2. With immediate effect all public commercial vehicles excluding taxis should clearly display their destinations in the front and rear of the vehicle and the routes prescribed should strictly be adhered to for the approved fares.

3. All defaulters failing to comply with these new feet regulations will face serious consequences in accombine the Road Transport Act of 1964.
