WHEREAS by section 228 (2) of the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria 1979 is provided that the Federal High Court shall consist of a Chief Judge of the Federal High Court and such number of Judges of the Federal High Court as may be prescribed by law :

AND WHEREAS, by section 229 (1) of the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria 1979 it is provided that the appointment of a person to the office of a Judge of the Federal High Court shall be made by the President on the recommendation of the Federal Judicial Service Commission :

NOW, THEREFORE, I, SHEHU USMAN ALIYU SHAGARI, President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of the Federation, acting on the recommendation of the Federal Judicial Service Commission, do hereby appoint **GBOLAHAN AJAGBE AMODU TIJANI JINADU** as a Judge of the Federal High Court with effect from the 4th day of January, 1982.

REPUBLIC BUILDING FIRE INCIDENT TRIBUNAL OF INQUIRY

Tribunal of Inquiry Act 1966 (1966 No. 41)

SUBMISSION OF MEMORANDA

Following its inaugural meeting held on Wednesday, 6th January, 1982, the Tribunal set up by the President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria to inquire into the fire incident at the Republic Building, Marina, Lagos, hereby invites individuals, groups of persons, institutions and the public at large (Nigerians and non-Nigerians alike) to submit to it memoranda and/or any other representations.

2. Memoranda/representations should be in line with the Tribunal's terms of reference which are as follows:

"The Tribunal shall with all convenient speed inquire into the cause or causes of the recent fire incident affecting the Republic Building, Marina, Lagos, on or about 14th December, 1981.

AND, in particular, the Tribunal shall—

(a) determine the circumstances leading to the fire and subsequent conflagration which engulfed the building and the extent of damage thereto;

(b) determine whether any person or group of persons by conduct or negligence or otherwise howsoever in any way contributed to the breaking out of the fire and make, in the light of its findings in that behalf, recommendations as to measures to be taken against any such person or persons;

(c) ascertain whether any person or group of persons, not being citizens of Nigeria, encouraged or in any other way contributed towards the incident;

(d) determine the circumstances leading to the death of, or injury to, any person in or around the building during the course of the fire;

(e) determine the actual and remote causes of the fire outbreak and suggest measures generally for the avoidance of similar incidents in the future and, in particular, for the promotion of safety of Government buildings against fire outbreaks and minimising loss of lives and property where a fire does occur in any such building;

(f) examine any other matter incidental to the foregoing and make recommendations generally thereon."

3. Memoranda/representations should preferably be in five copies and addressed to the Secretary, Republic Building Fire Incident Tribunal of Inquiry, Executive Office of the President (Room 323) Tafawa Balewa Square, Lagos so as to reach him not later than Friday, 22nd January, 1982.

4. All those submitting written evidence should also be prepared to appear before the Tribunal to give oral evidence.

5. Members of the public who would like to give only oral evidence before the Tribunal should give notice of such intention to the Secretary to the Tribunal at the address stated above on or before 22nd January, 1982, and at any time during the sittings of the Tribunal.

6. The Tribunal will commence public sittings to take oral evidence on Monday, 25th January, 1982.

WAGES AND SALARIES

Preamble:—The management of private sector establishments should be guided in their administration of wages and salaries by government intention, as enunciated in successive economic plans, of promoting a fairer distribution of income and enhancing productivity within a virile economy. The recently approved national minimum wage is a measure designed to bring further improvement in income in favour of the lowest paid.

Private Sector

(i) Establishments that have not implemented the 15 per cent and 10 per cent allowable increase in wages and salaries for the low and high income groups respectively during the three years 1980-82 may do so this year. For the purpose of these guidelines, the low income group will be regarded as employees whose basic salary per annum prior to the wages adjustment in 1980, was less than ₦3,000.00; and conversely, the high income group are those earning ₦3,000.00 per annum and above prior to that wages adjustment;

(ii) The implementation of salary adjustments shall not preclude the granting of normal annual increments within the financial year;

(iii) All establishments employing fifty or more persons are to submit to the Ministry of Employment, Labour and Productivity; productivity schemes drawn up with their employees, and full information on wages, salaries and fringe benefits, paid to all categories of their employees, together with the number of employees in each occupational group.

(iv) No revisions of fringe benefits or introduction of new ones will be valid except with the express approval of the Minister of Employment, Labour and Productivity. Companies applying for revision of fringe benefits or introduction of new ones should enclose a copy of their productivity scheme;

(v) Employers except where specifically excluded, are obliged to pay a wage not less than ₦125.00 per month minimum to every worker in their establishments.

(vi) An employer would be deemed to have complied with the Minimum Wage Act 1981 if he pays no less than ₦125.00 per month to a worker, howsoever the total emolument in cash may be designated;

(vii) Employers and unions in each industry are expected to negotiate and agree on the extent and mode of structural adjustments in salaries and wages consequent upon compliance with the minimum wage law, provided the adjustment is limited to the low income group defined within the existing Incomes Policy Guidelines on wages to include only workers on any salary below ₦3,000.00 per annum.

Government Notice No. 15 (2nd publication)

PUBLIC NOTICE

PRODUCTIVITY, PRICES AND INCOMES BOARD

INCOMES POLICY GUIDELINES 1982

The Government of the Federal Republic of Nigeria has directed the implementation of the guidelines on wages, salaries, fringe benefits, professional incomes, dividends and prices for the 1982 financial year. Accordingly, pursuant to section 4 (5) of Act No. 30 of 1977, the Productivity, Prices and Incomes Board hereby issues the following Public Notice:

Public Sector

(viii) Studies made by the Pay Research Unit should form the basis for negotiating and determining increases in wages, salaries and fringe benefits for the Civil Service. For the rest of the public service, changes in fringe benefits negotiated will be channelled through the Office of the Head of the Civil Service of the Federation for approval ;

General—Application to both Sectors

(ix) Arrears arising from pay agreements shall not normally be back-dated but where it is necessary to back-date, it should not be beyond the beginning of the current financial year.

B. PROFESSIONAL INCOMES GUIDELINES

(i) Remuneration (i.e. fees, allowances and any other perquisites in cash or kind) of non-executive members of Boards in the private sector shall be subject to an increase of not more than 15 per cent in the case of those earning less than ₦3,000.00 per annum and 10 per cent for those earning ₦3,000.00 per annum and above during the three years 1980 to 1982 taken together ;

(ii) Government approved rates for professional services such as those provided by Architects, Estate Managers, Locum Medical Doctors, Engineers—Civil, Mechanical and Electrical, Quantity Surveyors, etc. shall not normally be exceeded throughout the economy, i.e. in both the public and private sectors ;

(iii) The scale rates for fees charged by accounting firms or auditing firms for 1981 shall be applicable also in 1982 provided that the total amount payable does not increase by more than 10 per cent.

(iv) The payment of fees, charges, retainers, etc., higher than those specified in (ii)—(iii) above will not be accepted by the Internal and Inland Revenue Departments as expenses for tax purposes.

C. DIVIDENDS :

(i) Dividends up to 60 per cent of profit after tax may be declared and distributed.

(ii) A withholding tax of 12.5 per cent is payable on all dividends.

(iii) The issue of scrips based on a revaluation of assets is forbidden.

(iv) For effective monitoring, companies are required to submit two copies of their annual reports and accounts to the Secretary, Productivity, Prices and Incomes Board.

(v) For the avoidance of doubt, the guidelines which obtain on the date of a company's annual general meeting shall apply in determining its distributable dividend, provided the timing of the annual general meeting fits the provision of section 124 (1) of the Companies Act 1968.

D. PRICE GUIDELINES :

(i) A single increase in price of not more than 5 per cent during the year can be effected after prior consultation provided the Board is notified 40 days in advance. No subsequent increase of below 5 per cent can thereafter be implemented except with the approval of the Board.

(ii) Prior notification of not less than 10 weeks must be given for price increases above 5 per cent. Such revision can only be effected with the specific approval of the Board.

(iii) Companies granted price increase of over 5 per cent in 1981 may effect another price revision of below 5 per cent in 1982 only with the express consent of the Board.

(iv) Companies applying for price increase should enclose a copy of their productivity scheme.

(v) Importers of all heavy industrial machinery for resale should, not apply a mark-up of more than 25 per cent of the CIF.

(vi) Importers/dealers in motor spare-parts should not apply a factor of more than 2.0 to CIF. Other officially approved local costs may be added to arrive at the selling price.

(vii) The rates charged for advertisement in the media as well as fees and commissions charged by advertisement agencies should not be increased during the year without the approval of the Board.

(viii) Applications for increases in the rentals paid for the hiring and maintenance of machines and equipments shall be made in the same manner as stipulated in paragraphs (i) and (ii) above.

(ix) Where there is a net reduction in allowable costs per unit of out-put, prices should be reduced by an amount equal to any percentage reduction resulting therefrom. The Board may, therefore, call on any firm to reduce the prices if there is evidence of reduction in allowable costs.

(x) No price increases will be entertained on the basis of anticipated increases in costs.

(xi) Items whose prices are determined through the application of government approved formula are not governed by the price guidelines.

(xii) All advertisements for the sale of goods and services in any news-media must carry actual prices of the goods and services advertised. The prices of all traded goods and services must be conspicuously exhibited to guide consumers.

E. CERTIFICATION

Auditors' reports on companies and other institutions must contain statements as to whether or not the provisions of the Incomes Policy Guidelines, as specified above, have been adhered to in every respect.

F. PENALTY

Failure to comply with the provisions of these guidelines will be punishable under section 5 (2) of Act No. 30 of 1977.
