strengthen their competitiveness and training capacity. The adviser will also be required to participate in national workshops and other meetings on international co-operative trade.

Specific duties.—In particular, the adviser is expected to undertake the following duties :

provide advice to co-operative organisations on organisational and structural questions, on staffing and training requirements, and on marketing requirements as well as export promotion measures ;

advise on financial aspects and on procedures to be followed ;

provide advice on the introduction of reasonable and competitive product quality standards, suitable types of commodities and pricing policy ;

advise on the adaptation of marketing techniques to the requirements of international trade, and

make suggestions for further specialised assistance to co-operative trading organisations in the field of marketing and management aspects of trade operations.

Qualifications required.—The adviser should have sound practical experience in management and marketing aspects of import and export organisations. The adviser must have a very good knowledge of marketing requirements, export techniques, trade promotion measures as well as questions relative to the management of export and import operations. The adviser should have educational qualifications in either economics, business administration and commerce or related fields and should have gained experience partly in developing countries. A co-operative background is desirable.

Language.—A full command of English.
