GOVERNMENT SECONDARY SCHOOL, KOYEIMA, BO

Tenders are invited for supply to Government Secondary School, Koyeima via Bo, of the following articles of foodstuffs for the period September, 1984 to July, 1985.

- (a) Rice (preferably native milled) ... 124 bags x 110lbs. net monthly or as requisitioned by the Principal.
- (b) Edible Palm-Oil (without Offensive smell) ... 10x44-gallon drum per term or as requisitioned by the Principal.
- (c) Meat (fresh, exclusive of ribs, bones, feet, back bones, head and entrails of cattle) ... 600lbs. weekly or as requisitioned by the Principal.
- (d) Dried bonga (Good average size of 4oz. whole and free from moisture) ... 910 dozens monthly or as requisitioned by the Principal.
- (e) Groundnuts (Decorticated and sun-dried) ... 620lbs. monthly or as requisitioned by the Principal.
- (f) Bread ... Forty cent loaves, 600 thrice weekly or as requisitioned by the Principal.
- (g) Cakes ... Ten cent pieces 600 thrice weekly or as requisitioned by the Principal.
- (h) Beans (broad and small black-eyed sun-dried) ... 400lbs. monthly or as requisitioned by the Principal.
- (i) Fruits: according to season (Bananas and oranges) ... 600 daily or as requisitioned by the Principal.
- (j) Pepper (freshly dried) 100lbs. monthly or as requisitioned by the Principal.
- (k) Onions ... 3 bags monthly or as requisitioned by the Principal.
- (l) Provisions ... As requisitioned by the Principal.
- (m) Firewood ... 40 cords monthly or as requisitioned by the Principal.

2. Tenders should state seasonal or all year prices; the articles are to be delivered at the Government Secondary School, Koyeima. The Principal reserves the right to state which articles are fit for consumption. Articles not fit for consumption should be removed at the expense of the contractor. Tenders may be made for one or more of the above-mentioned articles.

3. Tenders which must be sealed and addressed to the Secretary, Board of Governors, Government Secondary School, Koyeima and clearly marked "Tender for supply of foodstuffs to the Government Secondary School Koyeima", will be accepted up to 23rd August, 1984 inclusive. Tenders must be sent under sealed cover through the post.

4. Each successful tender will be required to deposit against the contract, or amount equivalent to 5% (five per cent) of the annual value of the contract which deposit will be refunded on the satisfactory termination of the contract.

5. The person whose tenders are accepted will be required to enter into bonds for the fulfilment of their respective contracts and every contract shall contain a clause to the effect that the person whose tender is accepted agrees that the provisions set forth in schedule to the Government Circular No. 23 of 1946 shall be referable to and form part of the contract.

6. Government does not bind itself to accept the lowest of any tender and reserves the right to accept all or any portion of any tender.

7. Successful tenderers must deliver their foodstuffs to the school themselves and make private arrangements for the collection of their containers. The school is under no obligation to do these contracts.
