DETERMINATION OF THE LIMITS AND CONDITIONS FOR THIRD PARTY NAMED PORTFOLIOS OF COLLECTIVE INVESTMENT SCHEMES

FINANCIAL SERVICES BOARD

Under section 46(2) of the Collective Investment Schemes Control Act, 2002 (Act No. 45 of 2002), I, Dube Phineas Tshidi, the Registrar of Collective Investment Schemes, after consultation with the Collective Investment Schemes Advisory Committee established in terms of section 8 of the Act, have determined in the Schedule the limits and conditions applicable to Third Party Named Portfolios of Collective Investment Schemes.

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SCHEDULE

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PREAMBLE

Prior to the enactment of the Collective Investment Schemes Control Act, 2002 a practice colloquially described as "white labelling" emerged within the collective investment schemes industry. This was the practice whereby a third party, who did not have the capacity or the intention to establish a collective investment scheme, requested a manager to establish a portfolio in the name of the third party under the manager's registered collective investment scheme.

It is considered desirable that this practice be more closely regulated in order to protect the interests of investors:

Section 46(2) of the Act empowers the Registrar to determine the manner, limits and conditions applicable to portfolios of collective investment schemes;

This Notice regulates third party named portfolios by *inter alia* providing for two categories of arrangements which will be allowed, namely incubator portfolios where the financial services provider intends to become a manager and co-named portfolios where the financial services provider has no intention to become a manager. The reason for the differentiation is to assist emerging entities to attain the required level of skills and experience to be authorised as managers in their own right. If the intention of the financial services provider is not to, eventually, as prescribed in this Notice, register as a manager, the collective investment scheme manager, who remains ultimately responsible for the portfolio, must connect its name to the portfolio. Transparency is therefore achieved by disclosure requirements. Portfolios sizes will be regulated to ensure viable portfolios. Finally it must be ensured that the core business of a manager remains the administration of its own portfolios rather than providing a platform for third party portfolios to which its name is not connected.

PART I

1. Application of Notice

This Notice does not apply to authorised agents and third party arrangements other than the situation where the name of a financial services provider is utilised in the name of a portfolio.

2. Definitions

In this Schedule, "Act" means the Collective Investment Schemes Control Act, 2002. Any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Act has that meaning and, unless the context otherwise indicates—

"co- named portfolio" means a portfolio bearing the name of both the manager and the financial services provider and where the financial services provider undertakes financial services of a discretionary nature, as contemplated in the Financial Advisory and Intermediary Services Act, 2002 in relation to the assets of the portfolio;

"financial services provider" means a discretionary financial services provider as defined in section 2 of the Code of Conduct for Administrative Financial Services Providers promulgated in terms of the Financial Advisory and Intermediary Services Act, 2002, and who is acting as an authorised agent of the manager;

"incubator portfolio" means a portfolio bearing the name of a financial services provider who intends to apply to the Registrar to be approved as a manager within three years after the Registrar has approved the portfolio, and where the financial services provider undertakes financial services of a discretionary nature, as contemplated in the Financial Advisory and Intermediary Services Act, 2002, in relation to the assets of the portfolio;

"registered name of portfolio" means the name under which the portfolio was approved by the Registrar in terms of section 42, read with section 98 of the Act;

"third party named portfolio" means an incubator portfolio or co-named portfolio established in terms of an agreement.

PART II

INCUBATOR PORTFOLIOS

3. Application

An application by a manager to establish an incubator portfolio must be made in accordance with the provisions of section 42 read with section 98 of the Act, and be accompanied by

- (a) A business plan including the following:-
 - (i) the projected size of the portfolio over a five-year period:
 - (ii) an indication of where assets will be sourced:
 - (iii) a description of any possible area of conflict of interest, and the actions to be taken in circumstances of a conflict of interest:
 - (iv) a description of the marketing and distribution strategies; and
 - (v) a description of systems and resources to be used.

and

(b) An agreement contemplated in paragraph 6 of this Notice.

4. Naming

An incubator portfolio must bear the name of the financial services provider with whom the manager has entered into an agreement as contemplated in paragraph 6 of this Notice.

5. Duration

- (1) The Registrar approves the name of an incubator portfolio for a period of three years.
- (2) During the three-year period, referred to in sub-paragraph 1, and not more than six months after expiry of the three year period, the financial services provider must lodge an application for registration as a manager of a collective investment scheme in securities as contemplated in section 42 of the Act.
- (3) If an application contemplated in sub-paragraph (2) is not lodged within the period prescribed in sub-paragraph (2), the manager must apply to the Registrar to-
 - (a) wind up the portfolio in accordance with section 102 of the Act; or
 - (b) amalgamate the portfolio with one of its portfolios in accordance with section 99 of the Act; or
 - (c) rename the portfolio in accordance with section 43(1) of the Act to reflect the registered name of the manager.
- (4) The manager may apply for an extension of the three-year period on good cause shown, provided that the total duration of the portfolio name may not exceed five years from the date of initial approval of that name. The application for extension must be lodged with the Registrar before expiry of the three-year period referred to in sub-paragraph (1).

6. Agreements

- (1) A manager must enter into an agreement with the financial services provider, which agreement must:-
 - (a) stipulate the three-year period for which the agreement will subsist;
 - (b) identify and address all possible areas of conflict of interest between the parties;
 - (c) indicate the functions of the respective parties in relation to the portfolio, including all sub-contracting arrangements;
 - (d) outline how the manager will capitalise the portfolio should it not reach the minimum size as contemplated in paragraph 12;
 - (e) stipulate that the manager shall commit to the incubator portfolio as if it were one of its own portfolios, in accordance with all relevant legislation;
 - (f) indicate that on termination of the agreement the portfolio remains the responsibility of the manager who shall continue to meet its commitment to investors and that it will rename, amalgamate or wind-up the portfolio in accordance with the Act;
 - (g) stipulate the extent to which the financial services provider will be entitled to participate in the manager's foreign allowance as contemplated in Exchange Control Regulations;
 - (h) stipulate that the manager's identity and role in the portfolio must be disclosed to investors;
 - (i) stipulate that the financial services provider may not enter into a similar agreement with another manager;

- (j) stipulate that the manager remains responsible for compliance with the Act and that the compliance function of the manager may not be outsourced or delegated to another party;
- (k) stipulate that the portfolio may only be marketed under its registered name;
- (I) stipulate that the financial services provider must render financial services of a discretionary nature in relation to the assets of the portfolio.
- (2) Subject to the provisions of sections 42, read with section 98(2) of the Act and paragraph 3 of this Notice, the manager must submit the agreement to the Registrar.
- (3) A manager may not amend the agreement without prior written notice to the Registrar.
- (4) Should the parties terminate the agreement, prior to the expiration of the three year period the manager must, within ten working days of the date of termination, inform the Registrar, in writing, that the agreement has been terminated and immediately take the steps stipulated in paragraph 5(3) of this Notice.

7. Disclosure

The manager must ensure that the financial services provider has procedures in place to adequately disclose, in all communications to investors, the following:-

- (a) the identity of the manager, including its contact information; and
- (b) its role and responsibility as manager of the portfolio

8. Portfolios under Administration

A manager may not have more than 30% of its number of portfolios comprised of incubator portfolios, nor may a manager have more than 30% of its total assets under management in incubator portfolios.

PART III

CO-NAMED PORTFOLIOS

9. Application

An application by a manager to establish a co-named portfolio must be made in accordance with the provisions of section 42, read with section 98 of the Act, and be accompanied by:

- (a) a business plan including the following:-
 - (i) the projected size of the portfolio over a five-year period;
 - (ii) an indication of where assets will be sourced;
 - (iii) a description of any possible area of conflict of interest and the actions to be taken in circumstances of a conflict of interest;
 - (iv) a description of the marketing and distribution strategies; and
 - (v) a description of systems and resources to be used.

and

(b) An agreement, as contemplated in paragraph 11.

10. Naming

A co-named portfolio must bear the name of both the financial services provider and the manager.

11. Agreements

- (1) A manager must enter into an agreement with the financial services provider, which agreement must:-
 - (a) identify and address all possible areas of conflict of interest between the parties;
 - (b) indicate the functions of the respective parties in relation to the portfolio including all sub-contracting arrangements;
 - (c) outline how the manager will capitalise the portfolio should it not reach the minimum size as contemplated in paragraph 12;
 - stipulate that the manager shall commit to the portfolio as if it were one of its own portfolios, in accordance with all relevant legislation;
 - (e) indicate that on termination of the agreement the portfolio remains the responsibility of the manager who shall continue to meet its commitment to investors and to rename, amalgamate or wind-up the portfolio;
 - (f) stipulate the extent to which the financial services provider will be entitled to participate in the manager's foreign allowance as contemplated in Exchange Control Regulations;
 - (g) stipulate that the manager's identity and role in the portfolio will be disclosed to the investor:
 - (h) stipulate that the financial services provider may not enter into a similar agreement with another manager;
 - stipulate that the manager remains responsible for compliance with the Act and that the compliance function of the manager shall not be outsourced or delegated to another party;
 - (j) stipulate that the portfolio may only be marketed under its registered name; and
 - (k) stipulate that the financial services provider must render financial services of a discretionary nature in relation to the assets of the portfolio.
- (2) Subject to the provisions of section 42, read with section 98, of the Act and paragraph 9 of this Notice, the manager must submit the agreement to the Registrar.
- (3) A manager may not amend the agreement without prior written notice to the Registrar.
- (4) Should the parties terminate the agreement, the manager must, within ten working days of the date of termination, inform the Registrar, in writing, that the agreement has been terminated and the manager must apply to the Registrar to:

- (a) wind up the portfolio in accordance with section 102 of the Act; or
- (b) amalgamate the portfolio with one of its portfolios in accordance with section 99 of the Act; or
- (c) rename the portfolio in accordance with section 43(1) of the Act to reflect only the registered name of the manager.

PART IV

GENERAL PROVISIONS

12. Minimum Size of Portfolios

- (1) The assets under management of a third party named portfolio, may not be less than R50 million after a period of three-years from date of approval of the name of the portfolio.
- (2) If the assets under management of the third party named portfolio have not reached R50 million on expiry of the three year period referred to at sub-paragraph 1, the manager must apply to the Registrar to:-
 - (a) wind up the portfolio in accordance with section 102 of the Act; or
 - (b) amalgamate the portfolio with one of its portfolios in accordance with section 99 of the Act.

13. Duplicate Portfolios

A manager may not appoint a financial services provider to provide financial services in respect of one of the manager's own portfolios if that financial services provider is providing financial services in respect of an incubator or co-named portfolio of a similar nature within the manager's collective investment scheme.

14. Transitional Arrangements

- (1) This Notice applies to all applications, whether submitted to the Registrar or not.
- (2) A manager of a third party named portfolio previously known as a white label portfolio, approved by the Registrar before the commencement of this Notice, must submit an application to the Registrar in accordance with the provisions of this Notice to approve such portfolio as either an incubator portfolio or a co-named portfolio.
- (3) The manager of a portfolio, referred in sub-paragraph (2), that has been in existence for more than five years may not apply for such portfolio to be approved as an incubator portfolio. If the financial services provider whose name is linked to the portfolio does not apply to be registered as a manager, the manager of the portfolio must either apply to co-name the portfolio or apply for such portfolio to be wound up or amalgamated in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

(4) Applications referred to in sub-paragraphs (2) and (3) must be submitted to the Registrar within twelve months of commencement of this Notice.

15. Short Title

This Notice is called the Determination of the Limits and Conditions for Third Party Named Portfolios of Collective Investment Schemes.

RULES FOR INQUIRY INTO ALLEGED IMPROPER CONDUCT: ENGINEERING PROFESSION ACT, 2000 (ACT NO. 46 OF 2000)

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SCHEDULE

Introduction

- 1. It is acknowledged that the *Council* is mandated to take any steps it considers necessary for the protection of the public and the environment in their dealings with *registered persons* for the maintenance of the integrity and the enhancement of the status of the engineering profession.
- 2. In pursuance of the Council's right and obligation mentioned in 1 above, the Council must investigate an act of alleged improper conduct by a registered person and/or investigate a complaint, charge or allegation of improper conduct against a registered person brought by any person.
- 3. An investigation mentioned in 2 above is directed towards the professional conduct of a registered person, and does not intend to recover damages on behalf of any person, or enforce specific performance against any person and as such, is not meant to replace civil and/or criminal litigation.
- 4. It is furthermore acknowledged that the *Council* may take any steps which it considers necessary where, as a result of engineering related undertakings, public health and safety is prejudiced.

- Where a registered person or persons registered with different Built Environment Professions
 are involved in the same subject of investigation, the Council will share relevant information with
 such other Councils and Stakeholders.
- 6. These rules are to be read with the Act.

Definitions

In these *rules*, any expression or word which has been defined in *the Act* has that meaning and, unless the context otherwise, indicates –

"Act" means the Engineering Profession Act, 46 of 2000.

"Advisory letter" means correspondence with a respondent advising of concerns raised by the investigating committee regarding the respondent's professional behaviour.

"CEO" means the person appointed as Chief Executive Officer under section 8(1)(a) of the Act

"Complainant" means a person or body lodging a complaint in terms of rule 1(1) hereof.

"Council" means the Engineering Council of South Africa established in terms of section 2 of the Act.

"Disciplinary tribunal" means the tribunal appointed by the Council in terms of section 30 of the Act.

"Improper conduct" means a transgression of the Code of Conduct published in terms of 27(1) of the Act.

"Inquiry" means the process of investigation in terms of these rules.

"Investigating committee" means a committee appointed by the Council under section 17 of the Act and to which the power to inquire into the conduct of a registered person under section 28 of the Act is delegated.

"Peer counselling" means a meeting held between a respondent and appropriate members of the investigating committee or their nominees to counsel the respondent on aspects of his/her conduct that are construed as unprofessional but do not warrant a disciplinary tribunal hearing.

"Pro forma complainant" means a person appointed in terms of rule 4(1)(a) of the rules to perform the duties required in terms of the Act and rules, and duties that are reasonably required to conduct disciplinary hearings and investigations.

"Registered person" means a person registered in terms of section 18 of the Act.

"Respondent" means a registered person whose conduct is the subject of an inquiry in terms of these rules.

"Rules" means these rules.

PROCEDURE PRIOR TO INQUIRY

Information and complaints of improper conduct

- (1) Any person lodging a complaint of improper conduct against a registered person with (a) the Council must lodge the complaint in the form of an affidavit or an affirmation, must detail the specific act or acts relating to the alleged improper conduct, and must submit evidence in support of it.
 - The CEO, upon receipt of a complaint referred to in paragraph (a) which prima facie (b) points to the improper conduct by a registered person or information of conduct which prima facie points to improper conduct by a registered person, must refer the complaint or the information to the investigating committee to determine whether the registered person should be charged.

2 Investigation

- The CEO must within 3 (three) working days furnish any registered person whose conduct is the subject of a complaint received in terms of rule 1 or who has committed an act which may render him or her guilty of improper conduct, a written copy of the complaint and/or information related to the conduct.
- The CEO must inform the registered person -(2)
 - (a) of the right to be represented or assisted by another person; and
 - that he/she is not obliged to make any statement and any statement so made may be (b) used in evidence against the registered person.
- (3) The investigating committee must afford the registered person the opportunity to respond to the complaint and all other evidence considered against him/her.
- (4) The investigating committee or persons assigned by the investigating committee including people appointed to investigate the complaint may, with due consideration of the provision section 28(3) of the Act, question the registered person concerned.
- (5) The investigating committee must investigate the matter and obtain evidence to determine whether or not, in its opinion, the registered person concerned should be charged and if so, recommend to the Council the charge or charges that should be preferred against that registered person.
- The investigating committee, may when it becomes aware of engineering related (6)undertakings that may prejudice public health and safety, investigate such undertakings and report to the CEO on its findings and recommendations.
- The investigating committee must consider whether the matter ought to be reported to any of (7) the other Councils in the Built Environment or to any other stakeholder.

3 Peer counselling and Advisory letters

The investigating committee, if it is of the opinion that charges should not be preferred (1) against a registered person, may resolve to conduct a peer counselling meeting with the registered person or address an advisory letter to the registered person.

(2) Peer counselling or the issuing of an advisory letter does not amount to disciplinary action in terms of section 32(3)(a) of the Engineering Profession Act.

4 Preparation for disciplinary hearing

- (1) In the event of a disciplinary hearing being decided upon by the Council -
 - the CEO must appoint a pro forma complainant who must formulate the charge in writing, arrange a disciplinary hearing and, at the disciplinary hearing, adduce all evidence in support of the charge;
 - (b) the CEO may appoint one or more persons to assist the pro forma complainant; and
 - (c) the pro forma complainant must cause a copy of these rules to be served on the respondent, as well as a charge sheet and notice of set down -
 - (i) informing the respondent of the charge;
 - requiring the respondent to attend the hearing at a stated place, date and time, which may not be earlier than 30 days after the date of service of the notice;
 and
 - (iii) inviting the respondent to file a plea to the charge sheet by no later than 14 days after receipt of the charge sheet.
 - (d) The parties shall give each other notice of the intention to call expert witnesses and by not later than 7 (seven) days before the hearing, provide a summary of such expert evidence to the other party.
- (2) The summons for the *respondent* referred to in *sub rule* (1)(c) must be substantially in the form of Annexure A, and must be served on the *respondent* by the sheriff concerned or in any of the manners described in *rule* 5 below.
- (3) The summons for a witness to attend a disciplinary hearing contemplated in section 31(3) of the Act must be substantially in the form of Annexure B.

5 Service of documents

- (1) A party must serve a document on the other party:
 - (a) by handing a copy of the document to-
 - (i) the person concerned;
 - (ii) a representative authorised in writing to accept service on behalf of the person;
 - (iii) a person who appears to be at least 16 years old and in charge of the person's place of residence, business premises or place of employment at the time;
 - (b) by leaving a copy of the document at an address chosen by the person to receive service;
 - by faxing or emailing a copy of the document to the person's fax number or email address or a number chosen by that person to receive service;
 - (d) by sending a copy of the document by registered post or telegram to the last known address of the party or an address chosen by the party to receive service.

6 Proof of service

- A party must prove to the disciplinary tribunal that a document was served in terms of these rules by, providing the tribunal:
 - with a copy of proof of mailing the document by registered post to the other party; or (a)
 - with a telegram or fax communicating the document to the other party; or (b)
 - with a copy of the fax transmission report indicating the successful transmission to the (c) other party of the whole document; or
 - if a document was served by hand-(d)
 - with a copy of a receipt signed by, or on behalf of, the other party clearly (i) indicating the name and designation of the recipient and the place, time and date of service; or
 - with a statement confirming service signed by the person who delivered a copy (ii) of the document to the other party or left it at any premises; or
 - (e) if a document was sent by electronic mail, electronic acknowledgement of receipt by the respondent or other party.
- (2) If proof of service in accordance with sub rule (1) is provided, it is presumed, until the contrary is proved, that the party on whom it was served has knowledge of the contents of the document.
- The disciplinary tribunal may accept proof of service in a manner other than prescribed in (3) this rule as sufficient.

PLEA AGREEMENTS

- 7 (1) A respondent desirous to plead guilty, may enter into a plea agreement with the pro forma complainant with due consideration to the following factors:
 - the nature and circumstances of the transgression: (a)
 - (b) personal circumstances of the respondent;
 - whether the respondent was found guilty of related transgressions in the past; (c)
 - (d) the interest of the community;
 - remedial work done and/or required to rectify the condition caused by the (e) respondent's conduct; and/or
 - any other relevant considerations.
 - (2)Plea agreements:
 - must be in writing and signed by the pro forma complainant and the respondent or (a) his/her legal representative.
 - are subject to approval by the disciplinary tribunal. (b)
 - The disciplinary tribunal must consider and approve or reject a plea agreement entered into (3) in terms of 7(2) above. If the plea agreement is approved, a sanction is imposed in accordance with the plea agreement. If the agreement is rejected, the matter shall be referred to a disciplinary hearing as if the respondent had pleaded not guilty.

DISCIPLINARY TRIBUNALS

- **8** (1) The function to appoint a *disciplinary tribunal* in terms of section 30 of the *Act* is delegated to the *CEO*.
 - (2) The CEO shall appoint a disciplinary tribunal at the request of the pro forma complainant.

PROCEDURE AT DISCIPLINARY HEARING

- 9 (1) The pro forma complainant shall present the case on behalf of the Council.
 - (2) The presiding officer of a disciplinary tribunal shall, subject to sections 31 and 32 of the Act, and having regard to the seriousness, complexity and urgency of the charges, determine the procedure to be followed at the hearing before it, after hearing both sides.
 - (3) At the start of the hearing, the presiding officer shall put the charge or charges to the respondent and request him or her to plead to such charge or charges.
 - (4) If the *respondent* pleads guilty to the charge or charges, the *disciplinary tribunal* may find the *respondent* guilty without hearing evidence, or if it deems it necessary, after hearing evidence and argument.
 - (5) After a finding of guilty and before sanction, any previous convictions of the *respondent* may be presented to the *disciplinary tribunal*.
 - (6) Should the respondent fail to attend the hearing without good cause, the disciplinary tribunal may proceed to hear evidence and argument, and may find the respondent guilty, provided that the disciplinary tribunal is convinced that the charge sheet has been served on the respondent.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

10 Repeal of rules

The *rules* on the Method of Inquiry into alleged Improper Conduct published in Board Notice 106 of 1997 are hereby repealed.

11 These *rules* are called the Rules for Inquiry into Alleged Improper Conduct: Engineering Profession Act, 2000 (Act No. 46 of 2000).
