

Notice submission deadlines

Government Printing Works has over the last few months implemented rules for completing and submitting the electronic Adobe Forms when you, the customer, submit your notice request.

In line with these business rules, GPW has revised the notice submission deadlines for all gazettes. Please refer to the GPW website www.gpwonline.co.za to familiarise yourself with the new deadlines.

CANCELLATIONS



Cancellation of notice submissions are accepted by GPW according to the deadlines stated in the table above. Non-compliance to these deadlines will result in your request being failed. Please pay special attention to the different deadlines for each gazette.

Please note that any notices cancelled after the cancellation deadline will be published and charged at full cost.

Requests for cancellation must be sent by the original sender of the notice and must accompanied by the relevant notice reference number (N-) in the email body.

AMENOMENTS TO NOTICES



With effect from 01 October, GPW will not longer accept amendments to notices. The cancellation process will need to be followed and a new notice submitted thereafter for the next available publication date.

CUSTOMER INQUIRIES



Many of our customers request immediate feedback/confirmation of notice placement in the gazette from our Contact Centre once they have submitted their notice – While GPW deems it one of their highest priorities and responsibilities to provide customers with this requested feedback and the best service at all times, we are only able to do so once we have started processing your notice submission.

GPW has a <u>2-working day turnaround time for processing notices</u> received according to the business rules and deadline submissions.

PROOF OF PAYMENTS REMINDER

EXTRA-ORDINARY

GOVERNMENT PRINTING WORKS BUSINESS RULES

Government Printing Works has established rules for submitting notices in line with its electronic notice processing system, which requires the use of electronic Adobe Forms. Please ensure that you adhere to these guidelines when completing and submitting your notice submission.

- 1. No hand written notices will be accepted for processing, this includes Adobe forms which have been completed by hand.
- 2. Notices can only be submitted in Adobe electronic form format, to the email submission address submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za. All notice submissions not on Adobe electronic forms will be rejected.
- 3. When submitting your notice request, please ensure that a purchase order (GPW Account customer) or proof of payment (non-GPW Account customer) is included with your notice submission. All documentation relating to the notice submission must be in a single email and must be attached separately. (In other words, your email should have an Adobe Form plus proof of payment/purchase order as 2 separate attachments. Where notice content is applicable, it should also be a 3rd separate attachment).
- 4. Notices brought to GPW by "walk-in" customers on electronic media can only be submitted in Adobe electronic form format.
- 5. All "walk-in" customers with notices that are not on electronic Adobe forms will be routed to the Contact Centre where they will be assisted to complete the forms in the required format. RATES BYLAWS OF ENGCOBO LOCAL MUNICIPALITY

Be it enacted by the Council of the Engcobo Local Municipality, in terms of section 156(2) of the Constitution, 1996, read with section 11(3)(m) of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act, 2000 (Act No 32 of 2000), and section 6 of the Local Government: Municipal Property Rates Act, 2004 (Act No 6 of 2004), as follows:

1. DEFINITIONS

In these bylaws, unless the context indicates otherwise -

- "agricultural property" means land zoned for agricultural purposes in excess of two hectares;
- "annually" means once every financial year;
- "business" means the activity of buying, selling or trade in goods or services and includes any office or other accommodation on the same erf, the use of which is incidental to such business, with the exclusion of the business of mining, agriculture, farming, or inter alia, any other business consisting of cultivation of soils, the gathering in of crops or the rearing of livestock or consisting of the propagation and harvesting of fish or other aquatic organisms.

"category" -

- (a) in relation to property, means a category of property determined in terms of section 4 of these bylaws;
- (b) in relation to owners of property, means a category of owners of property determined in terms of section 7 of these bylaws;
- "exemption" in relation to the payment of a rate, means an exemption grated in terms of section 7 of these bylaws;
- "industrial" means a branch of trade or manufacturing, production assembling or processing of finished or partially finished products from raw materials or fabricated part, on so large scale that capital and labour are significantly involved.
- "land tenure right" means an old order right or a new order right as defined in section 1 of the Communal Land Rights Act, 2004 (Act No 11 of 2004);
- "multiple purposes", in relation to property, means the use of property for more than one purpose; "municipal council" or "council" means the Engcobo Local Municipal council, a council referred to in section 18 of the Local Government: Municipal Structures Act, 1998 (Act No 117 of 1998);
- "municipal properties" means those properties of which the municipality is the owner.

"municipality" means the Engcobo Local Municipality established in terms of section 155(6) of the Constitution, 1996, and established by and under sections 11 and 12 of the Local Government: Municipal Structures Act, 1998 (Act No 117 of 1998

"owner" -

- (a) in relation to property referred to in paragraph (a) of the definition of "property", means a person in whose name ownership of the property is registered;
- (b) in relation to a right referred to in paragraph (b) of the definition of "property", means a person in whose name the right is registered;
- (c) in relation to a land tenure right referred to in paragraph (c) of the definition of "property" means a person in whose name the right is registered or to whom it was granted in terms of legislation provided that a person mentioned below will for the purposes of these bylaws be regarded by the municipality as the owner of the property in the following cases –
- (i) a trustee, in the case of a property in a trust excluding State trust land;
- (ii) an executor or administrator, in the case of property in a deceased estate;
- (iii) a trustee or liquidator, in the case of property in an insolvent estate or in liquidation;
- (iv) a judicial manager, in the case of property in the estate of a person under judicial management;
- (v) a curator, in the case of property in the estate of a person under curatorship;
- (vi) an usufructuary or other person in whose name a usufruct or other personal servitude is registered, in the case of property that is subject to a usufruct or other personal servitude;
- (vii) a lessee, in the case of a property that it registered in the name of the municipality and is leased by it; or
- (viii) a buyer, in the case of a property that was sold by a municipality and of which possession was given to the buyer pending registration of ownership in the name of the buyer;
- "permitted use", in relation to property, means the limited purposes for which the property may be used in terms of –
- (a) any restriction imposed by -
- (i) a condition of title;
- (ii) a provision of a town planning or land use scheme; or
- (iii) any legislation applicable to any specific property or properties; or
- (b) any alleviation of any such restrictions;

"property" means -

- (a) immovable property registered in the name of a person, including, in the case of a sectional title scheme, a sectional title unit registered in the name of a person;
- (b) a right registered against immovable property in the name of a person, excluding a mortgage bond registered against the property;
- (c) a land tenure right registered in the name of a person or granted to a person in terms of legislation; or(d) public service infrastructure.
- "property register" means a register of properties referred to in section 23 of the Act;
- "protected area" means an area that is or has to be listed in the register referred to in section 10 of the National Environmental: Protected Areas Act, 2003 (Act No 57 of 2003);
- "Public Benefits Organisation" means an organisation conducting specified public benefit activity listed in item 1 (welfare and humanitarian), item 2 (health care) and item 4 (education and development) of part 1 of the Ninth Schedule to the Income Tax Act
- "publicly controlled" means owned or otherwise under the control of an organ of state, including -
- (a) a public entity listed in the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act No 1 of 1999);
- (b) a municipality; or
- (c) a municipal entity as defined in the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act, 2000 (Act No 32 of 2000);
- "public service infrastructure" means publicly controlled infrastructure of the following kinds:
- (a) national, provincial or other public roads on which goods, services or labour move across the municipal boundary;
- (b) water or sewer pipes, ducts or other conduits, dams, water supply reservoirs, water treatment plants or water pumps forming part of a water or sewer scheme serving the public;
- (c) power stations, power substations or power lines forming part of an electricity scheme serving the public;
- (d) gas or liquid fuel plants or refineries or pipelines for gas or liquid fuels, forming part of a scheme for transporting such fuels;
- (e) railway lines forming part of a national railway system;
- (f) communication towers, masts, exchanges or lines forming part of a communications system serving the public;

- (g) runways or aprons at national or provincial airports;
- (h) breakwaters, sea walls, channels, basins, quay walls, jetties, roads, railway or infrastructure used for the provision of water, lights, power, sewerage or similar services of ports, or navigational aids comprising lighthouses, radio navigation aids, buoys, beacons or any other device or system used to assist the safe and efficient navigation of vessels;
- (i) any other publicly controlled infrastructure as may be prescribed; or
- (j) rights of way, easements or servitudes in connection with infrastructure mention in paragraphs (a) to (i).

"rate" means a municipal rate on property envisaged in section 229(1)(a) of the Constitution, 1996;

"rateable property" means property on which a municipality may in terms of section 2 of the Act levy a rate, excluding property fully excluded from the levying of rates in terms of section 17 of the Act;

"ratepayer" means a person or entity that is liable in terms of the Act for the payment of rates on property levied;

"rebate", in relation to a rate payable on property, means a discount in the amount of the rate payable on the property granted in terms of these by-laws;

"reduction", in relation to a rate payable on property, means the lowering of the amount for which the property was valued and the rating of the property at that lower amount granted in terms of these by-laws;

"residential property" means improved property that is:

- (a) used for residential purposes only, with not more than two dwelling units per property, and includes any adjoining property registered in the name of the same owner and used together with such residential property as if it were one property. (Any such grouping shall be regarded as one residential property for rate rebate or valuation reduction purposes.), or
- (b) a unit registered in terms of the Sectional Titles Act, used predominantly for residential purposes, and includes any unit in the same Sectional Title Scheme registered in the name of the same owner, which is used together with the residential unit as if it were one property, for example a garage or servant's quarters. (Any such grouping shall be regarded as one residential property for rate rebate or valuation reduction purposes); or
- (c) owned by a share-block company and used solely for residential purposes.

The following properties are specifically excluded from the definition of residential property:

A hotel, commune, boarding and undertaking, old age homes, guesthouses, retirement villages, life right schemes and residential properties with other permitted use.

"sectional title scheme" means a scheme as defined in section 1 of the Sectional Titles Act;

"sectional title unit" means a unit as defined in section 1 of the Sectional Titles Act;

"specified public benefit activity" means an activity listed in item 1 (welfare and humanitarian), item 2 (health care) and item 4 (education and development) of Part 1 of the Ninth Schedule to the Income Tax Act, 1962 (Act No 58 of 1962);

"the Sectional Titles Act" means the Sectional Titles Act, 1986 (Act No 95 of 1986);

"the Act" means the Local Government: Municipal Property Rates Act, 2004 (Act No 6 of 2004);

"vacant land" means land where no immovable improvements

"developed" means in the case of properties in process of construction:

The Valuer will determine as developed by using the following guideline -

The roof completed, and some windows and doors installed

Or

Any partial occupation on the property

2. RATES POLICY AND OBJECTS OF BY-LAW

- (1) The municipal council must, by resolution, adopt a policy on the levying of rates on rateable property in the municipality.
- (2) The rates policy adopted by the municipal council in terms of section 2(1) must comply with the provisions of the Act.
- (3) The municipality must levy rates in accordance with the Act, these by-laws and the rates policy adopted by the municipal council in terms of section 2(1).
- (4) The object of this by-law is to give effect to the implementation of rates policy as contemplated in section 6 of the Municipal Property Rates Act

3. PRINCIPLES

- 3.1 Rates are levied in accordance with the Act as an amount in the rand based on the market value of all rateable property contained in the municipality's general valuation roll and supplementary valuation roll.
 - 3.2 As allowed for in the Act, the municipality has chosen to differentiate between various categories of property and categories of owners of property as contemplated in clause 4 and 7 of this By Law. Some categories of property and categories of owners are granted relief from rates as contemplated in clause 7 to 8 of this policy. The municipality however does not grant relief in respect of payments for rates to any category of owners or properties, or to owners of properties on an individual basis other than those contemplated in clause 7 to 8.

3.3 The rates By Law for the municipality is based on the following principles:

(a) Equity

The municipality will treat all ratepayers with similar properties the same.

(b) Affordability

i. The ability of a person to pay rates will be taken into account by the municipality. In dealing with the poor/indigent ratepayers the municipality will provide relief measures through exemptions, reductions or rebates.

(c) Sustainability

i. Rating of property will be implemented in a way that:

it supports sustainable local government by providing a stable and buoyant revenue source within the discretionary control of the municipality; and Supports local social economic development

(d) Cost efficiency

i. Rates will be based on the value of all rateable property and will be used to fund community and subsidised services after taking into account surpluses generated on economic (refuse removal) services and the amounts required to finance exemptions, rebates, reductions and phasing-in of rates as approved by the municipality from time to time.

4. CATEGORIES OF PROPERTIES FOR THE PURPOSE OF LEVYING DIFFERENT RATES

4.1 Different rates may be levied in respect of the following categories of rateable properties and such rates will be determined on an annual basis during the compilation of the annual budget:-

Residential properties;

- 4.1.1 Industrial properties;
- 4.1.2 Business/office properties;
- 4.1.3 Business/commercial properties;
- 4.1.4 Farm properties (including small holdings) used for:-
 - Agricultural purposes only;
 - Commercial purposes;
 - Industrial purposes;
 - Residential purposes;
 - Recreational purposes such as sport farms and/or resorts or game farms;

- Other;

 4.1.5 Farm properties used for residential purposes;

 4.1.6 State owned properties;

 4.1.7 Municipal properties;

 4.1.8 Public service infrastructure referred to in the Act;

 4.1.9 Informal settlements;

 4.1.10 State trust land;

 4.1.11 Communal land as defined in section 1 of the Communal Land Rights Act of 2004;
 - 4.1.12 Properties-
 - acquired through the Provision of the Land and Assistance Act, 1993(Act 126 of 1993), or the Restitution of Land Rights Act, 1994 (Act 22 of 1994); or
 - Properties subject to the Communal Property Associations Act, 1996 (Act 28 of 1996);
 - 4.1.13 Protected areas:
 - 4.1.14 Properties on which national monuments are proclaimed;
 - 4.1.15 Properties owned by Public Benefit Societies;
 - 4.1.16 Properties used for multiple purposes;
 - 4.1.17 Vacant land
- 4.2 In determining the category of a property referred to in 4.1 the municipality shall take into consideration the following criteria or a combination thereof:-
 - 4.2.1 The formal zoning of the property;
 - 4.2.2 Township establishment approvals;
 - 4.2.3 The use of the property;
 - 4.2.4 Permitted use of the property; and
 - 4.2.5 The geographical area in which the property is situated.

- 4.3 In order to create certainty and to ensure consistency the criteria mentioned in 4.2 shall be applied as indicated below in order of priority and no deviation is permissible:
 - 4.3.1 Properties shall first of all be categorised in accordance with their actual use.
 - 4.3.2 Town planning schemes, Town establishment schemes and Town planning regulations where applicable may be used to determine the formal use if for whatever reason the status of usage of a property cannot be determined in terms of 4.3.1 above. All relevant information including circumstantial evidence may be taken into consideration in attempt to determine for what purpose the property is being used. A physical inspection may be done to acquire the necessary information.
- 4.4 Properties used for multiple purposes shall be categorised and maybe rated as provided for in section 9 of the Act and as more fully described in clause 9.

5. RATING OF MULTIPLE USE PROPERTIES

- 5.1 Rates on properties used for multiple purposes will be levied as per Property Rates Act, Section 9 as follows:-
 - 5.1.1 In accordance with the "permitted use of the property".
 - 5.1.2 In accordance with the "dominant use of the property" if (a) cannot be applied; or
 - 5.1.3 In accordance with the "different uses" by apportioning the market value of a category of property to the different purposes for which the property is used if both (a) and (b) above cannot be applied.
 - 5.1.4 applying the rates applicable to the categories determined by the municipality for properties used for those purposes to the different market value apportionments.

6. DIFFERENT CATEGORIES PAY DIFFERENT RATES

- 6.1 Criteria for differential rating on different categories of properties will be according to:-
 - (a) The nature of the property including its sensitivity to rating e.g. agricultural properties used for agricultural purposes.
 - (b) The promotion of social and economic development of the municipality.
- 6.2 Differential rating among the various property categories will be done by way of setting different cent amount in the rand for each property category; and
- 6.3 by way of reductions and rebates as provided for in this policy document.

7. CATEGORIES OF OWNERS OF PROPERTIES THAT WILL RECEIVE EXEMPTIONS OR REBATES

The following category of owners of properties will receive exemptions or rebates:

CATEGORIES OF OWNERS

- 7.1 For the purpose of granting exemptions, reductions and rebates in terms of clause 11, 12 and 13 respectively the following categories of owners of properties are determined:-
 - (a) Those owners who qualify and who are registered as indigents in terms of the adopted indigent policy of the municipality;
 - (b) owners dependent on pensions or social grants for their livelihood;
 - c) owners temporarily without income; owners of property situated within an area affected by a disaster within the meaning of the Disaster Management Act, 2002 (Act No. 57 of 2002); or any other serious adverse social or economic conditions; owners of residential properties with a market value lower than an amount determined by the municipality; or owners of agricultural properties who are bona fide farmers

8. CATEGORIES OF PROPERTIES THAT WILL RECEIVE EXEMPTIONS, REBATES OR REDUCTIONS

- (8.1) <u>Business, commercial and industrial properties</u>
 - 8.1.1. The municipality may grant rebates to rateable enterprises that promote local, social and economic development in its area of jurisdiction, based on its Local, Social and Economic Development Policy. The following criteria will apply:-
 - (8.1.1.2.) job creation in the municipal area;
 - (8.1.1.3.) social upliftment of the local community; and
 - (8.1.1.4.) creation of infrastructure for the benefit of the community.
 - 8.1.2. A maximum rebate as annually determined by the municipality will be granted on application subject to:-
 - 8.1.2.1 a business plan issued by the directors of the company indicating how the local, social and economic development objectives of the municipality are going to be met;

- 8.1.2.2 a continuation plan issued by the directors and certified by auditors of the company stating that the objectives have been met in the first year after establishment and how the company plan to continue to meet the objectives;
- 8.1.2.3 an assessment by the municipal manager or his/her nominee indicating that the company qualifies; and
- 8.1.2.3 a municipal resolution.
- 8.1.3 In determining the annual rebate the municipality shall take into consideration all relevant and applicable circumstances.

(8.2) State properties

8.2.1 State properties are exempt on the first 20% of the market value

(8.3) Residential properties

The first R15 000 of the market value of a property assigned in the valuation roll or supplementary valuation roll of a municipality to a category determined by the municipality—

for residential properties; or

for properties used for multiple purposes, provided one or more components of the property are used for residential purposes.

(8.4) Agricultural property rebate

- 8.4.1. The granting of additional rebates is subject to the following:
 - 8.4.1.1 the submission of an affidavit by 30 September each year including a certificate from the owner's auditors indicating how service delivery and development obligations of the municipality and contribution to the social and economic welfare of farm workers were met;
 - 8.4.1.2 an assessment by the municipal manager or his/her nominee indicating that the application qualifies; and
 - 8.4.1.3 a Council resolution.

11. POWER TO LEVY RATES

Council must exercise its power to levy a rate on property subject to the provisions of the Constitution, the Act and the municipality's approved rates policy.

12. PAYMENT OF RATES

- 12.1 Ratepayers may choose between paying rates annually in one instalment on or before 30 October or in twelve equal instalments on or before the seventh day of the month following on the month in which it becomes payable. If no arrangement are made with the municipality the municipality billed the rate annually.
- 12.2 If the owner of property that is subject to rates, notify the municipal manager or his/her nominee in writing not later than 31 May in any financial year, or such later date in such financial year as may be determined by the municipal manager or his/her nominee that he/she wishes to pay all rates in respect of such property in instalments, such owner shall be entitled to pay all rates in the subsequent financial year and each subsequent financial year in twelve instalments until such notice is withdrawn by him/her in a similar manner.
- 12.3 Interest on arrears rates, whether payable on or before 30 September or in equal monthly instalments, shall be calculated in accordance with the provisions of the credit control, debt collection and indigent policy of the municipality.
- 12.4 If a property owner who is responsible for the payment of property rates in terms of this policy fails to pay such rates in the prescribed manner, it will be recovered from him/her in accordance with the provisions of the Credit Control, Debt Collection and indigent policy of the Municipality.
- 12.5 Arrears rates shall be recovered from tenants, occupiers and agents of the owner, in terms of section 28 and 29 of the Act as follows:-
 - 12.5.1 If an amount, due for rates levied on a property, is not paid by the owner by the due date as shown on the account and no reaction is forthcoming from the owner after two written reminders have been issued, the municipality shall recover the arrear amount in full or partially as follows: (arrears might include collection costs)
 - 12.5.2 From the agent who is lawfully responsible to collect commission or rental in respect of the property concerned;
 - 12.5.3 From a tenant or occupier of the property, only after an attempt was made to collect it from an agent but such attempt was unsuccessful or no such agent exists or only a part of the outstanding amount could successfully be recovered.
 - 12.5.4 The amount recoverable is limited to the amount as stipulated in the Act and it may only be recovered after written notice has been served on the party concerned (tenant, occupier or agent) of the rates due and payable, but not yet paid by owner of the property.
 - 12.5.5 The notice referred to in 14.5.4 shall give the party concerned at least 14 calendar days to pay the outstanding rates.

- 12.6 Where the rates levied on a particular property have been incorrectly determined, whether because of an error or omission on the part of the municipality or false information provided by the property owner concerned or a contravention of the permitted use to which the property concerned may be put, the rates payable shall be appropriately adjusted for the period extending from the date on which the error or omission is detected back to the date on which rates were first levied in terms of the current valuation roll.
- 12.7 In addition, where the error occurred because of false information provided by the property owner or as a result of a contravention of the permitted use of the property concerned, interest on the unpaid portion of the adjusted rates payable shall be levied at the maximum rate permitted by prevailing legislation.

13. ANNUAL REVIEW OF RATES POLICY

The municipality's Rates Policy will be reviewed on an annual basis during the budget process to ensure that it complies with the municipality's strategic objectives and legislation, and will take into account public comments and inputs.

14. THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE RATES POLICY

The Rates Policy takes effect from the start of the municipal financial year when the new valuation roll is implemented on 1 July 2014.

15. SHORT TITLE

These bylaws will be called the Rates Bylaws for the Engcobo Local Municipality.

16. COMMENCEMENT

These bylaws come into force and effect on 1 July 2016.
