The Bank of Sierra Leone announces that Treasury Bills to the face value of Le820,950,000 (Eight hundred and twenty million, nine hundred and fifty thousand leones) will be offered for sale to the public at a discount of 18 % (eighteen per cent) per annum on Thursday, 3rd November, 1988, to mature on Thursday, 2nd February, 1989.

Applications for the purchase of Treasury Bills may be lodged through any of the Commercial Banks or at the Bank of Sierra Leone which will not accept applications after 1.30 p.m. on Tuesday, 1st November, 1988.

The minimum amount for which applications can be made is Le5,000 (five thousand leones) but applications can be made for higher amounts in multiples of Le1,000 (One thousand leones) to any amount.

##### SIERRA LEONE DEBT EQUITY CONVERSION CODE

1. **Eligible Debt:** External debt eligible for a debt equity conversion should be any of the following:
  - (a) blocked accounts either in the Bank of Sierra Leone or local commercial banks awaiting ease in foreign exchange availability for repatriation.
  - (b) Rescheduled debt.
  - (c) Unrescheduled past due debt.
2. Each application for conversion would be assessed by the Bank of Sierra Leone on a case by case basis but preference would be given to applications for investments in the following:
  - (a) export sector;
  - (b) import substituting activities and
  - (c) in addition to (a) and (b) activities should show capacity to generate high value added and employment promoting. Authority should be obtained from the Ministry of Trade and Industry for all non-financial investments.
3. **Use of capitalised funds:** Funds converted cannot be used for the following:
  - (a) working capital;
  - (b) pay off existing prior debts;
  - (c) to buy foreign currency or precious minerals and metals or pay foreign banks or suppliers,
  - (d) to acquire existing foreign debt unless seller invests proceeds in Sierra Leone in accordance with this Debt/Equity Conversion Code.
4. **Repatriation of Capital:** Capital repatriation can only take place after five years of the investment. Dividends out of the profit earned by the local enterprise on the other hand can be paid after two years. In both cases application for repatriation would have to be approved by the Bank of

Sierra Leone. If an investment effected through the debt equity scheme is liquidated and results in an involuntary conversion, then any amount in excess of that allowed for repatriation should be deposited either in a commercial bank or re-invested in another preferred investment project.

5. **Matching Funds:** Applications for debt equity conversion with associated foreign currency inflows would receive priority consideration relative to unmatched applications.
6. **Release Rate of Converted Funds:** The rate of release for debt equity funds will be determined by the Bank of Sierra Leone. Amount not immediately released should be deposited at the Bank of Sierra Leone until the effective release date approved by the Bank of Sierra Leone occurs.
7. **Required Documentation**
  - (a) Each application for debt equity conversion should be supported by:
    - (i) A Purchase Agreement between the holder of the eligible debt and the investor.
    - (ii) A Termination Agreement between the holder of the eligible debt, the investor and the beneficiary of the investment.
  - (b) Applications should contain the following details:
    - (i) Investor's name and address—
    - (ii) Local investment proposed—
      - (a) Name and address of company
      - (b) Board of Directors/Principal officers
      - (c) Economic activity of enterprise
    - (iii) (a) Amount of proposed convertible debt in US\$
    - (b) Closing date of application
    - (iv) Details of investment
      - (a) Sector
      - (b) Export/Import bias
      - (c) Evidence of share certificate (photocopy).
8. **Exchange Rate:** The exchange rates applicable to any conversion would be negotiated for each application.
9. **Conversion Fee:** Conversion rights attract a fee ranging from 10 %–14 % of the face amount being converted to be paid to the Bank of Sierra Leone.
