

DECLARATION OF AN APPROVED TOWNSHIP AND NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF AN AMENDMENT SCHEME IN TERMS OF SECTION 16(9) OF THE CITY OF TSHWANE LAND USE MANAGEMENT BY-LAW, 2016 FOR AN APPROVED TOWNSHIP

MONTANA EXTENSION 212

It is hereby notified in terms of the provisions of Section 16(9) of the City of Tshwane Land Use Management By-Law, 2016 that the City of Tshwane has approved and hereby adopted the land development application for the amendment scheme with regard to the property(ies) in the township of Montana Extension 212, being an amendment of the Tshwane Town-planning Scheme, 2008 (Revised 2014).

The Tshwane Town-planning Scheme, 2008 (Revised 2014), and the adopted scheme map and the adopted annexures of this amendment scheme are filed with the Municipality, and are open to inspection during normal office hours.

It is hereby declared that in terms of the provisions of section 16(9) of the City of Tshwane Land Use Management By-Law, 2016, that Montana Extension 212 is an approved township, subject to the conditions as set out in the schedules hereto.

CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH THE APPLICATION MADE BY INVICTA KONSTRUKSIE CC (REGISTRATION NR 1996/004407/23), IN TERMS OF SECTION 16(4)(f)(i) OF THE CITY OF TSHWANE LAND USE MANAGEMENT BY-LAW, 2016 FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A TOWNSHIP ON PORTION 669 (A PORTION OF PORTION 41) OF THE FARM HARTEBEEST-FONTEIN 324JR, PROVINCE OF GAUTENG, HAS BEEN GRANTED

1. CONDITIONS OF ESTABLISHMENT

1.1 NAME

The name of the township shall be Montana Extension 212.

1.2 DESIGN

The township consists of Erven 2385 and 2386 as indicated on General Plan SG No 1482/2023

1.3 PROVISION AND INSTALLATION OF ENGINEERING SERVICES

The Township Owner shall at his cost provide the township with such engineering services, social infrastructure and open spaces as the Municipality may deem necessary for the properdevelopment of the township and comply with the engineering services agreement entered intobetween the township owner and the Municipality as required in terms of Section 21(3) of theBy-law and in accordance with section 49 of the Spatial Planning and Land Use ManagementAct, 16 of 2013.

1.4 ACCEPTANCE AND DISPOSAL OF STORMWATER

The township owner shall arrange for the drainage of the township to fit in with that of the adjacent road and all stormwater running off or being diverted from the road and higher lying areas shall be received and disposed of, to the satisfaction of the Municipality.

1.5 ACCESS CONDITIONS

Access to or egress from the township shall be provided to the satisfaction of the Municipality.

2. CONDITIONS TO BE COMPLIED WITH BEFORE THE ERVEN IN THE TOWNSHIP BECOME REGISTRABLE WHICH SHALL BE READ WITH THE CONDITIONS OF ESTABLISHMENT INDICATED IN 1 ABOVE IN TERMS OF SECTION 16(10) OF THE BY-LAW AND SECTION53 OF THE SPATIAL PLANNING AND LAND USE MANAGEMENT ACT, 16 OF 2013

2.1 REFUSE REMOVAL

- 2.1.1 The township owner shall at his own expense have all litter within the township area removed to the satisfaction of the City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality, when required to do so by the City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality.
- 2.1.2 The township owner shall provide sufficient refuse collection points in the township and shall make arrangements to the satisfaction of the Municipality for the removal of all refuse.

2.2 REMOVAL OR REPLACEMENT OF EXISTING SERVICES

If, by reason of the establishment of the township, it should be necessary to remove or replaceany existing municipal, TELKOM and/or ESKOM services, the cost of such removal or replacement shall be borne by the township owner. For purposes of removal or replacementthe township owner shall, at its own costs, protect the services by means of the registration of servitudes in favour of the City of Tshwane, TELKOM and/or ESKOM should it be deemed necessary.

2.3 DEMOLITION OF BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES

The township owner shall at its own costs cause all existing buildings/structures situated within the building line reserves, side spaces, or over common boundaries to be demolished to the satisfaction of the Municipality, when requested thereto by the Municipality or where buildings/structures are dilapidated.

2.4 CONSOLIDATION OF ERVEN

The township owner shall, at its own costs, after proclamation of the township but prior to thedevelopment of any erf/unit in the township, consolidate Erven 2385 and 2386

The Municipality hereby grants approval for the consolidation of Erven 2385 and 2386 in terms of section 16(12)(d) of By-law read with section 15(6) of the By-law, which consolidation approval shall only come into operation on proclamation of the township and subject to the section 16(10) certification in term of the By-law by the City of Tshwane.

The Township Owner shall simultaneously with an application for a section 16(10) certification for the registration of erven in the township apply for a section 16(10) certification for purposes of the consolidation and shall comply with the conditions of the consolidation and the townshipfor issuing of both certifications.

2.5 RESTRICTION ON REGISTRATION AND TRANSFER OF ERVEN FROM THE TOWNSHIP

In terms of section 16(10) of the By-law read with section 53 of Spatial Planning and Land UseManagement Act, (Act 16 of 2013) no property(ies) or land and/or erf/erven and/or sections and/or units, sectional title schemes/registers or other registration transaction/s, in a land development area, which registration transactions results from a land development application(s), may be submitted by the applicant and/or owner, to the Registrar of Deed for registration, including transfer and the registration of a Certificate of Consolidated Title and/or Certificate of Registered in the name of the owner;

prior to the Municipality certifying to the Registrar of Deeds that;

- (i) All engineering services have been designed and constructed to the satisfaction of the Municipality, including the provision of guarantees, and maintenance guarantees, forservices having been provided to the satisfaction of the Municipality as may be required.
- (ii) All engineering services contributions and open spaces and parks contributions and/or development charges and/or other monies have been paid.
- (iii) All engineering services have been or will be protected to the satisfaction of the Municipality by means of servitudes.
- (iv) All conditions of the approval of the land development application have been complied with or that arrangements for compliance to the satisfaction of the Municipality have been made, which arrangements shall form part of an agreement read with Chapter 7of the By-law, to the satisfaction of the Municipality.
- (v) It is in a position to consider a final building plan; and
- (vi) All the properties have either been transferred in terms of subsection 16(11) hereof orshall be transferred simultaneously with the first transfer or registration of a newly created property or sectional title scheme.

2.6 PROVISION OF OPEN SPACES AND PARKS

The township owner shall, in terms of the provisions of Section 47(3) read with Schedule 16 of the By-Law, pay an amount of money to the Municipality for the shortfall in the provision of land for the provision of opens spaces and parks equal to **988m**² and provide open spaces of **748m**².

2.7 CONDITIONS TO BE COMPLIED WITH SIMULTANEOUSLY WITH THE REGISTRATION OF ANY PROPERTY/ERF/ERVEN OR UNIT WITHIN THE LAND DEVELOPMENT AREA (BEFORE ISSUING OF THE SECTION 16(10) CERTIFICATE)

A detailed Construction or Phase 2 Geotechnical Report, which must include the mapping details of the trenches and the revised geotechnical map, confirming the soil conditions on siteand the positioning of structures and wet services. A table indicating the stand sizes, and geotechnical soil class for each stand within the township must be included. Certification on the method of backfilling of the trenches must also be included.

3. DISPOSAL OF EXISTING CONDITIONS OF TITLE IN TERMS OF SECTION 16(4)(g)

All erven shall be made subject to existing conditions and servitudes, if any.

- 3.1 Excluding the following servitude which only affects Erf 2385 in the township:
 - "E. By virtue of Notarial Deed of Servitude K9262/2004S dated 2nd of November 2004 the within mentioned property is subject to a servitude for sewerage and other municipal services approximately 12m² (square metres) wide on the South Western corner of Holding 35 Montana Agricultural Holdings of which this property forms a portion along a route to be determined, in favour of the City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality aswill more fully appear on the aforesaid Notarial Deed."

4. CONDITIONS OF TITLE

Conditions of Title imposed in favour of the Municipality in terms of the section 16(4)(g)of the Bylaw.

4.1 ALL ERVEN

- 4.1.1 Each erf is subject to a servitude, 2m wide, in favour of the Municipality, for sewerage and other municipal purposes, along any boundary other than a street boundary and inthe case of a panhandle erf, an additional servitude for municipal purposes 2m wide across the access portion of the erf, if and when required by the Municipality: Providedthat the Municipality may dispense with any such servitude.
- 4.1.2 No building or other structure or any part of its foundation shall be erected within the aforesaid servitude area and no large, rooted trees shall be planted within the area of such servitude or within 2m thereof.
- 4.1.3 The Municipality shall be entitled to deposit temporarily on the land adjoining the aforesaid servitude such material as may be excavated by it during the process of the construction, maintenance or removal of such sewerage mains and other works as it, inits discretion may deem necessary and shall further be entitled to reasonable access tothe said land for the aforesaid purpose subject to any damage done during the process of the construction, maintenance or removal of such sewerage mains and other works being made good by the Municipality.

4.2 ERF 2385

The erf is subject to the following servitudes in favour of the Municipality, as indicated on the LayoutPlan:

A 2m wide stormwater servitude.
