EAST RAND PROPRIETARY MINES, LIMITED.

The following report is published for general information:—
THE RIGHT HONOURABLE THE MINISTER OF MINES AND INDUSTRIES.

Sir,

In accordance with your instructions to inquire into and report upon the possibility of the closing of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, we have the honour herewith to submit our report.

The terms of reference into which you have instructed us to inquire are as follows:—

- (a) The possibility of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, being closed down, and any practical measures which may be adopted to prevent or delay such closing down, whether by agreement with the owners of neighbouring properties or otherwise;
- (b) The immediate or ultimate effect of the closing down of the East Rand Proprietary Mines upon the working of neighbouring mines.
- (c) The possibility of arranging contributions towards the cost of carrying out the necessary pumping operations in the East Rand Proprietary Mines by the owners of neighbouring mines and in what manner such contributions should be assessed.

Four Committee meetings were held and, in addition, several informal meetings and conferences were attended by various members of your Committee at the offices of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, and Witwatersrand Deep, Limited.

The conclusions of your Committee have been arrived at by means of examination of records and plans, no formal evidence having been taken.

The property known as the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, is situated in the vicinity of the town of Boksburg, and comprises 4412 mining claims, of which number 776 are situated north of the reef, and 1261 have been developed, leaving therefore 2371 claims as yet unexploited. Almost the whole—i.e. 81 per cent—of this unexploited area lies at a depth of between 4000 and 9000 feet.

The size of the workings of this mine is, approximately, 3.8 miles on the strike of the reef and 1.3 mile on the incline.

Operations for the extraction of ore are at present being conducted at various points throughout the whole of this large area.

The ore from these workings is drawn through seven main shafts and four subsidiary shafts. This property thus requires the maintenance of eleven separate shafts.

The ore is treated in two separate plants with a total capacity of 140,000 tons per mensem, viz., Angelo mill 60,000 tons and the Cason mill 80,000 tons, the ore being conveyed to these reduction plants by means of steam locomotives.

The results of milling operations, costs, and profits per ton, and the progressive position in regard to ore reserves and development footage, etc., since 1st January, 1912, are given in appendices marked "A," "B," and "C," attached to our report.

In considering the imminence of the danger of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, being unable to continue operations, your Committee have based its calculations as to the probabilities in the immediate future upon the present level of prices of gold, labour, and stores. It is outside the province of your Committee, nor have they the information which would enable them to give an opinion, as to whether this general price level is likely in the near future to depart further from or to approach nearer to the level ruling in 1914.

It is clear, however, to your Committee that the present difficulties of this mine, as of other mines, are increased by the level of prices at present ruling; that should this level in the next few years approximate to that of 1914, the position may be materially altered, and the possibility of such an alteration in price levels should be taken into consideration in dealing with a problem which so vitally affects a considerable mining district. Your Committee, therefore, have viewed the problem not merely as one of keeping the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, from closing down in the next few months, but rather from the point of saving the district as a whole until the conditions become more calculable.

Reference "A."

It appears probable to your Committee that the quantity and value of the available ore reserves of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, under present conditions, and the curtailment of development, will preclude the continuance of operations by the mine, as at present constituted, after the expiration of approximately nine months from date. It also appears to your Committee from the large amount of development which has been carried out in promising areas without success, that the probability of developing a quantity of payable ore within the boundaries of their own property to maintain the ore reserves, while milling at full capacity, is remote, although at the extreme east and extreme west, in the lower portion of the mine, the prospects for future development are more favourable.

The four points which your Committee find themselves called upon to decide are therefore:—

Firstly.—Whether such a reduction of working costs could be brought about as would so materially lower the pay limit to permit of a considerable increase to the present available ore reserves.

Secondly.—Whether by means of selective mining the life of the mine could be prolonged on a reduced scale.

Thirdly.—Whether the acquisition of a portion of the properties of the Cinderella Consolidated Gold Mines, Limited, on the east, and the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited, on the west, would be likely so to add to the amount of payable ore obtainable per month as to permit the continuance of working under present conditions for an appreciable longer period.

Het volgende rapport is gepubliceerd voor algemene informatie:—

AAN ZIJN HOOGEDELACHTBARE DE MINISTER VAN MIJNWEZEN EN NIJVERHEID.

HED. Achtb. Heer,

Ingevolge uwe instructies om een onderzoek in te stellen naar en rapport uit te brengen over de mogelijkheid van een sluiting der East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., hebben wij de eer hieronder ons rapport over te leggen.

De punten waarnaar, volgens uw opdracht, wij onderzoek hadden te doen zijn de volgende:—

- (a) De mogelijkheid van sluiting der East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., en enige maatregelen welke kunnen worden gevuld om zodanige sluiting te voorkomen of uit te stellen, hetzij in overleg met de eigenaren der naburige eigendommen of anderszins.
- (b) De onmiddellijke of uiteindelijke uitwerking van de sluiting der East Rand Proprietary Mijnen op het werk der naburige mijnen.
- (c) De mogelijkheid voor vaststelling van bijdragen in de kosten van nodige pompwerkzaamheden in de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen door de eigenaren der naburige mijnen en op welke wijze zodanige bijdragen moeten worden vastgesteld.

Vier komitee-vergaderingen werden gehouden en daarenboven verschillende vergaderingen en konferenties door de verschillende leden van uw Komitee in de kantoren van de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., en Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt., gehouden.

De gevolgtrekkingen waartoe uw Komitee geraakte, werden verschillende vergaderingen en konferenties door de verschillende Geen formele getuigenissen werden afgelegd.

Het eigendom, bekend als de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., is gelegen in de nabijheid van Boksburg en omvat 4412 mijnclaims, van welk aantal 776 ten noorden van het rif zijn gelegen en 1261 zijn uitgewerkt, latende dus een balans van 2371 claims, welke tot nu toe onbewerkt zijn gebleven. Bijna het gehele blok, nl. 81 percent van dit onbewerkte deel, ligt op een diepte van tussen de 4000 en 9000 voet.

De grootte der werken dezer mijn bedraagt ongeveer 3.8 mijl tegen de helling van het rif en 1.3 mijl op de helling.

Werkzaamheden voor de uithaling van het erts worden op het ogenblik op verschillende punten van deze grote uitgestrektheid gedaan.

Het uitgehaalde erts wordt door zeven hoofdschachten en vier hulpsschachten opgebracht. Dit eigendom vereist dus het onderhoud van elf afzonderlike schachten.

Het erts wordt in twee afzonderlike machineriën bewerkt met een totale vermogen van 140,000 ton per maand, nl. de Angelo molen 60,000 ton en de Cason molen 80,000; het erts wordt naar deze machineriën door middel van locomotieven gebracht.

De resultaten van malen, kosten en winsten per ton en de geregelde stand voor wat betreft de ertsreserven, ontwikkeling, enz., sedert 1 Januarije 1912, worden in de bijlagen gemerkt "A," "B" en "C" bij dit rapport gevoegd, weergegeven.

Bij de beoordeling van het dreigend gevaar dat de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., niet in staat zullen zijn om de werkzaamheden voort te zetten, heeft uw Komitee zijn berekeningen gemaakt op de mogelijkheden in de onmiddellijke toekomst wat betreft de heersende prijzen van goud, arbeid en benodigdheden. Het ligt niet op de weg van uw Komitee, noch bezit het de inlichtingen welke het in staat zouden stellen om daarover een oordeel te vellen, om te zeggen of die algemene heersende prijs wellicht in de naaste toekomst zal kunnen wijken van, of nader aan die in 1914 heersende, zal komen.

Het is uw Komitee echter duidelijk dat de tegenwoordige moeilijkheden dezer mijn, evenals die van andere mijnen, worden vermeerderd door de heersende prijzen en dat, indien die heersende prijzen in de eerstkomende jaren min of meer tot die van 1914, zullen dalen, de toestand aanzienlijk zal worden gewijzigd. De mogelijkheid van zodanige verandering der heersende prijzen dient in overweging te worden genomen, wanneer op een vraagstuk wordt ingegaan welke van uiterst belang is voor een groot mijndistrict. Uw Komitee heeft daarom dit vraagstuk in overweging genomen, niet enkel van uit het oogpunt te voorkomen dat de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., in de eerstvolgende maanden zullen sluiten, maar eerder met het doel om het gehele district te helpen totdat de omstandigheden beter zijn.

Referentie "A."

Het komt uw Komitee waarschijnlijk voor dat de hoeveelheid en waarde van de voorhanden zijnde ertsreserven van de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., onder de tegenwoordige omstandigheden en de geringere ontwikkeling, de mijn zullen beletten de werkzaamheden voort te zetten na verloop van ongeveer negen maanden van af datum. Het komt uw Komitee ook voor, uit de grote ontginningen welke in veelbelovende streken zonder sukses zijn uitgevoerd, dat de kans om een hoeveelheid betaalbaar erts te vinden binnen de grenzen van het eigendom om de ertsreserven op te houden, terwijl intussen met alle kracht wordt gemalen, gering is, ofschoon in het uiterste oosten en uiterste westen in het lagere gedeelte van de mijn, de vooruitzichten voor toekomstige ontwikkeling gunstiger zijn.

De vier punten over welke uw Komitee zich verplicht acht te beslissen, zijn daarom:—

Eerstens.—Kan zodanige vermindering van werkbonkosten worden teweeggebracht dat de grens van betaalbaarheid zou worden omlaag gebracht dat een aanzienlijke vermeerdering van de tegenwoordige voorhanden zijnde ertsreserves kon plaats vinden?

Tweedens.—Kan door middel van uitgezochte ontginding het bestaan van de mijn op verminderde schaal worden verlengd?

Derdens.—Kan door de aankoop van een gedeelte van de eigendommen van de Cinderella Consolidated Goudmijnen, Bepkt., in het oosten en de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt., in het westen de hoeveelheid betaalbare erts, per maand verkrijgbaar, zo worden vergroot, dat met de werkzaamheden onder de tegenwoordige omstandigheden gedurende een aanzienlijk langer tijdperk kan worden voortgegaan?

Fourthly.—Whether on a basis of the acquisition by the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited, by lease or otherwise of a portion of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, at its western boundary, and the purchase by the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, of Cinderella Consolidated (or amalgamation therewith) on the east, a reconstitution of the district might be feasible which holds out reasonable prospects of the mining and accessibility of the whole area being saved.

With regard to the first point, your Committee having gone into this matter, have arrived at the conclusion that, owing to the vast extent of the property necessitating the maintenance of so many shafts, the abnormal quantity of water which has to be dealt with, and for other reasons, it would not be possible to effect such economies as would materially reduce the costs.

With reference to the second point, a study of the ore reserve plan reveals the fact that there is little opportunity for selective mining. Any increase that might be obtained in the recovery per ton milled by this means would be more than set off by the increase in the costs per ton milled on account of the standing charges having to be distributed over the smaller tonnage. In connection with this matter, your Committee refers you to Appendix "C" and plan "A.1."

We now come to the third point. The proposal considered by your Committee was that the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, should acquire certain areas from the neighbouring properties. These areas are shown on plans "A" and "B." Plan "A" shows the portion of the Cinderella Consolidated Gold Mines, Limited, the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, should acquire, and plan "B" the portion belonging to the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited.

Approximately, the tonnage of payable ore which might be recovered from these two areas is, in the case of "A," 185,000, and, in the case of "B," 171,000.

It will be noted from these plans that the areas in question could be attacked from the present workings of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, expeditiously.

In considering this scheme, however, your Committee were of opinion that the monthly tonnage which it would be possible to draw from the areas in question would be inadequate materially to affect the position. Your Committee were of opinion further that even if relief could be obtained in this matter, such relief would be merely temporary, and within a short period, possibly after having injured the future prospects of both adjoining companies, the mine must inevitably close down, since it is unlikely that within such a short period working conditions would have improved to an extent which would enable it to continue operations permanently. It is obviously desirable, if it can be managed, that the mine should be tided over the present emergency not only temporarily, but also permanently.

There remains the fourth point to be considered. An analysis of the ore reserves of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, shows that if the property is divided into three sections, viz., (1) Driefontein and Ginsberg, (2) Angelo and Comet, and (3) Cason, Cinderella, and Hercules, we get the following distribution of ore reserves. In the first or western section the total ore reserve amounts to 607,000 tons, with an average value of 6.0 dwt. Of this total, 48 per cent. is over 6.0 dwt., with an average value of 7.0 dwt., and the remaining 52 per cent. average 5.0 dwt.

In the third or eastern section, the total reserve is 808,000 tons, averaging 6.3 dwt. Of this total, 48 per cent. is above 6.0 dwt., with an average of 7.7 dwt., and 52 per cent. is below 6.0 dwt., and averages 5.0 dwt.

In the second or central section, the total ore reserve is 782,000 tons, averaging 5.5 dwt. Of this total only 23 per cent. is above 6.0 dwt., the remaining 77 per cent. again averaging 5.0 dwt.

The development in this central section, which can only proceed in depth, has not only not been encouraging, but the proximity of the water zone will increase the water difficulty as development is extended. The figures also show that mining operations in this section have about exhausted all but low grade rock.

In the eastern and western sections, on the other hand, not only is there a considerably higher proportion of higher grade rock in the reserves, but there is opportunity for development, which not only holds out more encouraging prospects, but which can be prosecuted without increasing water troubles.

Adjoining the western section is the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited, which under existing conditions is operating profitably from a similar depth.

Adjoining the eastern section is the Cinderella Consolidated Gold Mines, Limited, which has been closed down since 1913, but which contains a reserve of developed ore stated at 519,000 tons, averaging 6.2 dwt., fully developed, and 74,000 tons partially developed of a higher value. The Cinderella Consolidated Gold Mines, Limited, workings can be reached either through its own main shaft, which is fully equipped, and about the same depth as the Hercules Shaft, or from the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, workings.

The main outlines of the proposal examined by your Committee were:—

(1) That the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited, should lease the western section for a term of years, and should operate on a scale of 50,000 tons per month.

(2) That the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, operations should be mainly confined to the area represented by a consolidation of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, eastern section with the Cinderella Consolidated Gold Mines, Limited, and should operate on a basis of from 70,000 to 80,000 tons per month.

(3) That each of these two establishments should purchase its water from the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, main pumping station, at the rate of 1s. 6d. a thousand gallons (Rand Water Board rate), and that the cost of pumping, after being credited with these sales and any others which might be effected, should be borne between them pro rata to the milling tonnage.

Vierdens.—Kan op een basis van verwerving door de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt., door huur als anderszins van een gedeelte van de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., op diens westelijke grens, en de aankoop door de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., van de Cinderella Consolidated (of amalgamatie daarmee) in het oosten, een herinrichting van het district mogelijk worden waardoor redelike vooruitzichten voor ontginnings en toegankelijkheid van het gehele gebied wordt gewaarborgd.

Met betrekking tot het eerste punt is uw Komitee, na in deze zaak te zijn ingegaan, tot de overtuiging gekomen dat, tengevolge van de grote uitgestrektheid van het eigendom waardoor het onderhouden van zovele schachten nodig wordt, de abnormale hoeveelheid water waarmee rekening moet worden gehouden en andere redenen, het niet mogelijk zal zijn om zodanige bezuinigingen te bewerken dat daardoor de kosten aanmerkelijk zouden worden verminderd.

Met betrekking tot het tweede punt brengt een studie van het ertsreserve plan het feit aan het licht dat er weinig gelegenheid is voor ontginnings naar keuze. Enige vermeerdering welke op die wijze kan worden verkregen in de opbrengst per gemalen ton, zou meer dan overtroffen worden door de vermeerdering in de kosten per gemalen ton, omdat de vastgestelde kosten over de kleinere tonnemaat moeten worden verdeeld. In verband met deze zaak wenst uw Komitee u te verwijzen naar bijlage "C" en plan "A.1."

Wij komen nu tot het derde punt. Het plan door uw Komitee in overweging genomen was dat de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., zekere gronden van de naburige eigendommen zou verkrijgen. Deze gronden worden op plannen "A" en "B" getoond. Plan "A" vertoont het gedeelte van de Cinderella Consolidated Goudmijnen, Bepkt., welke de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., zou verkrijgen en plan "B" het gedeelte behorende aan de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt.

Bij benadering is het aantal tonnen betaalbare erts welke van deze twee gronden kan worden gewonnen, in het geval van "A" 185,000 en in het geval van "B" 171,000.

Uit deze plannen kan worden gezien dat de gronden in kwestie van uit de tegenwoordige werken van de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., gemakkelijk kunnen worden bewerkt.

Bij het in overweging nemen echter van dit schema, was uw Komitee van mening, dat de maandelijke hoeveelheid erts, welke mogelijk uit de gronden in kwestie kan worden getrokken, in werkelijkheid onvoldoende zou zijn om de toestand te beïnvloeden. Uw Komitee was verder de mening toegedaan dat, zelfs wanneer er verlichting in deze zaak kon worden verkregen, deze slechts tijdelijk zou zijn en dat binnen een kort tijdperk, na wellicht de toekomstige vooruitzichten van beide aangrenzende maatschappijen te hebben benadeeld, de mijn onvermijdelijk moet sluiten, aangezien het niet waarschijnlijk is dat binnen zulk een kort tijdperk de toestand van werkzaamheden in zodanige mate zou zijn vooruitgaan, dat met de werkzaamheden duurzaam kon worden voortgegaan. Het is blijkbaar wenselijk, indien zulks gedaan kan worden, dat de mijn over de huidige nood dient te worden geholpen, niet slechts tijdelijk maar ook permanent.

Blijft nog het vierde punt te worden in onverweging genomen. Een analyse van de ertsreserven van de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., toont aan dat, indien het eigendom in drie sekties wordt verdeeld, t.w. (1) Driefontein en Ginsberg, (2) Angelo en Comet en (3) Cason, Cinderella en Hercules, wij de volgende verdeling van ertsreserven verkrijgen. In de eerste of westelijke sektie bedragen de totale ertsreserven 607,000 ton met een gemiddelde waarde van 6.0 dwt. Van dit totaal is 48 percent over 6.0 dwt., met een gemiddelde waarde van 7.0 dwt. en de overige 52 percent gemiddeld 5.0 dwt.

In de derde of oostelijke sektie, bedraagt de totale reserve 808,000 ton, met een gemiddelde van 6.3 dwt. Van dit totaal is 48 percent boven de 8.0 dwt. met een gemiddelde van 7.7 dwt en 52 percent beneden 6.0 dwt. en gemiddeld 5.0 dwt.

In de tweede of centrale sektie bedraagt de totale ertsreserve 782,000 ton met een gemiddelde van 5.5 dwt. Van dit totaal is slechts 23 percent boven de 6.0 dwt., en de overige 77 percent wederom gemiddeld 5.0 dwt.

De ontginnings van deze centrale sektie, welke alleen in diepte kan worden bewerkt, was niet enkel niet aanmoedigend, maar de nabijheid van water zal de watermoeilijkheid vermeerderen naarmate ontginnings plaats vindt. De cijfers tonen ook aan dat mijnwerkzaamheden in deze sektie alles heeft uitgeput, uitgezonderd de rots van laag gehalte.

In de oostelijke en westelijke sekties daarentegen is er niet alleen een belangrijk hogere verhouding van goed erts in de reserven, maar is er gelegenheid voor ontginnings, waardoor er niet alleen meer aanmoedigende vooruitzichten ontstaan, maar welke ook verder kunnen worden bewerkt, zonder de watermoeilijkheden te vergroten. Grenzende aan de westelijke sektie is de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt., welke onder bestaande omstandigheden van een gelijke diepte met winst werkzaam is.

Grenzende aan de oostelijke sektie is de Cinderella Consolidated Goudmijnen, Bepkt., welke sedert 1913 is gesloten, maar een reserve van bereikbare erts bevat, geschat op 519,000 ton van gemiddeld 6.2 dwt. ten volle bereikbaar, en 74,000 ton gedeeltelijk bereikbaar van een hogere gehalte. De werken der Cinderella Consolidated Goudmijnen, Bepkt., kunnen worden bereikt, hetzij door zijn eigen hoofdzak, die ten volle is uitgerust en van ongeveer dezelfde diepte als de Hercules schacht, of van uit de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt.

De voornaamste punten van het voorstel door uw Komitee onderzocht waren:—

(1) Dat de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt., de westelijke sektie voor een termijn jaren dient te huren en op een schaal van 50,000 ton per maand dient te werken.

(2) Dat de verrichtingen van de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., hoofdzakelijk moeten worden beperkt tot het terrein verkregen door een samensmelting van de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., oostelijke sektie met de Cinderella Consolidated Goudmijnen, Bepkt., op een basis van 70,000 tot 80,000 ton per maand.

(3) Dat elk dezer twee instellingen water zal kopen van de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., en wel van de hoofdpomp statie tegen een bedrag van 1s. 6d. per duizend gallons (Rand Water Bestuur tarief) en dat de kosten van pompen, na met deze verkoop en enige andere welke mochten worden aangegaan te zijn gekrediteerd, tussen hen beide pro rata het aantal gemalen tonnen moeten worden gedragen.

In examining this proposal, your Committee has not felt itself called upon to discuss the financial adjustments involved between the owners concerned, as it conceived these to be a matter for the principals themselves. Your Committee has confined itself to the question: Would such a reconstitution of the district hold out a reasonable probability of sufficiently profitable mining operations being carried on to keep the district alive and the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, unwatered for, at all events a few years, which would keep open the opportunity for the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, to resume operations on a larger and more permanent scale?

Your Committee is of opinion that if an arrangement on these lines can be come to, it presents a possibility of prolonging the life of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, and of keeping open this long stretch of mine workings as does the suggestion that the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, should absorb the adjacent properties.

Your Committee desires to lay the utmost possible stress on the imminence and urgency of the danger which confronts the whole of this mining district, and it recommends that the principals concerned in the arrangements indicated above should be called together as soon as possible, so that all details and financial arrangements involved therein may be closely investigated, and a decision as to the necessary action, if any, may be come to without such delay as may prove fatal to any plans being effective.

Your Committee also desires to direct very earnest attention to the disastrous effect that the closing down of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, would have on the livelihood of a whole district. It is of opinion that if it is found that an arrangement on the lines above indicated cannot be carried into effect, the only way of keeping the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, at work is by the Government guaranteeing that Company against loss to the extent of its pumping charges incurred.

Reference "B."

The effect upon neighbouring mines of the closing down of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, will not be immediate.

If, however, no effort is made to cope with or delay the rising of the water, it is estimated that within a period of about seven months from the cessation of pumping in the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, it would rise to the level at which it would flow into the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited. This estimate is based on the cubic content of the mine excavation to be filled in the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, itself, and does not take account of the water absorbed in filling the now drained portion of the water zone itself. The period of seven months may, therefore, possibly be prolonged by a small respite.

Under these circumstances, the alternatives confronting the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited, in the event of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, closing down, are:—

- (1) To arrange to shut down itself at the expiration of about seven months;
- (2) To arrange with the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, for the use of the two Angelo Deep shafts and equipment, and by bailing through these to delay the rising of the water to the danger level for perhaps a matter of a further few months; and
- (3) To make more permanent arrangements for keeping the water below the danger level either by installing a suitable plant on the eighteenth level of its own mine, or by arranging to take over and operate the main pumping station on the twenty-first level of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, i.e. about 300 feet below the level at which the water would flow into the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited.

With regard to the problem confronting that Company of endeavouring to make more permanent arrangements, the latter of the two plans indicated above would seem to offer the more favourable chance of the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited, being able to continue the struggle. For how long a period it would be able to keep up that struggle depends on too many contingencies for your Committee to be able to offer any estimate. Even taking into account the smaller depth from which the water would be pumped compared to that from which the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, has now to lift it, it seems probable that the cost of pumping will absorb the current rate of profits of the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited, and force the Company to suspend operations.

Whether the hope of general conditions improving in a few years, and the prospective value of possessing what would then be the only open access to what are now East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, deeper level claims will induce the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited, to prolong an existence in which quite probably the whole of its current profits are devoted to struggling with the water difficulty, is a matter of financial policy for that Company to decide.

It need only further be said here that any plans which the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited, may eventually make for temporarily or permanently coping with the water, would involve the use of certain portions of East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, shafts and equipment for a longer or shorter period; your Committee presumes that, as the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, would in the supposed contingency be finally and definitely closed down, the arrangement of such matters would offer no difficulty.

The period within which mines further to the west than the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited, would be affected obviously depends upon how long the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited, continues to work after the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, ceases pumping operations.

Basing the estimate again on the cubic content of the mine excavations, and taking no account of the filling of the water zone, your Committee estimates that if the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited, were forced to close down a period of twelve months would elapse between such closing down and the rising of the water to a level at which it would flow into the Witwatersrand Gold Mine Company, Limited.

Bij het nagaan van dit voorstel, voelde uw Komitee zich niet gerechtigd om de financiële schikkingen tussen de betrokken eigenaren te bespreken, aangezien dit een zaak is voor de partijen zelve. Uw Komitee heeft zich beperkt tot de kwestie: Zou zulk een indeling van het terrein een redelijke mogelijkheid voldoende winstgevende mijnwerkzaamheden kunnen opleveren om het district te laten voortbestaan en de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., altans voor enkele jaren, waardoer de mogelijkheid voor de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., wordt opengehouden om werkzaamheden weer op een grotere en meer permanente schaal te beginnen.

Uw Komitee is van mening dat, indien een schikking op deze wijze kan worden getroffen, er een kans is om het bestaan van de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., te verlengen en deze lange reeks van mijnwerken open te houden ook zou gebeuren indien de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., de naburige eigendommen in zich opnam.

Uw Komitee wenst de meest mogelijke nadruk te leggen op het belang en spoedeisende van de zaak en het gevaar waaraan het gehele mijndistrict bloot staat en zij beveelt aan dat de partijen, betrokken in de schikkingen hierboven aangegeven, zo spoedig mogelijk bij elkaar zullen worden geroepen, ten einde alle biezonderheden en financiële schikkingen, daarmee in verband staande, ten volle na te gaan en tot een besluit, wat betreft de te volgen handelwijze, indien al, te komen, zonder een oponthoud te veroorzaken, dat noodlottig kan wezen voor de uitvoering van enig plan.

Uw Komitee wenst ook de ernstige aandacht te trekken op de vernietigende gevolgen van het sluiten der East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., op het bestaan van het gehele district. Het Komitee is van mening dat, indien een schikking op de wijze zoals hierboven aangegeven, bevonden wordt niet uitvoerbaar te zijn, de enige manier om de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., aan het werk te houden zou zijn, dat het Gouvernement de maatschappij tegen verlies, ter grootte van de pompkosten zal vrijwaren.

Referentie "B."

De uitwerking van het sluiten der East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., op de naburige mijnen zal niet onmiddellijk zijn. Indien echter geen poging wordt aangewend om de stijging van het water te bestrijden of die te vertragen, dan zal volgens berekening binnen een tijdperk van ongeveer zeven maanden vanaf dat met pompen in de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., wordt opgehouden, het water tot zulk een hoogte komen dat het in de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt., zal invloeden. Deze schatting is gebaseerd op de kubieke inhoud van de mijnngravingen in de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., welke zullen worden opgevuld en houdt geen rekening met het water nodig voor het vullen van het nu gedraaide gedeelte van het watergebied zelf. Het tijdperk van zeven maanden kan daarom wellicht iets langer worden.

Onder deze omstandigheden zal het alternatief welke de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt., in geval de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen zullen sluiten, te wachten is, zijn:—

- (1) Zich er op voor te bereiden om zelf na verloop van ongeveer zeven maanden te te sluiten.
- (2) Schikkingen te treffen met de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., voor het gebruik van de twee Angelo Deep schachten en uitrusting en door deze het water uit te scheppen waardoor het rijzen van het water tot het gevaarlijke peil voor wellicht enkele maanden zal worden vertraagd.
- (3) Meer permanente schikkingen te treffen om het water beneden het gevaarspeil te houden, hetzij door de oprichting van een geschikte machinerie op de achttiende vloer van zijn eigen mijn of door een schikking te treffen voor het overnemen en de werking van de hoofdpompstation op de een en twintigste vloer van de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., t.w. ongeveer 300 voeten beneden de vloer waar het water in de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt., zal invloeden.

Met betrekking tot het vraagstuk welke die maatschappij heeft op te lossen om te trachten permanenter schikkingen te treffen, schijnt de laatste van de twee plannen hierboven aan de hand gedaan, een gunstiger kans aan de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt., aan te bieden om de strijd vol te houden. Hoelang zij in staat zal zijn om die worsteling op te houden hangt van te vele toevallige omstandigheden af om uw Komitee in staat te stellen daarover enige benadering te geven. Zelfs indien de kleinere diepte van waar het water zou worden gepompt in rekening wordt genomen en vergeleken met die waaruit de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., het nu heeft te halen, dan schijnt het waarschijnlijk dat de kosten van pompen de gewone winsten van de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt., zullen opslurpen en de maatschappij dwingen om de werkzaamheden op te schorten.

Of de hoop dat de algemene toestanden in enkele jaren zullen verbeteren en de prospektieve waarde van bezit, welke dan de enige open toegang zal zijn tot de diepere vloerklaams van de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen Bepkt., de Witwatersrand Deep Bepkt., zullen bewegen om een bestaan te verlenen waarin heel waarschijnlijk al hare winsten zullen worden opgeslurpt om de watermoeilijkheden te bekampen, is een zaak van financiële politiek welke die maatschappij heeft te beslissen.

Enkel kan hier verder worden gezegd dat enig plan, dat de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt., later mocht maken om tijdelijk of permanent het water te bekampen, het gebruik van zekere deelten van de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., schachten en uitrusting, voor een korter of langer tijdperk met zich zal slepen; uw Komitee neemt aan dat, aangezien de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., in de veronderstelde omstandigheden te goed en final zullen zijn gesloten, de schikking van zulke zaken geen moeilijkheid zal opleveren.

Het tijdperk waarin de mijnen, ten westen van de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt., zouden worden getroffen, hangt klaarblijkelijk af van hoe lang de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt., zal voortgaan te werken, nadat de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., met de pompwerkzaamheden zullen zijn opgehouden.

Een begroting aannemende welke wederom gebaseerd is op de kubieke inhoud van de mijnholten en geen nota nemende van het opvullen van de watergrens, is uw Komitee van oordeel dat, indien de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt., gedwongen werd om te sluiten, er een tijdsverloop van 12 maanden zal verlopen tussen zodanige sluiting en het rijzen van het water tot een hoogte waar het in de Witwatersrand Goudmijn Mij., Bepkt., zou vloeien,

The estimated life of the Witwatersrand Gold Mine Company, Limited, is three years.

Assuming that the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, does not close down before nine months from the present date, that without embarking on any more permanent arrangements the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited, delay the rising of the water by baling so that it takes fifteen months thereafter before it is flooded out, and that as above stated a further twelve months ensues before the water rises to the level where the Witwatersrand Gold Mine Company, Limited, will be affected it would appear that the last-named company will not be affected by the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, shutting down or keeping open.

The other mines situated west of the Witwatersrand Gold Mine Company, Limited, in which direction the water from the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, will flow are as follows:—

Knights Deep, Eastern Section.
Knights Central.
Knights Deep, Western Section.
Simmer Deep.
Jupiter.
Simmer & Jack.
Geldenhuys Deep.
Rose Deep.
New Primrose.

These mines are taken in the order in which they will be successively affected.

The Knights Deep, Limited, the Simmer Deep, Limited, and Jupiter Gold Mine Company, Limited, are already permanently closed down, so need not be considered. The Knights Central, Limited, will close within a period of twelve months, so similarly need not be considered.

The life of the Goldenhuys Deep, under present conditions, is at most two years; this mine also may be left out of consideration.

There remains therefore only the Simmer & Jack, Rose Deep, and New Primrose.

In the case of the Simmer & Jack Proprietary Mines, Limited, the estimated life, under present conditions, is in the vicinity of five years.

If the water which is making in the western area is dealt with a period of about three years will elapse before this water is augmented by that from the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited; this is provided that no further attempt is made to deal with the water from the latter property after closing. The life of this mine may therefore be curtailed by two years.

In the case of the Rose Deep, Limited, which has an estimated life of about five years from date, a curtailment of about one year would probably result.

The workings of the New Primrose being situated above those of the Rose Deep, Limited, need not be considered.

The neighbouring mines which would be thus affected in greater or less degree, as indicated, are the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited, Witwatersrand Gold Mine Company, Limited, the Simmer & Jack Proprietary Mines, Limited, and Rose Deep, Limited.

Reference "C."

Excluding the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited, the lives of the other mines, dated from the period when they would be affected by the inflow of the water from the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, are so short that they would not be likely to consider any contribution towards the cost of pumping such water.

The only mine, therefore, which might consider a contribution towards the pumping costs for its own salvation is the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited, but it is obvious that the financial position of this company is such as to preclude a possibility of any material assistance.

Aannemende dat de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., niet voor negen maanden van af heden sluiten, dat zonder in te gaan op enige verdere permanente schikkingen, de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt., het rijzen van het water tegenhoudt door zo te pompen dat het vijfentwintig maanden duurt voor dat de mijn onder water komt en dat er, zoals boven vermeld, een verdere twaalf maanden zullen verlopen voordat het water aan de vloer komt waar de Witwatersrand Goudmijn Mij., Bepkt., zal worden aangestast, dan schijnen het dat de laatstgenoemde maatschappij er niet onder zal lijden of de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., sluiten dan wel doorgaan met werken.

De andere mijnen gelegen ten westen van de Witwatersrand Goudmijn Mij., Bepkt., in welke richting het water van de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., zal vloeien, zijn de volgende:—

Knights Deep, oostelike sektie.
Knight Central.
Knight Deep, westelike sektie.
Simmer Deep.
Jupiter.
Simmer and Jack.
Geldenhuys Deep.
Rose Deep.
New Primrose.

Deze mijnen zijn in die volgorde genomen zoals zij achtereenvolgens zullen worden getroffen.

De Knights Deep, Bepkt., de Simmer Deep, Bepkt., en Jupiter Goudmijn Mij., Bepkt., zijn reeds voor goed gesloten en behoeven niet in besprekking te worden genomen. De Knight Central, Bepkt., zal binnen een tijdsperiode van twaalf maanden worden gesloten en behoeft daarom eveneens niet in aanmerking te worden genomen.

Het voortbestaan van de Goldenhuys Deep, zal onder de huidige omstandigheden, hoogstens twee jaren duren; deze mijn kan eveneens buiten overweging blijven.

Blijven dus enkel over de Simmer en Jack, Rose Deep en New Primrose.

In het geval van de Simmer en Jack Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., kan het voortbestaan ervan, onder de tegenwoordige omstandigheden, op ongeveer vijf jaren worden gesteld.

Indien het water in het westelijk gebied wordt onder handen genomen, zal er een tijdsperiode van ongeveer drie jaren verlopen voordat dit water wordt verstrekt met dat van de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt.; dat wil zeggen, mits geen verdere poging wordt aangewend om het water van laatstgenoemd eigenlijk onder handen te nemen, nadat die mijn gesloten is. Het voortbestaan van deze mijn kan daarom met twee jaren worden bekort.

In het geval van de Rose Deep, Bepkt., welke een geschat voortbestaan van ongeveer vijf jaren zal hebben vanaf heden, zal een bekorting van ongeveer een jaar waarschijnlijk het gevolg zijn.

Aangezien de werken van de New Primrose gelegen zijn boven die van de Rose Deep, Bepkt., behoeven zij niet in aanmerking te worden genomen.

De naburige mijnen welke zoals beschreven in meerdere of mindere mate zullen worden getroffen zijn de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt., Witwatersrand Goudmijn Mij., Bepkt., de Simmer en Jack Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., en de Rose Deep, Bepkt.

Referentie "C."

Met uitzondering van de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt., is het voortbestaan van de andere mijnen vanaf het tijdsperiode dat zij door het invloeden van het water zullen worden getroffen, van zo korte duur, dat zij waarschijnlijk enige bijdrage voor de kosten van het uitpompen van water, niet in overweging zullen nemen.

De enige mijn daarom welke een bijdrage ter bestrijding van de pomponkosten zal in overweging nemen en zulks wegens eigen redding, is de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt., maar het is duidelijk dat de financiële positie van deze maatschappij zodanig is dat de mogelijkheid van enige flinke steun uitgesloten is.

EAST RAND PROPRIETARY MINES CLOSING DOWN COMMITTEE.

So far as the Committee's investigations have gone up to the present the position of affairs is as follows:—

The East Rand Proprietary Mines, with reserves stated at 2.4 million tons at 6.1 dwt., composed of 213,500 shaft pillars at 7.8 dwt. and 2,197,350 at 5.93 dwt., anticipates that it will have to close down about the end of this year. With the price level of gold, labour, and stores midway between that obtaining to-day and that of 1914, it estimates that its life would be eight years, while with the price levels of 1914 it estimates that its life would be indefinitely long.

The actual mining position may be thus summarized:—

Between the western boundary and the Angelo Deep west shaft they have in hand 600,000 tons of reserves (including Ginsberg and shaft pillars).

The Farrar subsidiary incline, which was sunk 453 feet in 1920, is no longer sinking. It is a three-compartment shaft, and if sinking were also in progress probably not more than 15,000 to 20,000 tons a month could be hoisted through this shaft. To this would be added Ginsberg rock and reclamation rock from above the level of the start of this subsidiary shaft.

The Farrar subsidiary is the only shaft in the mine which is down into the country beyond the water zone.

Between the Angelo Deep west shaft and the eastern boundary there are some 1,800,000 tons of reserves, the bulk of which would appear from the plan to be situated east of the line of the Phoenix shaft. No shaft-sinking is being done in this part of the mine, and each incline will, as it sinks, approach the water zone. The most encouraging district for the rapid opening out of reserves is in this district, if an arrangement can be come to with the Cinderella Consolidated. But even supposing such arrangement to be come to it is difficult to see how, with their access to deeper development in the west confined to the Farrar subsidiary three-compartment incline, they can for long keep up the scale of over 100,000 tons a month, which is stated to be a *sine qua non* to their continued working.

The quantity of water entering the mine is now about 2,038,000 gallons a day, and has been as much as three millions. The cost of pumping this water is stated at £100,000 to £110,000 a year. If the mine were shut down it would, according to Sir H. Skinner, cost about £20,000 to £25,000 a month to keep the mine dry. This has not been verified, nor has the cost of fitting with new motors to synchronize with V.F.P. (if required) been inquired into. If the East Rand Proprietary Mines were shut down and pumping stopped it was estimated by Mr. Clifford at the preliminary meeting called by Sir Robert Kotzé that in about twelve months the water would begin to flow into the Wit Deep at the rate of from 500,000,000 gallons to 1,000,000,000 a year, i.e. 1½ million gallons to nearly 3 million gallons per diem.

MEMORANDUM OP 12 APRIL GECIRKULEERD.

SLUITINGSKOMITEE VAN DE EAST RAND PROPRIETARY MINES.

In zo verre het de onderzoeking van het Komitee tot op het ogenblik betreft, is de stand van zaken als volgt:—

De East Rand Proprietary Mines, met reserven welke beraamd worden op 2.4 miljoen ton tegen 6.1 dwt., bestaande uit 213,500 schachtkolommen tegen 7.8 dwt. en 2,197,350 tegen 5.93 dwt., verwacht tegen het eind van dit jaar tot sluiten verplicht te zullen worden.

Met de prijs van goud, arbeid en voorraden halverwege tussen die welke vandaag geldt en die van 1914, wordt zijn verder bestaan op acht jaar geschat, terwijl zijn bestaan onbeperkt geschat wordt tegen de prijs van 1914.

De wezenlike positie van de mijn kan dus als volgt opgesomd worden:—

Tussen de westelike grens en de Angelo Deep West Shaft heeft men 600,000 ton reserven ingesloten Ginsberg en schachtpilaren.

De Farrar subsidiare helling welke in 1920 tot 453 voet gezonken werd wordt niet verder voortgezet. Het is een schacht met drie kamers en als het zinken nog voorgezet werd, zou waarschijnlijk door deze schacht niet meer dan 15,000 tot 20,000 ton kunnen opgehaald worden. Daarbij zou men rots uit de Ginsberg en herwonnen rots van boven het peil van de ingang van deze subsidiare schacht moeten bijrekenen.

De Farrar subsidiare is de enige schacht in de mijn welke in het land afdaalt tot beneden de waterzone.

Tussen de Angelo Deep west shaft en de oostelike grens zijn daar zowat 1,800,000 ton reserven, waarvan volgens het plan het grootste gedeelte oost van de linie van de Phoenix shaft gelegen is. In dit deel van de mijn wordt er niets aan het zinken van schachten gedaan en elke helling zal, naarmate hij lager daalt de waterzone naderen. De hijkcapaciteit van de Hercules en Cason schachten is voldoende. Het meestbelovende distrik voor de snelle ontwikkeling van reserven is deze streek, als er met de Cinderella Consolidated een overeenkomst kan getroffen worden. Maar zelfs als er zulke schikking kon getroffen worden, valt het moeilijk te zien hoe, met hun toegang tot diepere ontwikkeling in het westen beperkt tot de Farrar subsidiare 3-kamer helling, zij voor 'n langen tijd de schaal van meer dan 100,000 ton per maand, wat verklaard wordt het *sine qua non* voor hun voortgezette bewerking te zijn, kunnen volhonden.

De hoeveelheid water dat de mijn binnenstroomt is tans 2,038,000 gallon per dag en is zo veel als drie miljoen per dag geweest. De kosten van het uitpompen worden beweerd £100,000 tot £110,000 per jaar te belopen. Indien de mijn gesloten wordt zou het, volgens Sir H. Skinner £20,000 tot £25,000 per jaar kosten om de mijn droog te houden. Dit is niet op de proef gesteld geworden, zo ook is er niet navraag gedaan naar de kosten van het uitrusten met nieuwe motoren om met V.F.P. samen te vallen, indien nodig. Indien de East Rand Proprietary Mines zou gesloten en het pompen stopgezet worden, dan zou volgens beraming van de heer Clifford, op de voorlopige vergadering door Sir Robert Kotzé belegd, het water binnen twaalf maanden de Wit Deep beginnen binnenvloeiën tegen 'n mate van 500,000,000 gallon tot 1,000,000,000 gallon per jaar, d.w.z. een en een-derde miljoen gallon tot bijna drie miljoen gallon per dag.

According to figures supplied by Mr. Clifford to the Committee the water would flow into the Wit Deep in 207 days, if we take 2,000,000 gallons a day, and in 167 if we take 2½ million gallons a day. Probably, taking into account the diminished head and pressure at that level, the former would be the figure more nearly approaching to what would actually occur. After 527 days it would begin to flow into the Witwatersrand Mine. The Knights Central need not be considered as it is closing down in any case, and the Committee prosecuted its inquiry no further into the dates at which other mines would be affected.

If the worst came to the worst the Wit Deep would probably try to save itself by continuing the struggle, and while dying would so prolong the period before the flooding of the Witwatersrand Mine took place that the life of the latter company, stated at three to four years, would have been ended before flooding occurred.

The problem for the Committee is whether and by what means the life of the East Rand Proprietary Mines can be prolonged.

The suggestion put forward is that the Government should subsidize the East Rand Proprietary Mines to the extent of its pumping charges. While a strong case might be made out for such a course as an alternative to the relief expenditure which might devolve upon the Government if such an event were to occur as the closing down of the East Rand Proprietary Mines with its effect on the whole district, it is clear that there are great difficulties in the way of this solution of the problem.

One argument against such a course is that, even with such a subsidy, there is no guarantee in the present state of the mine that it would be effective in delaying closing down for any extended period. This argument could be met with some force by the contention that the whole problem is essentially contingent on whether the present level of prices of gold and costs is likely to be permanent or whether it is merely a phase of greater or less duration which will pass, price levels eventually reverting to conditions approximately those of 1914. It is this consideration which governs the whole matter. Such adjustments to former price levels, or levels approximate thereto, may or may not take place within the next few years. But alike to the owners of adjacent mines, to the East Rand Proprietary Mines, and to the Government the whole question is one of struggling through the next few years until tendencies become clearer and more calculable than is the case to-day.

Of much more weight against the proposal of a Government subsidy would be any argument based on the ground that every possible and reasonable alternative had not been examined by the owners of the East Rand Proprietary Mines and adjacent mines in their own interests to avert the cessation of pumping. It is clear that every possible solution along these lines should be explored before asking for a Government subsidy.

Such possible solutions may be considered in the following order:—

- (1) By internal reorganization of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, leaving its claim area as at present and working on a considerably smaller scale.
- (2) By giving the East Rand Proprietary Mines the right to mine on the claim area of its east and west neighbours.
- (3) By subsidies from neighbouring mines.
- (4) By a combination of (1), (2), and (3) as suggested herein.

Any solution along these lines must have in it elements which are clearly to the advantage of such neighbours as well as advantageous to the East Rand Proprietary Mines.

We will take each of these in turn.

(1) The position taken by the East Rand Proprietary Mines is that, under pressure of the difficulties confronting them during the last three years, they have explored every possible suggestion for reducing their scale of operations, for concentrating their work, and for suitable internal reorganization; that none of these are workable, and that with their lay-out it is essential that they must work on a scale of about 100,000 tons a month or shut down. They state that out of their 2.4 million tons of reserves they will have to leave at least one half in the mine when they close down, and that once pumping ceases and the lower levels of the mine are flooded, the mine can never be reopened.

The Chairman extracted from the group returns comparative figures showing that in many categories of costs the East Rand Proprietary Mines costs were slightly higher than other mines working on a comparable scale. Mr. Meyer gave reasons to account for each of these comparisons. The cumulative effect of all these comparisons would seem to indicate that economy might be effected. But the truth of the matter probably is that the higher costs are due to the fact that the policy of big scale working cannot be adjusted to the existing conditions of the mine. To express a personal opinion, I do not see how any real economy is likely to be effected unless arrangements are made to work on a smaller scale. Only a radical alteration of policy can meet the position, and such radical alteration will be considered under (4).

(2) We now come to the solution along the lines of absorption of neighbouring properties or portions of them. Before entering on this discussion it is necessary to note the actual position of the East Rand Proprietary Mines. In doing so it must be clearly borne in mind that the question alluded to above, of the permanence or otherwise of the present level of prices, is of very vital importance to a property of the large claim holding of the East Rand Proprietary Mines.

As already stated, the East Rand Proprietary Mines estimates that if the price level were midway between that now obtaining and that of 1914 they would be able to go on for eight years, while if the 1914 level prevailed its life would be indefinitely long. They also state that once the mine is allowed to flood, or even if the

Als het ergste kwam te gebeuren zou de Wit Deep waarschijn- lijk trachten zichzelf te reden door het voortzetten van de strijd om het bestaan en terwijl het aan het sterven is zou het de periode zo verlengen voordat het vollopen van de Witwatersrand Mijn gebeurde, dat het leven van laatstgenoemde maatschappij, op 3 tot 4 jaar geschat, zou opgehouden hebben te bestaan voordat het vollopen plaatsvindt.

Het probleem voor het Komitee is hoe en door welk middel het leven van de East Rand Proprietary Mines kan verlengd worden.

Het plan aan de hand gegeven is dat het Gouvernement de East Rand Proprietary Mines geldelijk zou steunen tot het bedrag van zijn pompkosten. Terwijl men 'n sterk pleidooi voor zulk 'n optreden zou kunnen maken als 'n alternatief tot uitgave voor verlichting, waarvoor het Gouvernement zou aangesproken worden indien zo 'n gebeurtenis zou plaatsvinden als het sluiten van de East Rand Proprietary Mines, met de gevolgen voor het gehele distrik, is het toch duidelijk dat er grote moeilijkheden in de weg staan van zodanige oplossing van het probleem.

Een argument tegen zodanige oplossing is dat zelfs met zo 'n geldelike steun daar geen waarborg bij de huidige toestand van de mijn bestaat, dat het doeltreffend zou zijn met het voorkomen van de sluiting voor 'n lange tijdperk. Tegen dit argument zou men met kracht kunnen optreden door te beweren dat het hele probleem noodwendig afhanklik is van de omstandigheid of het huidige peil van de prijs van goud en kosten waarschijnlijk permanent zal zijn dan of het slechts 'n fase is van langer of korter duur dat zal voorbijgaan, waarbij het peil van prijzen uiteindelijk zal terugkeren tot toestanden bij benadering gelijkaardige met die van 1914. Het is deze overweging waardoor de gehele zaak beheerd wordt, zodanige aanpassing bij 'n vorige peil van prijzen of 'n peil wat bij benadering daarmee overeenkomt zou wel of niet binnen enige toekomstige jaren kunnen plaatsvinden. Doch zowel voor de eigenaars van aangrenzende mijnen, voor de East Rand Proprietary Mines, en voor het Gouvernement, is de gehele kwestie een van 'n zwoegen door de eerstkomende jaren totdat het beloop van zaken helderder en berekenbaarder wordt dan heden het geval is.

Van veel meer gewicht tegen het voorstel van geldelike ondersteuning door het Gouvernement zou enig argument zijn dat gebaseerd is op de grondslag dat de eigenaars van de East Rand Proprietary Mines en aangrenzende mijnen in hun eigen belang nog niet iedere mogelijke en redelike alternatief onderzocht hebben om het ophanden met pompen of te weren. Het is duidelijk dat iedere mogelijke oplossing in deze richting moet gezocht worden voordat om 'n geldelike ondersteuning van Regeringswege gevraagd wordt.

Zodanige mogelijke oplossings zou men in de volgende orde kunnen overwegen:—

- (1) Door interne reorganisatie van de East Rand Proprietary Mines, waarbij zijn claimgebied zoals tans gelaten wordt en waarbij daar op aanmerklik kleinere schaal gewerkt wordt.
- (2) Door het toekennen van het recht aan de East Rand Proprietary Mines om op het claimgebied van zijn oostelike en westelike buren, te delven.
- (3) Door geldelike ondersteuning van naburige mijnen.
- (4) Door 'n vereniging van (1), (2) en (3) zoals hierboven aan de hand gegeven.

Enige oplossing langs deze lijnen moet in zich eigenschappen hebben welke klaarblijkelijk voordeelig voor zodanige buren zullen zijn, zowel als voordeilig voor de East Rand Proprietary Mines.

Wij zullen iedereen hiervan om de beurt behandelen:—

(1) De positie door de East Rand Proprietary Mines opgenomen is dat, onder druk van de moeilijkheden waarmede zij gedurende de laatste drie jaren te kampen hadden, zij elk mogelijk voorstel tot verminderen van de schaal van hun werkzaamheden, tot concentreren van hun werk en tot geschikte interne reorganisatie onderzocht hebben; dat geen dezer uitvoerbaar is en dat zij, met hun inrichting, noodwendig op 'n schaal van 100,000 ton maandeliks moeten werken of de mijn sluiten. Zij verklaren dat van hun 2.4 miljoen ton reserven, zij ten volle de helft in de mijn zullen moeten achterlaten wanneer zij sluiten—en dat als het pompen eens gestaakt wordt en de lagere delen van de mijn vollopen, de mijn nooit weer kan heropenen.

Uit de groepsgaven heeft de voorzitter vergelijkende sijfers gehaald welke aantonen dat in menige lijst van kosten de East Rand Proprietary Mines kosten 'n weinig hoger waren dan die van andere mijnen op 'n vergelijkende schaal. De heer Meyer gaf redenen voor iedereen van deze vergelijkingen. De gezamenlijke uitslag van al deze vergelijkingen schijnt aan te duiden dat daar kan bezuinigd worden. Doch de waarheid van de zaak is waarschijnlijk dat de hogere kosten te wijten zijn aan het feit dat het beleid van werken op 'n grote schaal niet overeen te brengen is met de bestaande toestanden van de mijn. Om mijn persoonlike gevoelens te geven zie ik niet in hoe dat enige wezenlike bezuiniging kan verkregen worden tenzij 'n schikking getroffen wordt voor werk op 'n kleinere schaal. Slechts 'n grondige verandering in beleid kan de positie reden en zodanige verandering zal onder (4) overwogen worden.

(2) Wij komen nu tot de oplossing langs de lijnen van het absorberen van naburige eigendommen of delen van hen.

Voordat wij dit bespreken is het nodig om de wezenlike positie van de East Rand Proprietary Mines te overwegen. Bij het doen daarvan moet duidelijk in het oog gehouden worden dat de hierbovenaangehaalde vraag van het permanente peil of het tegenovergestelde van zeer groot belang is voor zo 'n groot eigendom als dat van de East Rand Proprietary Mines.

Zoals reeds gezegd schat de East Rand Proprietary Mines dat als het peil van prijzen midden tussen dat, wat tans heerst, en dat van 1914 zou zijn, zij daar instaat zouden zijn voor nog acht jaren voort te gaan, doch als het peil van 1914 zou heersen, zijn bestaan voor 'n onbeperkte tijd zou voortduren. Ook verklaren zij dat

lower levels are allowed to fill, the mine will never be reopened and their claim holding as a mining property will presumably be worthless to them. In this connection allusion should be made to the company's scheme for deep development, known as the Southern Area Scheme. This scheme, the execution of which was commenced in 1916 and abandoned in 1918, and as its object the mining of an area, estimated at between 600 and 700 claims, which lies below the water zone and above 7000 feet level. It involved the sinking of a circular deep level shaft in two stages, with connection at the bottom of the first stage by a cross-cut from the twenty-sixth level of the present mine. In fact the scheme meant the opening of a new mine below the water zone, the centre of gravity of which would be at the west or Angelo-Driefontein end of the property. This work was stopped in 1918, after the new circular shaft had been sunk over 1000 feet. This proposition is not enticing with to-day's level of prices and with the somewhat pessimistic mood engendered by the rather poor results of development in the old mine and other circumstances. But the same proposition in the year 1925-26 may wear a very different aspect if by that time the general level of prices were approximately those of 1914. That it was in fact considered a proposition worth carrying out at a great outlay is proved by its having been commenced in 1916, a year in which the adverse conditions resulting from the war were already causing uneasiness. It must also be supposed that it is looked upon by the East Rand Proprietary Mines as a scheme which, under favourable conditions, will be worth resuming. On any other supposition one does not see why it should be continuing to pay claim licences on a large number of what must be *ex hypothesi* worthless claims.

In considering any proposition for encroachment on neighbouring owners the value of any such accommodation to the East Rand Proprietary Mines must not, therefore, be considered in the light merely of the immediate lessening of the difficulties of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, or of its effect in prolonging its life for a year or two. It must be considered in the light of enabling them to struggle through a few years to a time when conditions may quite possibly obtain when their mine, instead of being a moribund concern, may have a long life before it with great financial advantage to the company—a possible future which would be forfeited if the mine were now shut down.

With this in mind we proceed to discuss the concrete suggestions made for encroachment:—

(a) The suggestion is that the East Rand Proprietary Mines should be allowed to encroach on the Wit Deep and Cinderella Consolidated. So far as the Wit Deep is concerned the only advantage that would accrue to it would be the royalty payment when such encroachment took place. The Farrar subsidiary shaft, presuming sinking to be renewed, would probably not be able to deal with more than 15,000 to 20,000 tons a month; and if one assumed one-quarter of this to come out of Wit Deep ground this royalty would be a very inconsiderable amount. Were this arrangement of a character which would give any real security against the East Rand Proprietary Mines closing down it would possibly be worth considering, although the Wit Deep, being confined laterally as it is, cannot afford any considerable shortening up of its possible lateral development.

As, however, the East Rand Proprietary Mines is actually situated, and in view of its reiterated statement that it must deal with a large tonnage or stop, it does not appear that relief in this part of the mine, where they are able to get at such a small tonnage, can really avert the closing down, or even delay it to any material extent at all.

Relief in this direction could only really materially assist if the East Rand Proprietary Mines were to absorb the Wit Deep with its five-compartment shaft going down in this region. As the full capacity of this shaft is, or will in the near future be required, to feed the Wit Deep mill, the transaction would, from the public standpoint, mean practically wiping out the Wit Deep mill to keep the East Rand Proprietary mills going. From the Wit Deep point of view the difference of having to shut down a short time after the East Rand Proprietary Mines stop pumping and having its mine, with its limited life, used to keep the East Rand Proprietary Mines pumps at work, seems financially negligible.

With all the contingencies in view it is not considered likely that the Wit Deep would entertain any offer for their property other than on a secure cash basis.

At this point it will be well to consider the alternatives before the Wit Deep should the proposal for absorption be pressed.

The mine, after some vicissitudes and a good deal of work, is making regular profits. It is threatened with flooding if the East Rand Proprietary Mines closes down. The alternatives before it are (1) closing down itself, or (2) struggling with the water difficulty.

The whole matter hinges on whether the Wit Deep can or cannot make a fight for existence even if the East Rand Proprietary Mines ceases pumping.

If the East Rand Proprietary Mines were to shut down, the Wit Deep would be able to urge the strongest claims to be allowed to operate the Angelo shafts for baling water, or to operate the East Rand Proprietary Mines pumping plant down to the main pumping station on the twenty-first level until it could make its own arrangements for fighting the water.

Under any supposition it would be a severe struggle. In spite of all its efforts, and taxing its resources to the utmost, the Wit Deep might very likely not be able to keep up the struggle for more than two or three years unless conditions improved. But the essence of the whole problem is the contingent possibility of a general price level prevailing in a comparatively few years which would make conditions more nearly approximate to 1914 with all that such a state of affairs would involve. If the Wit Deep were successful in struggling through to such better days it would

als men de mijn eens zou laten vollopen of zelfs indien men de lagere vloeren zou laten opvullen, de mijn nooit weer zou bewerkt worden en hun recht op hun claim als mijneigendom vermoedelik voor hen geen waarde zou hebben. In dit verband moet gewezen worden op het schema van de maatschappij voor ontwikkeling in de diepte van wat bekend is als de Southern Areas Scheme. Dit schema, met het ontwikkelen waarvan in 1916 'n begin gemaakt is en in 1918 opgegeven is, had tot doel de ontwikkeling van 'n streek, geschat op 600 tot 700 claims, gelegen tussen de waterzone en boven de 7000 voet vloer. Het vereiste het zinken van 'n cirkelvormige deep level shaft in twee stadiums, met verbinding aan de bodem van het eerste stadium door 'n dwarsgang van de 26ste vloer van de tegenwoordige mijn. Het schema beoogde feitelijk het openen van een nieuwe mijn beneden de waterzone, waarvan het zwaartepunt aan de westkant of Angelo-Driefontein zijde van het eigendom zou zijn. Dit werk hield op in 1918 nadat de New Circular Shaft meer dan 1000 voet diep gegraven was. Dit voorstel is niet aanloklik onder het huidige peil van prijzen samen met het ietwat pessimisties gevoel dat verwekt werd door de vrij armoeidige resultaten van ontwikkeling in de oude mijn zowel als door andere omstandigheden. Doch hetzelfde voorstel in het jaar 1925-26 zou wel 'n heel ander uitzicht aannemen, indien tegen die tijd het algemene peil van prijzen bij benadering met dat van 1914 gelijkstond. Dat het inderdaad 'n uitvoerenswaardige propositie beschouwd word tegen 'n grote uitgave, wordt bewezen doordat men reeds in 1916 daarmee begonnen was, 'n jaar waarin reeds de nadelige toestanden door de oorlog verwekt ongerustheid begon verweken. Ook moet verondersteld worden dat het door de East Rand Proprietary Mines als 'n schema beschouwd werd dat, onder gunstige omstandigheden, weer zou aangepakt kunnen worden. Men zou onder geen ander veronderstelling kunnen begrijpen waarom het zou voortgaan met het betalen van claimlicenties op 'n groot aantal van wat *ex hypothese* waardeloze claims moeten zijn.

Bij 'n overweging van enig voorstel tot overschrijden van de grond van naburige eigenaars moet de waarde van enige zodanige akkomodatie aan de East Rand Proprietary Mines derhalve niet beschouwd worden in het licht bloot van 'n dadelike vermindering van moeilijkede van de East Rand Proprietary Mines of van het gevolg van het verlengen van zijn leven voor een of twee jaar. Het moet overwogen worden in het licht daarvan dat het hen in staat stelt enige jaren te doorworstellen tot zulk 'n tijd wanneer daar heel waarschijnlik zulke toestanden zullen heersen wanneer hun mijn, instede van 'n stervende onderneming te zijn, 'n levensleven voor zich mag hebben met uitgebreide financiële voordelen voor de maatschappij—'n mogelijke toekomst, die zou verbeurd worden indien de mijn tans gesloten wordt.

Met deze dingen voor ogen gaan wij nu voort met het bespreken van konkrete voorstellen gedaan voor overschrijden:—

(a) Het voorstel is dat de East Rand Proprietary Mines zal toegelaten worden de Wit Deep en Cinderella Consolidated te overschrijden. In zoverre het de Wit Deep raakt zou het enige voordeel dat het zou behalen zijn het betalen van 'n premie, betalung wanneer het overschrijden plaats vindt. De Farrar Subsidiary Shaft zou als met het zinken voortgegaan werd, waarschijnlik niet in staat zijn meer dan 15,000 tot 20,000 ton per maand te hanteren en als men veronderstelt dat een kwart hiervan uit Wit Deep grond komt, zou deze premier 'n aanmerklik klein bedrag zijn. Indien deze schikking van 'n aard ware die enige wezenlike waarborg zou geven tegen het sluiten van de Rand Proprietary Mines, zou dit wel overweging waard zijn, ofschoon de Wit Deep, zoals het geval wil aan de zijde beperkt is, geen aanmerklike inkorting van zijn mogelijke zijde-ontwikkeling kunnen verdragen.

De positie echter waarin de East Rand Proprietary Mines wezenlijk verkeert en met het oog op de herhaalde verklaring dat het 'n grote tonnemaat moet behandelen, of sluiten, wil het voorkomen of er in dit deel van de mijn geen hulp kan verkregen worden waar zo 'n geringe tonnemaat niet wezenlik het sluiten kan voorkomen of zelfs in enige materiële mate het enigzins kan vertragen.

Verlichting in hierdie richting zou slechts wezenlik kunnen helpen inlinie de East Rand Proprietary Mines de Wit Deep met zijn vijf-kamer schacht—wat in deze streek naar beneden leidt—zou absorberen. Omdat de volle kapasiteit van deze schacht in de nabije toekomst nodig is of zal nodig worden, om de Wit Deep molen te voeden, zou de transkatie, uit 'n publieke standpunkt feitelijk het wegdoen van de Wit Deep molen betekenen om de East Rand Proprietary Mines aan de gang te houden. Uit het Wit Deep oogpunt schijnt het verschil, van te moeten sluiten kort nadat de East Rand Proprietary Mines het pompen staakt en van de mijn met zijn korte leven te moeten gebruiken om de pompen van de East Rand Proprietary Mines aan de gang te houden, geldelik buiten rekening gelaten te kunnen worden.

Met al de gebeurlijkheden in zicht, beschouwt men het niet waarschijnlik dat de Wit Deep 'n aanbod voor hun eigendom zou overwegen behalve op 'n zekere kontante basis.

Hier behoort goed overwogen te worden de alternatieven voor de Wit Deep indien op voorstel van absorberen wordt aangedrongen.

Na enige wisselvalligheden en heelwat werk maakt de mijn geregeld winsten. Hij wordt met ondergang bedreigd wegens vollopen als de East Rand Proprietary sluit. De alternatieven voor zich zijn (1) zelf sluiten, of (2) 'n worstelen met de moeilijkheid van water.

De hele zaak hangt ervan af of de Wit Deep 'n gevecht om zijn bestaan kan doorzetten, ja dan neen, indien de East Rand Proprietary Mines het pompen staakt.

Indien de East Rand Proprietary Mines zou sluiten, zou de Wit Deep het sterkste pleidooi kunnen maken om toegelaten te worden de Angelo schachten voor het uitpompen van water te bezigen, of de East Rand Proprietary Mines pompinrichting te gebruiken tot bij de hoofd pompstation om de 21ste vloer, totdat hij zijn eigen schikking kan treffen voor het weerstaan van het water.

Hoe men het stellen wil, de strijd zal moeilijk zijn. Ten spijte van alle pogingen en aanspraken op zijn hulpbronnen, zou de Wit Deep waarschijnlik niet in staat zijn de strijd eerder dan tweé of drie jaren voor te houden tenzij toestanden verbeteren. Maar de grondzaak van het hele probleem ligt in de toevallige mogelijkheid dat 'n algemeen peil van prijzen binnen betreklik weinige jaren zal heersen, wat toestanden bijna met die van 1914 zullen doen overeenkomen, met alles wat zulk 'n toestand van zaken met zich zou brengen. Indien het de Wit Deep zou gelukken de strijd door te maken tot zulke tijden aanbreken, zou het

- (1) have a very strong claim to extend its workings into what are now East Rand Proprietary Mines' claims, as these would be worthless to any one else; and
 (2) it would possess the only means of access open to the areas south of the water zone.

Under such circumstances it would appear from the Wit Deep standpoint preferable to face the chances of such a struggle rather than agree to an absorption which would mean that its property would be used up to enable the East Rand Proprietary Mines to struggle through to such possible brighter days.

The question of encroaching on the Cinderella or an absorption of the Cinderella is somewhat different in aspect. That mine has been closed for several years, and its being reopened evidently depends on the contingency of the adjustment of the level of prices which, as has been repeatedly pointed above, governs the whole position.

Furthermore, in that portion of the mine, hoisting facilities are ample. Here the amount of payable ore found by development is the limit of the more or less immediate relief that would be afforded in the urgent problem of getting enough out of the mine to keep it from closing down. It is not limited, as in the western end of the mine, by shaft capacity in the bottom of the mine. But from the Cinderella standpoint there would probably be a similar objection to that indicated above to having its ground used by the East Rand Proprietary Mines merely to tide the latter over the next few years to possible better conditions and more prosperous times unless it were assumed of sharing in these.

(3) We now come to (3)—the keeping of the mines going by the neighbouring mines subsidizing the East Rand Proprietary Mines' pumping expenses. This I will not discuss at length beyond remarking that the Witwatersrand, being little interested and with some reason relying on the Wit Deep not giving up without a struggle, during which it would come to the end of their life, have not shown any disposition as yet to entertain the suggestion. The Knights Central and Knights Deep, being out of action, need not be considered, and it practically resolves itself into a proposal for the Wit Deep and the Rose Deep to contribute to enable the East Rand Proprietary Mines to tide over possibly the next few years with all contingent advantage in the future accruing to the East Rand Proprietary Mines, and no such contingent future to the two mines named which have at best strictly limited lives.

(4) I now come to a proposed solution which I submit has in it the elements of mutual advantage to those who appear from the above analysis to be the parties most immediately concerned, viz., East Rand Proprietary Mines and its two next neighbours.

Let us recapitulate the principal factors in the situation.

(1) The East Rand Proprietary Mines say that it is a *sine qua non* that it must work on 100,000 tons a month scale, otherwise it cannot keep going.

(2) The Wit Deep is actually working on 35,000 tons from approximately the same depth.

(3) The East Rand Proprietary Mines are asking the Wit Deep and Cinderella to give them ground, a more reasonable claim in so far as the Cinderella is concerned than in the case of the Wit Deep, as the former is shut down and not likely to work under present conditions.

(4) The western part of the East Rand Proprietary Mines is inaccessible in depth to that Company so far as any considerable tonnage is concerned.

(5) The eastern and central part is well equipped for tonnage in depth, and the most favourable prospects for grade are in the east.

(6) The claim area north of the water zone extends in depth in the eastern part of the mine, and this water zone at that depth forms a boundary under present conditions to the workings of the East Rand Proprietary Mines and probably of the Cinderella Mines.

(7) If the East Rand Proprietary Mines shut down, as they anticipate they will be obliged to in nine or ten months' time, its equipment and plant will be worth to it only break-up value, and its claims will be worthless as mining property.

(8) The tiding over of the next few years may possibly bring us into a set of conditions approaching those of 1914, in which case the estimated life of the East Rand Proprietary Mines would be indefinitely and profitably prolonged.

(9) To meet the exigencies of this period it is essential to devise some plan whereby the East Rand Proprietary Mines can reduce its scale. You cannot hope to carry on the "Lusitania" on the lines of a 4000-ton tramp steamer, and if any suggestion is to be of any use it must involve a radical change of policy.

The suggestion put forward is—

- (1) that the East Rand Proprietary Mines should hand over to the Wit Deep by lease or other arrangement the right to mine between the boundary of the latter and a line drawn parallel to that boundary through the neighbourhood of the Angelo Deep west shaft, handing over at the same time the Farrar and Farrar subsidiary shafts with equipment;
- (2) that the Wit Deep should increase its crushing capacity to 50,000 tons a month;
- (3) that the East Rand Proprietary Mines, confining itself to the Cason-Comet-Hercules section and any ground it can avail itself of by arrangement with the Cinderella, should concentrate thereon, using one only of its big mills and putting out of commission all but two or three shafts. As a mining proposition this would then be comparable to that of the Wit Deep;
- (4) that each mine should take all the water required for industrial purposes from the East Rand Proprietary Mines main pumping station at 1s. 3d. per thousand gallons; and that after crediting pumping account with this sum and any other amounts which might be realized by the sale of water, the balance should be divided between them on a basis pro rata to the tonnage milled with the proviso that

- (1) een zeer sterke eis kunnen stellen voor het uitbreiden van zijn deliverij tot in wat tans East Rand Proprietary Mines claims zijn, omdat deze dan voor allen waardeloos zouden zijn; en
- (2) het zou het enige middel van toegang bezitten wat openstaat tot de streken zuid van de waterzone.

Ander zodanige omstandigheden zou het uit het standpunt van de Wit Deep verkeerslijker zijn de kansen van zo'n strijd te aanvaarden liever dan toe te stemmen tot het absorberen, hetgeen zou betekenen dat zijn eigendom verbruikt wordt om de East Rand Proprietary Mines in staat te stellen door te worstelen totdat betere dagen aanbreken.

De kwestie van het overschrijden van de Cinderella of van het absorberen van de Cinderella is heelwat anders. Die mijn is reeds enige pareni gesloten en zijn heropening hangt klaarblijkelijk af van de gebeurlikheid van 'n herstel van prijzen op het peil van wat, zoals reeds meermalen aangehaald, de gehele positie beheert.

Bovendien zijn de hiefsfaciliteiten in dat deel van de mijn voldoende. Hier is de hoeveelheid betalende erts door ontwikkeling gevonden, de grens van 'n min of meer dadelike verlichting die zou verschaffen worden bij het dringend probleem van genoeg uit de mijn te halen om het sluiten te verhinderen. Het is niet beperkt door schachtkapasiteit op de bodem van de mijn zoals bij het westelijke eind van de mijn. Doch uit het standpunt van de Cinderella zou daar waarschijnlijk hetzelfde voorzwaar zijn als hierboven genoemd, om de grond door de East Rand Proprietary Mines te laten gebruiken bloot om de laatstgenoemde over de volgende jaren heen te helpen tot mogelijk betere toestanden en voorspoediger tijden, tenzij het verzekerd werd van 'n aandeel daarin.

(3) Nu komen wij tot (3): Het instandhouden van de mijn door 'n bijdrage van de aangrenzende mijnen tot de pompkosten van de East Rand Proprietary Mines. Ik zal niet lang hierover uitwijken, en wil slechts opmerken dat de Witwatersrand weinig belang daarin stelt en tot nog toe geen neiging getoond heeft om het voorstel te onderzoeken en redelikwijze daarop rekent dat de Wit Deep niet zal sluiten zonder daarvoor te strijden, gedurende de tijd dat het aan het eind van zijn bestaan zal komen. De Knights Central en Knights Deep die op 't ogenblik niet werken, behoeven niet in konsideratie genomen te worden, en feitelijk komt dit neer op 'n voorstel voor de Wit Deep en Rose Deep om te kontribueren om de East Rand Proprietary Mines in staat te stellen de volgende paar jaren doortekomen met al de toevallige voordelen die aan de East Rand Proprietary Mines verbonden zijn en geen zodanige toevallige voordelen aan die twee mijnen, die nog slechts 'n beperkt bestaan hebben.

(4) Ik kom nu tot 'n voorgestelde oplossing, hetwelk de elementen bevat van wederzijds voordeel aan diegenen die volgens bovengenoemde analyse de partijen schijnen te zijn die onmiddellijk daarmee gemoeid zijn nl. East Rand Proprietary Mines en zijn twee naburen.

Laten wij die voornaamste faktoren weer opnemen:

(1) De East Rand Proprietary Mines zeggen dat het 'n *sine qua non* is dat zij op 'n 100,000 ton schaal per maand moeten werken, anders is het onbetaalbaar.

(2) De Wit Deep werkt werkelijk op 35,000 ton van ongeveer diezelfde diepte.

(3) De East Rand Proprietary Mines hebben de Wit Deep en Cinderella verzocht om hen grond te geven, hetgeen 'n redelik eis is voor zoover dit de Cinderella betreft, als in het gaval van de Wit Deep, daar eerstgenoemde gesloten is, en onder de tegenwoordige omstandigheden niet weer geopend zal worden.

(4) Het westelijk deel van de East Rand Proprietary Mines is op die diepte voor de maatschappij ontoegankelijk wat betreft enige aanmerkelijke tonnemaat.

(5) Het oostelijk en centrale gedeelte is op die diepte goed van tonnemaat voorzien, en die gunstigste vooruitzichten om te graderen zijn in het oostelijk gedeelte gelegen.

(6) De claimstreek ten noorden van de waterzone strekt zich ondergrond uit tot het oostelijk gedeelte van de mijn en op die diepte vormt die waterzone onder de tegenwoordige toestanden 'n grens voor het werk van de East Rand Proprietary Mines en waarschijnlijk voor de Cinderella Mines.

(7) Als de East Rand Proprietary Mines zullen sluiten, zoals verwacht wordt dat dit in 9 of 10 maanden zal gebeuren, zal zijn uitrusting en machinerie slechts afbreukwaarde bezitten en zijn claims waardeloos als mijneigdom zijn.

(8) Nadat die volgende paar jaren te boven zijn gekomen kunnen wij misschien in toestanden zoals die van 1914 geraken, in welk geval de geschatte leeftijd van de East Rand Proprietary Mines onbepaald en voordelig verlengd zouden zijn.

(9) Om aan de behoeften van dit tijdperk tegemoet te komen is het hoogst nodig om 'n plan te beramen waarbij de East Rand Proprietary Mines zijn schaal kan reduseren. Gij kunt niet verwachten om de Lusitania te laten loopen op dezelfde middelen als één kustvasser van 4000 ton, en indien enig voorstel aan het doel zal moeten beantwoorden, dan moet daarin radikale veranderingen aangeleid worden.

Wórdt voorgesteld dat:

(1) Dat de East Rand Proprietary Mines, als huur of wegens andere overeenkomst, het recht van ontginnings tussen de grens van laatstgenoemde mijn en 'n lijn evenwijdig aan de grens, nabij de Angelo W. Schacht, zal overhandigen, en eveneens de Farrar en Farrar Subsidiaire Schachten met uitrusting.

(2) Dat de Wit Deep zijn breekkapasiteit tot 50,000 ton per maand zal vernieerderen.

(3) Dat de East Rand Proprietary Mines zich zullen beperken tot de Cason Comet Hercules Seksie en tot enige grond hetwelk verkrijgbaar is door een overeenkomst met de Cinderella, waarbij slechts een van zijn grote molens gebruikt zal worden en alle schachten op uitzondering van twee of drie, buiten werking stellen. Als een mijnpropositie kan dit vergeleken worden aan die van de Wit Deep.

(4) Dat elke mijn al het benodigde water voor industriële doeleinden van het hoofdpompstation van de East Rand Proprietary Mines zal nemen, tegen 1s. 3d. per duizend gallons; en dat nadat de pomprekening met deze som of enige andere bedragen hetwelk door het verkopen van water gerealiseerd mochten zijn, gekrediteerd is, het overschot onder hen verdeeld behoort te worden op 'n basis pro rata aan de tonnemaat uit de molens, op die voorwaarde dat indien de tonnemaat van de East Rand Proprietary Mines

the East Rand Proprietary Mines' tonnage, if less than 50,000 monthly, should still be reckoned at 50,000. This, or any other basis ultimately arrived at, would, of course, depend upon other terms of the agreement upon which the right to mine in the area referred to in paragraph (1) is based.

From the Wit Deep standpoint this would involve capital expenditure in extending the mill.

The advantage to the Wit Deep would be:—

(1) It would extend the life of its mine to a material extent and with the possibility of a greater part of that prolonged life being projected into a period where more favourable cost conditions may rule;

(2) at a cost which would depend upon the amount of profit it could get out of the Farrar shaft section it would get rid of great danger of being flooded out.

The disadvantage to the Wit Deep would be that it would still be dependent on the East Rand Proprietary Mines going on pumping and, unless sufficient pillars were left in the lower levels, would be irretrievably flooded with any flooding of the East Rand Proprietary Mines.

Such a contingency would have to be provided in any agreement come to.

From the East Rand Proprietary Mines' standpoint the proposal seems to present certain advantages:—

(1) One principal advantage (apart from the incidental relief in the sharing of some pumping costs) would be the complete break it would make with past big scale tradition and policy without which complete break it is not likely that any real concentration of work can take place.

(2) If by arrangement with the Cinderella Consolidated, or amalgamation, a "50,000 to 70,000 ton proposition could be organized centering about the Hercules-Cinderella shafts, all that portion north of the water zone could be worked, and it is apparently in this eastern region that the best prospects exist.

(3) The access to the areas of the East Rand Proprietary Mines' property south of the water zone through reef workings would be preserved in the Driefontein end of the mines. An essential and important element if conditions in the future lead to the revival of a scheme for the development of those areas.

(4) By such a radical reorganization a great deal of scattered reserves could be worked out in the upper part of the mine, which would otherwise, on the shutting down of the mine, be lost to the mine as well as to the country.

It will, perhaps, be urged against such a suggestion, that it is impossible so to reorganize the East Rand Proprietary Mines' layout as to meet the needs of such a scheme.

I would only point out that any such reorganization may mean some capital expenditure if the East Rand Proprietary Mines' establishment cannot be economically run to deal with what will then be practically only one end of the property. Viewed as a mining proposition, the Cason-Cinderella-Hercules Mine would not be very different from the Wit Deep with a subsidiary supply from the Farrar shaft, and it should be possible to arrange to work it with similar results.

It seems to me clearly impossible that the East Rand Proprietary Mines can continue as it is. It is the familiar case of a mine which cannot supply its big mill equipment. In similar cases it is sometimes possible to run on a portion of the mill. In this case it seems that only a very radical change of policy can be effective, and that is ensured in this proposal by looping off the Driefontein end, which, being badly equipped for tonnage and development, cannot pull its weight in the boat, but which can be used as a subsidiary supply by the Wit Deep.

It seems possible that some such solution of the problem could be arrived at to the advantage of both the Wit Deep and East Rand Proprietary Mines, and possibly of the Cinderella. The suggestion is based upon the supposition that the East Rand Proprietary Mines must close in the next twelve months if it goes on as at present; and that though such an event would not necessarily involve the closing of the Wit Deep without making a fight for it, it would certainly cripple the mine, and might kill it in a few years.'

I have merely set out the lines on which a solution seems possible, and I submit that its feasibility should be carefully examined.

MEMORANDUM "B."

29th April, 1921.

I desire to add the following remarks to memorandum circulated on 12th April.

1. More accurate information discloses that the 600,000 tons of reserve ore averaging 6 dwt. alluded to in the memorandum is not, as I had understood, in the area comprised between the western boundary of the E.R.P.M. and a line through the Angelo Deep west shaft, but in a smaller area adjoining the western boundary, viz., the Driefontein and Ginsberg section. This fact, in so far as it affects the arguments put forward in the memorandum, strengthens them.

2. The reasons advanced by the representatives of the E.R.P.M. against the practicability of the scheme put forward have not been, in my opinion, at all convincing. I will discuss them seriatim.

A. It is stated that although the average value of the developed ore in the Driefontein-Ginsberg section is some three-tenths of a pennyweight lower than that of the Cason end of the property, yet the value of the rock which is mined from the latter is lower than that coming from the former. It is quite unreasonable to suppose that the valuation of ore in the west is reliable, and that, for some occult reason, that of the ore on the east is unreliable. The reasonable interpretation of the facts as stated is that under pressure of having to supply a tonnage which the mine as constituted cannot properly supply; they are not mining in the east up to the value of their reserves, and that in the west they are mining above the value of their reserves.

minder is als 50,000 per maand, dit toch als 50,000 berekend behoort te worden: Deze enige andere basis van overeenkomst zal natuurlik afhankelik zijn van de overeenkomst waarop het recht van ontginding, zoals verwezen in paraaf (1) gebaseerd is. Van het standpunt van de Wit Deep zal dit kapitaal vereisen om de molen uittebreiden.

Het voordeel voor de Wit Deep zou zijn:

- (1) Het leven van zijn mijn zal aanmerkelijk verlengd worden, en met 'n mogelijkheid dat het grootste gedeelte van dat verlengde leven in 'n tijdperk zal vallen, waarbij gunstiger condities mogen bestaan wat betreft onkosten.
- (2) Tegen 'n prijs hetwelk zal afhangen van de winst hetwelk uit de Farrar Schacht gemaakt zal worden, zal het aan 'n groot gevaar ontsnappen, nl. het vollopen van de mijn.

Het nadeel voor de Wit Deep zal zijn dat het steeds afhankelik zal zijn, dat de East Rand Proprietary Mines met pompen zullen aanhouden, en tenzij dat voldoende pilaren waren achtergelaten, zouden de diepere werkgangen reddeloos onderlopen, als er veel water in de East Rand Proprietary Mines staat. Voor dergelijke gebeurlijkheden moet in enige overeenkomst voorziening gemaakt worden. Van het standpunt van de East Rand Proprietary Mines beschouwd schijnt het voorstel in strijd te zijn met zekere voordeelen.

(1) Een hoofdvoordeel (afgescheiden van de toevallige verlichting in het betalen van kleine pompkosten) zal het complete afbreken zijn van de vroegere grote schaal tradities en politiek, waarbij zonder 'n complete break het niet mogelijk zou zijn om enige werkelijke konsentratie van werk te laten plaats vinden.

(2) Indien door 'n overeenkomst met de Cinderella Consolidated —of door amalgamatie—'n 50,000 tot 70,000 ton propositie gekonsentreerd kon worden, hetwelk als 'n middelpunt de Hercules Cinderella schachten heeft, zou dat gedeelte ten noorden van de waterzone bewerkt kunnen worden, en het schijnt als of de beste vooruitzichten in dit noordelijk gedeelte gelegen zijn.

(3) De toegang tot de rifwerken van de East Rand Proprietary Mines, ten zuiden van de waterzone zou vallen in het Driefontein gedeelte van de mijnen. Dit is 'n wesenlik en belangrijk element, indien in de toekomst deze toestanden aanleiding zouden kunnen geven tot het vernieuwen van 'n schema om deze streken te ontwikkelen.

(4) Door 'n dergelijke radikale reorganisatie zal 'n groot gedeelte van de verspreidde voorraden in het bovenste gedeelte van de mijn bewerkt kunnen worden, hetwelk anders door het sluiten der mijn voor de mijn en eveneens voor het land verloren zal gaan.

Er zal misschien tegen zo een voorstel beweerd worden dat het onmogelijk is om de East Rand Proprietary Mines zoo te reorganiseren, om aan de behoeften van 'n dergelijk schema te beantwoorden.

Ik wil slechts aantonen dat zulk 'n organisatie, 'n grote uitgave zal zijn, de East Rand Proprietary Mines—wat dan slechts een gedeelte van de mijn zou zijn—zullen niet op 'n economiese wijze gedreven kunnen worden. Daar zal geen groot verschil tussen de Cason-Cinderella-Hercules Mijn en de Wit Deep zijn met de hulpvoorraad uit de Farrar Schacht—uit 't oogpunt van 'n mijnpropositie beschouwd—en wij zullen in staat zijn, om deze mijn met dezelfde resultaten te ontginnen.

Voor mij schijnt het onmogelijk dat de East Rand Proprietary Mines, zoals het nu is, kan voortduren. Het is het bekende geval van 'n mijn hetwelk zijn grote molens niet kan voorzien. In dit geval schijnt het alsof slechts 'n radikale verandering effectief kan zijn, hetwelk door dit voorstel verzekerd wordt, en door het Driefontein gedeelte uit te schakelen wat betreft de tonnemaaat en ontwikkeling slecht toegerust is en zijn gewicht in het schip niet kan vervoeren, maar wat als 'n hulpvoorraad door de Wit Deep kan gebruikt worden.

Het schijnt onmogelijk dat zo 'n oplossing van het probleem tot stand kan komen, wat voordelig zal zijn en voor de Wit Deep en voor de East Rand Proprietary Mine en mogelijk ook voor de Cinderella. Het voorstel is gebaseerd op de veronderstelling dat de East Rand Proprietary Mine in de volgende 12 maanden moet sluiten, indien de toestand blijft zoals het op het ogenblik is, en ofschoon daardoor dit het sluiten van de Wit Deep niet ten gevolge zal hebben, zonder dat de uiterste pogingen aangewend worden, zal dit ongetwijfeld de mijn verlammen en die binnen 'n paar jaren doden.

Ik heb slechts de punten vermeld waarop het mogelijk schijnt om tot 'n oplossing te geraken, en ben van mening dat de mogelijkheid daarvan zorgvuldig onderzocht zal worden.

MEMORANDUM B.

29 April 1921.

Ik wens de volgende opmerkingen te maken betreffende het memorandum hetwelk op de 12de April rondgezonden was.

1. Meer akkurate informatie toont aan dat de 600,000 ton reserve-erts met 'n gemiddelde 6 dwt., zoals bedoeld in het memorandum, is niet, zoals door mij verstaan was, gelegen in de streek tussen de westelijke grens van de East Rand Proprietary Mines en 'n lijn door de Angelo West Schacht, maar in 'n kleiner streek hetwelk nabij de westelijke grens gelegen is, nl. De Driefontein en Ginsberg Seksie. Dit feit, voor zo ver dit die argumenten betreft die in het memorandum voorkomen, versterkt hen.

2. De redenen door de vertegenwoordigers van de East Rand Proprietary Mines aangehaald tegen de uitvoerbaarheid van het schema zijn in mijn opinie, niet overtuigend. Ik zal ze in biezon-derherden bespreken.

A. Het wordt verklaard dat ofschoon de gemiddelde waarde van de ontgonnen erts in de Driefontein-Ginsberg Seksie is ongeveer drie-tiende van 'n pennyweight lager als die van het gedeelte van Cason Mijn, de waarde van de rots wat uit laatstgenoemde ontgonnen is lager is als die hetwelk uit eerstgenoemde afkomstig is. Het is geheel en al onredelijk om te veronderstellen dat men staat kan maken op de waardering van erts in het westen, en dat wegens 'n geheime rede geen staat gemaakt kan worden op de waardering van erts in het oosten. 'n Redelijke uitlegging van de feiten zoals vermeld, is dat doordat de mijn verplicht was om 'n tonnemaaat te leveren, hetwelk hij niet in staat was om dit te doen, in het oosten niet ontgonnen wordt naar evenredigheid van de waarde van hun voorraden, en dat in het westen meer wordt ontgonnen als de waarde van hun voorraden.

B. It is also pressed as a reason against the scheme that the figures of cost of production per ounce of gold show that it is from the Ginsberg-Driefontein districts that the profit is made which enables them to pay for the pumping. The figures of the cost of production per ounce of gold are merely a function of the cost of production per ton and the gold value per ton. If, as indicated by the argument dealt with in the preceding paragraph, the E.R.P.M. is, irrespective of the relative value of its reserves, mining higher grade rock in the west than in the east, it follows as a matter of arithmetic that the cost per ounce of gold will be less in the west than in the east.

C. So far as I could understand them, the further arguments advanced were that no reliance can be placed on the stated value of the reserves in the Cinderella Consolidated; that the old stopes in the Cinderella were caved so that they would be inaccessible; that it would take a year before the scheme suggested could be operated. As to the first of these, I can see no reason for dismissing in this summary way estimates by responsible men made in the year the mine closed down. As to the second, it is the blocks of reserve ore which are most germane to the feasibility of the scheme and the approach to these are in the main, presumably, not greatly affected by the caved areas. In any case it is a matter of fact to be determined by inspection. As to the third point, in my view the placing at twelve months the time which must elapse before the scheme becomes operative is a pessimistic view, and is quite inconsistent with the claim urged so strongly from the same quarter that immediate relief would be afforded if they could be allowed to carry their development drives into the Cinderella ground. In any case, if the lines of an arrangement as indicated were agreed upon by the principals concerned, it seems obvious that any arrangements which would facilitate operations during the intervening few months would also be agreed upon.

In conclusion I would record my view that the emergency is a serious one, and the danger of the E.R.P.M. as at present constituted being unable to carry on is imminent. Under such circumstances the question is not one to be dealt with, as in happier circumstances it might be, on lines on which no step was taken except with a certainty of considerable financial profit. The question is whether a way out of immediate overwhelming difficulties for an appreciable time can be found on these lines and must be envisaged as such, and it can only be so envisaged with the concurrence of the principals concerned.

I also desire to qualify the opinion expressed on page ten of the report that the Wit Deep would probably be forced to suspend operations. I agree that in the circumstances stated there would be a great risk of this eventuality.

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE THE MINISTER OF MINES AND INDUSTRIES.

Sir,

In accordance with your instructions to inquire into and report upon the possibility of the closing of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, we have the honour herewith to submit our report.

The terms of reference into which you have instructed us to inquire are as follows:—

- (a) The possibility of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, Limited, being closed down, and any practical measures which may be adopted to prevent or delay such closing down, whether by agreement with the owners of neighbouring properties or otherwise;
- (b) The immediate or ultimate effect of the closing down of the East Rand Proprietary Mines upon the working of neighbouring mines.
- (c) The possibility of arranging contributions towards the cost of carrying out the necessary pumping operations in the East Rand Proprietary Mines by the owners of neighbouring mines and in what manner such contributions should be assessed.

The property known as the East Rand Proprietary Mines is situated in the vicinity of the town of Boksburg, and comprises 3936 mining claims and a mynpacht equal in area to 612 claims, of which number diggers' licences are paid on 1340 claims and prospecting licences on 2611 claims, thus showing that portions of approximately 29 per cent. of the area have been mined, leaving 71 per cent. as yet unexploited. Almost the whole of this unexploited area lies at a depth of between 4000 and 9000 feet.

The extent of the workings of this mine is approximately 20,000 feet on the strike of the reef and 7200 feet on the incline. It is bounded on the east by the Cinderella Consolidated Mines, and on the west by the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited.

Operations for the extraction of ore are at present being conducted at various points throughout the whole of this large area.

The ore from these workings is drawn through seven main shafts and four subsidiary shafts. This property thus requires the maintenance of eleven separate shafts.

The ore is treated in two separate reduction plants, with a total capacity of 140,000 tons per mensem, the ore being conveyed to these reduction plants by means of steam locomotives, by mechanical haulages, and belt conveyors.

B. Evenens wordt als 'n reden tegen het schema aangebracht dat de cijfers van de kosten van produktie per ons goud aantoont dat de winst afkomstig is van de Ginsberg Driefontein distrikte waardoor zij in staat gesteld worden de pompkosten te betalen. De cijfers van de kosten van produktie per ons goud is slechts alleenlik 'n functie van de produktie per ton en de goudwaarde per ton. Indien, zoals door de besprekking in de voorafgaande paragraaf aangegeven word, de East Rand Proprietary Mines, afgezien van de betrekkelijke waarde van zijn voorraden, hogere gegradeerde rots in het westen zou bewerken als in het oosten, volgt dit van zelf dat de kosten per ons goud in het westen minder zal zijn als in het oosten.

C. Zover als ik kon volgen, waren verdere argumenten opgebracht dat geen vertrouwen gehecht kon worden aan de opgegeven waarde van de voorraden in de Cinderella Consolidated; dat de oude werkgangen in de Cinderella ingevalen waren, zodat zij ontoegankelijk waren; dat het 'n jaar zou nemen voor dat met het voorgestelde schema 'n begin gemaakt kon worden. Wat betreft eerstgenoemd argument, kan ik niet inzien waar beramingen van verantwoordelike personen, gemaakt in het jaar toen de mijn gesloten werd, op deze korte wijze verworpen zullen worden. Met betrekking tot het tweede argument, zijn de blokken ertsvoorraad die onmisbaar zijn voor de verweliking van het schema, en deze kunnen vermoedelijk door de hoofdschacht bereikt worden, en de ingevalen gangen zullen niet veel moeite geven. Wat betreft het derde punt, is het pessimisties, wegens mijn opinie, om twaalf maanden te stellen voor den tijd waarop het schema in werking kan treden, en het komt niet overeen met de bewering door diezelfde personen gemaakt, waarin gezegd wordt dat onmiddellike redding verschaft zou worden, indien hun toegestaan werd om hunne gangen tot in de Cinderella grond te laten doorlopen. In enig geval indien de lijnen van 'n schikking, zoals aangegeven, door de daarbij betrokken principaal en aangenomen worden, wil het mogelijk voorkomen dat enige schikkingen, welke de werkzaamheden zouden bespoedigen gedurende de tussentijd, ook zullen goedgekeurd worden.

Ten slotte wil ik mijn inzicht teboekstellen dat het 'n dringend geval is en dat het gevaar dat de East Rand Proprietary Mines, zoals tans samengesteld, niet in staat zal zijn voort te werken, dreigend is. Onder zulke omstandigheden kan in de zaak niet opgetreden worden, zoals onder gunstiger omstandigheden zou kunnen gedaan worden, op lijnen waarop er geen stap genomen werd zonder de zekerheid van grote geldelike winsten. De kwestie is of men 'n weg uit onmiddellike overweldigende moeilijkheden op deze lijnen vinden kan en die als zodanig aanzien, en het kan slechts als zodanig beschouwd worden door toestemming van de betrokken principalen.

Ik wens ook de mening te onderschrijven, welke op bladzij 10 van het rapport uitgedrukt wordt, dat de Wit Deep waarschijnlijk tot opschorten van zijn werkzaamheden zal gedwongen worden. Ik stem toe dat in de genoemde omstandigheden er groot gevaar voor deze gebeurlijkheid bestaat.

Hoogedelachte Heer,

Ingevolge uwe instruktes om een onderzoek in te stellen naar en rapport uit te brengen over de mogelijkheid van een sluiting der East Rand Proprietary Mines hebben wij de eer hieronder ons rapport over te leggen.

De punten waarnaar, volgens uwe instructie, wij onderzoek hadden te doen zijn de volgende:—

- (a) De mogelijkheid van sluiting der East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, Bepkt., en enige maatregelen welke kunnen worden gevolgd om zodanige sluiting te voorkomen of uit te stellen; hetzij in overleg met de eigenaren der naburige eigendommen of anderszins.
- (b) De onmiddellike of uiteindelike uitwerking van de sluiting der East Rand Proprietary Mijnen op het werk der naburige mijnen.
- (c) De mogelijkheid voor vaststelling van bijdragen in de kosten van nodige pompwerkzaamheden in de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen door de eigenaren der naburige mijnen en op welke wijze zodanige bijdragen moeten worden vastgesteld.

Het eigendom bekend als de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen is gelegen in de nabijheid van Boksburg en bevat 3936 mijnclaims en een mynpacht in oppervlakte gelijkstaande aan 612 claims, op welk getal mijndelvers licenties worden betaald voor 1340 claims, en prospekteertlicenties voor 2611 claims wat bewijst dat een gedeelte van ongeveer 29 percent van het geheel bewerkt is, latende dus 71 percent onbewerkt. Bijna alles van dit onbewerkte deel ligt op een diepte van tussen de 4000 en 9000 voet.

De uitgestrektheid van de werken van deze mijn bedraagt bij benadering 20,000 voet van de rif en 7200 voet op de helling. In het oosten wordt het eigendom begrensd door de Cinderella Consolidated Mijnen en in het westen door de Witwatersrand Deep, Bepkt.

Werkzaamheden voor de uithaling van het erts worden op het ogenblik op verschillende punten van dit grote terrein gedaan.

Het uitgehaalde erts wordt door zeven hoofdschachten en vier hulpschachten opgebracht. Dit eigendom vereist dus het onderhoud van elf verschillende schachten.

Het erts wordt in twee afzonderlike machinerieën bewerkt, welke gezamenlik 140,000 ton per maand kunnen afwerken; het erts wordt naar deze machinerieën door stoommachines, mechanose trekmachines en drijfriem-vervoerbakken gebracht.

1. A gradual fall in yield per ton from 32s. 1d. in 1912 to 23s. in 1920, and 21s. 1ld. in March of this year.

In 1912 some 1,029,106 tons of payable ore, averaging 8.2 dwt., were exposed, while in 1920 only 424,470 payable tons, averaging 7.3 dwt., were exposed.

The actual footage done in 1912 is a little over three times that done in 1920, and if in the latter year the same footage had been done as in 1912, the total working costs per ton would have been in the neighbourhood of 30s. per ton.

The reasons for the shortfall in the development position are clearly shown in the following extract from the Consulting Engineer's Report for 1918:—

"The urgent problem of prolonging the life of the mine to the utmost possible extent has been steadily kept in view, because on this point hangs the practicability of carrying out the southern areas scheme. The difference in cost of a particular development programme on a producing mine as compared with a non-producing mine is always large, and, in this instance, on account of the very heavy pumping and other standing charges, the difference is so great that failure to continue production would render impracticable the southern areas scheme, which, under more favourable conditions, might have been carried through.

"I propose to give you an account of the steps taken, the results achieved, and the extent to which we have fallen short of the object in view. Attached to this report will be found a plan of the underground workings, showing the disposition of the worked-out areas, and the payable and unpayable ore, as far as is at present known. You will observe the prevalence of unpayable ore along the whole extent of the bottom workings of the mine and the eastern workings of the Cason—in fact, it may be said, with the exception of three isolated localities, to be referred to later, that the mine workings are bounded on the south and east by a continuous fringe of unpayable ore. At the bottom of the mine, level after level revealed the same state of affairs, and in the Cason section nearly every drive has been unpayable for hundreds and, in some cases, thousands of feet. This latter section, on account of its accessibility to a well-equipped main shaft, might have saved the situation had even a moderate amount of payable ore been found, but a very large expenditure made in 1917 for this object was unsuccessful.

"The following table shows the amount of money spent during the last three years and the results obtained:—

"The payable tonnage developed during 1916 and 1917 was far short of the amount then being taken from reserves, and further, the cost of development, together with the cost of mining and treatment, would come to a much higher figure than the value of the gold contents.

Bovenstaande tabel wijst aan:—

1. Een geleidelijke val in opbrengst per ton van 32s. 1d. in 1912 tot 23s. in 1920 en tot 21s. 1ld. in Maart van dit jaar.

2. Een vermeerdering in de werkosten van 19s. 5.4d. per gemaal ton (een bedrag van 3s. per ton voor aflossing van ontginningskosten werd in 1912 gemaakt en in werkelijkheid werd slechts 1s. 7.4d. uitgegeven) in 1912 tot 27s. 7d. in 1920. In 1912 werd 1,029,106 ton betaalbaar erts, gemiddeld 8.2 dwt. bevattende, uitgehaald, terwijl in 1920 dit slechts 424,470 bedroeg, met een gemiddelde van 7.3 dwt.

De afgewerkte grond in voeten in 1912 is iets meer dan driemaal dat van 1920 en, indien in dit laatste jaar dezelfde hoeveelheid grond was bewerkt, dan zouden de totale werkosten per ton nabij 30s. zijn geweest.

De redenen voor de vermindering in ontginding worden duidelijk aangegeven in het volgend uittreksel van het Rapport van de Adviserende Ingenieur over 1918:—

"Het dringende vraagstuk om de mijnwerkzaamheden zoveel mogelijk te verlengen werd steeds voor ogen gehouden, omdat hiervan het uitvoeren van het schema voor de zuidelijke terreinen afhangt. Het verschil in kosten van een biezonder ontginningsprogramma van een producerende mijn is, in vergelijking met dat van een niet-producerende mijn, altijd groot en, in dit geval is het verschil, vanwege de zeer zware pomp- en andere steeds voorkomende onkosten, zo groot, dat mislukking om verdere produktie te bewerkstelligen, het zuidelijk terrein schema ondeenlijk zou maken, welke, onder meer gunstige omstandigheden, wel zou kunnen worden uitgevoerd.

"Ik wens u hier een verslag te geven van de genomen stappen, de verkregen resultaten en de mate waarin wij te kort zijn geschoten in het bereiken van dat doel. Bij dit rapport is gevoegd een plan van de werken ondergronds, aantonende de ligging der uitgewerkte stukken grond en de betrouwbaar en onbetaalbare erts, zover die tot nu toe bekend is. U zult daaruit zien dat het onbetaalbare erts overwegend voorkomt over de gehele uitgestrekte lengte van de onderlagen der mijn en de oostelijke werken van de Cason—inderdaad kan worden gezegd dat, met uitzondering van drie afzonderlijke plekken, waarnaar later zal worden verwezen, de mijnwerken ten zuiden en oosten begrensd zijn door een aanhoudende rand van onbetaalbare erts. Op de bodem van de mijn werd vloer na vloer, dezelfde toestand van zaken aangetroffen en in het Cason gedeelte was zo goed als elke vloer voor honderde voeten en in enkele gevallen duizend voeten onbetaalbaar. Dit laatste gedeelte had, wegens de toegankelijkheid tot een goed voorziene hoofdschacht, de toestand kunnen verhelpen, indien zelfs maar een middelmatige hoeveelheid betaalbare erts was gevonden, maar zeer grote uitgaven in 1917 met dat doel gedaan, waren onvoorspoedig.

"Het aantal uitgehaalde betaalbare tonnen gedurende 1916 en 1917 was veel minder dan dat van de reserve genomen en verder zullen de kosten van uithaling, samen met de kosten van ontginding en behandeling, een veel groter bedrag uitmaken dan de waarde van het goud daarin.

"Notwithstanding the large funds specifically set aside for development and the vital necessity of obtaining payable ore, we could not continue spending money indefinitely in the light of such totally deficient results as had been obtained during 1916 and 1917, and the conviction was forced upon us that an adequate trial had been made, and nothing further could be hoped for by continuing this policy. Accordingly, it was decided to devote the resources at the Company's command to development in areas where profitable results were reasonably certain. A reference to the above table will show that this policy has been successful in the sense that the results obtained in 1918 will show a substantial profit, but, as was expected, the new tonnage developed still remains very far short of the amount necessary for our main purpose. The question whether any particular district should be developed was determined entirely by its prospects, and wherever there have been encouraging features in any part of the mine, money and labour have been devoted to prove it.

"There are three principal localities in which payable ore is being found, namely, the Driefontein section, close to your western boundary, on the twenty-fifth and twenty-seventh levels; the lowest workings of the Hercules section of the thirty-third level, just to the west of the shaft; and the most easterly workings of the Cason Mine between the twenty-fourth and twenty-seventh levels, referred to as the Cason-Cinderella section. It is true there are isolated patches of payable ore in other districts, but, broadly speaking, the above-mentioned localities are the only ones where any considerable extent of payable ore has been found. Unfortunately, these districts are widely separated, and necessitate for their working the operation of several expensive hoisting equipments, which militates against any policy of economically working the mine on a smaller scale.

"The possibilities of extension are in all three cases restricted. On the Driefontein, there is a probability of the extension of the payable area in depth, but towards the west it is terminated by the boundary of your property, and on the east by an extensive area of badly faulted and quite unpayable ground. The payable section at the Hercules shaft was discovered during the course of the year, and any considerable extension can only be in a southerly direction. Unfortunately, this entails expensive dead-work in the form of shaft sinking, and we are getting seriously near the water-bearing zone. In the Cason-Cinderella section the values are good, and, although there is some falling off in the only direction in which we can extend, namely, to the east, the indications are satisfactory.

"The most attractive of the three areas is the Driefontein, not only because it is the most extensive, but because it forms an integral part of the southern areas scheme. Should the latter be undertaken, it would be necessary to form a connection with the new main shaft through this section. Apart from these districts, development and prospecting has been done in the old workings, with fairly satisfactory results. The ore remaining is naturally small in amount and expensive to get at, otherwise it would not have been left."

Since the above report was written, the Hercules shaft section has been thoroughly explored, with the result that that section too has now proved unpayable.

3. Although the stated value of the ore reserve has fallen from 6.8 to 6.1 dwt., or, say, 3s. per ton, the yield has gradually decreased 9s. 1d. per ton. This is probably due to the large percentage of low grade, cheaply mined, reclamation rock which is now being mined to maintain the tonnage sent to the mill. The yield has thus decreased by about 9s. per ton, while the costs, allowing for sufficient shaft-sinking and development, have risen by a little over 10s. per ton.

The actual monetary difference to the East Rand Proprietary Mines may be stated at 19s. per ton, as from the average of 1912 to the average of 1920.

During 1920, however, the premium on gold, which averaged about 26s. 4d. per oz., caused an increase in the value of the yield of 7s. 2.6d. per ton, thus to some extent balancing the increased costs.

An ostensible net profit of £152,363 was made in 1920, but only £102,208 was spent on development as compared with £149,880 in 1912.

4. A decline in the quantity and value of the available reserves—which—excluding shaft pillars—are shown to be at present 2,197,000 tons of an average assay value of 5.9.

5. The amount of incline-shaft sinking done in 1918 (859 feet), in 1919 (467 feet), and in 1920 (822 feet), is, for a property of 20,000 feet on the strike, insignificant. Shaft-sinking has been reduced considerably owing to the difficulties connected with water and the additional expenses incurred by sinking, as shown in the extract from the consulting engineer's report already quoted.

The ore reserve plan attached indicates that a moderate percentage of payability is now practically limited to the extreme west and east, and that there are not sufficient places for development to maintain the reserves. At the present rate of milling, say, 130,000 to 140,000 tons per month, mining operations must gradually be restricted until losses are made owing to the small tonnage mined consequent on the decrease in the number and linear extent of stoping faces.

The possibility of the East Rand Proprietary Mines incurring heavy losses and, therefore, being closed down, is very great if for no other reasons than the continued fall in value and percentage of payability in depth, the additional expenses consequent on mining at increased depths, and the gradual exhaustion of the ore reserves.

Assuming the continuation of the present prices of stores, labour, and gold, it is probable that by the end of this year the quantity and grade of the reserves will be so low as to cause mining and milling operations to result in considerable losses. A

"Niettegenstaande het grote bedrag in het biezonder voor ontwikkeling ter zijde gezet en de uiterste noodzakelijkheid om betaalbaar erts te verkrijgen, konden wij niet voortgaan om in het oneindige geld uit te geven met zulke totaal onbevredigende resultaten, zoals verkregen gedurende 1916 en 1917 en waren wij er van overtuigd dat een voldoende proef was genomen en dat er verder niets voor was te zeggen om die handelwijze voort te zetten. Dienovereenkomstig werd besloten om de hulpbronnen, ten dienste staande van de maatschappij, aan te wenden ter ontwikkeling van die stukken grond waar winstgevende resultaten redelijk konden worden verwacht. Een verwijzing naar bovenstaand tabel zal tonen dat deze handelwijze suksesvol was, in zoverre dat de resultaten in 1918 verkregen een flinke winst zullen aantonen, maar, zoals kan worden verwacht, valt de nieuwe ontgonnen tonnemaaat nog ver ten achter bij de hoeveelheid nodig voor ons hoofddoel. Het vraagstuk of enig biezonder stuk grond moet worden ontgonnen, hing geheel af van de vooruitzichten ervan en waar er aanmoedigende aanwijzingen in enig deel van de mijn waren gevonden, werden geld en arbeid eraan besteed om dat aan te tonen.

"Er bestaan drie hoofdplekken waar betaalbaar erts wordt gevonden, namelijk de Driefontein sectie, gelegen nabij uw westelijke grenslijn, op de 25ste en 27ste vloeren; de laagst gelegen werken van de Hercules sectie op de 33ste vloer, juist ten westen van de schacht; en de meest oostelijke werken van de Cason Mijn, tussen de 24ste en 27ste vloeren, bekend als de Cason-Cinderella sectie. Wel is waar bestaan er afgezonderde plekken van betaalbaar erts in andere terreinen, maar in het algemeen gesproken, zijn de bovengemelde lokaliteiten de enige waar een aanzienlijke uitgestrektheid betaalbaar erts is gevonden. Ongelukkig zijn deze plekken ver van elkaar verspreid en behoeven zij voor ontginding verscheidene kostbare hijsmachines, waardoor ekonomiese ontginding der mijn op kleiner schaal weer wordt tegewerkt.

"De mogelijkheid van uitbreiding is in alle drie gevallen beperkt. Op de Driefontein bestaat de mogelijkheid van een uitbreiding van betaalbaar erts in de diepte, maar naar het westen wordt die tegengehouden door de grenslijn van uw eigendom en naar het oosten toe door een uitgestrekt terrein van zeer slechte en totaal onbetaalbare grond. Een betaalbare sectie bij de Hercules schacht werd in de loop van het jaar ontdekt en enige aanzienlijke uitbreiding kan slechts in een zuidelijke richting zich voordoen. Ongelukkig sleept dit kostbaar doodwerk met zich in de vorm van het zinken van een schacht en komen wij zeer nabij het waterhoudend gebied. In de Cason-Cinderella sectie is de waarde van de grond goed en, ofschoon er enige vermindering is in de enige richting waarin wij kunnen uitbreiden, namelijk naar het oosten toe, zijn de aanwijzingen bevredigend.

"De meest aantrekkelijke der drie terreinen is de Driefontein, niet enkel omdat die het grootst is, maar omdat het een onderdeel vormt van het zuidelijk terrein schema. Wordt deze aangevat, dan zal het nodig zijn om een verbinding met de nieuwe hoofdschacht door deze sectie te vormen. Afgescheiden van deze terreinen werden de oude werken verder ontgonnen en geprospeert, met tamelijk bevredigende resultaten. Het overblijvende erts is natuurlijk gering in hoeveelheid en kostbaar om uit te halen, anders zou het niet zijn opgegeven."

Sedert bovenstaand rapport geschreven werd is de Hercules schacht sectie deugdelijk onderzocht geworden met het resultaat dat deze sectie eveneens onbetaalbaar werd bevonden.

3. Ofschoon de aangegeven waarde van de ertsreserves van 6.8 tot 6.1 dwt. of zeg 3s. per ton is gevallen, is de opbrengst langzamerhand met 9s. 1d. per ton verminderd. Dit is waarschijnlijk te wijten aan het grote percentage goedkoop uit te halen reclamatieteros van laag gehalte, welke nu wordt uitgehaald om de tonnemaaat, naar de molen gezonden, op te houden. De opbrengst is dus met ongeveer 9s. per ton verminderd, terwijl de kosten, insluitende voldoende voorziening voor schachtzinking en ontstelling, iets over de 10s. per ton zijn gestegen.

Het werkelijk geldelijk verschil voor de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen kan op 19s. per ton worden vastgesteld op het gemiddelde van 1912 tot het gemiddelde van 1920 toe.

Gedurende 1920 echter veroorzaakte de premie op goud welke ongeveer 26s. 4d. per oz. bedroeg, een vermeerdering in de waarde van de opbrengst van 7s. 2.6d. per ton, aldus in zekere mate de verhoogde kosten goed makende.

De ongegeven netto winst voor 1920 bedroeg £152,363, maar slechts £102,208 werd aan ontginding uitgegeven, in verklijking met £149,880 in 1912.

4. Een vermindering in de hoeveelheid en waarde der vorhanden zijnde reserves—de schachtpilaren uitgesloten—worden op het ogenblik aangetoond te zijn 2,197,000 ton met een gemiddelde essaaiwaarde van 5.9.

5. De omvang van het zinken van hellende schachten gedaan in 1918 (859 voet), in 1919 (467 voet) en in 1920 (822 voet) is voor een eigendom van 20,000 voet op de rif onbeladen. Schachtzinking werd aanzienlijk verminderd tengevolge van ondervonden moeilijkheden in verband met water en de bijkomende onkosten bij het zinken ondervonden, zoals aangetoond in het uittreksel uit het Rapport van de Adviserende Ingenieur, hierboven reeds aangehaald.

Het plan van de ertsreserves hieraangehecht toont aan dat een matige percentage van betaalbaarheid nu feitelijk beperkt is tot het uiterste westen en oosten en dat er geen voldoende terreinen voor ontwikkeling zijn om de reserves op te houden. Berekend tegen de tegenwoordige hoeveelheid van malen, zeg 130,000 tot 140,000 ton per maand zullen de mijnwerkzaamheden langzamerhand moeten worden beperkt totdat verliezen worden gemaakt, wegens het gering aantal uitgehalde tonnen, als gevolg in de vermindering van het aantal en de werkelijke uitgestrektheid der "stope" wanden.

De mogelijkheid dat de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen grote verliezen zullen lijden en daarom gesloten moeten worden is daarom zeer mogelijk, indien om geen andere redenen dan de aanhoudende achteruitgang in waarde en percentage van betaalbaarheid in diepte, de bijkomende onkosten als gevolg van ontginding op grotere diepten en de gestadige uitputting der ertsreserves.

Aannemende dat de tegenwoordige prijzen van goederen, arbeid en goud blijven voortduren, dan is het waarschijnlijk dat tegen het einde van dit jaar de hoeveelheid en gehalte van de reserves zo laag zullen zijn, dat ontginding en maaloperaties aanzienlijke verliezen zullen tengevolge hebben. Een aantal wenken werden uw Komitee aan de hand gedaan betreffende veranderingen welke

number of suggestions were made to your Committee referring to changes that might be made to prevent these losses and the closing down of the mine. They may be taken in the following order:

First Suggestion.—Whether by means of selective mining the life of the mine could be prolonged although producing on a reduced scale.

An analysis of the ore reserves shows that there are probably 854,000 tons of an average value of 6.0 dwt. and over, and averaging 7.5 dwt. per ton. These occur in small blocks over the seven sections of the property and, unfortunately, the costs of mining, tramping, and milling, say, 40,000 tons per month, from such a huge area, would result in costs higher than the value of the yield in gold at to-day's price.

Second Suggestion.—Whether mining in the adjacent properties of the Cinderella Consolidated Mines, Limited, on the east, and the Witwatersrand Deep, Limited, on the west, would be likely to add such an amount and value of payable ore per month to the present output as to permit the continuance of working under present conditions for an appreciably longer period.

The number of tons that could be mined from these sources would possibly be a total of 8000 per month in the course of a few months, and assuming that this tonnage would be of the average value of the Witwatersrand Deep and Cinderella Consolidated yields, the effect upon the East Rand Proprietary Mines' grade would be practically negligible and would not appreciably ease the difficult situation.

Third Suggestion.—Whether by the acquisition by the Witwatersrand Deep, by lease or otherwise, of a portion of the East Rand Proprietary Mines at its western boundary and the purchase by the East Rand Proprietary Mines of the Cinderella Consolidated (or amalgamation therewith) on the east, a reconstitution of the district might be feasible which holds out reasonable prospects of the mining and accessibility of the whole area being saved.

The details of this suggestion are—

(1) That the Witwatersrand Deep should lease a portion of the Driefontein-Ginsberg area containing an ore reserve of 607,000 tons, having an average assay value of 6.0 dwt.

That it should proceed to increase its battery and cyanide works so that they may be capable of crushing and treating 50,000 tons per month, of which 35,000 would be mined from the Witwatersrand Deep and 15,000 from the acquired area.

That it should construct a haulage or loco. track from the Farrar shaft to the Witwatersrand Deep battery.

(2) That the central section of the East Rand Proprietary Mines, containing some 782,000 tons of an average assay value of 5.5 dwt., should for the present remain idle.

(With regard to this point, it must be remembered that the whole of the main pumping equipment for the mine is situated in this section, so that considerable maintenance charges must necessarily be incurred in keeping this section open so that the pumping may not be interfered with.)

(3) That the East Rand Proprietary Mines should limit its operations to the eastern section, in which it is estimated there are 808,000 tons of reserve of 6.3 dwt. assay value, and at the earliest moment amalgamate with the Cinderella Consolidated, which is said to have a reserve of 519,000 tons with an assay value of 6.2 dwt.

(4) That the Witwatersrand Deep and the East Rand Proprietary Mines should contribute, pro rata to the tonnages mined, to the cost of pumping, which is now about £100,000 per annum.

As regards these suggestions it should be pointed out at once that the following are the screen values and cost of producing an ounce of gold by the East Rand Proprietary Mines during the periods stated:

Het aantal tonnen dat uit deze bronnen kon worden uitgehaald, zal waarschijnlijk in totaal 8000 tonnen per maand in de loop van enkele maanden bedragen en, aannemende dat de gemiddelde waarde ervan gelijk is aan die van de Witwatersrand Deep en Cinderella Consolidated (of amalgamatie daarmee) in het oosten een nieuwe samenstelling van het terrein mogelijk zou zijn, waardoor redelijke vooruitzichten voor ontginnings en toegankelijkheid van het gehele terrein zouden worden gewaarborgd.

Die biezenonderheden van dit voorstel zijn:

(1) Dat de Witwatersrand Deep een deel van het Driefontein-Ginsberg terrein zal pachten, een ertsreserve bevattende van 607,000 ton met een gemiddelde essaaiwaarde van 6 dwt.

Dat de mijn moet overgaan tot een vergroting van de batterij en cyanidewerken, zodat die in staat zullen zijn om 50,000 ton per maand te breken en te bewerken, waarvan 35,000 uit de Witwatersrand Deep en 15,000 uit het verkregen terrein.

Dat zij een trekinrichting of spoorlijn van de Farrar Schacht naar de Witwatersrand Deep Batterij zal aanleggen.

(2) Dat de centrale sektie van de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, ongeveer 782,000 ton van een gemiddelde essaaiwaarde van 5.5 dwt., voorlopig onbewerkt dient te blijven.

(Met betrekking tot dit punt dient er aan te worden herinnerd dat alle pompvoorzieningen van de mijn in deze sektie zijn gelegen, zodat aanzienlijke onderhoudskosten noodzakelijkerwijze moeten worden gemaakt om deze sektie open te houden, zodat het pompen niet kan worden belemmerd).

(3) Dat de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen de werkzaamheden zullen beperken tot de oostelijke sektie waar, naar berekening, er 808,000 ton reserven van 6.3 dwt. essaaiwaarde liggen en zo spoedig mogelijk met de Cinderella Consolidated zal amalgameren, welke gezegd wordt een reserve te hebben van 519,000 ton van een essaaiwaarde van 6.2 dwt.

(4) Dat de Witwatersrand Deep en de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen dienen hij te dragen, pro rata de uitgehaalde tonnen, tot de kosten van het pompen, welke nu ongeveer £100,000 per jaar bedragen.

Wat betreft deze voorstellen, dient dadelijk de aandacht er op te worden gevestigd dat de volgende cijfers de schermwaarde en kosten zijn voor het voortbrengen van een ons goud door de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen gedurende de tijden daarin vermeld:

Het schijnt vreemd dat de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen een gedeelte van haar gebied heeft opgegeven welke de beste resultaten heeft gegeven aan een naburige mijn en beproefd heeft om winsten te maken uit de meer arme delen.

It is more than probable that the mining of 15,000 tons per month from the western area would be unprofitable, and it is certain that there would be heavy losses if the standing charges of the East Rand Proprietary Mines had to be paid by the eastern section. To these losses must be added at least £50,000, i.e. half the pumping charges. It is also fairly certain that the ore of the Cinderella Consolidated would not be available to any large extent in less than a year.

The development accomplished on the Witwatersrand Deep, according to their last annual report, only produced 187,311 payable tons, while they mined during the same period 369,567 tons, and their shaft-sinking position is acknowledged to be behind-hand. This is shown further by the fact that as their property is only approximately 2400 feet wide, assuming a stoping width of 60 inches and a payability as high as 75 per cent., it is essential that at least 480 feet of shaft-sinking be accomplished per annum to maintain the ore reserve position. During 1920 only 177 feet of shaft-sinking was done, and it is more than doubtful whether, with the amount of tonnage that has to be handled through this shaft to keep the mill going, it will be in any way possible to increase this footage to 480 feet per annum.

From the foregoing facts, based on their annual report, it appears to us that the only benefit that can be shown to arise from this suggestion is to enable the Witwatersrand Deep to obtain additional ore for their mill from the East Rand Proprietary Mines ore reserves while they attempt to make good the development and shaft-sinking position in their own mine. On the other hand, such a suggestion could only do the most serious harm to the East Rand Proprietary Mines.

Of all the suggestions made, this appears to be the most uneconomical and impracticable.

Fourth Suggestion.—A fourth suggestion was also made, namely, that the East Rand Proprietary Mines should absorb the Cinderella Consolidated on the east and the Witwatersrand Deep on the west. To investigate the possibilities of this suggestion would involve such detailed estimates and plans for future development, which would take so long to prepare, that we have been unable in the time at our disposal to inquire into them. We feel, however, that if there should be possibilities on these lines, the permission to mine in the areas on the western and eastern boundaries, as suggested in the above-mentioned second suggestion, would be of the greatest value.

Fifth Suggestion.—Whether a reduction in working costs could be brought about which would enable the Company to avoid losses and, at the same time, by lowering the pay limit permit of a considerable increase in the available ore reserves.

The usual method adopted to make any enterprise pay its way is to economize, and is probably a better plan than tacking an enterprise which is non-paying on to another of doubtful value.

It is questionable if there will be an improvement in depth in this district; at any rate such an improvement has not yet been discovered in the deep levels stretching from the Jupiter to the Witwatersrand, and we shall probably continue to find in depth in this district gold values in detached fragments which may average from 20s. to 22s. per ton or less.

A reduction in working costs is vital and probably the only way in which these deep-level mines can be made to pay.

The following are offered as suggestions:—

(a) A reduction in white wages.

The average rate of pay per white employee on this property during 1912 was £335 per annum, and during 1920 was £506—an increase of £171 per employee, or a total increase on 1435 employees of £245,385.

If white wages were reduced by half of the above increase it would represent a decrease in expenditure of £120,000 per annum, and an average decrease in pay per white employee of £85. 10s. per annum or about £7 per month, the resulting average pay per annum being £418.

(b) A reduction in cost of claim licences.

At the present time enormous sums are paid yearly by the mines as diggers' licences on claims that are supposed to be worked for gold. There are thousands of these claims on the Rand that are completely exhausted and on which the mining companies continue to pay £12 per annum per claim.

In the East Rand Proprietary Mines some 1340 diggers' claims are paid for in this manner. It is suggested that these should be paid for as prospectors' claims at the rate of £3 per annum. This decrease would save the East Rand Proprietary Mines some £12,060 per annum.

(c) Stores.—It is probable that the costs of stores will decrease considerably during the remainder of this year and next year. The following are the amounts spent on stores during the last three years:—

Increase of 1920 above 1919: 1s. 6d. per ton, or with the same tonnage milled as in 1919 there would have been an increase in expenditure on stores of £105,700.

It is probable that some amelioration of these conditions could be provided by a decrease in Custom dues and railway charges.

The above three suggestions are made as ways in which costs could be lowered and as being probably the most practical methods that could be adopted to prevent or delay the closing down of this large property and many others.

Het is meer dan waarschijnlijk dat de ontginding van 15,000-ton per maand van het westelijk terrein onvoordelig zal zijn en het is zeker dat er grote verliezen zouden zijn, indien de geregelde onkosten van de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen door de oostelijke sectie moesten worden betaald. Bij deze verliezen moeten op het minst £50,000 worden gevoegd, t.w. de helft der pomponkosten. Het is ook zo goed als zeker dat het erts van de Cinderella Consolidated niet in enige grote mate in minder dan een jaar ter beschikking zou komen.

De ontginding gedaan op de Witwatersrand Deep, bracht volgens hun laatste jaarverslag slechts 187,311 betaalbare tonnen op, terwijl zij gedurende hetzelfde tijdperk 369,567 ton uithaalden en hun positie, wat betreft schachtzinken, erkend wordt achter te zijn. Dit wordt verder aangetoond door het feit dat, aangezien hun eigendom bij benadering slechts 2400 voet breed is, aannemende dat de "stope" wijdt 60 duim is en de betaalbaarheid 75 percent bedraagt, het zeker nodig is dat minstens 480 voet schachtzinking per jaar moet worden gedaan om de positie van de ertsreserve op te houden. Gedurende 1920 werd slechts 177 voet schachtzinken gedaan en het is meer dan twijfelachtig of, met het oog op het aantal tonnen dat door deze schacht moet worden gebracht om de molen in werking te houden, het in enig opzicht mogelijk zal zijn om dat zinken tot 480 voet per jaar op te voeren.

Uit de voorgaande feiten, gebaseerd op hun jaarlijks rapport, schijnt het ons toe dat het enige voordeel dat kan worden aangevoerd voort te komen uit deze veronderstelling is, om de Witwatersrand Deep in staat te stellen verder erts te verkrijgen voor haar molen uit de ertsreserven van de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, terwijl zij moet trachten om ontwikkeling en schachtzinken in eigen mijn te verbeteren. Daartegenover staat dat zulk een voorstel slechts grote schade zal doen aan de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen.

Van al de gedane voorstellen schijnt dit het meest onpraktische en kostbare.

Vierde Voorstel.—Een vierde voorstel werd ook gedaan, namelijk dat de East Rand Proprietary Mijn de Cinderella Consolidated in het oosten en de Witwatersrand Deep in het westen zou opnemen. Om de mogelijkheden van dit voorstel na te gaan zou zovele omstandige berekeningen en plannen voor toekomstige ontginding met zich brengen en zou dit zoveel tijd vorderen, dat wij, met de tijd voor ons, geen kans hebben gezien om die te onderzoeken. Wij voelen echter dat, indien er een mogelijkheid hiervoor bestaat, de vergunning om in de terreinen nabij de oostelijke en westelijke grenslijnen te werken, zoals in het tweede voorstel, hierboven aangehaald, aan de hand gedaan, van het grootste gewicht zou zijn.

Vijfde Voorstel.—Of een vermindering in de werkosten kon worden teweeggebracht, welke de maatschappij in staat zou stellen om verliezen te voorkomen en terzelfdertijd door de grens van betaalbaarheid te verminderen een aanzielike vermeerdering in de voorradige ertsreserven te veroorloven.

De gewone manier om enige onderneming te laten betalen is om te bezuinigen en is waarschijnlijk een beter plan dan om een onderneming welke niet betaalbaar is te voegen bij een andere van twijfelachtige waarde.

Het is nog de vraag of er een verbetering in diepte in dit terrein zal zijn, in enige geval is zodanige verbetering nog niet in de diepe vloeren, beginnende vanaf de Jupiter tot de Witwatersrand, ontdekt en wij zullen waarschijnlijk voortgaan om in de diepten van dit distrik goudwaarden te vinden, in afzonderlijke stukken grond, welke een gemiddelde gehalte van 20s. tot 22s. per ton of minder zullen bevatten.

Een vermindering in de werkosten is allernodigst en waarschijnlijk de enige manier waarop deze diepe vloeren betaalbaar kunnen worden gemaakt.

De volgende voorstellen worden aan de hand gegeven:—
(a) Een vermindering in lonen van blanken.

Het gemelde loon per blanke werkman op dit eigendom gedurende 1912 bedroeg £335 per jaar en gedurende 1920 was dit £506—een vermeerdering van £171 per werkman, of een totale vermeerdering op 1435 werklieden van £245,385.

Indien het loon der blanken voor de helft van bovenstaande vermeerdering kon worden vermindert, dan zou zulks een vermindering in de uitgaven van £120,000 per jaar bedragen en een gemiddelde vermindering in loon per blanke werkman van 20s. 10d. per jaar of ongeveer £7 per maand en zou het gemiddelde loon per jaar £418 bedragen.

(b) Een vermindering in de kosten van claimlicenties.

Op het huidig ogenblik worden door de mijnen jaarlijks enorme sommen betaald als diggerslicenties op claims welke verondersteld worden goud te bevatten. Er zijn duizenden van deze claims op de Rand die geheel en al zijn uitgewerkt en waarop de mijnmaatschappijen voortgaan £12 jaarlijks per claim te betalen.

Op de East Rand Proprietary Mijn worden voor ongeveer 1340 diggersclaims licenties betaald. Er wordt aan de hand gedaan dat voor die claims prospektorlicenties tegen een bedrag van £3 per jaar zal worden betaald. Deze vermindering zou de East Rand Proprietary Mijn £12,000 per jaar besparen.

(c) Benodigheden.—Het is waarschijnlijk dat de kosten van benodigheden aanzienlijk gedurende het overige van dit jaar en volgend jaar zullen verminderen. De volgende bedragen werden gedurende de laatste drie jaren aan benodigheden uitgegeven:—

De vermeerdering van 1920 boven die van 1919 bedroeg 1s. 6d. per ton, of tegen hetzelfde aantal tonnen als in 1919 gemalen, zou er een vermeerdering in de uitgaven voor benodigheden zijn geweest van £105,700.

Het is mogelijk dat enige verbetering in deze toestand kan worden aangebracht door een vermindering in de invoerrechten en spoorwegvracht.

De bovenstaande drie voorstellen worden gemaakt als middelen waardoor de kosten konden worden vermindert en als zijnde waarschijnlijk de meest praktische wijze welke kan worden aangenomen om het sluiten van dit grote eigendom en van vele anderen te voorkomen of tegen te houden.

Assuming a saving of only 1s. per ton by a decrease in the cost of stores, a total saving of at least £200,000 per annum could be effected on this property by the adoption of the above suggestions.

Reference "B."

The immediate or ultimate effect of the closing down of the East Rand Proprietary Mines upon the working of neighbouring mines.

The flooding of mines west of the Geldenhuis Deep could be prevented by building strong dams in the three openings which have been made through the Treasury dyke.

The above lives of the mines were given by the representatives of these mines, and no responsibility is assumed by the other members of the Committee for the individual estimates, although considerable doubt was expressed by some of the members of the Committee on the reliability of the Witwatersrand Deep estimate.

The continuation of milling operations by all of the above mines depends upon the present level of prices remaining as favourable as they are to-day, or an amelioration of these conditions as the following table of mining and milling results for the quarter ended 31st March, 1921, indicates.

Knight Central is uit bovenstaande tabel weggelaten, omdat vermeld is dat die mijn ongetwijfeld voor het einde van 1921 zal worden gesloten.

The East Rand Proprietary Mines are making about 2,000,000 gallons of water per day, but during the past three or four years they have averaged two and a half millions per day.

On the smaller amount it would require two hundred and nine days, or seven months, to fill up the East Rand Proprietary Mines' cavities caused by mining to the twenty-first level, from which it would run into the Witwatersrand Deep Mine.

On the larger amount it would require one hundred and sixty-seven days, say five and a half months.

It is possible that many cavities in the fractured zone would also be filled, and possibly the amount flowing into the mine would diminish as the level gradually rose, but it seems inevitable that some twelve months after pumping ceased in the East Rand Proprietary Mines the Witwatersrand Deep would receive an additional two million gallons of water per day.

The figures of the last annual report of the Witwatersrand Deep indicate that its costs do not include the requisite amount of development and shaft-sinking, and with the additional cost of pumping to be borne its position would be hopeless.

Twelve months from the time at which the Witwatersrand Deep finds itself unable to cope with its additional water, and has to cease operations, the water will be flowing into the Witwatersrand.

The closing down of the Witwatersrand would then be inevitable, as it has not the equipment, nor can it afford to pump this additional amount of water.

Het bovenstaand aantal jaren van bestaan der mijnen werden door de vertegenwoordigers dier mijnen opgegeven en geen verantwoording wordt door de andere leden van het Komitee genomen voor de afzonderlike beramingen, ofschoon door enkele leden van het Komitee grote twijfel werd uitgesproken over de betrouwbaarheid van de raming van de Witwatersrand Deep.

De East Rand Proprietary Mijnen nemen ongeveer 2,000,000 gallons water per dag in, maar in de loop van de laatste drie of vier jaren bedroeg het ongeveer 2½ miljoen per dag.

Berekend tegen het kleiner bedrag zou het 209 dagen of zeven maanden nemen om de holten van de East Rand Proprietary Mijnen, veroorzaakt door ontginding tot de 21ste vloer, op te vullen, waar vandaan het water in de Witwatersrand Deep mijn zou lopen.

Tegen het groter bedrag berekend zou het 167 dagen, zeg 5½ maand nemen.

Het is mogelijk dat vele holten in het gebroken terrein eveneens zouden worden opgevuld en mogelijk zou de hoeveelheid in de mijn stromende verminderen, naarmate de vloer langzamerhand steeg, maar het schijnt onvermijdelijk dat, wanneer met pompen in de East Rand Proprietary Mijn wordt opgehouden, ongeveer 12 maanden later de Witwatersrand Deep een verdere twee miljoen gallons water zou inkrijgen.

De cijfers van het laatste jaarrapport van de Witwatersrand Deep wijzen er op dat de kosten ervan niet de vereiste kosten voor ontginding en schachtzinken insluiten en daarbij gevoegd de additionele kosten voor pompen, zou de positie van die mijn hopeloos doen worden.

Twaalf maanden van af de tijd waarop de Witwatersrand Deep niet in staat zou zijn om dit additionele water meester te blijven en dus de werkzaamheden zou moeten stoppen, zal het water in de Witwatersrand vloeien.

Het sluiten van de Witwatersrand zou dan onvermijdbaar worden aangezien die mijn noch de uitrusting heeft, noch de middelen bezit om deze verdere hoeveelheid water weg te pompen.

The Knights Central is making about eighty-seven million gallons per annum. Its cavities should contain about two hundred and forty-eight million gallons. If it closes at the end of this year, it would at the end of 1923 still have a capacity of, say, eighty gallons. This capacity would not materially assist the Rose Deep and Simmer & Jack, and it is probable that these two mines would have to bear the cost of pumping this water some three years after the East Rand Proprietary Mines closed down.

The above table of yields and profits indicates that they would probably be unable to bear these additional costs unless there are, meanwhile, great changes in the cost of producing gold on the Witwatersrand, and there lives would probably be shortened by two years.

Reference "C."

The table of yields and profits previously referred to indicates that these mines, excluding the Gedenhuis Deep, made profits at the rate of about £220,000 per annum during the quarter ended 31st March, 1921, but as these profits depend upon the continuation of the present value of gold, labour, and stores, and only amount to 1.42 shillings per ton, a contribution from these mines could not be relied upon, and, moreover, their short lives, low grade, and uncertainty of continuing to make profits, precludes them from such an assessment.

The whole of Boksburg and a portion of the Germiston district are practically entirely dependent on the employees of the East Rand Proprietary Mines and the mines mentioned in this report for their livelihood, as is shown by the following statement:—

Number of whites directly employed by the mines in the district referred to	4,260
Annual wages	£2,055,000
Natives directly employed by the mines ...	31,000
Annual wages	£1,082,000
Gross annual expenditure by mines	£5,420,000
Total crushing capacity	6,228,000 tons.

(The above figures are based on numbers employed and expenditure incurred for December, 1920.)

The townships of Germiston and Boksburg have a total population, including the mine employees mentioned above, of 33,000 whites and 70,000 natives.

It will be understood that we are concerned with the existence as a going concern, of a large and well equipped industrial and social organization, whose essential economic foundation is the mines themselves. When these close down, a great part of the value of both of the organization itself and the fixed capital employed will be destroyed, and until something else can be substituted the period of readjustment will certainly be painful to the community concerned, involving its migration to other districts, and expensive to the State.

From these facts it will be clearly seen that it is the Government itself which has the greatest financial interest in the continuation of the operations of these mines, and we are of the opinion that if the East Rand Proprietary Mines were guaranteed against loss to the extent of their pumping charges, which they have now carried for many years, it might be of considerable assistance to them in enabling them to prosecute further exploration for payable ore, and possibly to enable them to extend their life for some further period.

De steden Germiston en Boksburg hebben een totale bevolking, insluitende de mijnwerkers hierboven aangehaald, van 33,000 blanken en 70,000 naturellen.

Er zal worden begrepen dat wij belang stellen in het bestaan, als een lopende bezigheid, van een grote en wel voorziette industriële en sociale organisatie, welker wezenlike ekonomiese grondslag de mijnen zelve zijn. Wanneer deze sluiten zal een groot gedeelte van de waarde, zowel van de organisatie zelf als van het gevestigde kapitaal, vernield worden en tot tijd en wijle iets anders daarvoor in de plaats kan worden gesteld, zal het tijdperk van het weder in orde brengen zeker pijnlijk zijn voor de betrokken gemeenschap, niet zich slepende verhuizing maar andere distrikten en kostbaar voor de Staat.
