RECOMMENDATION BY THE DEFENCE FORCE SERVICE COMMISSION PAY AND SERVICE BENEFITS COMMITTEE (DFSC-PSBC) ON THE DELINKING SALARY FROM RANK

INTRODUCTION

1. The Defence Force Service Commission (DFSC) was established in terms of Section 62 of the Defence Amendment Act 22 of 2010. Section 62 (B) (1) (a) determines that the DFSC must, amongst other functions and on an annual basis, make recommendations to the Minister on improvements of salaries and service benefits of members. For purposes of making such recommendations, the DFSC should enquire into or conduct research on conditions of service, consult with various internal DOD primary stakeholders, consider representations made to the Commission, consult with National Treasury and consider, among others, the rank structure of the Defence Force, the affordability of different levels of remuneration, current principles and levels of remuneration in the Public Service and inflationary increases [Section 62 (B) (1) (d)]. The Minister of Defence and Military Veteran (MODMV), after receiving recommendations from the Commission in terms of Sec 62B(4) the MODMV, in consultation with the Minister of Finance, determines the conditions of service for members of the Defence Force.

2. In line with Section 62(B) (1) (a) of the Act the DFSC-PSBC is mandated by the DFSC to review pay and service benefits of the South African National Defence Force (SANDF) members and make recommendations to the DFSC Plenary based on research, consultations with internal DOD key stakeholders and external experts, other Government Departments as well as findings of the consultative visits to the SANDF Units/Bases in order to formalise a recommendation to the MODMV on Delinking Salary from Rank for members of the SANDF.

3. The importance of Delinking Salary from Rank in the SANDF was articulated by the former Minister of Defence and Military Veterans Lindiwe Sisulu on 17 May 2012 to the National Assembly during her budget vote when she said “Essentially we are de-linking salaries from rank. Because of the sheer size of the Defence Force a great number of our soldiers are trapped in particular ranks with no prospect of improvement of their salaries”.

4. Subsequently, the Defence Force Service Commission was tasked to deal with the matter of Delinking Salary from Rank.

5. In the 2013/14 financial year, the DFSC developed a model for delinking salary from rank. The proposed model was based primarily on the United States of America Defence Forces’ pay tables, which had pay grades for different ranks, recognising years of service with overlapping salary bands.

6. On 10 January 2013, the full cost of the model was estimated at Rbn1, 45 in addition to the HR budget. The model was deemed to be unaffordable for the SANDF and the DFSC was then tasked to explore alternative models or implementation strategies.

7. In February 2013, the Military Command Council approved the DOD HR Charter and the Defence Review 2014 was approved by Cabinet in March 2014.

8. Both these documents provide plans for the future SANDF and in particular the HR Charter, the human resource management aspect of the SANDF. It is because of this that the DFSC-PSBC is of the opinion that Delinking of Salary from Rank will provide an interim solution to stagnation while the Defence Review and the DOD HR Charter will provide a more permanent solution to challenges associated with salary stagnation.

9. With that being said, officials of the DFSC-PSBC participated in consultative visits to SANDF bases/units during the 2015/16 financial year. During these visits, members of the DFSC-PSBC noted remuneration concerns and challenges raised by SANDF members so as to inform the decision making processes of the committee when making recommendations to the DFSC Plenary Board.

10. Furthermore the DFSC-PSBC participated in benchmarking exercises to the Botswana Defence Forces (BDF), Tanzania People’s Defence Forces (TPDF), Namibian Defence Forces (NDF), and Zimbabwe Defence Force (ZDF). During these benchmarking visits, the subject of Delinking Salary from Rank was one of the significant topics which were raised and discussed with the different Defence Forces.

AIM

11. The aim of this report is to present to the Defence Force Service Commission Plenary, a recommendation on Delinking Salary from Rank for members of the South African National Defence Force in order to address the predicament of soldiers that are trapped in particular ranks with no prospect of improvement of their salaries.

SCOPE

12. This report considers DFSC’s previous recommendation on Delinking of Salary from Rank. The report concludes with the DFSC-PSBC findings and recommendations on the Delinking of Salary from Rank for the SANDF.

13. Recommendations contained in this report are for members who are employed in terms of the Defence Act, excluding members covered by OSDs.

FACTORS CONSIDERED FOR DELINKING SALARY FROM RANK

14. The DFSC-PSBC considered the Defence Review as approved by Cabinet, the DOD HR Charter as approved by the Military Command Council, presentations, comments, uniqueness of the SANDF and inputs made by stakeholders it interacted with internally and the external benchmarking exercises undertaken by both the Interim National Defence Force Service Commission and the Defence Force Service Commission. Furthermore the committee also considered factors which are stipulated in section 62B (viii) of the Defence Amendment Act. The factors that were considered are:

- a. The rank structure of the Defence Force;
- b. The affordability of different levels of remuneration of the Defence Force;
- c. Current principles and levels of remuneration in the public service generally; and
- d. Inflationary increases.

HR CHARTER AND THE DEFENCE REVIEW

15. Currently in the SANDF, the compulsory exit age is 60 years, which in our view compounds, amongst others, the challenges faced with promotion and salary stagnation.

16. Principles contained in the HR Charter which relate to the structure, remuneration and salary stagnation of members and how the HR Charter seeks to address such challenges are as follows:

- a. The Rank-Age policy is linked to Corps and mustering requirements that inform military personnel in respect of their individual career path and exit stages (members who have reached a career plateau).
- b. Exit stages and the progression or stagnation of members are supported by an attractive exit mechanism (including an appropriate benefit structure).
- c. A flexible remuneration system makes provision for broad-banding and limits rank inflation.
- d. Exit benefits (pension) make provision for compulsory preservation of pensions for those who exit the organisation before the retirement dates.
- e. A flexible remuneration system makes provision for broad-banding and limits rank inflation.

17. The objectives of the DOD HR Charter have been incorporated into the Defence Review 2014.

18. More importantly, the Defence Review envisages the desired personnel component of the SANDF to be the following:

- a. 90 000 Regular Force
- b. 82 000 Reserve Force
- c. 17 000 Defence Civilians (excludes civilians employed in the Defence Secretariat and Ministry of Defence)

19. In order to achieve sustainability, the Defence Review commands that the compensation for employees must not exceed 40%.

20. For 2015/16 financial year, the HR budget accounted for 55.6% (Rbn 24, 7) of the total defence budget (Rbn 44). This requires the DOD to decrease its HR budget by 15.6% in relation to its total defence budget over a specific period.

21. Notwithstanding the current and projected future of the South African economy, Public Service wage bill concerns, budget cuts and the effect they have on the DOD HR budget, members who are affected by salary stagnation cannot be expected to make unreasonable sacrifices which currently and will in the future affect their private lives.

22. It is important to also note that Reserve Force members are currently and will in future be part of the SANDF; therefore the DFSC-PSBC cannot neglect similar concerns which have been raised by both members and the Reserve Force Council relating to salary stagnation.

23. The DFSC-PSBC also took these factors into consideration when recommendations on Delinking Salary from Rank were made.

CURRENT REMUNERATION MODEL

PERMANENT FORCE

24. The SANDF's current model is similar to that of the Public Service with a few notable differences.

25. The SANDF's remuneration model consists of 5 dispensations which are:

- a. Senior Management Service (SMS – For Generals)
- b. Middle Management Service (MMS – For Colonels)
- c. Occupational Specific Dispensation (OSD)
- d. Grades A1-D1 (Private to Lieutenant Colonel)
- e. Personnel Management Code (PMC)

26. In the SANDF, a member may progress from the first notch of their respective rank through the pay progression system to the last notch of that salary scale/grade linked to the rank. When this occurs, one would stop progressing and become stagnated until they are promoted to the next rank, the processes would be repeated for the new rank after promotion.

27. The current structure, where salaries overlap, means that a member could reach the top notch of their respective rank in five years. An example of this can be seen in the illustration 1 below when a member who has been a Private for twelve years is promoted to the rank of Lance Corporal.

28. For a member to progress in their respective rank, that member's performance would have to be at least satisfactory and would have had to have spent a period of twelve months in that rank.

29. Some of the salary scales in the SANDF model overlap, unlike in the Public Service. Example of this overlap of salaries is demonstrated in the illustrations below:

RESERVE FORCE

30. The Reserve Force members on Grade B1-C7-2 do not have a way of progressing within their respective ranks as their salaries are calculated on a single fixed daily allowance per rank.

31. These daily allowances are adjusted annually with the Cost of Living Adjustment instruction.

32. Scales from the 2016/17 financial year for reserve force members on grades B1-C7-2 are presented as an example on table below.

33. This is also the case for musicians who fall within the Reserve Component in the SANDF; it is to be noted that, as stated in paragraph 13 above, members on OSD were excluded from this recommendation and its process.

34. The absence of a system for Reserve Force members to progress within their ranks suggests that members will remain stagnated up until such time they are promoted to the next rank.

ANALYSIS OF CURRENT DATA PER RANK GROUP OF MEMBERS WHO ARE CURRENTLY AFFECTED BY SALARY STAGNATION

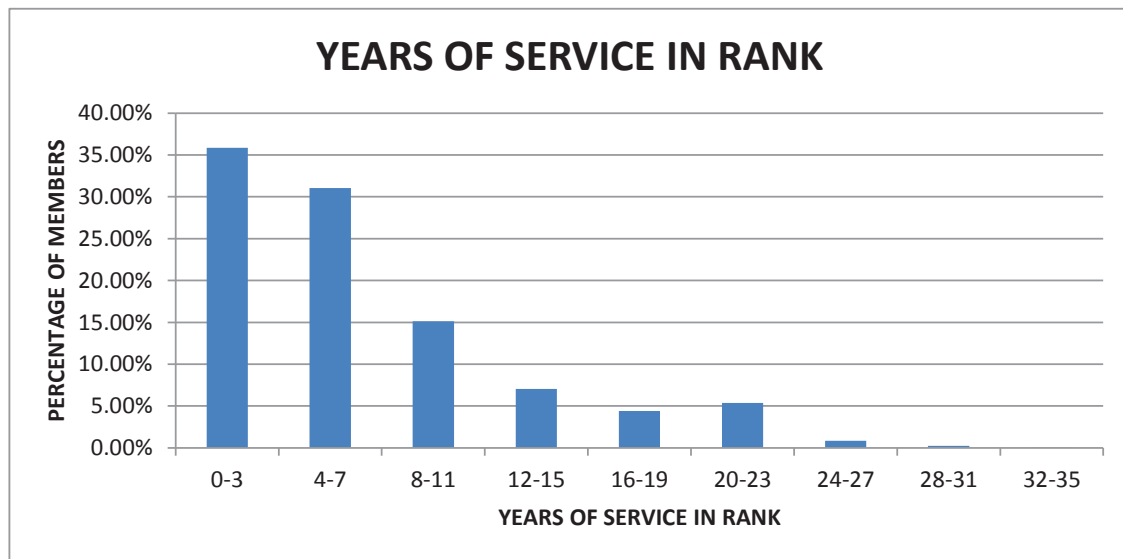
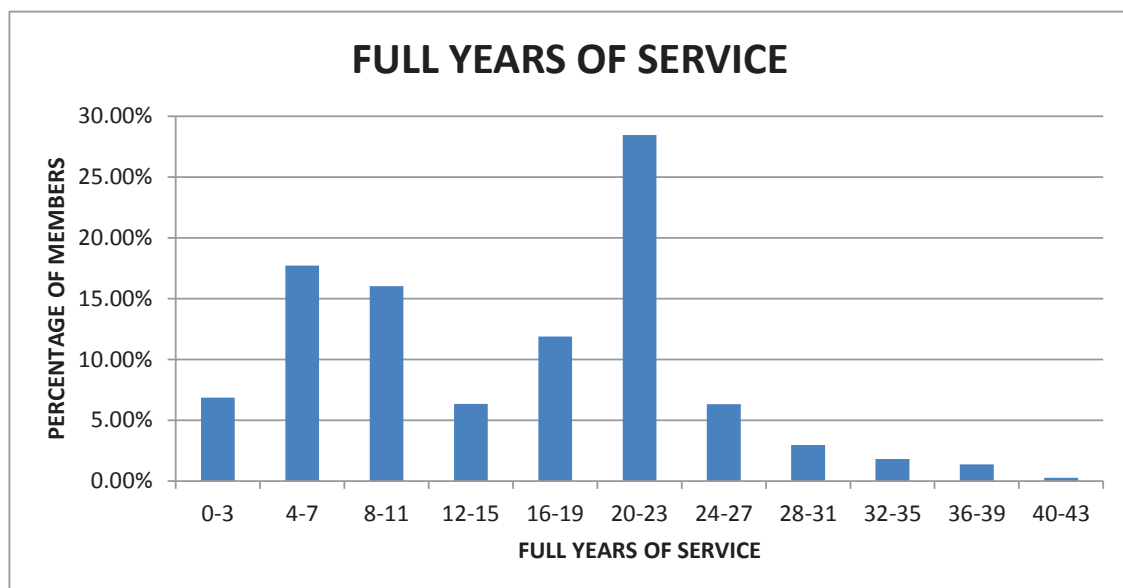
35. The DFSC-PSBC analysed data with the intention of determining the possible cause of salary stagnation. The analysis was done per rank group with data received from State Information and Technology Agency (SITA) (based on PERSOL data as at 31 May 2016) on the current statistics of members in the SANDF who are affected by salary stagnation, year of retirement, years of service in rank and full years of service of members are summarised in the tables and graph below.

36. From the tables 2 and 3 and graphs 1 and 2 above, 82.05% of members have spent less than 12 years on their current rank.

37. The current salary scale per rank provides for twelve notches per rank, meaning that approximately 82.05% of members in the SANDF are currently not affected by salary stagnation. Of the total data analysed, only 17.95% have been in ranks for periods longer than twelve years. In terms of full years of service, a peak can be seen in the 20-23 year group which can be attributed to the integration process that was undertaken by the SANDF.

38. In the next five years, a considerable number of members in leadership positions will reach the compulsory retirement age and majority of the retirements are in the groups which are currently the most affected by stagnation.

39. The rank groups being referred to in paragraph 38 above are:

- a. Colonel/ Captain (SAN)
- b. Lieutenant Colonel/ Commander
- c. Warrant Officer Class 1
- d. Warrant Officer Class 2
- e. Staff /Flight Sargent/ Chief Petty Officer
- f. Sargent/ Chief Petty Officer
- g. Lance Corporal/ Able Seaman
- h. Private

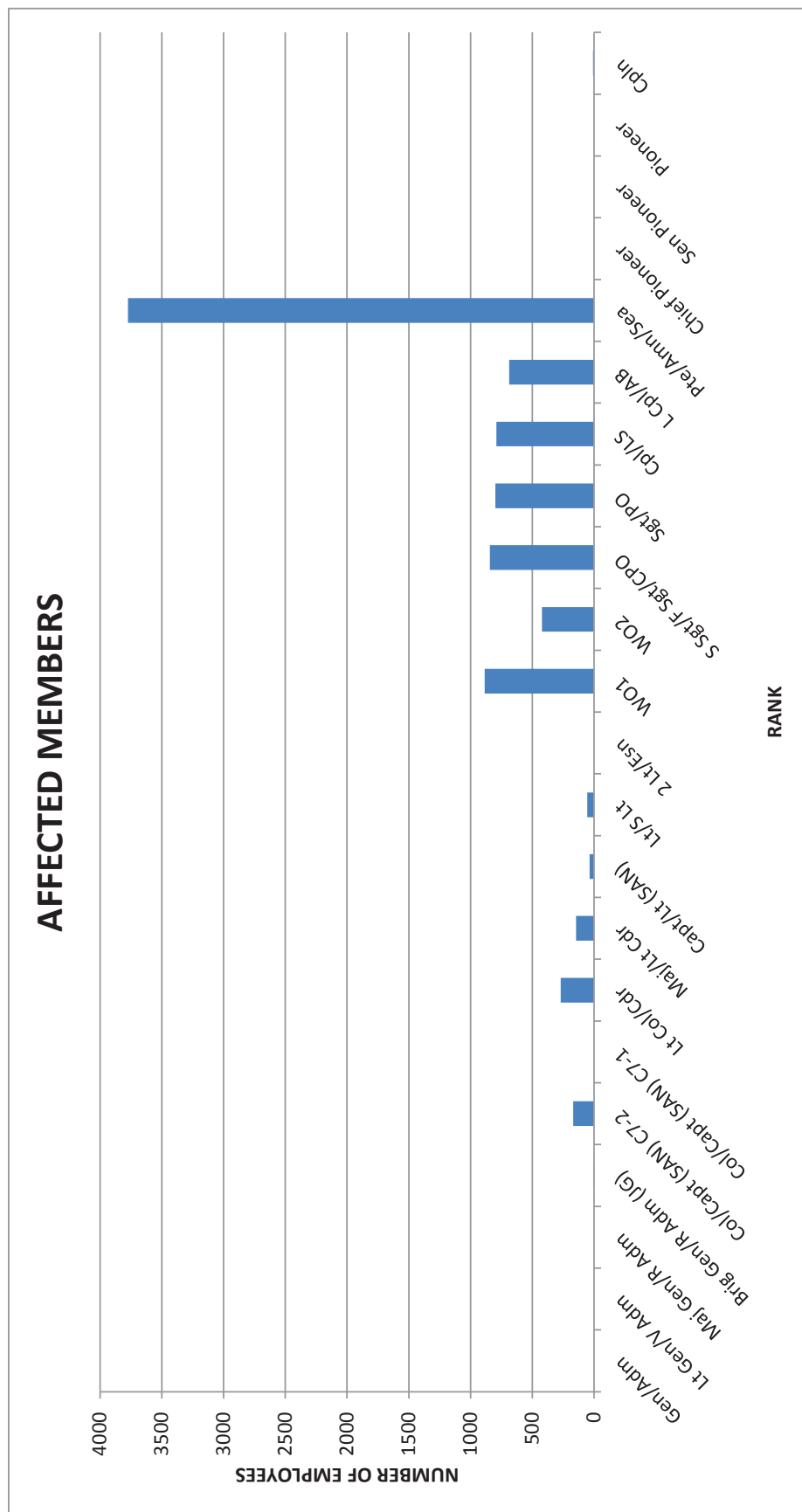

LESSONS LEARNT FROM OTHER (FOREIGN) DEFENCE FORCES

41. The DFSC-PSBC considered reports by the INDFSC from Russia, USA, UK, and DFSC's reports on Botswana Defence Forces, Namibia Defence Forces, Tanzania Peoples Defence Forces, and Zimbabwe Defence Forces. A summary of lessons learnt on delinking salary from rank from the various Defence Forces on how they deal with stagnation are presented below.

LESSONS LEARNT FROM OTHER GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS IN SOUTH AFRICA

42. The DFSC-PSBC also consulted with other Government Departments to ascertain how they deal with salary stagnation, Government Department that were consulted were the Department of Public Service and Administration in terms of the Public Service Resolutions (Public Service Co-ordinating Bargaining Council Resolution 3 of 2009), South African Police Services and the Department of Correctional Services. A summary of lessons learnt from the various Government Departments are presented in table below.

RECOMMENDATIONS

43. In reaching its decision, the DFSC-PSBC considered the delinking of salary from rank, a once off allowance for the affected members and the option of implementing a grade progression system as an interim measure while a unique SANDF dispensation framework is developed that will be in line with the Defence Review by the DFSC.

44. After analysing the data that is presented above, it is a clear that it is not everyone in the SANDF who is affected by salary stagnation, however only a group which constitutes approximately 15% of the SANDF members.

45. It is thus the DFSC-PSBC's opinion that the solution should target members affected by salary stagnation only.

46. The DFSC-PSBC therefore recommends that the SANDF should not delink salary from rank, instead implement a system that will target the affected members.

47. The proposed structure will be similar to the current grade progression model which is implemented in the general Public Service.

48. It is thus clear that delinking the entire SANDF will not be affordable and is unsustainable.

49. Nonetheless, delinking the entire SANDF would have cost the DOD Rbn 1,45 in 2013 as opposed to the Rm 87 (Cost breakdown presented below) that has been currently estimated with the implementation of this model.

50. The costing presented above does not take into consideration any allowances or the employers' portion of the pension contribution.

51. The calculations for members in the rank of Lt Col were calculated using an inclusive package from the Col rank.

52. From the rank of Private to Col, 2016/17 salary scales were used as opposed to 2015/16 for the rank of Brig Gen and above. This is because of the delay in the pronouncement of cost of living adjustment for SMS members.

53. The DFSC-PBSC also recommends that the SANDF develop a pay progression matrix for Reserve Force members which will allow members to progress to the next notch after 12 months of cumulative service in a rank.

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED MODEL FOR PERMANENT MEMBERS

54. Since this is not a general salary increase, it should be noted that employees will not benefit equally with the implementation of this salary structure.

55. The model will be based on the following principles:

- a. Completed continuous years of service in a rank and corresponding salary grade,
- b. Recognition of performance

56. SANDF members on any rank who have completed 15 years of continuous service in a particular rank, who have obtained at least a satisfactory rating in their most recent performance assessments, shall progress to the next salary grading.

57. Progressed members would then qualify for pay progression in terms the new salary grade.

58. The implementation of this model will not constitute a promotion, members will still retain their ranks and only the salary will be changed on Persol.

59. In practical terms, this means that when a member is appointed on the rank of Private and is remunerated in terms of Salary Grade B1 (for Private), he/she will be progress and be remunerated in terms of Salary Grade B2 (for Lance Corporal).

60. The DFSC found that, the proposed modified model of the public service will be more beneficial for members as this will also contribute to their pension as opposed to a once off allowance that would not be pensionable.

61. Unlike the Public Service, there won't be any accelerated progression, because the DFSC-PSBC anticipates the completion of a unique dispensation for the SANDF members within 24 months as referred to in paragraph 43 above.

CONCLUSION

62. The DFSC-PSBC's targeted approach to address the challenge of stagnation will allow the SANDF to provide relief where it was intended in a cost effective manner.

- 1.1. This policy has been developed to comply with section 4 (1) of the Use of Official Languages Act, 2012 (Act No. 12 of 2012). The section 4(1) requires every national department, national public entity and national public enterprise to have a language policy on its use of official languages. Therefore, the policy is intended to set out how Air Traffic and Navigation Services (ATNS) will use the official languages of South Africa to communicate effectively with the public and other stakeholders.
- 1.2. As an entity of the Department of Transport (DoT), the policy is also developed to align with The Department of Transport's Language Policy. The Department is a national department that has public entities which are critical pillars in the Department's service delivery agenda.
- 1.3. As The Department of Transport (representing South Africa) is a member state of The International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO), the policy has also been developed to comply with The International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO). Whilst ICAO uses 6 official languages namely: Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian, and Spanish, ICAO has established English language proficiency requirements (LPRs) for all pilots operating on international routes, and all air traffic controllers who communicate with foreign pilots (adopted by 38th Session of the ICAO Assembly (October 2013) Resolution A38/8 – Proficiency in the English language used for radiotelephony communications).

- 1.4. While ATNS is in favour of encouraging linguistic diversity, this is not its core business, and financial constraints will mean that it will have to find a balance between the language preferences and needs of its target audiences (internally and externally) and financial considerations

2. Department of Transport Mandate and Official Languages

- 2.1. The Department of Transport's (DoT's) vision is to make transport the heartbeat of economic growth and social development. Its mission is to lead the development of efficient integrated transport systems by creating a framework of sustainable policies, regulations and implementable models to support government strategies for economic, social and international development.
- 2.2. The Department is a national department that has public entities which are critical pillars in the Department's service delivery agenda.
- 2.3. The Department of Transport's direct communication with the general members of the public is limited. Most of its communication is with the public entities, the provincial government departments responsible for transport functions and municipalities, where English is accepted as the language of common usage. However, the Department is still working towards broader engagement with the general members of the public.
- 2.4. Owing to the mandate of the Department, and as English is the language of common use in Parliament, the Department, other government departments, and the public entities reporting to the Minister for Transport, the official language of the Department will be English. Therefore, English is used as the language in all official correspondence.
- 2.5. The three other languages selected for official use are Afrikaans, isiZulu and Sepedi languages. As according to the 2011 census the isiZulu and Sepedi are the most widely spoken first languages in the two biggest language groups (Nguni and Sotho) and Afrikaans is the language of the majority the provinces such the Northern Cape and Western Cape provinces where the Department has got major projects happening there.

3. ATNS Mandate

3.1. The Air Traffic and Navigation Service Company Limited a Schedule 2 public entity reporting to the Department of Transport was established in 1993 in terms of the ATNS Company Act (Act 45 of 1993), to provide air traffic management solutions and associated services on behalf of the state, in accordance with ICAO Standards and Recommended Practices and the South African Civil Aviation Regulations and Technical Standards. ATNS is an air navigation services provider (ANSP) and is governed by the nation's legislative and administrative framework. ATNS is also a commercialized ANSP operating on the "User Pays" principle that relies on current revenues and debt funding for its operational and capital expenditure requirements.

4. Official Languages of ATNS

- 4.1. Owing to the mandate of the DoT and the mandate of ATNS, and a subscriber to ICAO Standards and Recommended Practices the Official business language of ATNS will be English.
- 4.2. Owing to financial constraints, the Organisation's language policy will focus on the Official language.
- 4.3. Official publications intended for the public distribution (notices, advertisements, forms and other documents) will be in English.
- 4.4. Calls for nominations for the boards of the public entities for the Organisation will be published in English, as the business of the boards will be conducted in English, and the business people and engineers needed to serve on the boards will be familiar with English.
- 4.5. As far as official reports/publications such as the annual report are concerned, these will be published in English.

5. WHO IS COVERED BY THE POLICY

- 5.1. The policy covers all individuals working at all levels of the organisation, including Board members, Executives, Senior Managers/ Supervisors , Consultants, Contractors, Employees(including Part Time and Fixed Term Employees), Trainees and Bursars.
- 5.2. Third Parties (not mentioned in 5.1) who have access to ATNS' electronic communication systems and equipment are also required to comply with this policy.

6. Complaints Mechanism

- 6.1. Anyone who is dissatisfied with an aspect of the language policy may make a complaint, which will be dealt with in terms of Regulation 2(2) and 2(3) of the Use of Official Languages Regulation.
- 6.2. The complaint must be in writing, lodged within three months of the complaint arising, and provide the name, address and contact information of the person lodging the complaint.
- 6.3. The complaint may be delivered to: Executive Commercial Services The Head of the Language Unit-

- 6.7. The Executive Commercial Services or his/her delegate may request additional information from the complainant or a meeting with the complainant to discuss the complaint.
- 6.8. The Executive Commercial Services will consider the complaint and make a decision no later than three months after receipt of the complaint, and inform the complainant of the decision in writing.
- 6.9. If the complainant is not satisfied with this decision, he/she may lodge an appeal with the Chief Executive Officer. This must be done within one month of the decision referred to in par. 6.8, and The Chief Executive Officer will make a decision no later than three months after receipt of the complaint, and inform the complainant of the decision in writing

7. Access to ATNS Language Policy

- 7.1. The language policy will be published in the *Government Gazette* in English, as well as made available on the Organisation's website

8. Review of Policy

- 8.1. This policy will be reviewed whenever there is a need to do so. However, it will be appropriate to review it at least every five years

In terms of section 108(2) of the Income Tax Act, 1962 (Act No 58 of 1962), read in conjunction with section 231(4) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996, it is hereby notified that the Agreement for the exchange of information relating to tax matters set out in the Schedule to this Notice has been entered into with the Government of the Republic of Costa Rica and has been approved by Parliament in terms of section 231(2) of the Constitution.

It is further notified in terms of Article 12 of the Agreement, that the date of entry into force is 8 February 2017.

**AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF SOUTH AFRICA AND
THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF COSTA RICA FOR THE EXCHANGE OF
INFORMATION RELATING TO TAX MATTERS**

PREAMBLE

The Government of the Republic of South Africa and the Government of the Republic of Costa Rica (hereinafter jointly referred to as “the Contracting Parties” and separately as “a Contracting Party”) desiring to facilitate the exchange of information with respect to taxes;

HAVE AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE 1

SCOPE OF THE AGREEMENT

The competent authorities of the Contracting Parties shall provide assistance through exchange of information that is foreseeably relevant to the administration and enforcement of the domestic laws of the Contracting Parties concerning taxes covered by this Agreement. Such information shall include information that is foreseeably relevant to the determination, assessment and collection of such taxes, the recovery and enforcement of tax claims, or the investigation or prosecution of tax matters. Information shall be exchanged in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement and shall be treated as confidential in the manner provided in Article 8. The rights and safeguards secured to persons by the laws or administrative practice of the requested Party remain applicable to the extent that they do not unduly prevent or delay effective exchange of information.

ARTICLE 2

JURISDICTION

A requested Party is not obligated to provide information which is neither held by its authorities nor in the possession or control of persons who are within its territorial jurisdiction.

ARTICLE 3

TAXES COVERED

1. The taxes which are the subject of this Agreement are:
 - (a) in the Republic of Costa Rica: taxes of every type and description collected by the Ministry of Finance at the date of signature; and

- (b) in the Republic of South Africa: taxes of every type and description imposed by the Government of the Republic of South Africa at the date of signature of this Agreement.

2. This Agreement shall also apply to any identical taxes imposed after the date of signature of the Agreement in addition to or in place of the existing taxes. This Agreement shall also apply to any substantially similar taxes imposed after the date of signature of the Agreement in addition to or in place of the existing taxes if the competent authorities of the Contracting Parties so agree. The competent authorities of the Contracting Parties shall notify each other of any substantial changes to the taxation and related information gathering measures covered by the Agreement.

ARTICLE 4

DEFINITIONS

1. In this Agreement:

- (a) the term "Contracting Party" means Costa Rica or South Africa as the context requires;
- (b) the term "Costa Rica" means the land, maritime, and air space under its sovereignty and the exclusive economic zone and the continental shelf within which it exercises sovereign rights and jurisdiction in accordance with international law and its domestic law;
- (c) the term "South Africa" means the Republic of South Africa and, when used in a geographical sense, includes the territorial sea thereof as well as any area outside the territorial sea, including the continental shelf, which has been or may hereafter be designated, under the laws of South Africa and in accordance with international law, as an area within which South Africa may exercise sovereign rights of jurisdiction;
- (d) the term "competent authority" means:
 - (i) in the case of Costa Rica, the, Director of the Tax Administration or an authorised representative of the Director; and
 - (ii) in the case of South Africa, the Commissioner of the South African Revenue Service or an authorised representative of the Commissioner;
- (e) the term "person" includes an individual, a company or any other body of persons;
- (f) the term "company" means anybody corporate or any entity that is treated as a body corporate for tax purposes;

- (g) the term “publicly traded company” means any company whose principal class of shares is listed on a recognised stock exchange provided its listed shares can be readily purchased or sold by the public. Shares can be purchased or sold “by the public” if the purchase or sale of shares is not implicitly or explicitly restricted to a limited group of investors;
- (h) the term “principal class of shares” means the class or classes of shares representing a majority of the voting power and value of the company;
- (i) the term “recognised stock exchange” means any stock exchange agreed upon by the competent authorities of the Contracting Parties;
- (j) the term “collective investment fund or scheme” means any pooled investment vehicle, irrespective of legal form. The term “public collective investment fund or scheme” means any collective investment fund or scheme provided the units, shares or other interests in the fund or scheme can be readily purchased, sold or redeemed by the public. Units, shares or other interests in the fund or scheme can be readily purchased, sold or redeemed “by the public” if the purchase, sale or redemption is not implicitly or explicitly restricted to a limited group of investors;
- (k) the term “tax” means any tax to which the Agreement applies;
- (l) the term “applicant Party” means the Contracting Party requesting information;
- (m) the term “requested Party” means the Contracting Party requested to provide information;
- (n) the term “information gathering measures” means laws and administrative or judicial procedures that enable a Contracting Party to obtain and provide the requested information;
- (o) the term “information” means any fact, statement or record in any form whatever;
- (p) the term “criminal tax matters” means tax matters involving intentional conduct which is liable to prosecution under the criminal laws of the applicant Party;
- (q) the term “criminal laws” means all criminal laws designated as such under domestic law irrespective of whether contained in the tax laws, the criminal code or other statutes.

2. As regards the application of this Agreement at any time by a Contracting Party, any term not defined therein shall, unless the context otherwise requires, have the meaning that it has at that time under the law of that Party, any meaning under the applicable tax laws of that Party prevailing over a meaning given to the term under other laws of that Party.

ARTICLE 5

EXCHANGE OF INFORMATION UPON REQUEST

1. The competent authority of the requested Party shall provide upon request information for the purposes referred to in Article 1. Such information shall be exchanged without regard to whether the conduct being investigated would constitute a crime under the laws of the requested Party if such conduct occurred in the requested Party.

2. If the information in the possession of the competent authority of the requested Party is not sufficient to enable it to comply with the request for information, that Party shall use the information gathering measures it considers relevant to provide the applicant Party with the information requested, notwithstanding that the requested Party may not need such information for its own tax purposes.

3. If specifically requested by the competent authority of the applicant Party, the competent authority of the requested Party shall provide information under this Article, to the extent allowable under its domestic laws, in the form of depositions of witnesses and authenticated copies of original records.

4. Each Contracting Party shall ensure that its competent authorities for the purposes specified in Article 1 of the Agreement, have the authority to obtain and provide upon request:

- (a) information held by banks, other financial institutions, and any person acting in an agency or fiduciary capacity including nominees and trustees;
- (b) information regarding the ownership of companies, partnerships, trusts, foundations, "Anstalten" and other persons, including, within the constraints of Article 2, ownership information on all such persons in an ownership chain; in the case of trusts, information on settlors, trustees and beneficiaries; and in the case of foundations, information on founders, members of the foundation council and beneficiaries. Further, this Agreement does not create an obligation on the Contracting Parties to obtain or provide ownership information with respect to publicly traded companies or public collective investment funds or schemes unless such information can be obtained without giving rise to disproportionate difficulties.

5. The competent authority of the applicant Party shall provide the following information to the competent authority of the requested Party when making a request for information under the Agreement to demonstrate the foreseeable relevance of the information to the request:

- (a) the identity of the person under examination or investigation;
- (b) a statement of the information sought including its nature and the form in which the applicant Party wishes to receive the information from the requested Party;

- (c) the tax purpose for which the information is sought;
- (d) grounds for believing that the information requested is held in the requested Party or is in the possession or control of a person within the jurisdiction of the requested Party;
- (e) to the extent known, the name and address of any person believed to be in possession of the requested information;
- (f) a statement that the request is in conformity with the law and administrative practices of the applicant Party, that if the requested information was within the jurisdiction of the applicant Party then the competent authority of the applicant Party would be able to obtain the information under the laws of the applicant Party or in the normal course of administrative practice and that it is in conformity with this Agreement;
- (g) a statement that the applicant Party has pursued all means available in its own territory to obtain the information, except those that would give rise to disproportionate difficulties.

6. The competent authority of the requested Party shall forward the requested information as promptly as possible to the applicant Party. To ensure a prompt response, the competent authority of the requested Party shall:

- (a) confirm receipt of a request in writing to the competent authority of the applicant Party and shall notify the competent authority of the applicant Party of deficiencies in the request, if any, within 60 days of the receipt of the request;
- (b) if the competent authority of the requested Party has been unable to obtain and provide the information within 90 days of receipt of the request, including if it encounters obstacles in furnishing the information or it refuses to furnish the information, it shall immediately inform the applicant Party, explaining the reason for its inability, the nature of the obstacles or the reasons for its refusal.

ARTICLE 6

TAX EXAMINATIONS ABROAD

1. A Contracting Party may allow representatives of the competent authority of the other Contracting Party to enter the territory of the first-mentioned Party, to the extent permitted under its domestic laws, to interview individuals and examine records with the written consent of the persons concerned. The competent authority of the second-mentioned Party shall notify the competent authority of the first-mentioned Party of the time and place of the meeting with the individuals concerned.

2. At the request of the competent authority of one Contracting Party, the competent authority of the other Contracting Party may allow representatives of the competent authority of the first-mentioned Party to be present at the appropriate part of a tax examination in the second-mentioned Party.

3. If the request referred to in paragraph 2 is acceded to, the competent authority of the Contracting Party conducting the examination shall, as soon as possible, notify the competent authority of the other Party about the time and place of the examination, the authority or official designated to carry out the examination and the procedures and conditions required by the first-mentioned Party for the conduct of the examination. All decisions with respect to the conduct of the tax examination shall be made by the Party conducting the examination.

ARTICLE 7

POSSIBILITY OF DECLINING A REQUEST

1. The requested Party shall not be required to obtain or provide information that the applicant Party would not be able to obtain under its own laws for purposes of the administration or enforcement of its own tax laws. The competent authority of the requested Party may decline to assist where the request is not made in conformity with this Agreement.

2. The provisions of this Agreement shall not impose on a Contracting Party the obligation to supply information which would disclose any trade, business, industrial, commercial or professional secret or trade process. Notwithstanding the foregoing, information of the type referred to in Article 5, paragraph 4 shall not be treated as such a secret or trade process merely because it meets the criteria in that paragraph.

3. The provisions of this Agreement shall not impose on a Contracting Party the obligation to obtain or provide information, which would reveal confidential communications between a client and an attorney, solicitor or other admitted legal representative where such communications are:

- (a) produced for the purposes of seeking or providing legal advice; or
- (b) produced for the purposes of use in existing or contemplated legal proceedings.

4. The requested Party may decline a request for information if the disclosure of the information would be contrary to public policy (*ordre public*).

5. A request for information shall not be refused on the ground that the tax claim giving rise to the request is disputed.

6. The requested Party may decline a request for information if the information is requested by the applicant Party to administer or enforce a provision of the tax law of the applicant Party, or any requirement connected therewith, which discriminates against a national of the requested Party as compared with a national of the applicant Party in the same circumstances.

ARTICLE 8**CONFIDENTIALITY**

Any information received by a Contracting Party under this Agreement shall be treated as confidential and may be disclosed only to persons or authorities (including courts and administrative bodies) in the jurisdiction of the Contracting Party concerned with the assessment or collection of, the enforcement or prosecution in respect of, or the determination of appeals in relation to, the taxes covered by this Agreement. Such persons or authorities shall use such information only for such purposes. They may disclose the information in public court proceedings or in judicial decisions. The information may not be disclosed to any other person or entity or authority or any other jurisdiction without the express written consent of the competent authority of the requested Party.

ARTICLE 9**COSTS**

Unless the competent authorities of the Parties otherwise agree, indirect costs incurred in providing assistance shall be borne by the requested Party, and direct costs incurred in providing assistance (including costs of engaging external advisors in connection with litigation or otherwise) shall be borne by the requesting Party. The respective competent authorities shall consult from time to time with regard to this Article, and in particular the competent authority of the requested Party shall consult with the competent authority of the requesting Party in advance if the costs of providing information with respect to a specific request are expected to be significant.

ARTICLE 10**IMPLEMENTATION LEGISLATION**

The Contracting Parties shall enact any legislation necessary to comply with, and give effect to, the terms of the Agreement.

ARTICLE 11**MUTUAL AGREEMENT PROCEDURE**

1. Where difficulties or doubts arise between the Contracting Parties regarding the implementation or interpretation of the Agreement, the competent authorities shall endeavour to resolve the matter by mutual agreement.

2. In addition to the agreements referred to in paragraph 1, the competent authorities of the Contracting Parties may mutually agree on the procedures to be used under Articles 5, 6 and 9.

3. The competent authorities of the Contracting Parties may communicate with each other directly for purposes of reaching agreement under this Article.
4. The Contracting Parties may also agree on other forms of dispute resolution.

ARTICLE 12

ENTRY INTO FORCE

This Agreement shall enter into force when each Party has notified the other, through the diplomatic channel, of the completion of its necessary internal procedures for entry into force. Upon entry into force, it shall have effect:

- (a) for criminal tax matters on that date; and
- (b) for all other matters covered in Article 1 on that date, but only in respect of taxable periods beginning on or after that date, or where there is no taxable period, all charges to tax arising on or after that date.

ARTICLE 13

TERMINATION

1. Either Contracting Party may terminate the Agreement by serving a notice of termination either through diplomatic channels or by letter to the competent authority of the other Contracting Party.
2. Such termination shall become effective on the first day of the month following the expiration of a period of six months after the date of receipt of notice of termination by the other Contracting Party.
3. Following termination of the Agreement the Contracting Parties shall remain bound by the provisions of Article 8 with respect to any information obtained under the Agreement.

Sodanige inligting sluit in inligting wat voorsienbaar tersaaklik is vir die vasstelling, aanslaan en invordering van sodanige belasting, die verhaling en afdwinging van belastingeise, of die ondersoek of die vervolging van belastingaangeleenthede. Die regte en beskerming wat deur die wette of administratiewe praktyk van die versoekte Party aan persone verleen word, bly van toepassing in soverre dit die doeltreffende uitruil van inligting nie ten onregte voorkom of vertraag nie.

ARTIKEL 2

JURISDIKSIE

'n Versoekte Party is nie verplig om inligting te verskaf wat nóg deur sy owerhede gehou word, nóg deur persone wat binne sy gebiedsjurisdiksie is besit of beheer word nie.

ARTIKEL 3

BELASTINGS GEDEK

1. Die belasting wat die onderwerp van hierdie Ooreenkoms is, is:
 - (a) in die Republiek Costa Rica: belasting van elke soort en beskrywing wat teen die datum van ondertekening van hierdie Ooreenkoms deur die Ministerie van Finansies ingevorder word; en

- (b) in die Republiek van Suid-Afrika: belastinge van elke soort en beskrywing wat teen die datum van ondertekening van hierdie Ooreenkoms deur die Regering van die Republiek van Suid-Afrika opgelê word.

2. Hierdie Ooreenkoms is ook van toepassing op enige identiese belastinge wat na die datum van ondertekening van die Ooreenkoms bykomend tot of in die plek van bestaande belastinge opgelê word. Hierdie Ooreenkoms is ook van toepassing op enige wesenlik soortgelyke belastinge wat na die datum van ondertekening van die Ooreenkoms bykomend tot of in die plek van bestaande belastinge opgelê word indien die bevoegde owerhede van die Kontrakterende Partye daartoe instem. Elk van die bevoegde owerhede van die Kontrakterende Partye moet die ander kennis gee van enige wesenlike veranderinge in die belasting en verwante inligtingversamelmaatreëls wat deur die Ooreenkoms gedek word.

ARTIKEL 4

WOORDOMSKRYWING

1. In hierdie Ooreenkoms:

- (a) beteken die uitdrukking "Kontrakterende Party" Costa Rica of Suid-Afrika, na gelang van die samehang;
- (b) beteken die uitdrukking "Costa Rica" die grondgebied, die maritieme waters en die lugruim waaroor hy soewereiniteit het en die eksklusiewe ekonomiese sone en die vastelandsplat waarbinne hy sowereine regte en jurisdiksie uitoefen ooreenkomstig die volkereg en sy landsreg;
- (c) beteken die uitdrukking "Suid-Afrika" die Republiek van Suid-Afrika en, wanneer dit in 'n geografiese verband gebruik word, ook die territoriale waters daarvan asook enige gebied buite die territoriale waters, met inbegrip van die vastelandsplat, wat ingevolge die reg van Suid-Afrika en ooreenkomstig die volkereg aangedui is of hierna aangedui word as 'n gebied waarbinne Suid-Afrika sowereine regte van jurisdiksie kan uitoefen;
- (d) beteken die uitdrukking "bevoegde owerheid":
- (i) in die geval van Costa Rica, die Direkteur van Belastingadministrasie of 'n gemagtigde verteenwoordiger van die Direkteur; en
 - (ii) in die geval van Suid-Afrika, die Kommissaris van die Suid-Afrikaanse Inkomstediens of 'n gemagtigde verteenwoordiger van die Kommissaris;
- (e) behels die uitdrukking "persoon" 'n individu, 'n maatskappy of enige ander liggaam van persone;
- (f) beteken die uitdrukking "maatskappy" enige regspersoon of enige entiteit wat vir belastingdoeleindes as 'n regspersoon behandel word;

- (g) beteken die uitdrukking "openbaar verhandelde maatskappy" enige maatskappy waarvan die hoofklas van aandele op 'n erkende aandelebeurs genoteer is, mits sy genoteerde aandele geredelik deur die publiek gekoop of verkoop kan word. Aandele kan "deur die publiek" gekoop of verkoop word indien die koop of verkoop van aandele nie implisiet of eksplisiet tot 'n beperkte groep beleggers beperk word nie;
- (h) beteken die uitdrukking "hoofklas van aandele" die klas of klasse van aandele wat 'n meerderheid van die stemkrag en waarde van die maatskappy verteenwoordig;
- (i) beteken die uitdrukking "erkende aandelebeurs" enige aandelebeurs waartoe die bevoegde owerhede van die Kontrakterende Party ooreengekom het;
- (j) beteken die uitdrukking "kollektiewe beleggingsfonds of -skema" enige gepoelde beleggingsinstrument, ongeag die regsform daarvan. Die uitdrukking "openbare kollektiewe beleggingsfonds of -skema" beteken enige kollektiewe kollektiewe beleggingsfonds of -skema, mits die eenhede, aandele of ander belange in die fonds of skema geredelik deur die publiek gekoop, verkoop of afgelos kan word. Eenhede, aandele of ander belange in die fonds of skema kan geredelik "deur die publiek" gekoop, verkoop of afgelos word indien die koop, verkoop of aflossing nie implisiet of eksplisiet tot 'n beperkte groep beleggers beperk word nie;
- (k) beteken die uitdrukking "belasting" enige belasting waarop die Ooreenkoms van toepassing is;
- (l) beteken die uitdrukking "versoekende Party" die Kontrakterende Party wat die inligting versoek;
- (m) beteken die uitdrukking "versoekte Party" die Kontrakterende Party wat versoek word om inligting te verskaf;
- (n) beteken die uitdrukking "inligtingversamelmaatreëls" die wette en administratiewe of geregtelike prosedures wat 'n Kontrakterende Party in staat stel om die aangevraagde inligting te verkry en te verskaf;
- (o) beteken die uitdrukking "inligting" enige feit, verklaring of rekord in watter vorm ook al;
- (p) beteken die uitdrukking "strafregtelike belastingaangeleenthede" belastingaangeleenthede wat opsetlike gedrag behels, wat ingevolge die strafreg van die versoekende Party aan vervolging onderhewig is;
- (q) beteken die uitdrukking "strafreg" alle strafregbepalings as sodanig aangedui ingevolge die landsreg, ongeag of sodanige bepalinge in die belastingreg, die strafregkode of ander statute vervat is.

2. Betreffende die toepassing van hierdie Ooreenkoms te eniger tyd deur 'n Kontrakterende Party, het 'n uitdrukking wat nie daarin omskryf is nie, tensy dit uit die samehang anders blyk, die betekenis wat dit op daardie tydstip ingevolge die reg van daardie Party het, en geniet enige betekenis ingevolge die toepaslike belastingreg van daardie Party voorrang bo 'n betekenis wat ingevolge ander wette van daardie Party aan die uitdrukking geheg word.

ARTIKEL 5**UITRUIL VAN INLIGTING OP VERSOEK**

1. Die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekte Party moet op versoek inligting verskaf vir die doeleindes in Artikel 1 genoem. Sodanige inligting word uitgeruil sonder om in ag te neem of die gedrag wat ondersoek word ingevolge die reg van die versoekte Party 'n misdryf sou uitmaak indien sodanige gedrag in die versoekte Party plaasgevind het.

2. Indien die inligting in die besit van die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekte Party nie voldoende is om hom in staat te stel om aan die versoek om inligting te voldoen nie, gebruik daardie Party die inligtingversamelmaatreëls wat hy toepaslik ag om die aangevraagde inligting aan die versoekende Party te verskaf, al het die versoekte Party sodanige inligting nie vir sy eie belastingdoeleindes nodig nie.

3. Indien spesifiek deur die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekende Party daartoe versoek, moet die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekte Party ingevolge hierdie Artikel, in die mate waarin dit ingevolge sy landsreg toelaatbaar is, inligting verskaf in die vorm van verklarings van getuies en gewaarmerkte afskrifte van oorspronklike rekords.

4. Elk van die Kontrakterende Partye moet seker maak dat sy bevoegde owerheid, vir die doeleindes vermeld in Artikel 1 van die Ooreenkoms, die bevoegdheid het om op versoek:

- (a) inligting te verkry en te verskaf wat gehou word deur banke, ander finansiële instellings en enige persoon, ook benoemdes en trustees, wat in 'n volmag- of vertrouenshoedanigheid optree;
- (b) inligting te verkry en te verskaf betreffende die eienaarskap van maatskappye, vennootskappe, trusts, stigtings, instellings en ander persone, ook, binne die beperkinge van Artikel 2, inligting oor eienaarskap van al daardie persone in 'n eienaarskapsketting; in die geval van trusts, inligting oor trustoprigters, trustees en begunstigdes; en in die geval van stigtings, inligting oor stigters, lede van die stigtingsraad en begunstigdes. Hierdie Ooreenkoms skep voorts nie 'n verpligting vir die Kontrakterende Partye om inligting oor eienaarskap met betrekking tot openbaar verhandelde maatskappye of openbare kollektiewe beleggingsfondse of -skemas te bekom of te verskaf nie, tensy sodanige inligting bekom kan word sonder om tot buitensporige probleme aanleiding te gee.

5. Die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekende Party moet, wanneer hy ingevolge die Ooreenkoms 'n versoek om inligting rig, die volgende inligting aan die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekte Party verskaf om die voorsienbare tersaaklikheid van die inligting ten opsigte van die versoek aan te toon:

- (a) die identiteit van die persoon wie se sake nagegaan of wat ondersoek word;
- (b) 'n verklaring van die inligting wat verlang word, ook die aard daarvan en die vorm waarin die versoekende Party verkies om die inligting vanaf die versoekte Party te ontvang;

- (c) die belastingdoel waarvoor die inligting verlang word;
 - (d) gronde waarom vermoed word dat die aangevraagde inligting in die versoekte Party gehou word of in die besit of onder beheer is van 'n persoon binne die jurisdiksie van die versoekte Party;
 - (e) in soverre dit bekend is, die naam en adres van 'n persoon wat vermoedelik in besit van die aangevraagde inligting is;
 - (f) 'n verklaring dat die versoek in ooreenstemming is met die reg en administratiewe praktyke van die versoekende Party, dat indien die aangevraagde inligting binne die jurisdiksie van die versoekende Party was, die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekende Party in staat sou wees om die inligting te verkry ingevolge die reg van die versoekende Party of in die gewone loop van administratiewe praktyk en dat die versoek in ooreenstemming met hierdie Ooreenkoms is;
 - (g) 'n verklaring dat die versoekende Party alle metodes in sy eie gebied tot sy beskikking nagevolg het om die inligting te bekom, uitgesonderd waar dit tot buitensporige probleme aanleiding sou gee.
6. Die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekte Party moet die aangevraagde inligting so spoedig moontlik aan die versoekende Party versend. Om 'n spoedige antwoord te verseker, moet die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekte Party:
- (a) skriftelik ontvangs van 'n versoek erken aan die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekende Party, en moet hy die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekende Party binne 60 dae van ontvangs van die versoek in kennis stel van tekortkominge in die versoek, indien enige;
 - (b) indien hy nie in staat is om die inligting binne 90 dae van ontvangs van die versoek te bekom en te verskaf nie, ook indien hy beletsels teëkom in die verskaffing van die inligting of weier om die inligting te verskaf, die versoekende Party onverwyld inlig en die redes vir sy onvermoë, die aard van die beletsels of die redes vir sy weiering verduidelik.

ARTIKEL 6

BELASTINGONDERSOEKE IN DIE BUITELAND

1. 'n Kontrakterende Party kan verteenwoordigers van die bevoegde owerheid van die ander Kontrakterende Party toelaat om die gebied van eersgenoemde Party binne te gaan, in soverre dit ingevolge sy landsreg veroorloof is, om met individue onderhoude te voer en rekords na te gaan met die skriftelike toestemming van die betrokke persone. Die bevoegde owerheid van die ander Kontrakterende Party moet die bevoegde owerheid van eersgenoemde Party in kennis stel van die tyd en plek van die vergadering met die betrokke individue.

2. Op versoek van die bevoegde owerheid van een Kontrakterende Party kan die bevoegde owerheid van die ander Kontrakterende Party verteenwoordigers van die bevoegde owerheid van eersgenoemde Party toelaat om teenwoordig te wees op die gepaste deel van 'n belastingondersoek in die ander Party.

3. Indien die versoek in paragraaf 2 bedoel toegestaan word, moet die bevoegde owerheid van die Kontrakterende Party wat die ondersoek uitvoer, die bevoegde owerheid van die ander Party so gou moontlik in kennis stel van die tyd en plek van die ondersoek, die owerheid of beampte wat aangewys is om die ondersoek uit te voer, en die prosedures en voorwaardes wat deur eersgenoemde Party voorgeskryf word vir die uitvoer van die ondersoek. Alle besluite ten opsigte van die uitvoer van die belastingondersoek word geneem deur die Party wat die ondersoek doen.

ARTIKEL 7

MOONTLIKHEID VAN WEIERING VAN 'N VERSOEK

1. Daar word nie van die versoekte Party vereis om inligting te verkry en te verskaf wat die versoekende Party nie ingevolge sy eie reg vir doeleindes van die toepassing of afdwinging van sy eie belastingwette sou kon verkry nie. Die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekte Party kan weier om bystand te verleen waar die versoek nie ooreenkomstig hierdie Ooreenkoms gerig word nie.

2. Hierdie Ooreenkoms lê nie 'n verpligting op 'n Kontrakterende Party om inligting te verskaf wat enige handels-, sake-, nywerheids-, kommersiële of beroepsgeheim of handelsproses openbaar sou maak nie. Ondanks die voorgaande, moet die soort inligting wat in Artikel 5, paragraaf 4, genoem word nie as so 'n geheim of handelsproses gehanteer word bloot omdat dit aan die vereistes in daardie paragraaf voldoen nie.

3. Hierdie Ooreenkoms lê nie 'n verpligting op 'n Kontrakterende Party om inligting te bekom of te verskaf wat vertroulike mededelings tussen 'n kliënt en 'n advokaat, prokureur of ander toegelate regsverteenwoordiger openbaar sou maak nie, waar sodanige mededelings:-

- (a) geskep word vir die doeleindes van die verkryging of verskaffing van regsadvies; of
- (b) geskep word vir die doeleindes van gebruik in bestaande of beoogde regsverrigtinge.

4. Die versoekte Party kan 'n versoek om inligting weier indien die openbaarmaking van die inligting strydig sou wees met die openbare beleid (ordre public).

5. 'n Versoek om inligting mag nie geweier word op grond daarvan dat die belastingeis, wat tot die versoek aanleiding gegee het, betwis word nie.

6. Die versoekte Party kan 'n versoek om inligting weier indien die inligting deur die versoekende Party versoek word om 'n bepaling van die belastingreg van die versoekende Party, of enige vereiste wat daarmee verband hou, toe te pas of af te dwing wat diskrimineer teen 'n burger van die versoekte Party vergeleke met 'n burger van die versoekende Party in dieselfde omstandighede.

ARTIKEL 8**VERTROUOLIKHEID**

Enige inligting wat ingevolge hierdie Ooreenkoms deur 'n Kontrakterende Party ontvang word, moet vertroulik gehanteer word en mag slegs openbaar gemaak word aan persone of owerhede (ook howe en administratiewe liggame) in die jurisdiksie van die Kontrakterende Party wat gemoeid is met die aanslaan of invordering van, die afdwinging of vervolging ten opsigte van, of die beslissing van appèlle met betrekking tot, die belastings gedek deur hierdie Ooreenkoms. Sodanige persone of owerhede moet daardie inligting vir slegs sodanige doeleindes gebruik. Die inligting kan by openbare hofverrigtinge of in regterlike beslissings openbaar gemaak word. Die inligting mag nie sonder die uitdruklike skriftelike toestemming van die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekte Party aan enige ander persoon of entiteit of owerheid of enige ander jurisdiksie openbaar gemaak word nie.

ARTIKEL 9**KOSTE**

Tensy die bevoegde owerhede van die Partye anders ooreenkom, word die onregstreekse koste wat by die verskaffing van bystand aangegaan word, deur die versoekte Party gedra, en word die regstreekse koste wat by die verskaffing van bystand aangegaan word (ook die koste van die aanstelling van eksterne raadgevers in verband met litigasie of andersins), deur die versoekende Party gedra. Die onderskeie bevoegde owerhede moet van tyd tot tyd oorleg pleeg met betrekking tot hierdie Artikel, en in die besonder moet die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekte Party vooraf met die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekende Party oorleg pleeg indien die koste van die verskaffing van inligting met betrekking tot 'n spesifieke versoek na verwagting beduidend sal wees.

ARTIKEL 10**UITVOERINGSWETGEWING**

Die Kontrakterende Partye moet enige wetgewing wat nodig is uitvaardig om aan die bepalings van die Ooreenkoms te voldoen en daaraan uitvoering te gee.

ARTIKEL 11**PROSEDURE VIR ONDERLINGE OOREENKOMS**

1. Waar probleme of twyfel tussen die Kontrakterende Partye ontstaan betreffende die uitvoering of vertolking van die Ooreenkoms, moet die bevoegde owerhede alles in die werk stel om die aangeleentheid deur onderlinge ooreenkoms te besleg.
2. Bykomend tot die ooreenkomste in paragraaf 1 bedoel, kan die bevoegde owerhede van die Kontrakterende Partye onderling ooreenkom oor die prosedures wat ingevolge Artikel 5, 6 en 9 gebruik moet word.

3. Die bevoegde owerhede van die Kontrakterende Partye kan regstreeks met mekaar kommunikeer vir die doeleindes van die bereiking van 'n ooreenkoms ingevolge hierdie Artikel.
4. Die Kontrakterende Partye kan ook oor ander vorme van geskilbeslegting ooreenkom.

ARTIKEL 12

INWERKINGTREDING

Hierdie Ooreenkoms tree in werking wanneer elke Party die ander deur middel van die diplomatieke kanaal in kennis gestel het van die afhandeling van sy interne prosedures wat nodig is vir inwerkingtreding. By inwerkingtreding is die Ooreenkoms van toepassing:

- (a) op strafregtelike belastingaangeleenthede op daardie datum; en
- (b) op alle ander aangeleenthede wat op daardie datum in Artikel 1 gedek word, maar slegs ten opsigte van belasbare tydperke wat op of na daardie datum begin of, waar daar geen belasbare tydperk is nie, alle heffings op belasting wat op of na daardie datum ontstaan.

ARTIKEL 13

BEËINDIGING

1. Elk van die Kontrakterende Partye kan die Ooreenkoms beëindig deur 'n kennisgewing van beëindiging te beteken of deur middel van die diplomatieke kanaal of per brief aan die bevoegde owerheid van die ander Kontrakterende Party.
2. Sodanige beëindiging word van krag op die eerste dag van die maand wat volg op die verstryking van 'n tydperk van ses maande na die datum van ontvangs van die kennisgewing van beëindiging deur die ander Kontrakterende Party.
3. Na die beëindiging van die Ooreenkoms bly die Kontrakterende Partye gebind deur die bepalinge van Artikel 8 ten opsigte van enige inligting wat ingevolge hierdie Ooreenkoms verkry is.

TEN BEWYSE WAARVAN die ondergetekendes, behoorlik daartoe gemagtig deur hulle onderskeie Regerings, hierdie Ooreenkoms in twee oorspronklike eksemplare in die Engelse en in die Spaanse taal, waarvan albei tekste ewe outentiek is, onderteken en geseël het.

In terms of section 108(2) of the Income Tax Act, 1962 (Act No 58 of 1962), read in conjunction with section 231(4) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996, it is hereby notified that the Agreement for the exchange of information relating to tax matters set out in the Schedule to this Notice has been entered into with the Government of the Principality of Monaco and has been approved by Parliament in terms of section 231(2) of the Constitution.

It is further notified in terms of Article 10 of the Agreement, that the date of entry into force is 6 December 2014.

SCHEDULE

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF SOUTH AFRICA AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE PRINCIPALITY OF MONACO FOR THE EXCHANGE OF INFORMATION RELATING TO TAX MATTERS

PREAMBLE

WHEREAS the Government of the Republic of South Africa and the Government of the Principality of Monaco ("the Parties") have long been active in international efforts in the fight against financial and other crimes, including the targeting of terrorist financing;

WHEREAS the Parties wish to enhance and facilitate the terms and conditions governing the exchange of information relating to taxes;

DESIRING THEREFORE the Parties in concluding the following Agreement which contains obligations on the part of the Parties only;

HAVE AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE 1

SCOPE OF THE AGREEMENT

The Parties through their competent authorities shall provide assistance through exchange of information that is foreseeably relevant to the administration and enforcement of the domestic laws of the Parties concerning the taxes covered by this Agreement, including information that is foreseeably relevant to the determination, assessment, enforcement or collection of tax with respect to persons subject to such taxes, or to the investigation of tax matters or the prosecution of criminal tax matters in relation to such persons. A requested Party is not obliged to provide information which is neither held by its authorities nor in the possession of or obtainable by persons who are within its territorial jurisdiction. The rights and safeguards secured to persons by the laws or administrative practice of the requested Party remain applicable. The requested Party shall use its best endeavours to ensure that the effective exchange of information is not unduly prevented or delayed.

ARTICLE 2

TAXES COVERED

1. This Agreement shall apply to the following taxes imposed by the Parties:

(a) in Monaco:

- (i) the profit tax on commercial income levied from individual persons;
- (ii) the profit tax levied from companies;
- (iii) the inheritance tax;
- (iv) the gift tax; and
- (v) the transfer tax;

- (b) in the case of South Africa:
 - (i) the normal tax;
 - (ii) the withholding tax on royalties;
 - (iii) the dividend tax;
 - (iv) the withholding tax on interest; and
 - (v) the tax on foreign entertainers and sportspersons.

2. This Agreement shall apply also to any identical taxes imposed after the date of signature of the Agreement in addition to or in place of the existing taxes, or any substantially similar taxes if the Parties so agree. The competent authority of each Party shall notify the other of substantial changes in laws which may affect the obligations of that Party pursuant to this Agreement.

ARTICLE 3

GENERAL DEFINITIONS

1. In this Agreement:

- (a) the term “Monaco” means the Principality of Monaco’s lands, internal waters, territorial sea including its bed and subsoil, the air space over them, the exclusive economic zone and the continental shelf, over which the Principality of Monaco exercises sovereign rights and jurisdictions in accordance with the provisions of international law and the Principality of Monaco’s national laws and regulations; and
- (b) the term “South Africa” means the Republic of South Africa and, when used in a geographical sense, includes the territorial sea thereof as well as any area outside the territorial sea, including the continental shelf, which has been or may hereafter be designated, under the laws of South Africa and in accordance with international law, as an area within which South Africa may exercise sovereign rights of jurisdiction;
- (c) the term “company” means any body corporate or any entity that is treated as a body corporate for tax purposes;
- (d) the term “competent authority” means:
 - (i) in the case of Monaco, the Counsellor of the Government for Finance and Economy or an authorised representative of the Counsellor; and
 - (ii) in the case of South Africa, the Commissioner of the South African Revenue Service or an authorised representative of the Commissioner;
- (e) the term “criminal laws” means all criminal laws designated as such under domestic law, irrespective of whether such are contained in the tax laws, the criminal code or other statutes;
- (f) the term “criminal tax matters” means tax matters involving intentional conduct which is liable to prosecution under the criminal laws of the requesting Party;

- (g) the term “information” means any fact, statement, document or record in whatever form;
- (h) the term “information gathering measures” means laws and administrative or judicial procedures enabling a requested Party to obtain and provide the information requested;
- (i) the term “person” means a natural person, a company or any other body or group of persons;
- (j) the term “publicly traded company” means any company whose principal class of shares is listed on a recognised stock exchange provided its listed shares can be readily purchased or sold by the public. Shares can be purchased or sold “by the public” if the purchase or sale of shares is not implicitly or explicitly restricted to a limited group of investors;
- (k) the term “principal class of shares” means the class or classes of shares representing a majority of the voting power and value of the company;
- (l) the term “recognised stock exchange” means any stock exchange agreed upon by the competent authorities of the Parties;
- (m) the term “public collective investment scheme” means any scheme or fund, in which the purchase, sale or redemption of shares or other interests is not implicitly or explicitly restricted to a limited group of investors;
- (n) the term “requested Party” means the Party to this Agreement which is requested to provide or has provided information in response to a request;
- (o) the term “requesting Party” means the Party to this Agreement submitting a request for or having received information from the requested Party; and
- (p) the term “tax” means any tax covered by this Agreement.

2. As regards the application of this Agreement at any time by a Party, any term not defined therein shall, unless the context otherwise requires, have the meaning that it has at that time under the laws of that Party, any meaning under the applicable tax laws of that Party prevailing over a meaning given to the term under other laws of that Party.

ARTICLE 4**EXCHANGE OF INFORMATION UPON REQUEST**

1. The competent authority of the requested Party shall provide upon request by the requesting Party information for the purposes referred to in Article 1. Such information shall be exchanged without regard to whether the requested Party needs such information for its own tax purposes or the conduct being investigated would constitute a crime under the laws of the requested Party if it had occurred in the territory of the requested Party. The competent authority of the requesting Party shall only make a request for information pursuant to this Article when it is unable to obtain the requested information by other means, except where recourse to such means would give rise to disproportionate difficulty.

2. If the information in the possession of the competent authority of the requested Party is not sufficient to enable it to comply with the request for information, the requested Party shall use the information gathering measures it considers relevant to provide the requesting Party with the information requested, notwithstanding that the requested Party may not need such information for its own tax purposes.

3. If specifically requested by the competent authority of the requesting Party, the competent authority of the requested Party shall provide information under this Article, to the extent allowable under its domestic laws, in the form of depositions of witnesses and authenticated copies of original records.

4. Each Party shall ensure that it has the authority, subject to the terms of Article 1, to obtain and provide, through its competent authority and upon request:

- (a) information held by banks, other financial institutions, and any person, including nominees and trustees, acting in an agency or fiduciary capacity;
- (b) information regarding the legal and beneficial ownership of companies, partnerships, foundations and other persons, including in the case of collective investment schemes, information on shares, units and other interests;
- (c) in the case of trusts, information on settlors, trustees and beneficiaries.

5. This Agreement does not create an obligation for a Party to obtain or provide ownership information with respect to publicly traded companies or public collective investment schemes, unless such information can be obtained without giving rise to disproportionate difficulties.

6. Any request for information shall be formulated with the greatest detail possible in specifying in writing:

- (a) the identity of the person under examination or investigation;
- (b) the period for which the information is requested;
- (c) the nature of the information requested and the form in which the requesting Party would prefer to receive it;

- (d) the tax purpose for which the information is sought;
- (e) the reasons for believing that the information requested is foreseeably relevant to tax administration and enforcement of the requesting Party, with respect to the person identified in subparagraph (a) of this paragraph;
- (f) grounds for believing that the information requested is present in the requested Party or is in the possession of or obtainable by a person within the jurisdiction of the requested Party;
- (g) to the extent known, the name and address of any person believed to be in possession or able to obtain the information requested;
- (h) a statement that the request is in conformity with the laws and administrative practices of the requesting Party, that if the requested information was within the jurisdiction of the requesting Party then the competent authority of the requesting Party would be able to obtain the information under the laws of the requesting Party or in the normal course of administrative practice and that it is in conformity with this Agreement;
- (i) a statement that the requesting Party has pursued all means available in its own territory to obtain the information, except where that would give rise to disproportionate difficulty.

7. The competent authority of the requested Party shall acknowledge receipt of the request to the competent authority of the requesting Party and shall use its best endeavours to forward the requested information to the requesting Party with the least possible delay.

ARTICLE 5

TAX EXAMINATIONS ABROAD

1. With reasonable notice, the requesting Party may request that the requested Party allow representatives of the competent authority of the requesting Party to enter the territory of the requested Party, to the extent permitted under its domestic laws, to interview individuals and examine records with the prior written consent of the individuals or other persons concerned. The competent authority of the requesting Party shall notify the competent authority of the requested Party of the time and place of the intended meeting with the individuals concerned.

2. At the request of the competent authority of the requesting Party, the competent authority of the requested Party may permit representatives of the competent authority of the requesting Party to attend a tax examination in the territory of the requested Party.

3. If the request referred to in paragraph 2 is granted, the competent authority of the requested Party conducting the examination shall, as soon as possible, notify the competent authority of the requesting Party of the time and place of the examination, the authority or person authorised to carry out the examination and the procedures and conditions required by the requested Party for the conduct of the examination. All decisions regarding the conduct of the examination shall be made by the requested Party conducting the examination.

ARTICLE 6

POSSIBILITY OF DECLINING A REQUEST

1. The competent authority of the requested Party may decline to assist:
 - (a) where the request is not made in conformity with this Agreement;
 - (b) where the requesting Party has not pursued all means available in its own territory to obtain the information, except where recourse to such means would give rise to disproportionate difficulty; or
 - (c) where the disclosure of the information requested would be contrary to public policy of the requested Party.
2. This Agreement shall not impose upon a requested Party any obligation to provide items subject to legal privilege, or any trade, business, industrial, commercial or professional secret or trade process, provided that information described in Article 4, paragraph 4, shall not by reason of that fact alone be treated as such a secret or trade process.
3. A request for information shall not be refused on the ground that the tax claim giving rise to the request is disputed.
4. The requested Party shall not be required to obtain and provide information which, if the requested information was within the jurisdiction of the requesting Party, the competent authority of the requesting Party would not be able to obtain under its laws or in the normal course of administrative practice.
5. The requested Party may decline a request for information if the information is requested by the requesting Party to administer or enforce a provision of the tax law of the requesting Party, or any requirement connected therewith, which discriminates against a national or citizen of the requested Party as compared with a national or citizen of the requesting Party in the same circumstances.

ARTICLE 7

CONFIDENTIALITY

1. All information provided and received by the competent authorities of the Parties shall be kept confidential.
2. Such information shall be disclosed only to persons or authorities (including courts and administrative bodies) concerned with the purposes specified in Article 1, and used by such persons or authorities only for such purposes, including the determination of any appeal. For these purposes, information may be disclosed in public court proceedings or in judicial decisions.
3. Such information may not be used for any purpose other than for the purposes stated in Article 1 without the express written consent of the competent authority of the requested Party.
4. Information provided to a requesting Party under this Agreement may not be disclosed to any other jurisdiction.

ARTICLE 8

COSTS

Unless the competent authorities of the Parties otherwise agree, indirect costs incurred in providing assistance shall be borne by the requested Party, and direct costs incurred in providing assistance (including costs of engaging external advisors in connection with litigation or otherwise) shall be borne by the requesting Party. The respective competent authorities shall consult from time to time with regard to this Article, and in particular the competent authority of the requested Party shall consult with the competent authority of the requesting Party in advance if the costs of providing information with respect to a specific request are expected to be significant.

ARTICLE 9

MUTUAL AGREEMENT PROCEDURE

1. Where difficulties or doubts arise between the Parties regarding the implementation or interpretation of this Agreement, the respective competent authorities shall use their best efforts to resolve the matter by mutual agreement.
2. In addition to the agreements referred to in paragraph 1, the competent authorities of the Parties may mutually agree on the procedures to be used under Articles 4, 5 and 8.
3. The competent authorities of the Parties may communicate with each other directly for purposes of reaching agreement under this Article.
4. The Parties shall agree on other forms of dispute resolution should this become necessary.

ARTICLE 10

ENTRY INTO FORCE

This Agreement shall enter into force 30 days after receipt of written notification by the latter Party of completion of all legal formalities required for entry into force. Upon the date of entry into force, it shall have effect:

- (a) for criminal tax matters on that date; and
- (b) for all other matters covered in Article 1 on that date, but only in respect of taxable periods beginning on or after that date or, where there is no taxable period, all charges to tax arising on or after that date.

ARTICLE 11**TERMINATION**

1. This Agreement shall remain in force until terminated by either Party.
2. Either Party may terminate this Agreement by giving notice of termination in writing. Such termination shall become effective on the first day of the month following the expiration of a period of three months after the date of receipt of notice of termination by the other Party. All requests received up to the effective date of termination will be dealt with in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
3. If the Agreement is terminated the Parties shall remain bound by the provisions of Article 7 with respect to any information obtained under this Agreement.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the undersigned, being duly authorised by their respective Governments, have signed and sealed this Agreement in the French and English language, both texts being equally authentic. In case of diversion of interpretation the English text shall prevail.

AANGESIEN die Regering van die Republiek van Suid-Afrika en die Regering van die Vorstedom Monaco ("die Partye") lank reeds daadwerklik betrokke is by internasionale pogings in die stryd teen finansiële en ander misdrywe, ook pogings gerig op terreurfinansiering;

AANGESIEN die Partye die bepalings en voorwaardes wil verstewig en bevorder wat die uitruil van inligting met betrekking tot belastings reël;

HET DIE PARTYE WAT DUS BEGERIG IS om die volgende Ooreenkoms aan te gaan wat verpligtinge vir slegs die Partye bevat,

SOOS VOLG OOREENGEKOM:**ARTIKEL 1****BESTEK VAN OOREENKOMS**

Die Partye, deur hulle bevoegde owerhede, verleen bystand deur die uitruil van inligting wat voorsienbaar tersaaklik is vir die administrasie en afdwinging van die landsreg van die Partye rakende die belastings wat deur hierdie Ooreenkoms gedek word, insluitende inligting wat voorsienbaar tersaaklik is vir die vaststelling, aanslaan, afdwinging of invordering van belasting ten opsigte van persone wat aan sodanige belastings onderhewig is, of by die ondersoek van belastingaangeleenthede of die vervolging van strafregtelike belastingaangeleenthede met betrekking tot sodanige persone. 'n Versoekte Party is nie verplig om inligting te verskaf wat nóg deur sy owerhede gehou word, nóg deur persone wat binne sy gebiedsjurisdiksie is besit word of verkrygbaar is nie. Die regte en beskerming wat deur die wette of administratiewe praktyk van die versoekte Party aan persone verleen word, bly van toepassing. Die versoekte Party moet alles in sy vermoë doen om te verseker dat die doeltreffende uitruil van inligting nie ten onregte voorkom of vertraag word nie.

ARTIKEL 2**BELASTINGS GEDEK**

1. Hierdie Ooreenkoms is van toepassing op die volgende belastings wat deur die Partye gehef word:

- (a) in Monaco:
 - (i) die winsbelasting op handelsinkomste gehef op individue;
 - (ii) die winsbelasting gehef op maatskappye;
 - (iii) die belasting op erflatings;
 - (iv) die geskenkbelasting; en
 - (v) die oordragbelasting;

- (b) in die geval van Suid-Afrika:
 - (i) die normale belasting;
 - (ii) die terughoubelasting op tantième;
 - (iii) die dividendbelasting;
 - (vi) die terughoubelasting op rente; en
 - (vii) die belasting op buitelandse vermaaklikheidskunstenaars en sportpersone.

2. Hierdie Ooreenkoms is ook van toepassing op enige identiese belastinge wat ná die datum van ondertekening van die Ooreenkoms bykomend tot of in die plek van bestaande belastinge opgelê word of, indien die Partye daartoe instem, enige wesenlik soortgelyke belastinge. Elk van die bevoegde owerhede van die Partye moet die ander kennis gee van wesenlike veranderinge in wetgewing wat die verpligtinge van daardie ander Party ingevolge hierdie Ooreenkoms kan raak.

ARTIKEL 3

ALGEMENE WOORDOMSKRYWING

1. In hierdie Ooreenkoms:

- (a) beteken die uitdrukking "Monaco" die Vorstedom Monaco se grondgebiede, binnelandse waters, gebiedswaters met inbegrip van die bodem en ondergrond, die lugruim daaroor, die eksklusiewe ekonomiese sone en die vastelandsplat, waaroor die Vorstedom Monaco soewereine regte en jurisdiksies uitoefen ooreenkomstig die bepalings van die internasionale reg en die Vorstedom Monaco se landsreg en regulasies; en
- (b) beteken die uitdrukking "Suid-Afrika" die Republiek van Suid-Afrika en, wanneer dit in 'n geografiese verband gebruik word, ook die gebiedswaters daarvan asook enige gebied buite die gebiedswaters, ook die vastelandsplat, wat ingevolge die reg van Suid-Afrika en ooreenkomstig die volkereg aangedui is of hierna aangedui word as 'n gebied waarbinne Suid-Afrika soewereine regte van jurisdiksie kan uitoefen;
- (c) beteken die uitdrukking "maatskappy" enige regspersoon of enige entiteit wat vir belastingdoeleindes as 'n regspersoon behandel word;
- (d) beteken die uitdrukking "bevoegde owerheid":
 - (i) in die geval van Monaco, die Regeringsraadslid vir Finansies en Ekonomie of 'n gemagtigde verteenwoordiger van die Raadslid; en
 - (ii) in die geval van Suid-Afrika, die Kommissaris van die Suid-Afrikaanse Inkomstediens of 'n gemagtigde verteenwoordiger van die Kommissaris;
- (e) beteken die uitdrukking "strafreg" alle strafregbepalings as sodanig aangedui ingevolge die landsreg, ongeag of sodanige bepalings in die belastingreg, die strafregkode of ander statute vervat is;
- (f) beteken die uitdrukking "strafregtelike belastingaangeleenthede" belastingaangeleenthede wat opsetlike gedrag behels wat ingevolge die strafreg van die versoekende Party aan vervolging onderhewig is;

- (g) beteken die uitdrukking "inligting" enige feit, verklaring, dokument of rekord in watter vorm ook al;
- (h) beteken die uitdrukking "inligtingversamelmaatreëls" wette en administratiewe of geregtelike prosedures wat 'n versoekte Party in staat stel om die aangevraagde inligting te verkry en te verskaf;
- (i) beteken die uitdrukking "persoon" 'n natuurlike persoon, 'n maatskappy of enige ander liggaam of groep persone;
- (j) beteken die uitdrukking "openbaar verhandelde maatskappy" enige maatskappy waarvan die hoofklas van aandele op 'n erkende aandeelbeurs genoteer is, mits sy genoteerde aandele geredelik deur die publiek gekoop of verkoop kan word. Aandele kan "deur die publiek" gekoop of verkoop word indien die koop of verkoop van aandele nie implisiet of eksplisiet tot 'n beperkte groep beleggers beperk is nie;
- (k) beteken die uitdrukking "hoofklas van aandele" die klas of klasse van aandele wat 'n meerderheid van die stemkrag en waarde van die maatskappy verteenwoordig;
- (l) beteken die uitdrukking "erkende aandeelbeurs" enige aandeelbeurs waartoe die bevoegde owerhede van die Partye ooreengekom het;
- (m) beteken die uitdrukking "openbare kollektiewe beleggingskema" enige skema of fonds waarin die koop, verkoop of aflossing van aandele of ander belange nie implisiet of eksplisiet tot 'n beperkte groep beleggers beperk is nie;
- (n) beteken die uitdrukking "versoekte Party" die Party by hierdie Ooreenkoms wat versoek word om inligting te verskaf of wat inligting verskaf het in antwoord op 'n versoek;
- (o) beteken die uitdrukking "versoekende Party" die Party by hierdie Ooreenkoms wat 'n versoek om inligting indien of wat inligting van die versoekte Party ontvang het; en
- (p) beteken die uitdrukking "belasting" enige belasting wat deur hierdie Ooreenkoms gedek word.

2. Betreffende die toepassing van hierdie Ooreenkoms te eniger tyd deur 'n Party, het 'n uitdrukking wat nie daarin omskryf is nie, tensy die samehang anders vereis, die betekenis wat dit op daardie tydstip ingevolge die reg van daardie Party het, en geniet enige betekenis ingevolge die toepaslike belastingreg van daardie Party voorrang bo 'n betekenis wat ingevolge ander wette van daardie Party aan die uitdrukking geheg word.

ARTIKEL 4**UITRUIL VAN INLIGTING OP VERSOEK**

1. Die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekte Party moet op versoek van die versoekende Party inligting verskaf vir die doeleindes in Artikel 1 genoem. Sodanige inligting word uitgeruil sonder om in ag te neem of die versoekte Party sodanige inligting vir sy eie belastingdoeleindes nodig het en of die gedrag wat ondersoek word ingevolge die reg van die versoekte Party 'n misdryf sou uitmaak indien dit in die gebied van die versoekte Party plaasgevind het. Die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekende Party moet slegs 'n versoek om inligting ingevolge hierdie Artikel rig wanneer hy nie in staat is om die aangevraagde inligting volgens ander metodes te bekom nie, behalwe waar toevlug tot sodanige metodes tot buitensporige probleme aanleiding sou gee.

2. Indien die inligting in die besit van die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekte Party onvoldoende is om hom in staat te stel om aan die versoek om inligting te voldoen nie, moet die versoekte Party die inligtingversamelmaatreëls wat hy toepaslik ag om die aangevraagde inligting aan die versoekende Party te verskaf gebruik, al het die versoekte Party sodanige inligting nie vir sy eie belastingdoeleindes nodig nie.

3. Indien spesifiek deur die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekende Party daartoe versoek, moet die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekte Party ingevolge hierdie Artikel, in soverre dit ingevolge sy landsreg toelaatbaar is, inligting verskaf in die vorm van verklarings van getuies en gewaarmerkte afskrifte van oorspronklike rekords.

4. Elke Party moet seker maak dat hy, behoudens die bepalings van Artikel 1, die bevoegdheid het om deur sy bevoegde owerheid en op versoek:

- (a) inligting te verkry en te verskaf wat gehou word deur banke, ander finansiële instellings en enige persoon, ook benoemdes en trustees, wat in 'n volmag- of vertrouenshoedanigheid optree;
- (b) inligting te verkry en te verskaf betreffende die regs- en voordelige eienaarskap van maatskappye, vennootskappe, stigtings en ander persone, ook in die geval van kollektiewe beleggingskemas, inligting oor aandele, eenhede en ander belange;
- (c) in die geval van trusts, inligting te verkry en te verskaf oor trustoprigters, trustees en begunstigdes.

5. Hierdie Ooreenkoms skep nie 'n verpligting vir 'n Party om inligting oor eienaarskap met betrekking tot openbaar verhandelde maatskappye of openbare kollektiewe beleggingskemas te bekom of te verskaf nie, tensy sodanige inligting bekom kan word sonder om tot buitensporige probleme aanleiding te gee.

6. Enige versoek om inligting moet geformuleer word tot in besonderhede deur die volgende skriftelik uiteen te sit:

- (a) die identiteit van die persoon wie se sake nagegaan of wat ondersoek word;
- (b) die tydperk ten opsigte waarvan die inligting versoek word;
- (c) die aard van die inligting wat verlang word en die vorm waarin die versoekende Party verkies om dit te ontvang;

- (d) die belastingdoel waarvoor die inligting verlang word;
- (e) die redes waarom vermoed word dat die aangevraagde inligting voorsienbaar tersaaklik is vir die versoekende Party se belastingadministrasie en -afdwinging ten opsigte van die persoon wat in subparagraaf (a) van hierdie paragraaf geïdentifiseer is;
- (f) gronde waarom vermoed word dat die aangevraagde inligting in die versoekte Party gehou word of in die besit is van of verkrygbaar is deur 'n persoon binne die jurisdiksie van die versoekte Party;
- (g) in soverre dit bekend is, die naam en adres van 'n persoon wat vermoedelik in besit is van of in staat is om die aangevraagde inligting te bekom;
- (h) 'n verklaring dat die versoek in ooreenstemming is met die reg en administratiewe praktyke van die versoekende Party, dat indien die aangevraagde inligting binne die jurisdiksie van die versoekende Party was, die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekende Party in staat sou wees om die inligting te verkry ingevolge die reg van die versoekende Party of in die gewone loop van administratiewe praktyk en dat die versoek in ooreenstemming is met hierdie Ooreenkoms;
- (i) 'n verklaring dat die versoekende Party alle metodes in sy eie gebied tot sy beskikking nagevolg het om die inligting te verkry, uitgesonderd waar dit tot buitensporige probleme aanleiding sou gee.

7. Die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekte Party moet ontvangs van die versoek erken aan die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekende Party en alles in die werk stel om die aangevraagde inligting met die minste moontlike vertraging aan die versoekende Party te stuur.

ARTIKEL 5

BELASTINGONDERSOEKE IN DIE BUITELAND

1. Die versoekende Party kan, met redelike kennisgewing, versoek dat die versoekte Party verteenwoordigers van die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekende Party toelaat om die gebied van die versoekte Party binne te gaan, in soverre dit ingevolge sy landsreg veroorloof is, om met individue onderhoude te voer en rekords na te gaan met die vooraf skriftelike toestemming van die individue of ander betrokke persone. Die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekende Party moet die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekte Party in kennis stel van die tyd en plek van die beoogde vergadering met die betrokke individue.

2. Die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekte Party kan, op versoek van die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekende Party, verteenwoordigers van die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekende Party toelaat om 'n belastingondersoek in die gebied van die versoekte Party by te woon.

3. Indien die versoek in paragraaf 2 bedoel toegestaan word, moet die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekte Party wat die ondersoek uitvoer, die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekende Party so gou as moontlik in kennis stel van die tyd en plek van die ondersoek, die owerheid of persoon wat gemagtig is om die ondersoek uit te voer, en die prosedures en voorwaardes wat deur die versoekte Party vir die uitvoer van die ondersoek voorgeskryf word. Alle besluite rakende die uitvoer van die ondersoek word geneem deur die versoekte Party wat die ondersoek uitvoer.

ARTIKEL 6**MOONTLIKHEID VAN WEIERING VAN 'N VERSOEK**

1. Die bevoegde owerheid van die versoekte Party kan weier om bystand te verleen:-
 - (a) waar die versoek nie ooreenkomstig hierdie Ooreenkoms gerig is nie;

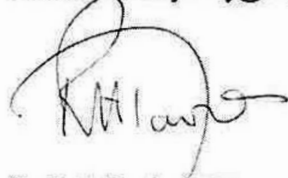

DIFFERENT CATEGORIES OF DEBT FOR INTEREST RATE APPLICABLE TO DEBTS
OWING TO STATE**

In terms of section 80(2) of the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act No.1 of 1999 – “the Act”), I Malusi KN Gigaba, the Minister of Finance, hereby repeal General Notices Nos. 4653 of 15 December 2000 and 1410 of 8 August 2002 and determine that for debt which is payable into a Revenue Fund and owed by a person to an institution to which the Act applies and which—

- (a) results from the employment relationship between the person and a department or constitutional institution, no interest shall be payable at the rate determined in terms of section 80(1)(b) of the Act, except that such interest shall be payable for-
 - (i) wrongly granted remuneration as provided for in the prescripts applicable to the department or constitutional institution, where—
 - (aa) the person has left the employ of the department or constitutional institution; or
 - (bb) the monetary advantage resulted from the person’s fraudulent action;
 - (ii) loss or damage resulting from wilful or grossly negligent act of an employee or former employee of the institution; or
 - (iii) breach of contract or any delictual claim relating to the contractual relationship between the person and the institution; or
- (b) is a debt other than a debt resulting from the employment relationship between the person and the institution, referred to in paragraph (a), the interest shall be payable at the rate determined in terms of section 80(1)(b) of the Act, except that no such interest shall be payable for-
 - (i) a health service by a public health establishment provided to the person who is a patient classified as H1 or H2 by the Minister of Health; or
 - (ii) an overpayment made to the person for a social or unemployment benefit.

PROPOSED SAVC LANGUAGE POLICY

In accordance with section 4(1) of the Use of Official Languages Act, Act 12 of 2012, the South African Veterinary Council (SAVC), as a national public entity, has developed a proposed Language Policy regarding the use of official languages for government purposes that it will adopt after a public consultation process.

1. PURPOSE OF THE POLICY

1.1 The purpose of this Language Policy is to give details of the following:

- 1.1.1 The use, by the SAVC, of English for its day-to-day activities including communicating with the general public;
- 1.1.2 Communication with individuals who use an indigenous South African language other than English and who are not proficient in English; and

1.2 The SAVC Language Policy is based on the following Acts, Regulations and Guidelines:

1.2.1 **The Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, (1996)** in terms of:

- Section 6(i) which affords official status to 11 languages and South African Sign Language;
- Section 6(3) which states that, *“The national government and provincial government may use any particular language for purposes of government taking into account usage, practicality, expense and regional circumstances and the needs and preferences of the population as a whole or in the province”*; and
- Section 30 which states that *“Everyone has the right to use the language and participate in the cultural life of their choice”*.

1.2.2 **The National Language Policy Framework (2003)** which states that, *“a publication policy of multilingualism (i.e. the function, the audience and the message) should be followed in those cases that do not require publication in all 11 official languages. However, where the effective and stable operation of government at any level requires comprehensive communication of information, it must be published in all 11 official languages”*.

1.2.3 **The Pan South African Language Board Act, Act 59 of 1995.**

1.2.4 **The Promotion of Access to Information Act, Act 2 of 2000.**

1.2.5 **The Batho Pele principles** as contained in the government white paper on *“Transforming Public Service Delivery”* (1997).

1.2.6 **Use of Official Languages Act, 2012 (Act No.12 of 2012) and Regulations.**

1.2.7 **The Veterinary and Para-Veterinary Professions Act, Act 19 of 1982.**

1.3 The SAVC has taken a decision to use English as the language of business and operations and to use English, Afrikaans and isiZulu for oral communications with the public. The decision taken is mindful of the following objectives and principles of the South African government, namely the need to:

- 1.3.1 Promote multilingualism amongst the South African public;
- 1.3.2 Support and grant equal access to information and services to all South Africans regardless of language, race religion, sexual orientation or creed;
- 1.3.3 Eradicate the marginalisation of indigenous South African languages;
- 1.3.4 Foster respect for and respect for language rights; and

- 1.3.5 Use language that is accessible to all.
- 1.4 English has been chosen as the language for daily operations at the SAVC for the following reasons:
- 1.4.1 The need to have a standardised format and terminology for dealing with members of the professions and the public and so avoid confusion and misunderstanding on the part of the professions and the general public;
 - 1.4.2 English is used by the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries in official communications, as do all government departments;
 - 1.4.3 The SAVC and its information system contain information in English that is accessed by interested parties around the world; and
 - 1.4.4 Resource constraints. Reproducing the work of the SAVC in other languages in addition to English, for example the minutes and proceedings of meetings, publications, website, policies and certificates and annual report in other languages would require additional human and financial resources, as well as time.
- 1.5 Where required, information on the SAVC will be translated into other official languages.
- 1.6 The SAVC has an information manual which is available in three official South African languages on the SAVC website which gives details of the services it offers.
- 1.7 The rights of indigenous South African language speakers are safeguarded as is their right to access information as the SAVC handles client queries, both oral and written, in the preferred language of the client, if required.

2. THE NATURE OF THE SAVC

- 2.1 The SAVC is a juristic person established by virtue of section 2 of the Act.
- 2.2 The SAVC advises the Minister of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (the Minister) in relation to any matter affecting a veterinary profession or a para-veterinary profession and submits a report on its activities to the Minister within six months after the close of its financial year, which report must be tabled in Parliament.
- 2.3 Section 3 of the **Veterinary and Para-Veterinary Professions Act, Act 19 of 1982**, provides as follows regarding the SAVC's objects:

"The objects of the council shall be to —

- (a) regulate the practising of the veterinary professions and para-veterinary professions and the registration of persons practising such professions;*
- (b) determine the minimum standards of tuition and training required for degrees, diplomas and certificates entitling the holders thereof to be registered to practise the veterinary professions and para-veterinary professions;*
- (c) exercise effective control over the professional conduct of persons practising the veterinary professions and para-veterinary professions;*
- (d) determine the standards of professional conduct of persons practising the veterinary professions and para-veterinary professions;*
- (e) encourage and promote efficiency in and responsibility with regard to the practice of the veterinary professions and para-veterinary professions;*
- (f) protect the interests of the veterinary professions and para-veterinary professions and to deal with any matter relating to such interests;*
- (g) maintain and enhance the prestige, status and dignity of the veterinary professions and para-veterinary professions and the integrity of persons practising such professions;*

- (h) *advise the Minister in relation to any matter affecting a veterinary profession or a para-veterinary profession.*"

3. THE SAVC's ROLE AND FUNCTIONS

In addition to achieving its objectives, the SAVC is responsible for the following:

- 3.1 Keeping registers in respect of all persons whose applications for registration in terms of this Act to practise veterinary professions or para-veterinary professions have been approved by the Council.
- 3.2 Evaluating the degrees, diplomas and certificates, granted after examination by a university or other educational institution, which shall entitle the holders thereof to registration in terms of this Act to practice veterinary professions or para-veterinary professions and make recommendations to the Minister may to prescribe those qualifications for automatic registration in terms of section 25.
- 3.3 Ensuring that no person practise a veterinary profession or a para-veterinary profession in any manner whatsoever unless he or she is registered or deemed to be registered in terms of the Act to practise the profession concerned.
- 3.4 Regulate the veterinary and para-veterinary professions by:
 - 3.4.1 Setting and maintaining the minimum standards for the practising of the veterinary and para-veterinary professions;
 - 3.4.2 Inspection of veterinary facilities to ensure compliance with minimum standards for facilities;
 - 3.4.3 Making rules for the veterinary and para-veterinary professions regarding ethical conduct;
 - 3.4.4 Investigating complaints in respect of unprofessional conduct and conducting inquiries where indicated;
 - 3.4.5 Setting and conducting an annual Council examination for the veterinary and para-veterinary professions for persons who do not qualify for automatic registration in terms of section 25 of the Act; and setting standards for specialisation.

4. THE NATURE OF THE SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE SAVC

The SAVC provides support and information to veterinary and para-veterinary professions and the general public regarding registration requirements, minimum standards of practise, training, education, specialisation, ethical requirements, liaison with international veterinary regulatory bodies regarding standards of training and education.

5. REGIONS OR GEOGRAPHIC LOCATIONS WHERE THE SAVC PROVIDES ITS SERVICES

The SAVC is situated in Pretoria, but as required, provides its services across the country and internationally. Services are provided and queries answered either face-to-face at the SAVC or by use of telephone, fax, e-mail and writing to members of the professions and the public who are unable to visit the SAVC personally.

6. THE SAVC's OFFICIAL LANGUAGE

The SAVC uses English as its medium of communication for all its day-to-day operations and three languages, namely English, Afrikaans and isiZulu for oral communications. The SAVC's business activities in English include:

- All meetings, workshops and conferences both within the SAVC and for the general public;
- Agenda documents for meetings and minutes and records of meetings;
- Publications, e.g. policies, criteria and guideline documents and research findings;
- The SAVC Annual Report;
- Information on the SAVC website;
- Communication with the Minister of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries;
- Communication with other government departments;
- Completion of official forms;
- Advertisements of the SAVC vacancies in the media;
- Notices in the government gazette;
- Registration certificates, letters of good standing, contracts;
- Inquiries into unprofessional conduct, suspension hearings and appeals; and
- Official signage in the SAVC building identifying facilities and services.

7. COMMUNICATION WITH MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WHO'S LANGUAGE OF CHOICE IS NOT ENGLISH

The SAVC communicates with members of the public whose language of choice is not English, as follows:

- 7.1 Written queries (faxes, letters and e-mails) in a language other than English are referred to a staff member who is proficient in the language used, and will compile a response. If that staff member is unable to answer the query, then assistance is provided to prepare an appropriate response which is then translated into the language of the query.

Written requests in a language other than English for certificates, and others are dealt with as in point 7.1 above.

Certificates, letters and statements are issued in English as that is the language used by most education and training institutions, business, the public service and government departments.

- 7.2 Verbal requests (telephonic and from walk-in clients) in a language other than English are referred to a staff member proficient in the language of the client.

When there is no staff member at the SAVC proficient in the client's language to act as an interpreter, the client is requested to return to the SAVC at an appointed time (within 10 working days) for a meeting with an interpreter. The SAVC arranges for an appropriate interpreter to be present.

- 7.3 Should a client with a hearing impairment approach the SAVC with a query and there is no SAVC staff member proficient in sign language, the client is requested to:

- 7.3.1 Submit the query in writing with the answer provided in writing while the client is present; or
- 7.3.2 Bring his/her own sign-language interpreter for a meeting at an arranged time; or
- 7.3.3 The SAVC will secure the services of a sign-language interpreter for a meeting at a predetermined time.

The follow-up meetings in all cases will be scheduled within 10 working days

of the client approaching the SAVC with the query.

8. ACCESS TO THE SAVC LANGUAGE POLICY BY MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC

- 8.1 The SAVC Language Policy will be available in English, Afrikaans and isiZulu on the SAVC website and in hard copy format.
- 8.2 Requests for a hard copy of the Language Policy may be made to the SAVC in writing, telephonically or in person. Copies of the Policy can either be handed to clients or sent to them.
- 8.3 People making telephonic requests will in the first instance be referred to the SAVC website, but can be provided with a hard copy on request.
- 8.4 The SAVC documents will not be available in Braille, due to the high cost of production and as no requests for Braille versions of documents were made in the past.

9. COMPLAINTS MECHANISM

- 9.1 Any person (either a SAVC staff member or a member of the public) who is dissatisfied with the SAVC's use of official languages may lodge a complaint. The complaint must be in writing. The name, address and contact details of the complainant, and full details of the complaint must be provided. Such a complaint must be:
 - Addressed to the Registrar of the SAVC;
 - Either delivered by hand to the SAVC, or sent by e-mail to the Registrar of the SAVC or sent by registered post to the SAVC's postal address; and
 - Lodged within 3 months of the complaint arising.
- 9.2 The Registrar of the SAVC will acknowledge receipt of the complaint within seventy-two (72) hours of receipt of the complaint.
- 9.3 The Registrar of the SAVC may request the complainant to:
 - Supply more information to aid the investigation into the complaint; and
 - Arrange a meeting to conduct a verbal enquiry into the complaint.
- 9.4 The Registrar of the SAVC must, within three (3) months of receipt of the complaint:
 - Consider the complaint, conduct the necessary investigation and make a decision on the complaint; and
 - Inform the complainant in writing of the decision.

- 9.5 A complainant not satisfied with the decision of the Registrar of the SAVC may lodge an appeal with the ad hoc Appeal Committee.
- 9.6 The appeal must be in writing. The name, address and contact details of the appellant and the full details of the appeal must be provided. Such an appeal must be:
- Addressed to the Registrar;
 - Either delivered by hand to the Registrar or sent by registered post to the postal address of the SAVC; and
 - Lodged within one (1) month of the Registrar of the SAVC's decision being received by the complainant.
- 9.7 The ad hoc Appeals Committee, in accordance with the Regulations must:
- Consider the appeal and make a decision; and,
 - Inform the appellant in writing of the decision.

10. THE LANGUAGE POLICY UNIT

The SAVC established a Language Policy Unit.

11. SUBMISSION OF ANNUAL REPORTS

The SAVC will on an annual basis, and within 3 months of the end of its financial year, submit a report to the Minister of Arts and Culture and to the Pan South African Language Board. The report will include details on:

- 11.1 The implementation of the SAVC's Language Policy;
- 11.2 Any complaints received regarding the SAVC's use of official languages and the manner in which these complaints were addressed; and
- 11.3 Any other matter that the Minister may prescribe.

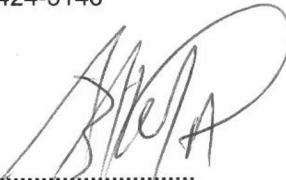

**DIRECTIVE FOR CONDUCT WITHIN THE NATIONAL PAYMENT SYSTEM
IN RESPECT OF THE COLLECTION OF PAYMENT INSTRUCTIONS FOR
AUTHENTICATED COLLECTIONS****DIRECTIVE No. 1 of 2017****1. LEGAL FRAMEWORK AND BACKGROUND**

- 1.1. In terms of section 10 (1) (c) (i) of the South African Reserve Bank Act, 1989 (Act No. 90 of 1989) (the SARB Act), the South African Reserve Bank (the SARB) is required to perform such functions, implement such rules and procedures and, in general, take such steps as may be necessary to establish, conduct, monitor, regulate and supervise payment, clearing or settlement systems. Furthermore, the National Payment System Act, 1998 (Act No. 78 of 1998) (the NPS Act) provides for the management, administration, operation, regulation and supervision of payment, clearing and settlement systems in the Republic of South Africa, and for connected matters.
- 1.2. The National Payment System (NPS) encompasses the entire payment process from payer to beneficiary, and includes settlement between banks. The process includes all the tools, systems, instruments, mechanisms, institutions, agreements, procedures, rules or laws applied or utilised to effect payment. The NPS is a primary component of the country's monetary and financial system as it enables the circulation of money, assisting transacting parties to make payments and exchange value.
- 1.3. In terms of section 12 (1) of the NPS Act, the SARB may from time to time, after consultation with the payment system management body, issue directives to any person regarding a payment system or the application of the provisions of the NPS Act.
- 1.4. The Directive for Conduct within the National Payment System No. 2 of 2006 published in the Government Gazette No. 28867, General Notice 680 of

2006 (Directive No. 2 of 2006) regulated the Early Debit Order (EDO) systems since 2006.

- 1.5. An in-depth investigation into the EDO environment, prompted by inefficiencies in the EDO systems, identified various issues, in both the Authenticated Early Debit Order (AEDO) and the Non-Authenticated Early Debit Order (NAEDO) systems. These issues spread across the payment system value chain from the customer who authorises the debit (payer) through to the collector (user), system operators, sponsoring and acquiring banks.
- 1.6. The issues included, amongst others, the growing number of disputes by payers relating to unauthorised debits and user complaints of illegitimate payer initiated reversals. A key concern for the SARB is the growing mistrust in the EDO systems and increasing complaints of abuse. These trends indicated the underlying structural issues to be addressed.
- 1.7. This culminated in the issuance of a Terms of Reference (ToR) by the SARB in July 2013, entitled: "Collections Review: Terms of Reference for the Payments Association of South Africa". The ToR defined the scope and minimum requirements for the design, development and implementation of an appropriate approach to the EDO collections.
- 1.8. Following the issuance of the ToR, the 'Authenticated Collections (AC)', initiative was launched with the objective of creating a method of collection that protects both sides of the market (payers and users). The Payments Association of South Africa (PASA) in collaboration with the relevant stakeholders was tasked to develop new authentication options for early debit orders that should give payers the opportunity to authorise future dated debit orders through an authentication process.

2. Objective and Purpose

- 2.1. The main objective of AC is to address the safety and efficiency of debit order collections, by strengthening debit order mandates and ensuring a secure debit is approved and authenticated by the paying customer upfront for future dated debit orders, thereby attempting to protect both sides of the market.
- 2.2. This Directive provides for the conduct of participants involved in the collection of payment instructions in the early debit order environment.

3. Position of the SARB

- 3.1. The SARB supports AC and is issuing this Directive in respect of the establishment of an authenticated collections mechanism in the early debit order environment to address the risks associated with the level of unauthorised debits and dispute ratios to maintain a safe and efficient NPS.

- 3.2. The SARB acknowledges that payment systems that process debit order payment instructions in the early processing window, similar to the current early debit order collections environment, are required by participants of the NPS, and should provide for appropriate risk management.
- 3.3. All the NPS participants who participate in the EDO payment clearing houses (PCHs), namely AEDO and NAEDO are required to implement AC by 31 October 2019.

4. DEFINITIONS

In this Directive, unless the context indicates otherwise, the words and expressions used herein shall have the same meaning assigned to them in the NPS Act and related expressions shall have corresponding meanings. The additional definitions below are provided for clarity.

4.1. Authentication

Is the electronic process whereby the payer, (i) confirms elements of a debit order mandate; and (ii) authorises the paying bank to debit the payer's account in accordance with the debit order mandate.

4.2. Authorisation

Authorisation refers to the consent or mandate or positive acknowledgement given by the payer to the paying bank to present a debit order to the payer's account.

4.3. Authenticated Collections (AC)

Debit order instructions which have been authorised by the payer and which is presented against the payer's account for collection in the early morning processing window through the AC PCH to be established under the EDO PCH PG.

4.4. Early processing window

It is the period or window where early morning collections are processed directly after bulk credits.

5. DIRECTIVE

- 5.1. Participants involved in the collection of payment instructions in the EDO environment are directed to:
- 5.1.1. design, develop and fully implement the payment system infrastructure to facilitate the collection of randomised early debit orders through AC in the early processing window, by 31 October 2019 (Implementation Date);
 - 5.1.2. maintain the stability of the existing systems and minimise operational risk throughout the migration period to AC;
 - 5.1.3. reach full implementation of AC through a phased approach and within the delivery dates prescribed in the SARB approved Implementation Plan referred to in 5.2 below;
 - 5.1.4. report progress on implementation of AC as and when requested by SARB in terms of section 10 of the NPS Act;
 - 5.1.5. comply with the applicable regulatory requirements, including the rules, compliance and enforcement framework set by PASA in respect of AC;
 - 5.1.6. fully implement AC under the EDO PCH PG as the only PCH to initiate new debit order instructions in the early processing window by 31 January 2019;
 - 5.1.7. not allow any new, extended or renegotiated AEDO or NAEDO collection agreements to be concluded after 31 January 2019, subject to 5.1.8 below; and
 - 5.1.8. continue to process existing early debit orders where the contractual term exceeds the cut-off date of 31 January 2019 until the Implementation Date of 31 October 2019 (in the AEDO and NAEDO PCHs according to the current processing arrangements and rules). These contracts shall be migrated to AC on or before the Implementation Date.
- 5.2. PASA must prepare the AC implementation plan (Implementation Plan) with phases and timelines for approval by the SARB, monitor compliance with the Implementation Plan by the participants and take appropriate (and where required) maximum enforcement action through an appropriate compliance and enforcement framework. Such compliance framework must include an escalating mechanism for each milestone missed.
- 5.3. PASA must continue to improve the safety and efficiency of debit orders, including the introduction of measures to address risk emanating from debit order abuse.
- 5.4. PASA through the EDO PCH PG must make provision for AC including the participation criteria, in the relevant PASA regulatory framework and rules.

6. CONCLUSION

- 6.1. This Directive is not exhaustive and may be supplemented or amended from time to time.
- 6.2. In order to maintain the effectiveness, efficiency and neutrality of the NPS, all participants in the NPS that are, or become involved in the EDO PCH PG as indicated herein are obliged to act in accordance with the NPS Act and in particular, this Directive.
- 6.3. This Directive is effective from the date of publication thereof in the Government Gazette (Effective Date).
- 6.4. Contravention of this Directive is an offence in terms of section 12 of the NPS Act. Any person convicted of an offence in terms of this Directive is liable to a fine or imprisonment or to both a fine and such imprisonment.
- 6.5. Persons who are uncertain as to whether their current or future business practices are aligned with this Directive should initiate discussions with PASA or the NPS Department of the SARB to clarify the matter.

7. REPEAL OF DIRECTIVE NO. 2 OF 2006

- 7.1. Directive No.2 of 2006 is hereby repealed with effect from the date of publication of this Directive.

This Guideline, issued in terms of Regulation 19(13), is applicable to all credit providers, all credit bureaux and data providers as hereinafter defined.

PURPOSE OF THE GUIDELINE: This Guideline prescribes the manner and form in which a credit or data provider must submit credit information to a credit bureau:

1. Definitions pursuant to Regulation 19(13)

[Unless otherwise herein defined, definitions of terms are as set out in the Act.]

"Act" means the National Credit Act, 34 of 2005, and its Regulations, as amended;

"assessment" for purpose of this Guideline, means the assessment undertaken by SACRRA to determine the on-boarding timetable applicable to a credit or data provider in accordance with the data format development and volume of credit information to be submitted by such credit or data provider to the credit bureaux;

"credit bureaux" means those credit bureaux that have been authorised in writing by the National Credit Regulator to receive, host and return credit information to any party requesting it for a permitted purpose or a purpose contemplated in the Act;

"credit information" means "consumer credit information" as defined in Section 70(1) of the Act, and includes payment profile information;

"data format" means the data specification prescribed by the National Credit Regulator in terms of this Guideline, attached as Annexure A hereto, and which may be updated by the National Credit Regulator from time to time. The data format specifies the data fields that must be completed when credit information is reported to the credit bureaux;

"data provider" means any source of information as set out in Regulation 18(7)(b) – (c) and 18(7)(e) – (f) that may provide credit information to the credit bureaux;

"Data Transmission Hub" means the encrypted data transfer interface managed by SACRRA through which credit information is submitted to the credit bureaux;

"Guideline" means this Guideline issued in terms of Regulation 19(13) of the Act, and which is binding on all credit providers, data providers and credit bureaux;

"payment profile information" means the payment history and financial information relating to a debt or credit transaction, including relevant payment dates, both negative and positive information and/or signs depicting action taken in respect of such debt or credit transaction;

"on-boarding" means the process whereby credit information is recorded in the data format and processed in a manner that enables it to be transmitted via the Data Transmission Hub to the credit bureaux; and

"SACRRA" means the South African Credit and Risk Reporting Association.

2. Reporting of credit information by credit providers

- 2.1. Credit information must be reported by credit providers to credit bureaux.
- 2.2. The National Credit Regulator shall publish on its website the names of the credit bureaux that have been approved to receive, host and return credit information in terms of this Guideline.
- 2.3. No credit or data provider shall be required or compelled to become a member of SACRRA by reason of the National Credit Regulator prescribing the usage of the Data Transmission Hub and data layout managed by SACRRA as the manner and form of reporting credit information to credit bureaux.
- 2.4. The National Credit Regulator will from time to time publish the fees payable to cover the costs of the manner and form of reporting credit information, which includes the assessment, on-boarding, operation, usage and reporting in terms of the Data Transmission Hub, as well as the maintenance and development of the data format; and will require its registrants to pay such fees in amended Conditions of Registration.

3. The form and manner of reporting credit information

- 3.1 All credit providers must utilise the Data Transmission Hub for the submission of credit information to the credit bureaux.
- 3.2 All credit providers must utilise the data format for purposes of the submission of credit information to the credit bureaux.
- 3.3 All data providers that access the payment profile information of a consumer for a permitted or prescribed purpose as provided for in the Act must:
 - 3.3.1 provide all relevant credit information in respect of consumers to credit bureaux in the same manner and form as credit providers in order to receive payment profile information from a credit bureau in respect of any consumer;
 - 3.3.2 ensure that they comply with all the requirements set out in the Act for loading credit information onto the credit bureaux;
 - 3.3.3 utilise the Data Transmission Hub for the submission of credit information to the credit bureaux and in doing so, must use the data format for purposes of such submission; and
 - 3.3.4 pay any fees that are prescribed for the usage and maintenance of the Data Transmission Hub.

- 3.4 Failure by a data provider to comply with Clause 3 of this Guideline will result in access to payment profile information being denied to such data provider, by the credit bureaux.
- 3.5 All credit providers and data providers currently providing credit information to the credit bureaux via the Data Transmission Hub, including all SACRRA members who provide credit information to credit bureaux, must continue or immediately commence with the on-boarding process to provide credit information to the credit bureaux in the manner and form prescribed in 3.1 and 3.2 above.
- Provided that such credit providers, data providers and credit bureaux retain their membership of SACRRA, no fees other than annual SACRRA membership fees will be levied or payable for the use or maintenance of the Data Transmission Hub until 2019 at which time new fees for all will be prescribed.
- 3.6 All credit providers and data providers not included in 3.5 above, including all non-SACRRA members must:
- 3.6.1 Undergo an assessment as a provider of credit information at the offices of SACRRA, between 1 July and 1 November 2017, at the commencement of which they must pay a once-off assessment fee of R500;
- 3.6.2 In January 2018, pay a once-off fee to be published in December 2017 for on-boarding onto the Data Transmission Hub; and
- 3.6.3 Ensure that all fees are paid within 30 days of receipt of invoice in respect thereof.
- 3.7 Fees to be payable annually for the usage and maintenance of the Data Transmission Hub and reporting thereof will be stipulated by category of credit provider and/or data provider and will be payable in accordance with the on-boarding timetable over a period of three years as determined in a subsequent Guideline, with credit providers in categories 1-5 and all data providers to be on-boarded in 2018.
- 3.8 At the same time as the fees are published annually, a date for commencement of submission of credit information will be prescribed for such credit and data providers.
- 3.9 Credit provider categories are detailed in Table A of the Act, as amended by the Government Gazette of 11 May 2016; and
- 3.10 Data provider categories will be determined by SACRRA during the registration process.
- 3.11 SACRRA will monitor the quality of the credit information reported by all credit providers and data providers and report any data quality problems to the National Credit Regulator at agreed intervals for appropriate regulatory action to be taken to address those issues.

4. Timeframes for reporting credit information

A credit provider must report credit information to the credit bureaux in the following manner and timeframes:

- 4.1 The details of all new credit agreements entered into with consumers within 48 (forty-eight) hours of the credit agreements being concluded;
- 4.2 The details of all closed, terminated or settled credit agreements within 48 (forty-eight) hours of the credit agreements being closed, terminated or settled;
- 4.3 The monthly payment profile information of consumers within five (5) days of the agreed billing cycle;
- 4.4 Subject to the provisions of Regulation 19(4) and Regulation 19(7), the adverse classifications of consumer behaviour and adverse classifications of enforcement actions on a monthly basis; and
- 4.5 The removal of all adverse information and judgment debts as set out in S71A (1) (a) to (d) of the Act within seven (7) days of settlement by the consumer of such adverse information or judgment debt.
5. Guideline 4(1) to 4(5), read with the changes required by law or context, apply to the reporting of credit information to credit bureaux by all data providers.

6. Effective date

This Guideline is effective in accordance with the timeframe set out herein.

ANNEXURE A: DATA FORMAT PRESCRIBED BY THE NATIONAL CREDIT REGULATOR**Overarching Category 1: Data Subject Demographics**

Consumer name/s and surname/s, address, and unique identifier (e.g. ID number/passport/date of birth).

Overarching Category 2: Data Supplier Demographics

Account number/s of consumer account/s; name of Credit/Data Provider; and supplier reference number per file, which number is issued by SACRRA; and month end date or transaction date of the file.

Overarching Category 3: Product Descriptors

Current categories of credit agreements, products, and services (Account types) utilised by industry for credit information reporting as at September 2016. Should SACRRA innovate these to meet the dynamics of the market, the NCR will be advised accordingly.

- (f) who has not been found guilty of improper or disgraceful conduct at an inquiry held under Chapter IV of the Act;
 - (g) who has not been convicted of an offence in respect whereof he or she was sentenced to imprisonment without the option of a fine or in the case of fraud, a fine or imprisonment;
 - (h) who is not a member of a municipal council, provincial legislature or parliament; or
 - (i) who is not a provincial or national office bearer or employee of any party, organization or body of a political nature,
- is eligible for nomination.

(4) Each nominee must be nominated on a separate nomination form, and any person entitled to nominate in the nomination process shall only nominate and sign up to three nomination forms for any number of nominees to be appointed.

(5) Each nomination form must -

- (a) state the first names and the surname of the person nominated;
- (b) state the nominee's registered profession and professional category, if any;
- (c) state the other details of the nominee as required in the nomination form, including a brief curriculum vitae of the nominee and a written motivation by the nominee outlining his or her vision for the profession, contribution he or she made to the profession and future contribution he or she intends to make towards the development of the profession, including his or her actual or potential leadership qualities and the ability to assume the responsibilities and functions entrusted under the Act;
- (d) be signed by two persons whose names appear in the register or registers referred to in paragraph (3) above; and
- (e) be signed by the nominee confirming that he or she consents to his or her nomination, while also declaring under oath, that he or she will execute the functions of the professional board and ensure adherence to the Act and any other applicable prescript if appointed.

- (6) If the person nominated is unable to sign the nomination form, he or she may inform the returning officer by letter or facsimile transmission that he or she consents to his or her nomination and attach the required declaration under oath.
- (7) Formal Notices with specific categories of persons eligible for nomination in each professional board and nomination forms may be obtained from the Returning Officer at the physical address given below and may also be downloaded from www.hpcsa.co.za from the date of publication of this notice.

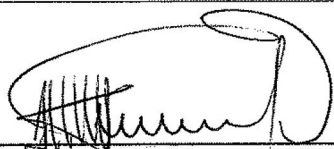
