#### AMENDMENT OF PROPERTY RATES AND TARIFF OF CHARGES

That in terms of Sections 2, 7, 8 and 14 of the Local Government: Municipal Property Rates Act 6 of 2004 ("the Act"), read with Sections 4(1)(c)(ii) and 11(3)(i) of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act 32 of 2000 ("the Systems Act") and Section 24(2)(c)(i) of the Local Government: Municipal Financial Management Act 56 of 2003 ("the MFMA"), the following rates in the Rand be levied by the City of Johannesburg Metropolitan Municipality ("the Council") for the financial year 1 July 2010 to 30 June 2011, on the market value of property or on the market value of a right in land within the area of jurisdiction of the Council as appearing in the valuation roll, in respect of the various categories of properties set out below:

- That the rates so levied in terms of paragraph 1 above shall become due and payable in twelve equal instalments on fixed days for twelve consecutive months, these being the due date stipulated in the account sent to the ratepayer.
- 3 That in terms of paragraph 16(3)(b) of the Council's Property Rates Policy interest be charged on rates not paid on or before the fixed days, at the rate determined by the Council from time to time.
- That in terms of Section 15(1)(b) of the Act read with Sections 9 and 10 of the Council's Property Rates Policy, the Council grants, subject to paragraph (5) below, the following rebates on the rate levied for the financial year 2010/2011 to any owner of rateable property in the following circumstances:
  - (a) Residential property owned and occupied by natural persons who have limited income and who are not pensioners but can show that his or her annual income falls below the limit determined by Council from time to time in terms of the Expanded Social Package: dependent on points rating
  - (b) Residential property owned and occupied by natural persons who are dependent on a State social security grant in terms of the Social Assistance Act 59 of 1992 as their sole source of income: 100%
  - (c) Residential property owned and occupied by pensioners who are not persons contemplated in paragraph (b), if the total income of the household does not exceed the maximum of R5 300 per month over the previous income tax year: 100%
  - (d) Residential property owned and occupied by pensioners who are not persons contemplated in paragraph (b), if the total income of the household does exceed the average of R5 300 per month over the previous income tax year but does not exceed the maximum of R9 600 per month over the previous income tax year: 50%:

Provided that the rebate contemplated in subparagraphs 4(a)-(d) above shall only be granted where:

- (i) the market value of the property as recorded in the prevailing valuation roll does not exceed R1 500 000 and in the case of a pensioner, such pensioner has attained the age of 60 years or older; and in the case of dual ownership at least one of the owners has attained the age of 60 years or older; and
- (ii) the property owner personally occupies the property.
- (iii) A pensioner rebate will be applied to one property per pensioner or pensioner and spouse only
- (e) (f) Properties owned by organisations that are registered in terms of the Housing Development Schemes for Retired Persons Act: 50%
- (g) Property owned by institutions which provide education and / or student accommodation at -

- (i) public schools not qualifying for a rebate in terms of paragraph (h) below: 50%
- (ii) (iii) universities not qualifying for a rebate in terms of paragraph (h) below: 20%
- (iv) technical and other colleges not qualifying for a rebate in terms of paragraph (h) below: 20%
- (h) (i) Property owned by private sports clubs that are used primarily for sports purposes: 40%
- (j) Property in the inner city which is used with a minimum of 80% residential and maximum of 20% commercial use: 40%
- (k) Property declared as heritage sites in terms of Section 27, 28 and 31 of the National Heritage Resources Act 25 of 1999: 20%
- (I) Residential Sectional Title units: 20%
- (m) Property registered in the name of an institution or organisation which has as its exclusive objective the protection of animals: 100%
- (n) Property registered in the name of an institution or organisation which has as its exclusive objective the provision and/ or promotion of youth development programmes: 100%
- (o) Property that is vacant but that may not be developed as a direct result of the inability of Council to provide services, subject to the owner to provide written confirmation from the service entity stating that no development to be allowed for the duration of the ensuing financial year, as a result of lack of services: 50% of the vacant land tariff.

# Provided that:

- (aa) the first R150 000 of the value of all residential property shall be exempted from rating, subject to paragraph 5 below; and
- (bb) in instances where more that one rebate may be applicable, the heritage site rebate will take precedence, thereafter the sectional title rebate and then a further rebate based on ownership of property each calculated on the nett amount payable after deduction of each preceding rebate, as may be applicable.
- (5) That notwithstanding the provisions of paragraphs 4(a)–(q) above, all rateable property as defined in the Act, excluding property registered in the name of residents as defined in the Council's Expanded Social Package and other properties that qualify for 100% rebate such as owners dependent on a social security grant, or qualifying pensioners who earn up to R5300 per month shall be subject to the payment of a minimum property rate of R60 (Sixty Rand) per annum.
- (6) That, in terms of Sections 17(3)(a)(ii) and 22(a)(i) and (ii) of the Local Government Municipal Finance Management Act, 56 of 2003 and Sections 21, 21A(1) and 75A(3) of the Local Government Municipal Systems Act, 32 of 2000, as amended and also Section 14(3) of the Municipal Property Rates Act, 6 of 2004, the City of Johannesburg's municipal manager must without delay:
  - display a copy of the resolution in the manner prescribed Section 75A(3)(a) of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act, 32 of 2000, as amended;

- (ii) publish in a newspaper of general circulation a notice in the manner prescribed section 75A(3)(b) of the Local Government : Municipal Systems Act, 32 of 2000, as amended:
- (iii) seek to convey to the local community by means of radio broadcast covering the area of the City, the Information contemplated in Section 75A(3)(c) of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act, 32 of 2000, as amended;
- (7) That a copy of the notice referred to in Paragraph 2(ii) above be sent forthwith to the MEC for Local Government as well as the National and Provincial Treasury in terms of Section 75A(4) of the Local Government Municipal Systems Act, 32 of 2000 as amended;
- (8) That a copy of the finally approved Tariff of Charges be sent forthwith to the National and Provincial Treasury in terms of Section 24(3) of the Local Government Municipal Finance Management Act. 56 of 2003:
- (9) That the Property Rates and Tariff of Charges be published in the Provincial Gazette and be effective from 1 July 2010.

  - (ii) An application for Council's approval to re-erect an advertising sign and hoarding from a static display to a scrolling display shall consist of a non-refundable application fee consisting of R 763.00 plus an amount of R 288.00 per m<sup>2</sup> irrespective of whether the sign is erected on Private or Council land and if approved, approved only for the remaining period of the existing approval only.
  - (iii) An application for Council's approval to re-erect an advertising sign and hoarding from a static display to a LED (electronic) display shall consist of a non-refundable application fee consisting of R 763.00 plus an amount of R 433.00 per m<sup>2</sup> irrespective of whether the sign is erected on Private or Council land and if approved, approved only for the remaining period of the existing approval only.
- (c) An application for advertising signs/advertisements as set out in Section 14, shall be accompanied by:
  - A non-refundable application fee consisting of R 763.00 plus an amount of R 153.00 per m<sup>2</sup> of advertising display - irrespective of whether the sign is erected on Private or Council land

- (ii) A non-refundable application fee consisting of R 763.00 plus an amount of R 153 per m<sup>2</sup> of advertising display erected for a period of only up to 12 months irrespective of whether the sign is erected on Private or Council land.

- (i) An application for signs as set out in Section 25: Temporary advertising signs and hoardings on construction site boundary walls, fences, hoardings and scaffolding and if approved, approved for period of not more than 12 months (renewable maximum 12 months), shall be accompanied by a non-refundable application fee consisting of R 762.00 plus an amount of R153.00 per m² for first 100 m², and R 143.00 per m² of advertising display for the second 100 m² and R 74.00 per m² of advertising display for the balance (greater than 200 m²).
- (j) An application for the display of Event Posters, shall be accompanied by:
  - A refundable deposit of R 7.38 per poster (for removal) plus non-refundable application fee of R1.41 per poster shall be payable for the display of event posters of non-profit bodies.
  - ii) A non-refundable application fee of R 7.38 per poster shall be payable with a minimum fee of R 288.00 to permit the display of posters for religious, sporting, social and cultural events, with commercial content limited to a sponsors logo not exceeding 20% of the total poster content and where applicable, an entrance fee.

If it appears after the monthly calculation of the technical fare and the average passenger fare that the technical fare has on average been 8% or more higher or lower than the average passenger fare during the preceding month, the passenger base fare(s) will be adjusted accordingly. The adjustment the passenger base fare(s) shall be to the same extent (percentage) required to bring the average passenger fare to the same level as the technical fare. The percentage adjustment to each of the passenger base fares will be calculated in accordance with the following formula:

1.2. The passenger base fare(s) may not be decreased if the Contingency and Fare Stabilisation Fund balance has fallen below the reserve level of three-months payments to the Bus Operating Company.

The methodology to be used for the monthly calculation of the **technical fare** and the **average passenger fare**, in order to determine whether the **passenger base fare(s)** need to be adjusted, is described in Annexure B hereto.

Provided further that all fare adjustments during the 2010/2011 financial year resulting in an increase in the fares need to be approved by the Mayoral Committee before implementation thereof.

# METHODOLOGY TO BE USED IN DETERMINING WHETHER THE BRT PASSENGER BASE FARE(S) NEED TO BE ADJUSTED

# (i) Calculation of technical fare (average cost per passenger)

The following tariffs shall be effective from 1 July 2010:

## **Definitions**

For the purposes of this Tariff of Charges the following definitions will apply:

 "Dwelling unit" means a room or a suite of connected rooms, including not more than one kitchen, designed for residential purposes and occupation by a single family or household, including such ablution facilities, outbuildings and servants rooms normally connected therewith;

- 2. "Multi-dwelling" means any arrangement of premises that comprises more than one dwelling unit which, by reason of the particular increased engineering or systemic demands accepted by the City Engineer as being required for this category of accommodation, necessitates the application of design-specific water services resources, which thereby differentiates it from a simple collection of dwelling units, and without derogating from the generality thereof, includes semi-detached houses, simplex units and townhouses, whether or not any such multi-dwelling is served by single or multiple meters;
- 3. "Flat" means a dwelling unit set aside in a complex that comprises more than one such dwelling units which, by reason of the particular increased engineering or systemic demands accepted by the City Engineer as being required for this category of accommodation, necessitates the application of design-specific water services resources, which differentiates it from a simple collection of dwelling units or multi-dwelling units;
- 4. "Hostel" means any accommodation unit owned by the Provincial Government or a local authority referred to in General Notice No. 2133 of 2001 published in Gauteng Provincial Gazette No. 52 of 6th April 2001, (or in any legislative provision amending or taking the place of such Regulations) which, by reason of the particular increased engineering or systemic demands accepted by the City Engineer as being required for this category of accommodation, necessitates the application of design-specific water services resources, which thereby differentiates it from other forms of accommodation or dwelling units;
- "Residential purposes" shall be deemed not to include the letting of accommodation units for any category of hotel uses, which shall be deemed to constitute use for commercial purposes.
- 6. "Service Level 1" shall mean a service delivery option consisting of communal water points located within 200 metres of each other, with a ventilated improved pit latrine or equivalent on-site dry sanitation system located on each site. No water and sewer connections are provided to each individual property, and no waterborne sewer system is available.
- 7. "Service Level 2" shall mean a service delivery option consisting of an unmetered water connection to each stand or erf with and individual yard standpipe that is purposefully not connected to any plumbing fixtures located on the property. Also provided is a pour-flush waterborne sewer connection to each erf.
- 8. "Service Level 3" shall mean a service delivery option consisting of a metered pressured water connection to each stand or erf that can legally be connected by the developer/owner to the dwelling (or any other point on the property). Also provided is a conventional waterborne sewer network with individual sewer connections to each erf.
- 9. Condominial Sewer ~ shall mean a sewer network that is characterised by shallow gradients and small-diameter pipes, with numerous simplified inspection features. The system is divided into a main network and the condominial branches. A block of houses is considered a customer unit by the service provider, and this customer unit connects to the main network via a single connection. Within a block of houses, the households connect up to the condominial branch individually via a house connection that forms part of their private sanitary installation.

#### **Definitions**

For the purposes of this Tariff of Charges the following definitions will apply:

- "Dwelling unit" means a room or a suite of connected rooms, including not more than one kitchen, designed for residential purposes and occupation by a single family or household, including such ablution facilities, outbuildings and servants rooms normally connected therewith;
- 2. "Multi-dwelling" means any arrangement of premises that comprises more than one dwelling unit which, by reason of the particular increased engineering or systemic demands accepted by the City Engineer as being required for this category of accommodation, necessitates the application of design-specific water services resources, which thereby differentiates it from a simple collection of dwelling units, and without derogating from the generality thereof, includes semi-detached houses, simplex units and townhouses, whether or not any such multi-dwelling is served by single or multiple meters;
- 3. "Flat" means a dwelling unit set aside in a complex that comprises more than one such dwelling units which, by reason of the particular increased engineering or systemic demands accepted by the City Engineer as being required for this category of accommodation, necessitates the application of design-specific water services resources, which differentiates it from a simple collection of dwelling units or multi-dwelling units;
- 4. "Hostel" means any accommodation unit owned by the Provincial Government or a local authority referred to in General Notice No. 2133 of 2001 published in Gauteng Provincial Gazette No. 52 of 6th April 2001, (or in any legislative provision amending or taking the place of such Regulations) which, by reason of the particular increased engineering or systemic demands accepted by the City Engineer as being required for this category of accommodation, necessitates the application of design-specific water services resources, which thereby differentiates it from other forms of accommodation or dwelling units;
- "Residential purposes" shall be deemed not to include the letting of accommodation units for any category of hotel uses, which shall be deemed to constitute use for commercial purposes.
- 6. "Service Level 1" shall mean a service delivery option consisting of communal water points located within 200 metres of each other, with a ventilated improved pit latrine or equivalent on-site dry sanitation system located on each site. No water and sewer connections are provided to each individual property, and no waterborne sewer system is available.
- 7. "Service Level 2" shall mean a service delivery option consisting of an unmetered water connection to each stand or erf with and individual yard standpipe that is purposefully not connected to any plumbing fixtures located on the property. Also provided is a pour-flush waterbome sewer connection to each erf.
- 8. "Service Level 3" shall mean a service delivery option consisting of a metered pressured water connection to each stand or erf that can legally be connected by the developer/owner to the dwelling (or any other point on the property). Also provided is a conventional waterborne sewer network with individual sewer connections to each erf.

Condominial Sewer ~ shall mean a sewer network that is characterised by shallow gradients and small-diameter pipes, with numerous simplified inspection features. The system is divided into a main network and the condominial branches. A block of houses is considered a customer unit by the service provider, and this customer unit connects to the main network via a single connection. Within a block of houses, the households connect up to the condominial branch individually via a house connection that forms part of their private sanitary installation.

# POOLS TO BE CLOSED ON THE FOLLOWING DAYS 25 &26 DECEMBER & 1 January

#### RULES APPLICABLE TO SWIMMING POOL TARIFF

"Adult" means a person of 18 years or more

"Child" means a person of less than 18 years

"Scholar" means any person who is enrolled at a school as defined in the Education Ordinance, or who is enrolled at any other education Institution and who has not attained the age of 20 years.

"Senior Citizen" means a person who is 63 years or older or pensioners with pension cards

"Season Tickets" shall be valid for either the summer swimming season, the period beginning on 1 September and ending on the 31 March of the following year, or the Winter swimming season, the period beginning 1 April and ending on 31 August.

If a holder is unable to produce it on account of its loss or destruction he shall not be admitted to the premises unless he has purchased a replacement thereof, or purchased the appropriate daily admission ticket.

It shall be unlawful for the holder of a season ticket to transfer it or to allow it to be used by any other persons.

"Scholars" Scholars irrespective of age in parties of 10 or more may be admitted to pools at restricted hours to be approved by the Aquatic Manager of the Region at the scholar tariff teachers attending a pool in charge of 10 or more scholars shall be admitted free of charge.

"School Season Ticket" shall entitle scholars under the supervision of one or more teachers to admission to a designated pool once a week at such time and for such period during school hours only as may be agreed by the Aquatic Manager of that Region. Provided that the Aquatic Manager shall be entitled to refuse an application made in terms of this rule on the grounds that the accommodation of the pool is already fully taken up, preference being given to schools situated in the local area of the pool than those situated outside of it local area.

#### School season tickets

- (a) For every school with less than 150 scholars on its school register.
- (b) For every school with 150 to 350 scholars on its school register.
- (c) For every school with over 350 scholars on its school register.

"Hire of Pool" Swimming Gala, Swimming competitions and Organized Aquatic Event only. Must be in accordance with the Aquatic by-laws.

"Club Season Ticket" Issued only to swimmers who are Members of a swimming club making use of a City of Joburg swimming pool as a home base. Proof of membership must be produced.

"Baptisms" Only before normal operating hours of the pool.

"Tariffs apply to all Council Employee's unless special permission has been obtained in writing from the Executive Director, Community Development."
