The Republic of Sierra Leone has received a Credit/Loan from the International Development Association and the International Bank of Reconstruction and Development in various currencies equivalent to a total of U. S. \$1,500,000.00 towards financing the cost of mechanical equipment for highway maintenance, and it is intended that part of this Credit/Loan will be applied to payments under the contracts for which this Invitation to Tender is issued.

In accordance with the Credit/Loan Agreement, the Ministry of Works invites International Tenders for the provision of plant, vehicles and spare parts according to the INSTRUCTIONS TO TENDERERS and its ANNEXES that include the List of Types and Quantities and the Basic Technical Specifications of the equipment, General Requirements and Form of Contract.

Salary

Age

Candidates should not be less than 25 years and not more than 45 years of age.

Qualifications

Candidates should be of a good standard of Secondary Education preferably with G.C.E. "O" Level Certificate including English Language and at least five years Accounting experience in Local Government, Central Government or a recognised Commercial Institution. Those not in possession of the G.C.E. "O" Level Certificate or equivalent should have passed the Civil Service Entrance Examination. The educational standard may be relaxed in the case of a candidate with at least ten years Accounting experience.

Duties

(a) To take charge of the entire Accounts of the Town Councils incur expenditure in accordance with the approved Estimate; and to bring before the various Committee all bills necessary for consideration; to advise on the preparation of Annual Estimates and Applications for Supplementary Provisions Preparations of Monthly Trial Balances, Reconciliation Statements etc.

(b) Collection of Council's Revenue.

The following table shows how much was spent for various items by average low income African families in Freetown during 1961 and what the equivalent cost would be at the prices prevailing in the second quarter, 1972, and the third quarter, 1972. The relative changes in prices are shown by the index numbers.

Consumer prices rose by 46.4 per cent between the third quarter, 1972, and the average for 1961. The 'all items' index was 146.4 (1961=100). The index for the quarter under review reflected an increase of 4.3 per cent when compared with that for the corresponding quarter in 1971. There was a rise of 3.3 per cent in the index for the quarter under review when compared with that for the second quarter, 1972. The rise in the index was mainly due to increases in the average price of a number of items in the 'food and drink' group.

Food and Drink—The index for this group rose by 8.3 per cent as a result of a substantial rise in the average prices of onions, dried snapper, okra and bananas, a relatively moderate rise in the average prices of rice and mangoes and a smaller rise mainly in the average prices of palm oil, salt, groundnut oil and soda water. These increases were partially offset by a substantial fall in the average prices of big peppers, fresh tomatoes and small peppers, a relatively moderate fall in the average prices of oranges and cassava and a smaller fall mainly in the average prices of potato leaves, fresh fish and coffee.

Housing—There was a drop of 3.0 per cent in the index for this group mainly as a result of a fall in average price of firewood.

Clothing—There was no change in the index for this group.

Miscellaneous—This group recorded a rise of 0.5 per cent mainly as a result of a rise in the average prices of metholathum, liquifruta and kola nuts.

MINeworkERS PRICE INDEX

3RD QUARTER, 1972

The following table shows figures in respect of the revised Mineworkers Price Index. The index measures the average change in price of a fixed list of goods bought by mineworkers in Marampa, Yengema and Tongo earning up to Le40 a month. Separate indices are computed for Marampa and the Diamond Area (Yengema and Tongo combined). These are combined into a single index in proportion to the number of workers employed in each area.

Consumer prices rose by 34.2 per cent between the third quarter, 1972, and the average for 1961. The 'all items' index was 134.2 (1961=100). There was a rise of 3.4 per cent in the index for the quarter under review when compared with that for the corresponding quarter of 1971. Compared with the second quarter of 1972, the index for the quarter under review rose by 0.7 per cent. The rise in the index was mainly due to increases in the average price of a number of items in the 'food and drink' and 'housing' groups.

Food and Drink—The index for this group rose by 3.5 per cent mainly as a result of a substantial rise in the average price of onions and a smaller rise in the average prices of tinned milk and fanta. These increases were partially off set by a moderate fall in the average prices of pounded groundnuts, small peppers (fresh and dried), jacato and coffee and a smaller fall mainly in the average prices of cassava leaves, potato leaves, palm oil, sugar and salt.

Housing—This group recorded an increase of 1.1 per cent mainly as a result of a rise in the average price of mattress and in rent.

Clothing—There was no change in the index for this group.

Miscellaneous—The index for this group fell by 12.3 per cent mainly as a result of a substantial fall in the average prices of leaf tobacco and soda soap.

1. Application of the Programme

This programme provides for the following ordinary draws which will be performed in the manner and under the conditions specified below:—

- (1) Ordinary Draw No. 2/73 to be held on 6th February, 1973.
- (2) Mid-Month Draw No. 3/73 to be held on 20th February, 1973.

2. The Lottery tickets for the Ordinary and Mid-Month Draws

- (a) For the ordinary and mid-month draws specified in this programme, the State Lottery shall issue 50,000 tickets to bearer (hereinafter referred to as tickets).
- (b) The tickets issued for any of the series mentioned in section 1 above will be numbered in the places (on the face of each ticket) with serial numbers:—

- (1) Ordinary Draw No. 2/73 from AA 00001 to AA 50000
- (2) Mid-Month Draw No. 3/73 from B 00001 to B 50000 inclusive. The tickets will be marked with the words "Ordinary Draw" and "Mid-Month Draw" respectively also with the series number of the draw in which the tickets are to participate.

- (c) In the programme a reference to a serial number shall be deemed to include a reference to any letter printed immediately before the digits forming the said serial number

3. Participation in the draws

- (a) All tickets issued for the ordinary and mid-month draws specified in this programme will participate subject to the conditions specified in this programme. Separate draw will be held for each series.
- (b) Notwithstanding anything contained in this section 3, a ticket issued by the State Lottery under section 2 hereof shall not participate in the draw if either the serial number on the face of the tickets (in either of the places where that number is marked) or the series numbers or any digit or part of a digit, are not printed thereon, or are not properly printed or printed in such a manner that it is not possible to verify such numbers or digits on the face of the ticket.
- (c) The holder of a ticket on which the serial number of the ticket or the series number of the draw is not printed or is not properly printed or is printed in such a manner that it cannot be verified as stated in paragraph (b) of this section, shall be entitled to receive from the State Lottery only the nominal price of the ticket as stated thereon. Such ticket shall not entitle its holder to any right whatsoever other than the aforesaid right to receive the nominal price and in particular such ticket shall not entitle its holder to any compensation whatsoever for not including such ticket in the draw, or for any other reason.

4. The sale of tickets and their price

- (a) The ticket shall be sold by the State Lottery directly and/or through Selling Agents or Sellers appointed by the above-mentioned agents.
- (b) The price of each ticket shall be:—

9. Lottery Machines

- (a) For making the ordinary and mid-month draws under this programme, the State Lottery shall use, of its discretion from time to time:—

(i) The (five) rotary machines as specified in Section 10 herein or

(ii) The projection machine as specified in section 11 herein

- (b) For making the ordinary and mid-month draws under this programme, the State Lottery shall use, as addition to the machines as mentioned in paragraph (a) above, an additional lottery box in the form of a draw hereinafter referred to as (Prize Box).

- (c) In the said draw the machine and prize box specified above shall be operated in accordance with instructions given by the representative of the State Lottery present at the draw.

10. Rotary Machines—Manner of use

- (a) The five rotary machines shall be marked consecutively with letters A, B, C, D, and E.

- (b) Before the making of the draws under this programme, the balls as specified below shall be inserted in each of the rotary machines:—

- (1) In machine A—ten balls marked consecutively with digits 0 to 9 inclusive.
- (2) In machine B—ten balls marked consecutively with digits 0 to 9 inclusive.
- (3) In machine C—ten balls marked consecutively with digits 0 to 9 inclusive.
- (4) In machine D—ten balls marked consecutively with digits 0 to 9 inclusive.
- (5) In machine E—five balls marked consecutively with digits 0 to 4 inclusive.

- (c) Every ball of the said balls bearing digit 6 or 9 as the case may be shall be marked with an additional sign i.e. a horizontal line drawn under the digit on the ball referred to above.

11. Projecting Machine—Manner of use

- (a) The projecting machine—which was manufactured for the State Lottery by the Royal Institute for International Research in Norway—shall consist of wheels on which digits as specified below are engraved. The machine shall consist of a device for the projection of the digits on the wheels as specified, in such a manner that not more than one digit on any wheel of the machine shall be projected at a time.

- (b) In order to execute the draw in its following stages, i.e. first, second, third, fourth, fifth and sixth stages five wheels are to be inserted in the machine 1 and shall be marked consecutively with letters A, B, C, D, and E as follows:—

- (1) Wheel 'A' on which digits 0 to 9 inclusive are engraved.
- (2) Wheel 'B' on which digits 0 to 9 inclusive are engraved.
- (3) Wheel 'C' on which digits 0 to 9 inclusive are engraved.
- (4) Wheel 'D' on which digits 0 to 9 inclusive are engraved.
- (5) Wheel 'E' on which digits 0 to 4 inclusive are engraved.

12. *The preparation of the Prize Box for the Ordinary and Mid-Month draws*

Before making the ordinary and mid-month draws under this programme a number of cards equivalent to the number of the tickets that will be drawn at the 6th stages of the draw will be deposited in the prizes box. On each such card there will be printed a sum equal to the amount of one of the prizes specified for the said stage of the draw in accordance with sections 6 and 6A (a) of this programme.

13. *The manner in which the draw of the tickets for the ordinary and mid-month draws shall be made under sections 6 and 6A (a) by the rotary machine as specified in section 3*

(a) The winning numbers of the first stage of the ordinary and mid-month draws shall be drawn by the picking up of one ball only from the rotary machine marked 'A' and the coming up of this ball shall be deemed to constitute the drawing at this stage, of all the tickets of that series the serial numbers of which end with the digit marked on the ball as drawn from the machine marked 'A'.

(b) The winning numbers of the second stage of the ordinary and mid-month draws shall be drawn by picking up of the ball as specified in paragraph (a) above and before commencing the draw of the second stage of the ordinary and mid-month draws, the ball ejected from machine 'A' is re-inserted into that machine and ten balls marked consecutively with digits from 0 to 9 inclusive shall be deposited in machine marked 'B'.

(c) On completion of the operation prescribed in paragraph (b) the draw of the numbers corresponding to the second stage of the ordinary and mid-month draws shall be held by picking up two balls, the first ball from machine 'A' and the second ball from machine 'B' to constitute the drawing of all tickets the serial numbers of which end with the two digits marked on the balls picked up as aforesaid.

(d) On completion of the operation prescribed in paragraph (c), the draw of the numbers corresponding to the third, fourth and fifth stages of the ordinary and mid-month draws shall be held separately for each item of the items enumerated in the said third stage and immediately afterwards—separately for each item of the items enumerated in the said fourth stage—and immediately afterwards—separately for each item of the items enumerated in the said fifth stage, i.e. by picking up three balls and four balls respectively; the first ball from machine A, the second—from machine B, the third—from machine C and the fourth—from machine D, and the coming up of these three and four balls shall be deemed with respect to the relevant items of the third, fourth and fifth stages as the case may be, to constitute the drawing of all the tickets the serial numbers of which end with the digit marked on the ball picked up as aforesaid; that is—the digit marked on the ball drawn from the machine A shall be deemed to be the first digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit marked on the ball drawn from the machine B shall be deemed to be the second digit from the right side of the said serial number the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine C shall be deemed to be the third digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine D shall be deemed to be the fourth digit from the right side of the said serial numbers.

(e) After the completion of the draws of each item of the third, fourth and fifth stages, the balls that were picked up from each rotary machines marked A, B, C and D shall be returned to the machines from which they were removed before commencing the draws for the next stage.

(f) The draw of the numbers of the sixth stage of the ordinary and mid-month draws shall be made separately for each number which has to be drawn in accordance with the items enumerated for this stage) by the picking up of one ball only from each of the rotary machines marked A, B, C, D and E and the picking up simultaneously of one card only from the 'prize box'. The coming up of the five balls—one only from each of the rotary machines marked A, B, C, D and E shall be deemed to be the draw of the tickets bearing the serial number conforming to the number formed by the digits marked on the five balls in such away that the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine A shall be deemed to be the first digit from the right side of the serial number of the said ticket and the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine B shall be deemed to be the second digit from the right side of the said serial number and that the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine C shall be deemed to be the third digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine D shall be deemed to be the fourth digit from the right side of the said serial number and that the digit marked on the ball drawn from machine E shall be deemed to be the fifth digit from the right side of the said serial number. The amount marked on the card drawn simultaneously from the prizes box as aforesaid.

(g) After the picking up of the balls as specified in paragraph (f) above the ball drawn from each of the machines marked A, B, C, D and E as aforesaid, shall be returned to the machine from which it was drawn before beginning the draw for the next item of the stage.

(h) Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph (g) above, in the event that the balls drawn in accordance with the said paragraph from machines A, B, C, D and E all bear the digit '0', it shall be deemed that the ticket bearing number 5,0000 was drawn in accordance with that paragraph.

(i) Notwithstanding anything contained in this section 13 in the event of more than one ball being picked up from any of the machines A, B, C, D and E at the making of the draws specified in this programme, including the separate draw of tickets at the 6th stage, the picking up of all balls for this item of the stage of the draws in question shall be null and void and all balls so drawn shall be returned into the machine from which they were drawn and the draw for this item shall be recommenced from the beginning.

(j) Notwithstanding anything contained in this section, in the event of one or more of the balls being broken while a draw is being made for any item of a stage of the stages of the draw specified in this programme the draw shall be cancelled and the broken ball or balls shall be replaced by others bearing the same digit and the draw for this item shall be recommenced from the beginning.

(k) The provision of this section 13 shall not apply in the event of the State Lottery deciding under section 9 (a) hereof to use the projecting machine referred to in sub-para (ii) thereof.

14. *The manner in which the draw of the tickets for the Ordinary and Mid-Month draws shall be made under section 6 (a) by the projecting machine specified in section 9 (a) (ii)*

(a) The winning number of the first stage of the Ordinary and Mid-Month draws shall be drawn by the employment of wheel 'A' only of the machine No. 1 and the digit that will be projected from the wheel marked 'A' shall be deemed to constitute the drawing at this stage, of all the tickets of that series, the serial numbers of which end with the digit projected from wheel 'A'.

(b) Immediately after the projection of the digit as specified in paragraph (a) above, the machine No. 1 shall be removed from the projecting machine and substituted by machine No. 2 with its set of five wheels marked with letters 'A' to 'E' will be engraved with digits 0-4 and the others 0-9.

(c) On completion of the operation prescribed in paragraph (b) above, the draw of the numbers corresponding to the second stage of the ordinary and mid-month draws shall be held by the employment of wheels, A and B only of the projecting machine and the two digits that will be projected from the wheels A and B shall be deemed to constitute the drawing of all tickets the serial numbers of which end with the two digits projected as aforesaid, that is—the digit projected from wheel 'A', shall be deemed to be the first digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit projected from wheel 'B', shall be deemed to be the second digit from the right side of the said serial number.

(d) On completion of the operation prescribed in paragraph (c) above the draw of the numbers corresponding to the third, fourth and fifth stages of the ordinary and mid-month draws shall be held separately for each item of the items enumerated in the said third stage and immediately afterwards—separately for each item of the items enumerated in the said fourth stage and immediately—separately for each item of the items enumerated in the said fifth stage; by the employment of wheels A, B, C and D only of the projecting machine and the three and four digits that will be projected from the wheels A, B, C and D shall be deemed with respect to relevant items of the third, fourth and fifth stages as the case may be, to constitute the drawing of all tickets the serial numbers of which, end with the three and four digits projected as aforesaid that is—the digit projected from wheel 'A' shall be deemed to be the first digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit projected from wheel 'B' shall be deemed to be the second digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit projected from the wheel 'C' shall be deemed to be the third digit from the right side of the said serial number and the digit projected from wheel 'D' shall be deemed to be the fourth digit from the right side of the said serial number.

- (e) After the completion of the draws of each item of the third, fourth and fifth stages of the ordinary and mid-month draws prescribed in paragraph (d) above, the draw of the numbers of the 6th stage of the ordinary and mid-month draws shall be made separately for each number which has to be drawn in accordance with all the wheels A, B, C, D, and E and the picking up simultaneously of one card from the 'Prize Box' the five digits that will be projected from the wheels A, B, C, D and E shall be deemed to be the draw of the ticket bearing the serial number conforming to the number formed by the digit projected from the five wheels in such a way that the digit projected from wheel 'A' shall be deemed to be the first digit from the right side of the serial number of the said ticket and the digit projected from wheel 'B' shall be deemed to be the second digit from the right side of the serial number and that the digit projected from wheel 'C' shall be deemed to be the third digit from the right side of the said serial number and that the digit projected from wheel 'D' shall be deemed to be the fourth from the right side of the said serial number and that the digit projected from wheel 'E' shall be deemed to be the fifth digit from the right side of the said serial number. The amount marked on the card drawn simultaneously from the prizes box as aforesaid.
- (f) Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph (e) above, in the event that all the digits projected from the wheels A, B, C, D and E shall be '0' it shall be deemed that the ticket bearing serial number 00,000 was drawn in accordance with that paragraph.
- (g) Notwithstanding anything contained in this section 14 in the event of a number being unclearly projected on a digit or digits of such number shall be missing, at any time of any stage of the stages of the draws specified in the programme, including the separate draw of tickets at the sixth stage, such projection shall be null and void and the projecting machine shall be re-employed for the making of the draw of this item.
- (h) The provisions of this section 14 shall not apply in the event of State Lottery declining under section 9 (a) hereof to use the rotary machine referred to in sub-para (f) thereof.

- (d) Notwithstanding anything contained in this section 16, if the Managing Director of the State Lottery has reason to believe that a ticket presented for payment has been lost or stolen, payment of any prize to which the bearer would be entitled under this programme, may be withheld for a reasonable period in order to permit any person who claims that he has a better right to the ticket than the bearer, to institute legal action and if such person initiate any such action within the period, the State Lottery shall withhold payment until the matter has been finally decided by a competent Court.

17. *Income Tax*

The Prizes are not liable to Income Tax.

18. *Licence to hold the draw*

The draws are held in accordance with the terms of a licence issued under section 3 of the Control of Betting and Lotteries Act, 1962.

19. *The Address of the State Lottery*

In the case of Government Officers, the entry Form must be countersigned in the appropriate place by a Senior Officer of his/her Department, i.e. an Officer in Salary Scale A, B, C, 4-7 or M, certifying that the Entry Form was completed and signed in his presence in the usual handwriting of the candidate.

The signature of candidates who are NOT in the service of Government must be witnessed and the Entry Form countersigned in the appropriate place by a person in one of the following categories:—

- (a) A member of the Sierra Leone Parliament.
(b) A Clergyman.
(c) A Senior Civil Servant of the Government of Sierra Leone i.e. One earning Salary in Scale A., B, C 4-7 or M.
(d) A Solicitor and/or Barrister.
(e) A Qualified and Registered Medical Practitioner.
(f) A Principal of a Recognised Secondary School or Training College.

Any departure from the above requirement may lead to the rejection of a candidate's application.

The completed Entry Form must be accompanied by the Treasury Receipt, which would have been sent back to the candidate, and a recent PASSPORT-SIZED PHOTOGRAPH, witnessed at the back by a person in one of the Categories listed above who should also be the one Countersigning the Entry Form. OFFER OF SCHOLARSHIPS BY THE GOVERNMENT OF THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY

The Government of the Federal Republic of Germany is offering eight scholarships for the 1973/74 academic year to Sierra Leone Citizens for Advanced Vocational Training in the Federal Republic of Germany in all professional fields excluding Press, Broadcasting and Television. These awards include one which will be made for an Agriculture Expert in connection with the Fertilizer Project.

Duration of the Scholarship

Eighteen months, four months of which will be spent at a German Language School before candidates embark on their proposed courses of study.

Eligibility

Candidates should possess a good standard of general as well as professional education ranging from a G.C.E. O level or intermediate City and Guilds Certificate to a Bachelor or Master's degree and at least 5 years practical experience.

A comparatively lower standard of general and professional education can be compensated in individual cases by a record of outstanding practical experience of at least 10 years.

It is important that the candidates be recommended by their present employers.

The value of Awards

The Scholarships will include:

1. Free return air passage (Tourist Class) Freetown/Germany
2. A monthly allowance of Le120-Le170 during the vocational training.
3. Full boards and lodging while at the Language school plus a monthly pocket money.
4. Starting Allowance
5. Warm Clothing Allowance
6. Medical expenses and insurance against accidents.

No dependants allowance or any other allowance apart from these set out above, will be paid by either the German or the Sierra Leone Government.

Applications from candidates in Government Service and Non-Governmental organisations should be submitted through the heads of Departments or Employers in each case.
