SIAKA STEVENS, President.

WHEREAS by Sub-section (2) of Section 82 of the Constitution it is provided that the Chairman and Members of the Public Service Commission shall be appointed by the President acting in accordance with the advice of the Prime Minister:

AND WHEREAS the President is pleased to appoint EUGENE JOSEPHUS OMODELE GABBIDON, Esquire:

Now, THEREFORE, I SIAKA STEVENS, President and Commander-in-Chief of the Republic of Sierra Leone, acting in accordance with the advice of the Prime Minister, hereby appoint the said EUGENE JOSEPHUS OMODELE GABBIDON, Esquire, to be Chairman of the said Public Service Commission with effect from the 1st of October, 1977, subject to the provisions of the Constitution, for a period of three years.

Freetown Wellington Bo Town Bonthe (i) A number of workpeople who registered for employment are known to be "not unemployed". They register with the hope of obtaining more regular or more remunerative employment.

(ii) Maritime Pool:—Number awaiting sea-going employment = 8,574; this figure consists of the following:—

(a) Persons who have been unemployed for over three weeks.

Persons who have recently returned from a voyage and who should rest for three weeks before being eligible for another voyage. These unemployed workers are usually engaged on casual jobs asstevedores while awaiting sea-going employment. 9

(iii) Articled Seamen's Pool:—Number awaiting sea-going employment = 642; this figure consists of persons who were unemployed at the date referred to above.

(iv) With effect from January, 1973, this table has been revised by classifying the occupations for which people registered in accordance with the International Standard Classification of Occupations. The figure for Apprentices who normally are classified under a separate Group has been shown in this table under the occupational group for which they registered but separately. The figure for 'Boys' in previous statistics has been included in the figure for 'male' in the current statistics.

CONSUMER PRICE INDEX FOR MINEWORKERS-2ND QUARTER, 1977

The Consumer Price Index for 2nd Quarter, 1977 for mineworkers of the Diamond Mining Areas, Yengema and Tongo Field was 195.8 as compared with 199.3 for 1st Quarter, 1977. This shows a decrease of 3.5 points or 1.8 per cent over the previous quarter.

The most important decreases among the major group items were for "Food and Drinks" and "Housing". The former decreased by 15.5 points or 6.7 per cent while the latter decreased by 7.1 points or 3.5 per cent over the previous quarter. The index (1961=103) indicates the average movement of retail prices of selected items known as "market basket". This market basket represents the purchases of the low income earning African families in the mining areas of Marampa, Yengema and Tongo Field. The temporary closure of the S.L.D.C. Mines at Marampa has however made it impossible for the compilation of indices for that area. Separate indices are computed for the Diamond Mining Areas (Yengema and Tongo Field combined). These are combined into a single index weighted in proportion to the number of workers employed in each area.

Food and Drinks—The index for this group fell by 15.3 points or 6.7 per cent over the last quarter. It should be noted that this index group had not experienced a drop since the 4th quarter, 1975. The decrease this quarter was mainly due to seasonal factors. There were price decreases for palm oil, tinned tomato purce, cassava, onions, potato and cassava leaves. This is a continuation of the trend experienced last quarter. There were however price increases for beef, tinned sardines, tinned milk, small pepper, rice, sugar and coffee. The average price of palm wine was constant.

Housing—The housing index decreased by 7.1 points or 3.5 per cent over the previous quarter. Such a decrease was last experienced during 2nd quarter, 1973. Among the items that had a price decrease were glass tumblers, kettles (buckets) and firewood. There was a small price increase for torch light batteries while the prices of most of the items in this index group remained constant.

Clothing—There was a price increase of 13.4 points or 7.3 per cent compared with the previous quarter. The Clothing index and the Miscellaneous group index were the only 2 indices that experienced a price increase during this quarter. Towel (cotton), shirting, ladies slippers, men's sleeveless vests, men's sandals and tailoring charges were some of the items that accounted for this increase. Two items hat remained constant were women's lappas and men's cotton shirts.

Miscellaneous—There was an increase of 2.9 points or 1.9 per cent over the last quarter. Personal care items were responsible for this price increase. Most items remained constant among which were cough and headache medicines.
