SCHEDULE

Paragraph B of Part III of the Traditional Leadership and Houses of traditional leadership regulations is hereby amended by the deletion and substitution thereof of the following paragraph:

B. DETERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP AND THE FORMULA FOR REPRESENTATION

B.1 The number of members and formula for determining traditional council must be as follows:

Category A

A traditional community with 51 or more recognized headman or headwoman must be entitled to total of 50 traditional council members.

Category B

A traditional community with 25 to 50 recognized headmen or headwoman must be entitled to a total of 42 traditional council members.

Category C

A traditional community with 15 to 24 recognized headmen or headwoman must be entitled to a total of 32 traditional council members.

Category D

A traditional community with 08 to 14 recognized headmen or headwoman must be entitled to a total of 24 traditional council members.

Category E

A traditional community with 07 or less recognized headmen or headwoman must be entitled to a total of 18 traditional council members.
