## PROCLAMATION

BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

Whereas it is desirable to make further provision out of the public revenue and other funds of Swaziland to meet certain additional expenditure incurred during the financial year ended on the 31st day of March 1922;

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers authorities and jurisdiction conferred upon and committed to me by His Majesty under the Swaziland Order-in-Council 1903 as amended by the Swaziland Order-in-Council 1906 and the Swaziland Order-in-Council 1909, I do hereby declare proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. The public revenue and other funds of Swaziland are hereby charged with a further sum of £8165. 5s. 9d. (eight thousand one hundred and sixty-five pounds five shillings and ninepence) to meet expenditure incurred during the financial year which ended on the 31st day of March 1922 in excess of the amounts appropriated for the service of that year, according to the particulars set forth in the Schedule to this Proclamation.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Swaziland Additional Appropriation (1921-22) Proclamation 1923, and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

## PROCLAMATION

BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

Whereas it is necessary to fix the rate of Income Tax to be levied in Swaziland in respect of the twelve months ending the thirtieth day of June, 1923;

And whereas it is expedient to amend section *forty-one* of the Swaziland Income Tax Proclamation 1921 (which as amended by subsequent Proclamations is herein after referred to as "the Principal Proclamation");

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers, authorities and jurisdiction conferred upon and committed to me under the Swaziland Order-in-Council 1903 as amended by the Swaziland Order-in-Council 1906 and the Swaziland Order-in-Council 1909, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. In terms of sub-section (3) of section *four* of the Principal Proclamation there shall be levied in respect of every taxable income (as therein defined) received by or accrued to or in favour of any person during the twelve months ending the thirtieth day of June, 1923, an Income Tax at the rates specified in section *four* of the Swaziland Income Tax Further Amendment Proclamation 1922.

2. Section *forty-one* of the Principal Proclamation shall be and is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:—

41. Any tax chargeable under this Proclamation shall be paid on such days and at such places as may be notified by the Collector, and may be paid in one sum or in instalments of equal or varying amounts as may be determined by the Collector having regard to the circumstances of the case;

Provided that nothing herein contained shall deprive any taxpayer of the right to pay his tax either through the post or personally at the chief office of the Collector.

3. This Proclamation may be cited for all purposes as the Swaziland Income Tax Proclamation 1923 and shall be read as one with the Principal Proclamation and shall have force and take effect on the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

## PROCLAMATION

BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

Whereas by the Southern Rhodesia Order-in-Council, 1898, the High Commissioner is empowered by Proclamation to create electoral districts and to declare what number of members shall be elected to the Legislative Council for each district;

And whereas the total number of registered voters contained in fresh lists, framed in terms of Proclamation No. 47 of the 31st July, 1914, requires that the present number of members to be elected to the Legislative Council should be increased by two;

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. The territory of Southern Rhodesia shall be divided into fifteen areas, which are hereby created electoral districts, in each of which one member shall be elected to the Legislative Council.
