LEGAL NOTICE NO. 31 OF 1989

THE CONFERMENT OF HONOURS ACT, 1970

(Act No. 42 of 1970)

THE INSTITUTION OF THE SOMHLOLO BRAVERY MEDAL, NOTICE, 1989

(Under Section 2)

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Section 2 of the Conferment of Honours Act, 1970, I, MSWATI III, KING OF SWAZILAND, hereby issue the following Notice—

Citation and Commencement.

1. This Notice may be cited as the Institution of the Somhlolo Bravery Medal, Notice, 1989 and shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st January, 1987.

Institution of Somhlolo Bravery Medal.

- 2. (1) There is hereby instituted a medal known as the Somhlolo Brevery Medal which shall be in solid 9ct gold designed in the open shape of four gold battle axes joined in their end points and having a diameter of approximately one and three quarter inches.
 - (2) (a) Superimposed in the centre of the obverse side of the medal shall be a circular white enamelled shield bearing the words "YEBU QHAWE" in blue
 - (b) The shield shall be surrounded by a wreath of Lourie bird feathers.
 - (c) The reverse side of the shield shall be polished gold on which the recipient's name and date of award shall be engraved.
 - (3) The medal shall be pendent from a length of silk riband fitting at the back.

Oualifications for the medal.

3. The medal shall be awarded to persons who have displayed acts of bravery as determined by the Prime Minister in consultation with the King.

THE INSTITUTION OF THE CORONATION MEDAL NOTICE, 1989

(Under Section 2)

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Section 2 of the Conferment of Honours Act, 1970, I, MSWATI III, KING OF SWAZILAND, hereby issue the following Notice—

Citation and Commencement.

1. This Notice may be cited as the Coronation Medal Notice, 1989 and shall be deemed to have come into force on 25th April, 1986.

Institution of Coronation Medal.

- 2. (1) There is hereby instituted a medal known as the Coronation Medal which shall be of a 38.3 milimetre diameter and 3.6 milimetre thickness with a raised edge.
- (2) The medal shall be in a highly polished silver finish and on its obverse side shall be an effigy of the head of His Majesty King Mswati III raised whilst on the reverse side shall be the heraldic coat of arms of the Kingdom of Swaziland raised in relief with a ribbon and motto below surrounded by the works "TO COMMEMORATE THE CORONATION OF KING MSWATI III 25TH APRIL, 1986".
- (3) The medal shall be attached by a circular ring to a 38 milimetre width ribbon of Lourie bird red with three stripes of white, royal blue and white on either side with an outer stripe of red.

Qualifications for the medal.

3. The Prime Minister in consultation with the King shall determine the people who qualify to be awarded the medal.

THE ORDERS, DECORATIONS AND MEDALS (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 1989

(Under Section 4)

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Section 4 of the Conferment of Honours Act, 1970, I hereby make the following Regulations—

Citation and commencement.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Orders, Decorations and Medals (Amendment) Regulations, 1989.

Amendment of regulation 31.

2. Regulation 31 of the Orders, Decorations, and Medals Regulations, 1971 is amended in subregulation (1) after the words "Umbutfo Swaziland Defence Force" by adding the words "who has completed a period of at least ten years continuous service and".
