
WITHDRAWAL OF THE OLD ONE SIZE FAMILY OF BANKNOTES FROM CIRCULATION

Govt. Notice No. 102

Further to the Government Notice on the introduction of the Resized Banknotes and the withdrawal of the old one size family of banknotes from circulation, the Bank of Sierra Leone, hereby wish to inform the general public as follows:-

- (1) "That as at 7th February, 2011, a total of 94.01% of old one size family of banknotes in circulation has been withdrawn from circulation.
- (2) In order to achieve complete withdrawal of the old one size family of banknotes from circulation, the bank has extended the period of withdrawal from May 14, 2011 to August 14, 2011 to give the general public an opportunity to exchange their old one size family of banknotes for the new family of resized banknotes through Commercial banks.
- (3) In accordance with Section 26 (3) and (4) of the Bank of Sierra Leone Act, 2000; the old one size family of banknotes shall cease to be legal tender, effective 15th August, 2011. In this regard, the general public is hereby informed that, a special window shall be opened at the Banking Department, Bank of Sierra Leone Headquarters, Siaka Stevens Street, Freetown and at the Branch Office in Kenema for the exchange of the old one size family of banknotes after 15th August, 2011".

GOVERNMENT WHITE PAPER ON THE CONDUCT
OF PARAMOUNT CHIEF ALHAJI DR. MADESARY
SHERIFF II OF BIRIWA CHIEFDOM, BOMBALI
DISTRICT IN THE NORTHERN PROVINCE

Background:

Following persistent complaints by the people of Biriwa Chiefdom to Government on the conduct of their Paramount Chief, Alhaji Dr. Madesaray Sheriff II an Administrative Investigation was set up followed by a Judicial Commission of Inquiry which was to look into the conduct of the Paramount Chief.

The Judiciary Commission had the following Terms of reference:

"To inquire into the conduct of Paramount Chief Alhaji Madesaray Sheriff II of Biriwa Chiefdom, Bombali District of the Northern Province of the Republic of Sierra Leone and to determine whether his conduct has been of a kind subversive of the interest of Good Government". The Commission met in Makeni, Bombali District in the Northern Province of Sierra Leone, from November 2009 to June 2010.

The Commission comprised the following:

Honourable Justice Abdulia Shiekh Fofanah—Chairman
P. C. Masa Yelli N'tham II
P. C. Alimamy B. Y. Korama II
as Assessors

The Commission after critical evaluation of the evidence adduced before it made the following findings, conclusion and recommendations.

Findings:

1. The Paramount Chief Alhaji Dr. Madesaray Sheriff II having being elected in office did not take appropriate steps and proper follow-up procedures to constitute or set up an effective functioning Chiefdom Council in order to ensure and promote good Chiefdom Administration for Biriwa Chiefdom.
2. The Paramount Chief of Biriwa Chiefdom, Chief Alhaji Dr. Madesaray Sheriff II outrightly showed a case of neglect for all Chiefdom Development Committees as he did not seek to create and effectively strengthen Chiefdom development Committees in order to properly coordinate Development activities and programmes in Biriwa Chiefdom.
3. The Paramount Chief Alhaji Dr. Madesaray Sheriff II did not take appropriate steps in the interest of Good Governance to ensure and maintain a properly functioning Local Court system that is viable and effective enough in the administration of justice among the people of Biriwa Chiefdom.
4. The Paramount Chief Alhaji Madesaray II did not strive for peace among the people of Biriwa Chiefdom in order to promote unity and to develop a good sense of unity and to develop a good sense of identity among them as people of the same Chiefdom despite their belonging to different tribes.
5. The Paramount Chief Alhaji Dr. Madesaray Sheriff II never held Consultations for advice from the Chiefdom Council on decisions and actions taken by him on matters relating to administrative governance in Biriwa Chiefdom. Instead the Paramount Chief always took unilateral decisions and acted single-handedly in matters or issues of public concern to the interest and welfare of the people in the Chiefdom.

6. The Paramount Chief Alhaji Dr. Madeseray Sheriff II could not effectively carry out or exercise the powers, duties and functions of paramount Chiefs for Biriwa Chiefdom, he was not physically resident in the Chiefdom.
7. The Paramount Chief Alhaji Dr. Madeseray Sheriff II is incapable of fulfilling his role as Traditional Ruler in the Biriwa Chief since he cannot participate in the traditional cultural lives of the people as he is not a member of any one of the Traditional Secret Societies in Biriwa Chiefdom.
8. The Paramount Chief Alhaji Dr. Madeseray Sheriff II has shown no respect and complete disregard for the existence and protection of traditional secret societies as socio-cultural institutions by improperly interfering with their right and freedom, largely among the Limba ethnic group who form the majority of residents in the Biriwa Chiefdom.
9. The Paramount Chief Alhaji Dr. Madeseray Sheriff II clearly showed himself to be partisan in national politics as he conduct himself among his people in a manner in which obviously holding himself out as an active political party supporter.
10. The Paramount Chief Alhaji Dr. Madeseray Sheriff II showed complete inability to competently mediate or settle disputes arising between cattle owners and farm owners and, he also demonstrates unfairness to local resident farmers whose crops are damaged by cattle denying them access to justice.
11. The Paramount Chief Alhaji Dr. Madeseray Sheriff II refused to participate in Government programmes, and support Government initiatives or actions implemented in the Biriwa Chiefdom.
12. The Paramount Chief Alhaji Dr. Madeseray Sheriff II on very many occasions demonstrated conduct which has not only negatively encouraged and promoted unrest but also undermines unity, freedom and justice in the Chiefdom among the people of Biriwa.
13. The Paramount Chief Alhaji Dr. Madeseray Sheriff II carried out extensive illegal logging activities in Biriwa Chiefdom and did so with conduct which is inimical to the right and land owners in the Chiefdom.
14. The Paramount Chief Alhaji Dr. Madeseray Sheriff II unduly interfered with the "Lumar" Market at Kamasigie Village in the Biriwa Chiefdom to the extent that he completely disorganizes the

"Lumar" market and diverted the revenue earned from it for his private use instead of the Chiefdom Treasury.

15. Lastly, the Paramount Chief Alhaji Dr. Madeseray Sheriff II improperly involved himself with local tax collection in the Biriwa Chiefdom and failed to make proper returns of local tax revenue collected by himself to the Chiefdom Treasury.

Conclusion

IN ACCORDANCE with all the findings made by this Commission as stated above, the conclusion of the Commission is that:

The Paramount Chief of Biriwa Chiefdom Bombali District in the Northern Province of The Republic of Sierra Leone, Alhaji Dr. Madeseray Sheriff II whilst serving as Paramount Chief for the Biriwa Chiefdom has clearly and in so many ways demonstrated conduct which is not in accordance with good governance.

Recommendations:

1. That immediate step must be taken to restore peace, order and proper Chiefdom Governance by putting in place the necessary administrative machinery for the enhancement and promotion of good governance in the Biriwa Chiefdom.
2. The Paramount Chief must give a proper account of or pay outstanding balance of Le 1,775,000 (One Million, Seven Hundred and Seventy Five Thousand Leones) to the Treasury Clerk of the Biriwa Chiefdom as local tax revenue on the remaining local tax receipt books he failed to account for to the Treasury Clerk in 2007.
3. The Paramount Chief must return to the Treasury Clerk of the Biriwa Chiefdom the remaining Local Tax Receipt Books, which he still has in his possession.
4. The Government having considered the report of the Commission of Inquiry.
 - (a) accepts its findings and recommendations and
 - (b) orders the Ministry of Internal Affairs, Local Government and Rural development and the National Electoral Commission to put modalities in place for the election of a new Paramount Chief for the Biriwa Chiefdom in accordance with the Chieftaincy Act 2009 as soon as possible.
