"examination", for purposes of this rule only, shall mean an evaluation by the Council of any qualification and any written or oral examination held to determine whether any particular qualification complies with the requirements for recognition in terms of sections 11, 12, 13 or 14 of the Act and shall also mean any written or oral examination prescribed by the Council in terms of sections 11, 12 or 14 of the Act;

"listing fee", shall mean the fee payable to the Council for the listing, as a lift inspector, by a person who is already registered in terms of sections 11, 12, 13 and 14 of the Act, and who applies for such listing after passing an examination prescribed by the Council in terms of section 14 of the Act;

"date of obtaining a qualification", shall mean date on which a qualification is awarded by an education provider at a formal ceremony, and in the case of a certificated engineer, the date shall be the date specified on the certificate of competency issued by the appropriate authority .

"the Act" shall mean the Engineering Profession of South Africa Act, 1990 (Act 114 of 1990); and

"year" shall mean the period commencing on 1 April of any year and ending on 31 March of the succeeding year.

2. Application fee

"In-training" categories

 - (a) **R800.00** including VALUE ADDED TAX, in the case of a person referred to in Rule 2(1)(a) whose registration remained uninterrupted for the full period of registration;
 - (b) **R690.00** including VALUE ADDED TAX, in the case of a person contemplated in Rule 2(1)(b) whose registration remained uninterrupted for the full period of registration; and
 - (c) **R1 100.00** including VALUE ADDED TAX, in the case of a person who has not been registered in any of the "in-training" categories contemplated in Rule 2(1).
- (3) Where the Council prescribes an examination, the application fee shall be the application fee as prescribed in Rule 2(1) or (2), as the case may be, and, in addition to such fee, the following fees, which includes VALUE ADDED TAX, shall be payable as applicable to each particular case:
 - (a) in respect of an oral examination prescribed by the Council in terms of section 11(1) and (3), 12(1) and (3) and 14(1) and (2).....**R1175,00**
 - (b) in respect of a paper evaluation or an oral examination to determine whether any particular qualification complies with the Council's requirements for recognition in terms of sections 11(1)(b)(i), 12(1)(b)(i), 13(1)(b)(i) and 14(1)(b)(i).....**R 310,00**

- (4) Upon successful completion of an examination prescribed in terms of section 14 of the Act, the application fee for listing as a lift inspector shall be **R470.00**, which includes VALUE ADDED TAX.

3. Annual fee

"In-training" categories

- (1) Subject to Rule 3(2), the annual fee for a person registered as an engineer in training, an engineering technologist in training, a certificated engineer in training or an engineering technician in training, shall be
- (a) **R260.00**, including VALUE ADDED TAX, in the case of a person who produces proof of current membership of an institute, institution, society or association recognised by ECSA for purposes of exemption from payment of a portion of the annual fee; and
 - (b) **R350.00**, including VALUE ADDED TAX, in the case of a person who is not a member of a recognised institute, institution, society or association, or who fails to produce proof of such current membership.
- (2) The *annual fee* of a person contemplated in sub-rule (1) who has been registered in that category for longer than six years shall be the annual fee payable in terms of Rule 3(3)(a) or (b) as the case may be: Provided that the Council may, upon receipt of a written motivation, exempt such person from paying such fee on such conditions which it may deem equitable.

Professional categories

- (3) The *annual fee* in respect of a person registered as a professional engineer, a professional technologist (engineering), a registered certificated engineer or a registered engineering technician shall be –
- (a) **R590.00**, including VALUE ADDED TAX, in the case of a person who produces proof of current membership of an institute, institution, society or association recognised by ECSA for purposes of exemption from payment of a portion of the annual fee; and
 - (b) **R850.00** including VALUE ADDED TAX, in the case of a person who is not a member of a recognised institute, institution, society or association, or who fails to produce proof of such current membership.

Duplicate registration certificate

4. The fee for issuing a duplicate registration certificate shall be **R156.00**, which includes VALUE ADDED TAX: Provided that a duplicate registration certificate shall only be issued to the person to whom the original certificate was issued: Provided further that such duplicate registration certificate shall only be issued if

the applicant submits an affidavit to the effect that the original certificate was not received through the post or, if it was so received, that such certificate was lost, that every effort had been made to trace it and that he or she had nevertheless not succeeded in finding the certificate concerned.


