Article 1.- The Trade Liberalization Scheme for Traditional Handicrafts shall be established as follows :-

(i) total exemption from import duties and

taxes; (ii) free movement without any quantitative restriction ;

(iii) no compensation for losses of revenue resulting from their importation.

Article 2.—Entitlement to the above scheme shall be subject to the presentation of a certificate of origin in respect of the said products.

Article 3.-This decision shall enter into force with effect from 29th May, 1981, and shall be published in the Official Journal of the Commu-nity and in the Official Gazette of each Member State.

THE AUTHORITY OF HEADS OF STATE AND GOVERN-MENT.

Mindful of Article 5 of the Treaty of ECOWAS establishing the Authority of Heads of State and Government and defining its composition and functions.

DECIDES

Article 1.- To recommend the adoption of the following recommendations relating to the harmonization of highway legislation in all Member States.

1. Administrative Framework .- The setting up of on appropriate machinery in the Member States to be responsible among other things for :

registration of vehicles ;

issue of driving licence ;

organising of technical inspection of vehicles ; compilation of statistics on movement of goods and passengers by road ;

organising of road safety measures and the relevant studies;

supervision of the enforcement of highway legislations;

implementation of agreements and conventions on road transport ;

organisation of road traffic studies ;

2. Legal Framework .- Within the framework of the proposed harmonization of road legislations in the sub-region, the adhesion by all Member States to the Vienna Conventions on Road Traffic and Road Signs.

3. Traffic Right of Way at Roundabout.-Introduction of the practice of driving on the right hand side of the road and use of directional signs on approaches of roundabouts for the control of traffic.

4. Road Signs and Markings .- The progressive introduction of international road signs and markings on inter-state as well as national highways.

5. Equipment .- For purposes of safety, provision on private and commercial vehicles of the following :

reflectorised licence plates ;

two triangular warning signs ;

safety belts (installation of which would be gradual) ;

one fire extinguisher which shall be progressively introduced for private cars

one emergency first aid kit ;

an extra rear signalling for vehicles transporting goods ;

owner address and registration number clearly visible (vehicles transporting goods and passengers);

the use of yellow headlights ;

one safety back-up bar ;

a long vehicle sign at the end of the reflectorised rear panel for vehicles transporting goods.

6. Inspection :- The introduction of compulsory vehicle inspection, the establishment of adequately equiped inspection centres and the setting up of an efficient control system to ensure compliance with laid down inspection periods.

7. Driving Licence :- The adoption of the threepart driving licence for reasons of uniformity and in compliance with the provisions of the Vienna Conventions and the eventual elimination of the international driving licence, within the Community consequently, the following minimum number of conditions shall be imposed;

The driving permits C and D shall be renewed as follows :

every 5 years for drivers under 45 years of age every 3 years for drivers of 45 to 55 years of age every year for drivers over 55 years of age

Professional licences should be operative solely within the boundaries of the States concerned.

8. Vehicle Documents :- The compulsory possession of the following documents for the purposes of facilitating identification and control of vehicles within the Community :

An international Motor Vehicle Certificate containing the characteristics of the vehicle and address of the owner.

A valid certificate of inspection a third party liability vehicle insurance an international Cover letter for the transport of goods a transport card in respect of transport vehicle in two languages.

All the documents shall be prepared in two languages of which one shall be the official language of the country and of ECOWAS (English and French).

Article 2

The present decision shall come into force ONE YEAR after signature and shall be published in the Official Journal of the Community and in the National Gazette of each Member State.

Mindful of Article 5 of the Treaty of ECOWAS establishing the Authority of Heads of State and Government and defining its composition and functions :

Decides

Article 1. The Executive Secretary is directed to carry out the following Energy programme :

Short Term

1. Carry out an assessment and analysis of the energy sector in ECOWAS. Its components will be :--

(i) Quantitative determination and evaluation of both conventional and new energy resources of energy production, consumption, exports and imports,

(ii) Projections, either from national plans. or by estimates based on plans of similar countries or approximate energy needs and the possible contribution by each of the different sources for the decade of the 80's.

(iii) Supply of oil and the reduction of oil bills. policies.

2. Identify and draw up plans for the imple-mentation of "Survival" energy projects in ECOWAS: The plan should consider the technical economic and social aspects of the energy problem and determine financing requirements, estimates of market penetration and expected effects (such as replacement of imported oil, increased supply of fuelwood and contribution to arresting deforestation). Examples of possible "survival projects are :

Identifying and promoting the adoption of methods for the increased efficient utilization of energy in transport, industry, buildings, etc.

Improved cooking stoves

More efficient charcoal production

Ethanol production

Replacement of electric by solar hot water heaters

Small hydro-electric power installations to replace diesel power

Utilization of agricultural ;; forestry and urban wastes.

Increased oil exploration

Use of coal or flared gas, etc.

3. Study of the energy problems and needs of the rural areas in ECOWAS and making concrete proposals in meeting those needs.

4. Study of the feasibility of establishing small scale industries of improved cooking appliances.

5. Preparation of an integrated ECOWAS energy policy in the areas of production, distribu-tion and research.

Long Term

1. Carry out an inventory of both the training resource facilities available and requirements in the Community and study the feasibility of establishing a Regional institute for the training of technicians and personnel in the field of energy.

2. Prepare joint programmes for the exchange of information and personnel in the Community.

3. Draw up long term and "survival" energy projects in the Community. Possible "long-term" projects would include :

Methanol production Photovoltaic systems development and installation

Solar Desalination

Wind power development

Solar air-conditioning and refrigeration

Solar ponds

Solar cookers

Biogas production

No. 1, Vol. 69

Solar Thermodynamic power production The "Survival" projects Ocean-thermal conversion

Inter-connection electricity networks .

Establishment of small and medium sized enterprises devoted to energy production and related activities.

5: Study into the problems of inter-connection of electricity transmission network in the Community.

Article 2 .- The Executive Secretary is authorised to take all necessary measures for the execution of the Energy Programme mentioned in Article 1.

PUBLIC NOTICE

PRODUCTIVITY, PRICES AND INCOMES BOARD

INCOMES POLICY GUIDELINES 1982

The Government of the Federal Republic of Nigeria has directed the implementation of the guidelines on wages, salaries, fringe benefits, professional incomes, dividends and prices for the 1982 financial year. Accordingly, pursuant to section 4 (5) of Act No. 30 of 1977, the Productivity, Prices and Incomes Board hereby issues the following Public Notice :

WAGES AND SALARIES

Preamble:—The management of private sector establishments should be guided in their administration of wage and salaries by government intention, as enunciated in successive economic plans, of promoting a fairer distribution of income and enhancing productivity within a virile economy. The recently approved national minimum wage is a measure designed to bring further improvement in income in favour of the lowest paid.

Private Sector

(i) Establishments that have not implemented the 15 per cent and 10 per cent allowable increase in wages and salaries for the low and high income groups respectively during the three years 1980-82 may do so this year. For the purpose of these guidelines, the low income group will be regarded as employees whose basic salary per annum prior to the wages adjustment in 1980, was less than N3,000.00; and conversely, the high income group are those earning N3,000.00 per annum and above prior to that wages adjustment ;

(ii) The implementation of salary adjustments shall not preclude the granting of normal annual increments within the financial year;

(iii) All establishments employing fifty or more persons are to submit to the Ministry of Employment; Labour and Productivity; productivity schemes drawn up with their employees, and full information on wages, salaries and fringe benefits, paid to all categories of their emloyees, together with the number of employees in each occupational group.

(iv) No revisions of fringe benefits or introduction of new ones will be valid except with the express approval of the Minister of Employment, Labour and Productivity. Companies applying for revision of fringe benefits or introduction of new ones should enclose a copy of their productivity scheme;

(v) Employers except where specifically excluded, are obliged to pay a wage not less than N125.00 per month minimum to every worker in their establishments.

(vi) An employer would be deemed to have complied with the Minimum Wage Act 1981 if he pays no less than N125.00 per month to a worker, howsoever the total emolument in cash may be designated ;

(vii) Employers and unions in each industry are expected to negotiate and agree on the extent and mode of structural adjustments in salaries and wages consequent upon compliance with the minimum wage law, provided the adjustment is limited to the low income group defined within the existing In-3 comes Policy Guidelines on wages to include only workers on any salary below #3,000.00 per annum.

Public Sector

(viii) Studies made by the Pay Research Unit should form the basis for negotiating and determining increases in wages, salaries and fringe benefits for the Civil Service. For the rest of the public service, changes in fringe benefits negotisted will be channelled through the Office of the Head of the Civil Service of the Federation for approval;

General-Application to both Sectors

(ix) Arrears arising from pay agreements shall not normally be back-dated but where it is necessary to back-date, it should not be beyond the beginning of the current financial year.

B PROFESSIONAL INCOMES GUIDELINES

(i) Remuneration (i.e. fees, allowances and any other perquisites in cash or kind) of non-executive members of Boards in the private sector shall be subject to an increase of not more than 15 per cent in the case of those earning less than N3,000.00 per annum and 10 per cent for those earning N3,000.00 per annum and above during the three years 1980 to 1982 taken together ;

(ii) Government approved rates for professional services such as those provided by Architects, Estate Managers, Locum Medical Doctors, Engineers-Civil, Mechanical and Electrical, Quantity Surveyors, etc. shall not normally be exceeded throughout the economy, i.e. in both the public and private sectors;

(iii) The scale rates for fees charged by accounting firms or auditing firms for 1981 shall be applicable also in 1982 provided that the total amount payable does not increase by more than 10 per cent.

(iv) The payment of fees, charges, retainers, etc., higher than those specified in (ii)—(iii)above will not be accepted, by the Internal and Inland Revenue Departments as expenses for tax purposes.

C. DIVIDENDS :

(i) Dividends up to 60 per cent of profit after tax may be declared and distributed.

(ii) A withholding tax of 12.5 per cent is payable on all dividends.

(iii) The issue of scrips based on a revaluation of assets is forbidden.

(iv) For effective monitoring, containes are required to submit two copies of their annual reports and accounts to the Secretary, Productivity, Prices and Incomes Board.

(v) For the avoidance of doubt, the guidelines which obtain on the date of a company's annual general meeting shall apply in determining its distributable dividend, provided the timing of the annual general meeting fits the provision of section 124 (1) of the Companies Act 1968.

D. PRICE GUIDELINES :

(i) A single increase in price of not more than 5 per cent during the year can be effected after prior consultation provided the Board is notified 40 days in advance. No subsequent increase of below 5 per cent can thereafter be implemented except with the approval of the Board.

(*ii*) Prior notification of not less than 10 weeks must be given for price increases above 5 per cent. Such revision can only be effected with the specific approval of the Board.

(iii) Companies granted price increase of over 5 per cent in 1981 may effect another price revision of below 5 per cent in 1982 only with the express consent of the Board.

(iv) Companies applying for price increase should enclose a copy of their productivity scheme.

(v) Importers of all heavy industrial machinery for resale should not apply a mark-up of more than 25 per cent of the CIF.

(vi) Importers/dealers in motor spare-parts should not apply a factor of more than 2.0 to CIF. Other officially approved local costs may be added to arrive at the selling price.

(vii) The rates charged for advertisement in the media as well as fees and commissions charged by advertisement agencies should not be increased during the year without the approval of the Board.

(viii) Applications for increases in the rentals paid for the hiring and maintenance of machines and equipments shall be made in the same manner as stipulated in paragraphs (i) and (ii) above.

(ix) Where there is a net reduction in allowable costs per unit of out-put, prices should be reduced by an amount equal to any percentage reduction resulting thereform. The Board may, therefore, call on any firm to reduce the prices if there is evidence of reduction in allowable costs.

(x) No price increases will be entertained on the basis of anticipated increases in costs.

(xi) Items whose prices are determined through the application of government approved formula are not governed by the price guidelines.

(xii) All advertisements for the sale of goods and services in any news-media must carry actual prices of the goods and services advertised. The prices of all traded goods and services must be conspicuously exhibited to guide consumers.

E. CERTIFICATION

Auditors' reports on companies and other institutions must contain statements as to whether or not the provisions of the Incomes Policy Guidelines, as specified above, have been adhered to in every respect.

F. PENALTY

Failure to comply with the provisions of these guidelines will be punishable under section 5 (2) of Act No. 30 of 1977.
