## **PROCLAMATION**

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Official Secrets (Bechuanaland Protectorate) Proclamation, 1922 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Proclamation"):

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

- New 1. Section five of the said Proclamation is section 5 of Proclama-hereby repealed and the following section is ton No. 69 substituted therefor:—
  - 5. (1) Where a commissioned police officer is satisfied that there is reasonable ground for suspecting that an offence under section one of the Official Secrets (Bechuanaland Protectorate) Proclamation, 1914, has been committed and for believing that any person is able to furnish information as to the offence or suspected offence, he may apply to the Resident Commissioner for permission to exercise the powers conferred by this sub-section and, if such permission is granted, he may authorise any European police officer of or above the rank of Corporal to require the person believed to be able to furnish information to give any information in his power relating to the offence or suspected offence, and, if so required and on tender of his reasonable expenses, to attend at such reasonable time and place as may be specified by a commissioned police officer; and if a person required in pursuance of such an authorisation to give information, or to attend as aforesaid, fails to comply with any such requirement or knowingly gives false information, he shall be guilty of an offence.
- (2) Where a commissioned police officer has reasonable grounds to believe that the case is one of great emergency and that in the interest of the State immediate action is necessary, he may exercise the powers conferred by the last foregoing sub-section without applying for or being granted the permission of the Resident Commissioner, but if he does so he shall forthwith report the circumstances to the Resident Commissioner.
- 2. This Proclamation may be cited as the short title Bechuanaland Protectorate Official Secrets and commencement. (Amendment) Proclamation, 1940, and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the Gazette.

- (2) Where the Chief of Police has reasonable grounds to believe that the case is one of great emergency and that in the interest of the State immediate action is necessary, he may exercise the powers conferred by the last foregoing sub-section without applying for or being granted the permission of the Resident Commissioner, but if he does so he shall forthwith report the circumstances to the Resident Commis-
- (3) References in this section to the Chief of Police shall be construed as including references to any other officer of police expressly authorised by the Chief of Police to act on his behalf for the purposes of this section when by reason of illness, absence, or other cause he is unable to do so."

## PROCLAMATION

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers, authorities and jurisdiction conferred upon and committed to me by His Majesty under the Swaziland Order-in-Council 1903, as amended by the Swaziland Order-in-Council 1906, and the Swaziland Order-in-Council 1909, and by virtue of the further authority conferred upon me under the Swaziland Crown Lands and Minerals Order-in-Council 1908, as amended by the Swaziland Crown Lands and Minerals Amendment Order-in-Council 1910, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:-

The area of land in Swaziland described in the Schedule to this Proclamation shall, from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Gazette be Crown land and shall be registered and known as numbered in the said Schedule, provided always that the proclamation of the said area as Crown land shall not affect any concession, lease, servitude or other right subsisting in respect of the said area which is registered at the date of such publication and is not vested in the Crown.

OFFICIAL SECRETS ACT, 1939.

CHAPTER 121.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION SIX OF THE OFFICIAL SECRETS ACT, 1920.

(23rd November, 1939.)

Be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

Amend 1. For section six of the Official Secrets and 1. Act, 1920, there shall be substituted the Geo. 5. c. 75, s. 6. following section:—

- "6. (1) Where a chief officer of police is satisfied that there is reasonable ground for suspecting that an offence under section one of the principal Act has been committed and for believing that any person is able to furnish information as to the offence or suspected offence, he may apply to a Secretary of State for permission to exercise the powers conferred by this sub-section and, if such permission is granted, he may authorise a superintendent of police, or any police officer not below the rank of inspec-tor, to require the person believed to be able to furnish information to give any information in his power relating to the offence or suspected offence, and, if so required and on tender of his reasonable expenses, to attend at such reasonable time and place as may be specified by the superintendent or other officer; and if a person required in pursuance of such an authorisation to give information, or to attend as aforesaid, fails to comply with any such requirement or knowingly gives false information, he shall be guilty of a misdemeanour.
- (2) Where a chief officer of police has reasonable grounds to believe that the case is one of great emergency and that in the interest of the State immediate action is necessary, he may exercise the powers conferred by the last foregoing sub-section without applying for or being granted the permission of a Secretary of State, but if he does so shall forthwith report the circumstances to the Secretary of State.
- (3) References in this section to a chief officer of police shall be construed as including references to any other officer of police expressly authorised by a chief officer of police to act on his behalf for the purposes of this section when by reason of illness, absence, or other cause he is unable to do so."

2. (1) This Act may be cited as the Official short title Secrets Act, 1939, and this Act and the construction. Official Secrets Acts, 1911 and 1920, shall be official short title construed as one, and may be cited together cation to as the Official Secrets Acts, 1911 to 1939.

(2) It is hereby declared that this Act extends to Northern Ireland; and, in the application thereof to Northern Ireland, this Act shall have effect subject to the following modifications, that is to say, for references to a chief officer of police there shall be substi-tuted references to a district inspector, for references to a Secretary of State there shall be substituted references to the Minister of Home Affairs, and for the reference to the rank of inspector there shall be substituted a reference to the rank of head constable.


