Notice submission deadlines

Government Printing Works has over the last few months implemented rules for completing and submitting the electronic Adobe Forms when you, the customer, submit your notice request.

In line with these business rules, GPW has revised the notice submission deadlines for all gazettes. Please refer to the GPW website www.gpwonline.co.za to familiarise yourself with the new deadlines.

CANCELLATIONS

Don't forget!

Cancellation of notice submissions are accepted by GPW according to the deadlines stated in the table above. Non-compliance to these deadlines will result in your request being failed. **Please pay special attention to the different deadlines for each gazette.**

Please note that any notices cancelled after the cancellation deadline will be published and charged at full cost.

Requests for cancellation must be sent by the original sender of the notice and must accompanied by the relevant notice reference number (N-) in the email body.

AMENDMENTS TO NOTICES

With effect **from 01 October**, GPW will not longer accept amendments to notices. The cancellation process will need to be followed and a new notice submitted thereafter for the next available publication date.

CUSTOMER INQUIRIES

PROOF OF PAYMENTS

REMINDER

GPW reminds you that all notice submissions **MUST** be submitted with an accompanying proof of payment (PoP) or purchase order (PO). If any PoP's or PO's are received without a notice submission, it will be failed and your notice will not be processed.

When submitting your notice request to submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za, please ensure that a purchase order (GPW Account customer) or proof of payment (non-GPW Account customer) is included with your notice submission. All documentation relating to the notice submission must be in a single email.

A reminder that documents must be attached separately in your email to GPW. (In other words, your email should have an Adobe Form plus proof of payment/purchase order – 2 separate attachments – where notice content is applicable, it should also be a 3rd separate attachment).

REMINDER OF THE GPW BUSINESS RULES

- Single notice, single email – with proof of payment or purchase order.
- All documents must be attached separately in your email to GPW.
- 1 notice = 1 form, i.e. each notice must be on a separate form
- Please submit your notice **ONLY ONCE**.
- Requests for information, quotations and inquiries must be sent to the Contact Centre **ONLY**.
- The notice information that you send us on the form is what we publish. Please do not put any instructions in the email body.

DECLARATION OF ANNLIN EXTENSION 139 AS APPROVED TOWNSHIP

In terms of section 103 of the Town-planning and Townships Ordinance, 1986 (Ordinance No 15 of 1986), the City of Tshwane hereby declares the township of Annlin Extension 139 to be an approved township, subject to the conditions as set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH THE APPLICATION MADE BY KAMP 248 SABIE PARK CC, IN TERMS OF THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER III: PART C OF THE TOWN-PLANNING AND TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1986 (ORDINANCE NO 15 OF 1986), FOR PERMISSION TO ESTABLISH A TOWNSHIP ON PORTION 398 OF THE FARM WONDERBOOM 302JR, PROVINCE OF GAUTENG, HAS BEEN GRANTED

1. CONDITIONS OF ESTABLISHMENT

1.1 NAME

The name of the township shall be Annlin Extension 139.

1.2 DESIGN

The township shall consist of erven and streets as indicated on General Plan SG No 374/2013 as approved by the Surveyor General.

1.3 DISPOSAL OF EXISTING CONDITIONS OF TITLE

All erven shall be made subject to existing conditions and servitudes, if any, including the reservation of the rights to minerals.

1.4 ENDOWMENT

Payable to the City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality.

The township owner shall pay endowment a total amount of **R180 000,00** for an area of **576m²** in terms of Regulation 44(1) of the Town-planning and Townships Regulations, to the City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality. The amount of this area shall be used by the City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality for the acquisition of land for park and/or public open space purposes.

The said endowment amount shall be payable in accordance with the provisions of section 81 of the Town-planning and Townships Ordinance, 1986 (Ordinance 15 of 1986).

1.5 REMOVAL OR REPLACEMENT OF MUNICIPAL SERVICES

Should it become necessary to move or replace any existing municipal services as a result of the establishment of the township, the cost thereof shall be borne by the township owner.

1.6 DEMOLITION OF BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES

When required by the City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality to do so, the township owner shall at his own expense cause to be demolished to the satisfaction of the Municipality all existing buildings and structures situated within building line reserves and side spaces or over common boundaries, or dilapidated structures.

1.7 REMOVAL OF LITTER

The township owner shall at his own expense have all litter within the township area removed to the satisfaction of the City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality, when required to do so by the Municipality.

1.8 REMOVAL AND/OR REPLACEMENT OF ESKOM POWER LINES

Should it become necessary to remove and/or replace any existing power lines of Eskom as a result of the establishment of the township, the cost thereof shall be borne by the township owner.

1.9 REMOVAL AND/OR REPLACEMENT OF TELKOM SERVICES

Should it become necessary to remove and/or replace any existing TELKOM services as a result of the establishment of the township, the cost thereof shall be borne by the township owner.

1.10 COMPLIANCE WITH CONDITIONS IMPOSED BY GDARD

The township owner shall at his own expense comply with all the conditions imposed, by which the Gauteng Department of Agriculture and Rural Development, including if applicable those by which exemption has been granted from compliance with Regulations No 1182 and 1183 promulgated in terms of Sections 21, 22 and 26 of the Environmental Conservation Act, (Act 73 of 1989) or the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act 107 of 1998) and Regulations thereto, as the case may be, for the development of this township.

1.11 NATIONAL HERITAGE RESOURCE ACT:

The township owner shall at his own expense comply with the provisions of the National Heritage Resource Act, 25 of 1999.

2. CONDITIONS OF TITLE

2.1 THE ERVEN MENTIONED BELOW SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE CONDITION AS INDICATED, LAID DOWN BY THE CITY OF TSHWANE METROPOLITAN MUNICIPALITY IN TERMS OF THE PROVISIONS OF THE TOWN-PLANNING AND TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1986 (ORDINANCE 15 OF 1986)

2.1.1 ALL ERVEN

2.1.1.1 The erf shall be subject to a servitude, 2m wide, for municipal services (water, sewer, electricity and stormwater) (hereinafter referred to as "the services"), in favour of the local authority, along any two boundaries, excepting a street boundary and, in the case of a panhandle erf, an additional servitude for municipal purposes, 2m wide, over the entrance portion of the erf, if and when required by the local authority: Provided that the local authority may waive any such servitude.

2.1.1.2 No buildings or other structures may be erected within the aforesaid servitude area and no trees with large roots may be planted within the area of such servitude or within a distance of 2m from it.

2.1.1.3 The City of Tshwane shall be entitled to temporarily deposit on the land adjoining the aforesaid servitude, any material it excavates during the laying, maintenance or removal of such services and other works which in its discretion it regards necessary, and furthermore the City of Tshwane shall be entitled to reasonable access to the said property for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the provision that the City of Tshwane shall make good any damage caused during the laying, maintenance or removal of such services and other works.

2.1.2 ERF 1886

2.1.2.1 The erf shall be subject to a servitude 2,0 m wide for municipal services (stormwater) in favour of the City of Tshwane, as indicated on the general plan.

2.1.2.2 No buildings or other structures may be erected within the aforesaid servitude area and no trees with large roots may be planted within the area of such servitude or within a distance of 2m there from.

2.1.2.3 The City of Tshwane shall be entitled to temporarily deposit on the land adjoining the aforesaid servitude, any material it excavates during the laying, maintenance or removal of such services and other works which in its discretion it regards essential, and furthermore the City of Tshwane shall be entitled to reasonable access to the said property for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the provision that the City of Tshwane shall make good any damage caused during the laying, maintenance or removal of such main sewer pipelines and other works.

2.1.3 ALL ERVEN

As this erf (stand, land, etc) forms part of an area which is subject to aircraft activity and noise as a result of the close proximity to the Wonderboom Airport, the owner thereof accepts that inconvenience with regard to noise as a result thereof, may be experienced.

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
