REBATES AND REFUNDS OF CUSTOMS DUTIES.

I. UNIFORMS FOR NURSES' ASSOCIATIONS.

1. A rebate of the full duty shall be allowed on appointments and uniforms and materials for uniforms imported by or on behalf of any recognized nurses' association, and on material for uniforms imported by or on behalf of any recognized boy scout association, boys' naval brigade, or boys' brigade, on a certificate signed by the secretary or officer in charge of such association or brigade that the articles are intended solely for the use of members of such association or brigade, or that the materials are intended solely for the manufacture of uniforms for such use, and on an undertaking that, if any of these articles or materials are otherwise sold or disposed of in the Union or in the territory, the duty rebated thereon will forthwith be paid to the Director of Customs.

2. The secretary or officer referred to in paragraph 1 shall keep a book showing the receipts and disposals of such appointments, uniforms, and materials, which book shall be open for inspection to an officer of customs at any time.

3. In the case of materials the book shall also show the quantities received, the number of uniforms made therefrom, and the disposal of such uniforms.

II. REGALIA FOR FRIENDLY SOCIETIES.

1. A rebate of the full duty shall be allowed on regalia imported by any recognized friendly society (excluding freemasons and similar societies) on a certificate signed by the secretary or person in charge of such society that the articles are intended solely for the use of members of such society, and on an undertaking that, if any of these articles are otherwise sold or disposed of in the Union or in the territory, the duty rebated thereon will forthwith be paid to the Director of Customs.

2. The secretary or person referred to in paragraph 1 shall keep a book showing the receipts and disposals of such regalia, which book shall be open for inspection to an officer of customs at any time.

Any person who fails to comply with the provisions of this Notice in respect of rebates of duty shall, in terms of section *fifty-nine* of the Customs Management Proclamation, 1914, be liable to a fine not exceeding three hundred pounds and to the forfeiture of the goods.

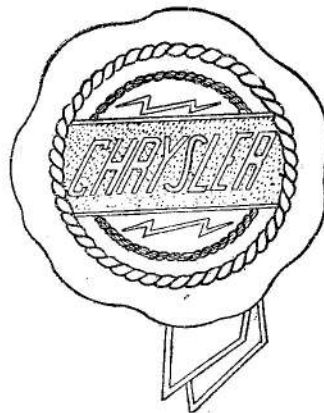
