# LEGAL NOTICE NO. 105 OF 2011

THE SWAZILAND NATIONAL PROVIDENT FUND ORDER, 1974 (Order No. 23 of 1974)

# THE SWAZILAND NATIONAL PROVIDENT FUND (FUNERAL BENEFIT) REGULATIONS, 2011 (Under Section 44)

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 44 of the Swaziland National Provident Fund Order, 1974, the Minister for Labour and Social Security makes the following Regulations -

### Citation and Commencement

- 1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Swaziland National Provident Fund (Funeral Benefit) Regulations, 2011.
  - (2) These Regulations shall come into force on the date of publication in the gazette.

## Qualifying Members

- 2. (1) A person who qualifies to benefit under these Regulations shall -
  - (a) be an active member of the Swaziland National Provident Fund at the time of his death;
  - (b) have contributed to the Swaziland National Provident Fund for a period not less than nine consecutive months in a period of twelve months prior to the member's demise; and
  - (c) be a member who dies on or after the commencement of these Regulations.
- (2) A seasonal or casual worker shall benefit under these Regulations where he has contributed for a period not less than five months prior to the commencement of these Regulations. Thereafter he must have contributed for at-least three consecutive months in a period of twelve months prior to his death.

# Funeral benefit

- 3. (1) The benefits in terms of these Regulations shall be paid upon the death of the qualifying member.
  - (2) The benefits of qualifying members of the Fund shall be as follows -
    - (a) a cash amount of E3000.00 (three thousand Emalangeni); or
    - (b) funeral services to the value or E3000.00 (three thousand Emalangeni).
