RADIOWYSIGINGSWET, 1974.

WET

Tot wysiging van die Radiowet, 1952, ten einde die bevoegdheid van die Staatspresident om regulasies uit te vaardig betreffende die beheer en voorkoming van versteuring van radio-ontvangs en om sekere gelde voor te skryf, uit te brei; en om voorsiening te maak vir aangeleenthede wat daarmee in verband staan.

DAAR WORD BEPAAL deur die Staatspresident, die Senaat en die Volksraad van die Republiek van Suid-Afrika, soos volg:—

Wysiging van artikel 15 van Wet 3 van 1952, soos vervang deur artikel 14 van Wet 67 van 1968 en gewysig deur artikel 11 van Wet 93 van 1969.

1. Artikel 15 van die Radiowet, 1952, word hierby gewysig deur subartikel (1) deur die volgende subartikel te vervang:

„(1) Behoudens die bepalinge van die regulasies, word alle gelde ingevolge hierdie Wet ingevorder, in die Poskantoorfonds gestort.”.

Wysiging van artikel 18 van Wet 3 van 1952, soos gewysig deur artikel 14 van Wet 93 van 1969.

2. Artikel 18 van die Radiowet, 1952, word hierby gewysig deur paragraaf (e) van subartikel (1) deur die volgende paragraaf te vervang:

„(e) die beheer oor en voorkoming van elektriese of ander versteurings van radio-ontvangs; die verlening aan bepaalde persone of klasse persone of persone in diens van en aangewys deur liggame by wet ingestel of persone deur die Posmeester-generaal aangewys, van bevoegdheid om appaarte wat sodanige versteurings veroorsaak of kan veroorsaak, te ondersoek en sertifikate in verband daarmee uit te reik; die gelde wat in verband met sodanige ondersoeke of die uitreiking van sodanige sertifikate betaalbaar is; die beskikking oor sodanige gelde; die betreding van persele en ondersoek van persele en goed en die ondervraging van persone deur genoemde persone vir die doeleindes van die verrigting van hul werksaamhede ingevolge hierdie Wet; die uitwerking, met betrekking tot padwaardigheid, van appaarte in of aan motorvoertuie wat nie aan die vereistes van die regulasies voldoen nie;”.

Kort titel en inwerkingtreding.

3. Hierdie Wet heet die Radiowysigingswet, 1974, en tree in werking op 'n datum wat die Staatspresident by proklamasie in die *Staatskoerant* bepaal, wat ook 'n datum voor die afkondiging van hierdie Wet in die *Staatskoerant* kan wees.

RADIO AMENDMENT ACT, 1974.

Act No. 50, 1974

ACT

To amend the Radio Act, 1952, so as to extend the powers of the State President to make regulations relating to the control and prevention of interference with radio reception and to prescribe certain fees; and to provide for matters connected therewith.

(Assented to 9 October 1974.)

BE IT ENACTED by the State President, the Senate and the House of Assembly of the Republic of South Africa, as follows:—

1. Section 15 of the Radio Act, 1952, is hereby amended by the substitution for subsection (1) of the following subsection:
- “(1) Subject to the provisions of the regulations, all moneys collected under this Act shall be paid into the Post Office Fund.”.
2. Section 18 of the Radio Act, 1952, is hereby amended by the substitution for paragraph (e) of subsection (1) of the following paragraph:
- “(e) the control and prevention of electrical or other interference with radio reception; the conferring on specified persons or classes of persons or persons employed and designated by bodies established by law or persons designated by the Postmaster-General, of the power to examine apparatuses causing or capable of causing such interference and to issue certificates in connection therewith; the fees payable in connection with such examinations or the issue of such certificates; the disposal of such fees; the entering upon premises and examination of premises and things and the interrogation of persons by the said persons for the purpose of the performance of their functions in terms of this Act; the effect, with reference to road-worthiness, of apparatuses in or on motor vehicles not complying with the requirements of the regulations;”.
3. This Act shall be called the Radio Amendment Act, 1974, and shall come into operation on a date fixed by the State President by proclamation in the *Gazette*, which may also be a date prior to the promulgation of this Act in the *Gazette*.

“(c) the control and prevention of electrical or other interference with radio reception; the conferring on specified persons or classes of persons or persons employed and designated by the Postmaster-General, or persons designated by the Postmaster-General, of the power to examine apparatus causing or capable of causing such interference and to issue certificates in connection therewith; the fees payable in connection with such examinations or the issue of such certificates; the disposal of such fees; the entering upon premises and examination of premises and things and the interrogation of persons by the said persons for the purpose of the performance of their functions in terms of this Act; the effect with reference to roadworthiness, of apparatuses in or on motor vehicles not complying with the requirements of the regulations.”
Amendment of section 18 of Act 3 of 1952 as amended by section 14 of Act 93 of 1969.

3. This Act shall be called the Radio Amendment Act, 1974, and shall come into operation on a date fixed by the State President by proclamation in the Gazette, which may also be a date prior to the promulgation of this Act in the Gazette.
