GENERAL NOTICE: NUMBER AUDIT SUBMISSION FORMAT

The Independent Communications Authority of South Africa ("the Authority") hereby gives notice that it requires licensees to submit numbering data in terms of the Electronic Communications Act of 2005 Subsection 68 (6) for audit purposes.

- 1. Licensees are required to submit their numbering data, <u>no later than 16h30 on</u>

 31 March annually. However, for the purposes of the 2013 submissions the deadline is 28 June 2013.
- 2. The submission of the numbering data by licensees must be as per format outlined in the schedule hereunder. Where necessary licensees may be requested to supply supporting information. A copy of this format is also available on the Authority's website (www.icasa.org.za) and in the ICASA Library at 164 Katherine Street, Pinmill Farm, First Floor, Block D between 10h00 and 16h30, on working days only.
- 3. The snap shot of the numbering data must be captured by no earlier than the last working day of February and by no later than the deadline of submissions.
- 4. General Notice no.360 of 2009 published in the Government Gazette number 32107 is hereby repealed.

SCHEDULE

1. Audit Return Format

1.1. Submission format

The Excel spreadsheet format contained in this report must be used by the licensed operators to ensure uniformity of returns. The audit data must be submitted to the Authority as an electronic Excel file, either as an email attachment or as a CD confirmed by hard copy.

1.2. Allocated Blocks, in use

Table 1 below should include blocks allocated while table 2 must include any blocks that have been sub-allocated to other licensees.

Notes:

- 1 Columns 5, 6 and 7 should be given as numbers and **not** as percentages. These numbers should be obtained from customer management or number management systems and given as exact figures.
- Numbers that are quarantined should be included in column 7 and not included in Column 5.
- 3 Column 5 should include only numbers that have already been activated for users.
- 4 Column 6 should include only numbers used for internal network purposes such as MSRNs and numbers whose use is expected to

cause problems through mis-dialling. Numbers used for customer mailboxes and numbers used by internal staff should not be included in Column 6 but should be included in Column 5.

- Where numbers are reserved by the licensee for specific customers but have not yet been activated, they should be included in column 7.
- 6 Columns 5, 6, and 7 should add up to the block size.
- 7 Machine Related numbers should be accounted for in the above table and not as individual allocations.
