

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1. Background

- 1.1 The post-school education and training sector comprises education and training institutions as well as entities that have, for the purposes of data management and data collection activities and responsibilities, been grouped as follows:
- 1.1.1 Public and private Higher Education Institutions (HEIs);
 - 1.1.2 Public and private Technical and Vocational Education and Training (FET (TVET)) Colleges ;
 - 1.1.3 Public and private Adult Education and Training (AET) Centres;
 - 1.1.4 Sector Education and Training Authorities (SETAs);
 - 1.1.5 Quality Councils:
 - i) The Council on Higher Education (CHE);
 - ii) uMalusi;
 - iii) The Quality Council on Trades and Occupations (QCTO);
 - 1.1.6 National Student Financial Aid Scheme (NSFAS);
 - 1.1.7 The South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA);and
 - 1.1.8 The National Institutes of Higher Education.
- 1.2 The Department of Higher Education and Training (DHET) in terms of the Higher Education and Training Information Policy, 2013 (No 36973 of 2013) is responsible for the development of a reporting system on post-school education and training sector and to create all specifications and rules for data uploads, data integration and data dissemination.
- 1.3 This standard is informed by the Promotion of Access to Information Act, 2000 (Act 2 of 2000) and the Higher Education and Training Information Policy, 2013 (36973 of 2013) which requires the DHET to provide information to a variety of interested parties in a predetermined format.
- 1.4 According to the Protection of Personal Information Act, 2013 (37067 of 2013) and the Higher Education and Training Information Policy, 2013 (36973 of 2013), this standard complements the protection of personal information.

2. Purpose and Applicability

- 2.1 This standard provides guidelines and procedures on the processes to be followed by the DHET in disseminating data and statistics on the post-school education and training sector to the public.
- 2.2. This standard applies only to the DHET, not its institutions or its entities

3. Statistical Publications

- 3.1 The DHET will publish post-school education and training statistical reports using data from Higher Education and Training Management Information Systems following the specifications indicated on the Standard of Publication (DHET009).
- 3.2 Such reports will cover particular components or aspects of the post-school education and training sector. The reports will not include private and confidential data provided by individual students or workplace trainees.
- 3.3 The DHET will publish one annual statistical report on the entire post-school education and training sector, which will provide statistical information as per the categories listed in Table 1 below.
- 3.4 The annual post-school education and training statistical report will be published on the department's internet by December, reflecting the previous year's data in an aggregated format.

4. Information to be Provided

- 4.1 Table 1 below indicates the types of information that will be made available to the public from each of the education and training sub-sectors, as well as on workplace education and training. It also indicates the specific database from which the information will be sourced and states the cycle period when information will be available.

5. External Data Requests

- 5.1 The Department will provide aggregated data that is not available on the DHET website to researchers, research organisations, other government departments and other stakeholders, upon request.
- 5.2 Stakeholders are expected to submit a data request form (see **Appendix 1**) to the relevant departmental data manager, accompanied by a letter of motivation. The names of responsible data managers and their contact details are available on the DHET website (<http://www.dhet.gov.za>).
- 5.3 The data managers will inform the DHET Higher Education and Training Information System (HETIS) officer if the request needs her/his attention and conduct quality assurance of the data before providing it to external requester.
- 5.4 The data manager concerned will inform the person requesting the data whether the request has been approved or declined, with reasons, via an electronic notification (email or fax).
- 5.5 The preparation time for the delivery of the data request will depend on the type and complexity of each request; therefore, the requester will be informed when the information will be available.
- 5.6 The data requesters must acknowledge the sources of data and indicate its date of publications.
- 5.7 The analysis reports or research papers derived from the requested datasets should be shared with the DHET.

6. DHET Data Requests

- 6.1 Internal requesters must send request(s) directly to the relevant data manager with details of specifications and the time when the data is needed via email. The time when the requested information will be available will be indicated by the relevant data manager.
- 6.2 The data managers will inform the DHET HETIS officer if the request needs his/her attention and conduct quality assurance of the data before providing data to the requester.
- 6.3 If the requester is in the same branch as the data manager, the matter should be addressed internally by the branch concerned.

- 6.4 The requests will be treated on a first-come-first-served basis, unless if they relate to branch activities and responding to parliamentary questions, when such requests will take priority.
- 6.5 All data managers are required to log data requests on a spread sheet and include the purpose for which data is required. This will assist the DHET HETIS officer to analyse the requests and make informed decisions when updating the departmental information system.
