Cancellation of notice submissions are accepted by GPW according to the deadlines stated in the table above.

Non-compliance to these deadlines will result in your request being failed. **Please pay special attention to the different deadlines for each gazette.**

Please note that any notices cancelled after the cancellation deadline will be published and charged at full cost.

Requests for cancellation must be sent by the original sender of the notice and must be accompanied by the relevant notice reference number (N-) in the email body.

AMENDMENTS TO NOTICES

With effect from 01 October, GPW will not longer accept amendments to notices. The cancellation process will need to be followed and a new notice submitted thereafter for the next available publication date.

CUSTOMER INQUIRIES

Amendment of regulation 85 subsection (1) of the Regulations

2. Regulation 85 is hereby as follows:

“85 Gaming tax

(1) The gaming tax payable in terms of section 61 of the Act, shall be paid **[at the rate of 9% of the licensees gross gaming revenue]** in accordance with the table below:

<u>TAXABLE REVENUE</u>	<u>RATES OF TAX IN RESPECT OF CASINO OPERATOR LICENCE</u>
<u>Where the taxable revenue in the tax period-</u>	
<u>Does not exceed R300 million</u>	<u>8% of the taxable revenue</u>
<u>Exceeds R300 million but does not exceed R600 million</u>	<u>R24 million plus 12% of the amount by which the taxable revenue exceeds R300 million</u>
<u>Exceeds R600 million</u>	<u>R69 million plus 15% of the amount by which taxable revenue exceeds R600 million</u>

Short title and commencement date

3. These Regulations are called the Gauteng Gambling Amendment Regulations, 2016.
