NOTICE 1610 OF 2001 BOARD ON TARIFFS AND TRADE

NOTICE OF INITIATION OF A REVIEW OF THE ANTI-DUMPING DUTIES ON POLYTETRAFLUOROETHYLENE (PTFE) TAPE ORIGINATING IN OR IMPORTED FROM THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

In accordance with the provisions in Article 11.3 of the World Trade Organisation Agreement on Implementation of Article VI of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, any definitive anti-dumping duty shall be terminated on a date not later than five years from its imposition, unless the authorities determine, in a review initiated before that date on their own initiative or upon a duly substantiated request made by or on behalf of the domestic industry within a reasonable period of time prior to that date, that the expiry of the duty would be likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of dumping and injury.

On 28 July 2000, the Board on Tariffs and Trade (the Board) notified all interested parties, through Notice No. 2666 of Government Gazette No. 21396, than unless a request is made by or on behalf of the domestic industry for the duty to be reviewed prior to the expiry thereof, the anti-dumping duty on polytetrafluoroethylene (PTFE) tape (the subject product) originating in or imported from the People's Republic of China (China) will expire on 18 October 2001.

A duly completed Petition Review Questionnaire was submitted to the Board on 18 April 2001.

THE PETITIONER

The petition was lodged by RIC Manufacturing, being the sole manufacturer of the subject product in the SACU. The Petitioner alleges that the expiry of the duty would be likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of dumping and injury. The Petitioner submitted sufficient evidence and established a *prima facie* case to enable the Board to arrive at a reasonable conclusion that a review investigation should be initiated.

THE PRODUCT

The product under investigation is polytetrafluoroethylene (PTFE) tape, commonly known as plumbers tape or teflon tape, classifiable under tariff subheading 3920.99.25, originating in or imported from China.

THE ALLEGATION OF THE CONTINUATION OR RECURRENCE OF DUMPING

The allegation of continuation or recurrence of dumping is based on the comparison between the normal value in and the export price from China. As the Board considers China as a non-market economy, Italy was used as the surrogate country for China for purposes of determining the normal value. The normal value was determined based on a quote received from a manufacturer in Italy for its product when sold in Italy. The export price was determined based on a quote from a manufacturer in China, if the product is to be exported from China to the SACU. On this basis, the Board found that there was *prima facie* proof of the recurrence of dumping if the duty expires.

THE ALLEGATION OF THE CONTINUATION OR RECURRENCE OF MATERIAL INJURY

The Petitioner alleges and submitted sufficient evidence to show that there is price undercutting and that the prices of the imports in question are suppressing its selling prices. The Petitioner further indicated that its prices will be depressed once the duty expires. The Petitioner's information indicated that it will experience a decline in sales, profit margins (to a loss situation), output, market share, productivity and capacity utilisation, if the duty expires. It was also indicated that the Petitioner's market share will decrease at the expense of a corresponding increase in the market share of the dumped goods. On this basis the Board found that there was *prima facie* proof of the continuation and/or recurrence of material injury.

PERIOD OF INVESTIGATION

The period of investigation for purposes of determining the continuation or recurrence of dumping from the exporting country of origin will be from 1 January 2000 to 31 December 2000. The period of investigation for purposes of determining continuation

or recurrence of injury will be for the years 1996 to 2000 and for the period January to December of each year. An estimate of what the situation will be if the duty expires will also be considered by the Board.

PROCEDURAL FRAMEWORK

Having decided that there is sufficient evidence and a *prima facie* case to justify the initiation of an investigation, the Board has begun an investigation in terms of section 4 of the Board on Tariffs and Trade Act, 1986 (the BTT Act). NOTICE OF FINAL TERMINATION OF AN INVESTIGATION INTO THE ALLEGED DUMPING OF GRINDING MEDIA ORIGINATING IN OR IMPORTED FROM AUSTRALIA AND THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

The Board on Tariffs and Trade (the Board) gave public notice of its investigation into the alleged dumping of grinding media originating in or imported from Australia and the People's Republic of China (PRC) in *Government Gazette* No. 20946 dated 10 March 2000 (Notice No. 967 of 2000).

On the basis of the information available the Board made a preliminary determination that the investigation be terminated and published its intention in *Government Gazette* No. 21733 on 17 November 2000.

The Board's Report No. 4072, explaining the preliminary determination, was forwarded to all interested parties.

After considering all parties' comments and representations in respect of the preliminary report, the Board made a final determination, as contained in its Report No. 4108, to terminate the investigation, which was accepted by the Minister of Trade and Industry (Minister).

The Board found that grinding media was being dumped into the domestic market, that the SACU industry suffered material injury, and that although there was a causal link between the dumping and the material injury experienced by the SACU industry, the efficiency and quality of the imported product through its technology and the cost benefit of using this product, sufficiently detracted from the causal link. The Board also found the volume of the low cost imports from Zimbabwe significant and concluded that it detracted from causal link.

Conclusion

The Board therefore made a final determination to recommend to the Minister that the investigation into the alleged dumping of grinding media originating in or imported from Australia and the People's Republic of China (PRC) be terminated.

Based on the report and the information submitted, the Minister of Trade and Industry made a final determination that the investigation be terminated.
