Notice submission deadlines

Government Printing Works has over the last few months implemented rules for completing and submitting the electronic Adobe Forms when you, the customer, submit your notice request.

In line with these business rules, GPW has revised the notice submission deadlines for all gazettes. Please refer to the GPW website www.gpwonline.co.za to familiarise yourself with the new deadlines.

CANCELLATIONS

Don't forget!

Cancellation of notice submissions are accepted by GPW according to the deadlines stated in the table above. Non-compliance to these deadlines will result in your request being failed. **Please pay special attention to the different deadlines for each gazette.**

Please note that any notices cancelled after the cancellation deadline will be published and charged at full cost.

Requests for cancellation must be sent by the original sender of the notice and must accompanied by the relevant notice reference number (N-) in the email body.

AMENDMENTS TO NOTICES

take note!

With effect **from 01 October**, GPW will not longer accept amendments to notices. The cancellation process will need to be followed and a new notice submitted thereafter for the next available publication date.

CUSTOMER INQUIRIES

PROOF OF PAYMENTS

REMINDER

GPW reminds you that all notice submissions **MUST** be submitted with an accompanying proof of payment (PoP) or purchase order (PO). If any PoP's or PO's are received without a notice submission, it will be failed and your notice will not be processed.

When submitting your notice request to submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za, please ensure that a purchase order (GPW Account customer) or proof of payment (non-GPW Account customer) is included with your notice submission. All documentation relating to the notice submission must be in a single email.

A reminder that documents must be attached separately in your email to GPW. (In other words, your email should have an Adobe Form plus proof of payment/purchase order – 2 separate attachments – where notice content is applicable, it should also be a 3rd separate attachment).

REMINDER OF THE GPW BUSINESS RULES

- Single notice, single email – with proof of payment or purchase order.
- All documents must be attached separately in your email to GPW.
- 1 notice = 1 form, i.e. each notice must be on a separate form
- Please submit your notice **ONLY ONCE**.
- Requests for information, quotations and inquiries must be sent to the Contact Centre **ONLY**.
- The notice information that you send us on the form is what we publish. Please do not put any instructions in the email body.

IN TERMS OF SECTION 103(1) OF THE TOWN-PLANNING AND TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1986 (ORDINANCE NO. 15 OF 1986), THE EKURHULENI METROPOLITAN MUNICIPALITY (KEMPTON PARK CUSTOMER CARE CENTRE) HEREBY DECLARES POMONA EXTENSION 138 TO BE AN APPROVED TOWNSHIP, SUBJECT TO THE CONDITIONS SET OUT IN THE SCHEDULE HERETO.

SCHEDULE

STATEMENT OF THE CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH THE APPLICATION MADE BY SUNSET BAY TRADING 582 PROPRIETARY LIMITED (HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE APPLICANT / TOWNSHIP OWNER) UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF PARTS A AND C OF CHAPTER 3 OF THE TOWN PLANNING AND TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1986 (ORDINANCE 15 OF 1986), FOR PERMISSION TO ESTABLISH A TOWNSHIP ON PORTION 571 (A PORTION OF PORTION 492) OF THE FARM RIETFONTEIN 31, REGISTRATION DIVISION IR HAS BEEN GRANTED

1. CONDITIONS OF ESTABLISHMENT**(1) NAME**

The name of the township shall be Pomona Extension 138.

(2) **DESIGN**

The township shall consist of erven and streets as indicated on S.G. No. 4964/2011.

(3) **ENDOWMENT**

Payable to the local authority.

The township owner shall, in terms of the provisions of Section 81, as well as Sections 98(2) and (3) of the Town Planning and Townships Ordinance, 1986, pay a lump sum endowment of R80 000,00 to the local authority. This money can be used for the purposes of upgrading any parks.

(4) **DISPOSAL OF EXISTING CONDITIONS OF TITLE**

All erven shall be made subject to existing conditions and servitude's, if any, but excluding condition 1) which will not be passed on to the owners of erven in the township:

"The original Remaining Extent of Portion A of the farm "RIETFONTEIN" No 18, District BENONI measuring as such 1205, 8671 (One Thousand and Two Hundred and Five comma Eight Six Seven One) Hectares (comprised of Portions "C" and "D" now forming Portion of Portion "G" of portion "A" of the said farm) held under Certificate of Amended Title 4882/1924, Portion "E" measuring 17,1306 (Seventeen comma One Three Nought Six) Hectares held under Deed of Transfer No. 3708/1917, of which the aforesaid Holding is a portion, is ENTITLED to one half of the water coming out of the fountain (running from three sources) situate near the Western Boundary line of that portion of the property held under the said Certificate of Amended Title No 4882/1924, indicated on the diagram annexed to the said Certificate of Amended Title by the figure a, F, b, G e, o, p, u, t, O and close to the Kaffir Dam, namely the dam from which a furrow is led to the Windmill and the right to lead the water aforesaid by means of pipes or a water furrow on the said original remaining extent of Portion A measuring as such 1205, 8671 (One Thousand Two Hundred and Five comma Eight Six Seven One) Hectares (now comprised as aforesaid) with the further right of access to the fountain and pipes or furrow for the purposes of upkeep and repair"

(5) **DEMOLITION OF BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES**

The township owner shall at his own expense cause all existing buildings and structures situated within the building line reserves, side spaces or over common boundaries to be demolished to the satisfaction of the Local Authority, when required by the Local Authority to do so.

(6) **ACCEPTANCE AND DISPOSAL OF STORM WATER**

The township owner shall arrange for the drainage of the township to fit in with that of the existing and planned road and storm water infrastructure in the vicinity and for all storm water running off or diverted from the roads to be received and disposed of.

(7) **PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES**

The township owner shall at his own expense, make arrangements with the local authority in order to ensure that:

- (a) water will not dam up, that the entire surface of the township area is drained properly and that streets are sealed effectively with tar, cement or bitumen; and
- (b) trenches and excavations for foundations, pipes, cables or for any other purposes, are properly refilled with damp soil in layers not thicker than 150mm, and compacted until the same grade of compaction as that of the surrounding material is obtained.
- (c) the recommendations as laid down in the geological report of the township are complied with and, when required, engineer certificates for the foundations of the structures must be submitted.

(8) **REMOVAL OF LITTER**

The township owner shall at his own expense cause all litter within the township area to be removed to the satisfaction of the local authority, when required by the local authority to do so.

(9) **REPOSITIONING OF SERVICES**

If, by reason of the establishment of the township, it should become necessary to reposition any existing services of ESCOM, Telkom or the local authority, the cost thereof shall be borne by the township owner.

(10) **ENGINEERING SERVICES**

- i) The applicant shall be responsible for the installation and provision of internal engineering services.
- ii) Once water, sewer and electrical networks have been installed, same will be transferred to the Municipality (if so required by the Municipality), free of cost, who shall maintain these networks (except internal street lights).
- iii) The Section 21 Company, will be responsible for the maintenance of the internal roads (including storm water) and the internal street lights (including electrical power usage)

2. CONDITIONS OF TITLE

All erven shall be subject to the following conditions, imposed by the local authority in terms of the provisions of the Town Planning and Townships Ordinance, 1986.

(1) **ERVEN 3187 and 3188**

- (a) The erf is subject to a servitude, 2 metres wide, in favour of the local authority, for sewerage and other municipal purposes, along any one boundary other than a street boundary and in the case of a panhandle erf, an additional servitude for municipal purposes, 2m wide across the access portion of the erf, if and when required by the local authority: Provided that the local authority may dispense with any such servitude.
- (b) No building or other structure shall be erected within the aforesaid servitude area and no large rooted trees shall be planted within the area of such servitude or within 2 metres thereof.
- (c) The local authority shall be entitled to deposit temporarily on the land adjoining the aforesaid servitude such material as may be excavated by it during the course of the construction, maintenance or removal of such sewerage mains and other works as it, in its discretion, may deem necessary and shall further be entitled to reasonable access to the said land for the aforesaid purpose, subject to any damage done during the process of the construction, maintenance or removal of such sewerage mains and other works being made good by the local authority.

Please take note of these guidelines when completing your form.

GPW Business Rules

1. No hand written notices will be accepted for processing, this includes Adobe forms which have been completed by hand.
2. Notices can only be submitted in Adobe electronic form format to the email submission address submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za. This means that any notice submissions not on an Adobe electronic form that are submitted to this mailbox will be **rejected**. National or Provincial gazette notices, where the Z95 or Z95Prov must be an Adobe form but the notice content (body) will be an attachment.
3. Notices brought into GPW by "walk-in" customers on electronic media can only be submitted in Adobe electronic form format. This means that any notice submissions not on an Adobe electronic form that are submitted by the customer on electronic media will be **rejected**. National or Provincial gazette notices, where the Z95 or Z95Prov must be an Adobe form but the notice content (body) will be an attachment.
4. All customers who walk in to GPW that wish to submit a notice that is not on an electronic Adobe form will be routed to the Contact Centre where the customer will be taken through the completion of the form by a GPW representative. Where a customer walks into GPW with a stack of hard copy notices delivered by a messenger on behalf of a newspaper the messenger must be referred back to the sender as the submission does not adhere to the submission rules.
5. All notice submissions that do not comply with point 2 will be charged full price for the notice submission.
6. The current cut-off of all Gazette's remains unchanged for all channels. (Refer to the GPW website for submission deadlines – www.gpwonline.co.za)
7. Incorrectly completed forms and notices submitted in the wrong format will be rejected to the customer to be corrected and resubmitted. Assistance will be available through the Contact Centre should help be required when completing the forms. (012-748 6200 or email info.egazette@gpw.gov.za)
8. All re-submissions by customers will be subject to the above cut-off times.
9. All submissions and re-submissions that miss the cut-off will be rejected to the customer to be submitted with a new publication date.
10. Information on forms will be taken as the primary source of the notice to be published. Any instructions that are on the email body or covering letter that contradicts the notice form content will be ignored.

You are therefore advised that effective from **Monday, 18 May 2015** should you not comply with our new rules of engagement, all notice requests will be rejected by our new system.

Furthermore, the fax number **012- 748 6030** will also be **discontinued** from this date and customers will only be able to submit notice requests through the email address submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za.
