

### **EXTRAORDINARY GAZETTES**

3. Extraordinary Gazettes can have only one publication date. If multiple publications of an Extraordinary Gazette are required, a separate Z95/Z95Prov Adobe Forms for each publication date must be submitted.

### Notice Submission Process

- 4. Download the latest *Adobe* form, for the relevant notice to be placed, from the **Government Printing Works** website www.gpwonline.co.za.
- 5. The Adobe form needs to be completed electronically using Adobe Acrobat / Acrobat Reader. Only electronically completed Adobe forms will be accepted. No printed, handwritten and/or scanned Adobe forms will be accepted.
- 6. The completed electronic *Adobe* form has to be submitted via email to <a href="mailto:submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za">submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za</a>. The form needs to be submitted in its original electronic *Adobe* format to enable the system to extract the completed information from the form for placement in the publication.
- Every notice submitted must be accompanied by an official GPW quotation. This must be obtained from the eGazette Contact Centre.
- 8. Each notice submission should be sent as a single email. The email **must** contain **all documentation** relating to a particular notice submission.
  - 8.1. Each of the following documents must be attached to the email as a separate attachment:
    - 8.1.1. An electronically completed Adobe form, specific to the type of notice that is to be placed.
      - 8.1.1.1. For National *Government Gazette* or *Provincial Gazette* notices, the notices must be accompanied by an electronic Z95 or Z95Prov *Adobe* form
      - 8.1.1.2. The notice content (body copy) **MUST** be a separate attachment.
    - 8.1.2. A copy of the official **Government Printing Works** quotation you received for your notice. (Please see Quotation section below for further details)
    - 8.1.3. A valid and legible Proof of Payment / Purchase Order: **Government Printing Works** account customer must include a copy of their Purchase Order. **Non-Government Printing Works** account customer needs to submit the proof of payment for the notice
    - 8.1.4. Where separate notice content is applicable (Z95, Z95 Prov and TForm 3, it should **also** be attached as a separate attachment. (*Please see the Copy Section below, for the specifications*).
    - 8.1.5. Any additional notice information if applicable.

- 9. The electronic *Adobe* form will be taken as the primary source for the notice information to be published. Instructions that are on the email body or covering letter that contradicts the notice form content will not be considered. The information submitted on the electronic *Adobe* form will be published as-is.
- To avoid duplicated publication of the same notice and double billing, Please submit your notice ONLY ONCE.
- 11. Notices brought to **GPW** by "walk-in" customers on electronic media can only be submitted in *Adobe* electronic form format. All "walk-in" customers with notices that are not on electronic *Adobe* forms will be routed to the Contact Centre where they will be assisted to complete the forms in the required format.
- 12. Should a customer submit a bulk submission of hard copy notices delivered by a messenger on behalf of any organisation e.g. newspaper publisher, the messenger will be referred back to the sender as the submission does not adhere to the submission rules.

### **Q**UOTATIONS

- 13. Quotations are valid until the next tariff change.
  - 13.1. Take note: GPW's annual tariff increase takes place on 1 April therefore any quotations issued, accepted and submitted for publication up to 31 March will keep the old tariff. For notices to be published from 1 April, a quotation must be obtained from GPW with the new tariffs. Where a tariff increase is implemented during the year, GPW endeavours to provide customers with 30 days' notice of such changes.
- 14. Each quotation has a unique number.
- 15. Form Content notices must be emailed to the eGazette Contact Centre for a quotation.
  - 15.1. The *Adobe* form supplied is uploaded by the Contact Centre Agent and the system automatically calculates the cost of your notice based on the layout/format of the content supplied.
  - 15.2. It is critical that these *Adobe* Forms are completed correctly and adhere to the guidelines as stipulated by **GPW**.

### 16. APPLICABLE ONLY TO GPW ACCOUNT HOLDERS:

- 16.1. GPW Account Customers must provide a valid GPW account number to obtain a quotation.
- 16.2. Accounts for GPW account customers must be active with sufficient credit to transact with GPW to submit notices.
  - 16.2.1. If you are unsure about or need to resolve the status of your account, please contact the GPW Finance Department prior to submitting your notices. (If the account status is not resolved prior to submission of your notice, the notice will be failed during the process).

### 17. APPLICABLE ONLY TO CASH CUSTOMERS:

- 17.1. Cash customers doing **bulk payments** must use a **single email address** in order to use the **same proof of payment** for submitting multiple notices.
- 18. The responsibility lies with you, the customer, to ensure that the payment made for your notice(s) to be published is sufficient to cover the cost of the notice(s).
- 19. Each quotation will be associated with one proof of payment / purchase order / cash receipt.
  - 19.1. This means that the quotation number can only be used once to make a payment.

### COPY (SEPARATE NOTICE CONTENT DOCUMENT)

- 20. Where the copy is part of a separate attachment document for Z95, Z95Prov and TForm03
  - 20.1. Copy of notices must be supplied in a separate document and may not constitute part of any covering letter, purchase order, proof of payment or other attached documents.

The content document should contain only one notice. (You may include the different translations of the same notice in the same document).

20.2. The notice should be set on an A4 page, with margins and fonts set as follows:

Page size = A4 Portrait with page margins: Top = 40mm, LH/RH = 16mm, Bottom = 40mm; Use font size: Arial or Helvetica 10pt with 11pt line spacing;

Page size = A4 Landscape with page margins: Top = 16mm, LH/RH = 40mm, Bottom = 16mm; Use font size: Arial or Helvetica 10pt with 11pt line spacing;

### **C**ANCELLATIONS

- 21. Cancellation of notice submissions are accepted by GPW according to the deadlines stated in the table above in point 2. Non-compliance to these deadlines will result in your request being failed. Please pay special attention to the different deadlines for each gazette. Please note that any notices cancelled after the cancellation deadline will be published and charged at full cost.
- 22. Requests for cancellation must be sent by the original sender of the notice and must accompanied by the relevant notice reference number (N-) in the email body.

### **A**MENDMENTS TO NOTICES

23. With effect from 01 October 2015, **GPW** will not longer accept amendments to notices. The cancellation process will need to be followed according to the deadline and a new notice submitted thereafter for the next available publication date.

### REJECTIONS

- 24. All notices not meeting the submission rules will be rejected to the customer to be corrected and resubmitted. Assistance will be available through the Contact Centre should help be required when completing the forms. (012-748 6200 or email <a href="mailto:info.egazette@gpw.gov.za">info.egazette@gpw.gov.za</a>). Reasons for rejections include the following:
  - 24.1. Incorrectly completed forms and notices submitted in the wrong format, will be rejected.
  - 24.2. Any notice submissions not on the correct Adobe electronic form, will be rejected.
  - 24.3. Any notice submissions not accompanied by the proof of payment / purchase order will be rejected and the notice will not be processed.
  - 24.4. Any submissions or re-submissions that miss the submission cut-off times will be rejected to the customer. The Notice needs to be re-submitted with a new publication date.

### **APPROVAL OF NOTICES**

- 25. Any notices other than legal notices are subject to the approval of the Government Printer, who may refuse acceptance or further publication of any notice.
- 26. No amendments will be accepted in respect to separate notice content that was sent with a Z95 or Z95Prov notice submissions. The copy of notice in layout format (previously known as proof-out) is only provided where requested, for Advertiser to see the notice in final Gazette layout. Should they find that the information submitted was incorrect, they should request for a notice cancellation and resubmit the corrected notice, subject to standard submission deadlines. The cancellation is also subject to the stages in the publishing process, i.e. If cancellation is received when production (printing process) has commenced, then the notice cannot be cancelled.

### GOVERNMENT PRINTER INDEMNIFIED AGAINST LIABILITY

# NATIONAL ENERGY REGULATOR OF SOUTH AFRICA NOTICE IN TERMS OF SECTION 2(3)(A) OF BOTH THE GAS REGULATOR LEVIES ACT, 2002 (NO. 75 OF 2002)

#### AND

THE PETROLEUM PIPELINES LEVIES ACT, 2004 (NO. 28 OF 2004)

Proposed Levy on the Piped-Gas and Petroleum Pipelines Industries for 2020/21

The National Energy Regulator of South Africa (NERSA), acting under section 2(3)(a) of both the Gas Regulator Levies Act, 2002 (Act No. 75 of 2002) and the Petroleum Pipelines Levies Act, 2004 (Act No. 28 of 2004), hereby publishes the proposed levies on the piped-gas and petroleum pipelines industries for the 2020/21 financial year. The aim is to bring the proposed levies to the attention of the stakeholders in the piped-gas and petroleum pipelines industries and invite representations to be made to the Energy Regulator within 30 days of the date of this publication. NERSA's strategic overview of the Strategic Plan and Annual Performance Plan (2020/21 – 2022/23), with the Budget (2020/21), is available on the NERSA website: <a href="https://www.nersa.org.za">www.nersa.org.za</a>.

The total budgets for the two specific budgets is as follows:

Piped-gas industry:

R85,234,615 (2019/20: R87,907,549)

Petroleum pipelines industry:

R77,468,256 (2019/20: R80,173,218)

The piped-gas levy for the piped-gas regulation industry will be effectively reduced by a refund of surplus funds to the value of R6,022,825 and interest and other income of R1,246,886.

The petroleum pipelines levy for the petroleum pipelines regulation industry will be effectively reduced by a refund of surplus funds to the value of R5,582,971 and interest and other income of R1,246,886.

Taking this into account, the total amount each industry will recover through levy income from the two industries is as follows

Piped-gas industry:

R77,964,905 (2019/20: R73,902,240)

### Proposed piped-gas levy - 2020/21

The proposed levy to be imposed on the piped-gas industry is **42.995 c/Gj** (2019/20: 40.754 **c/Gj**) in respect of the amount of gas, measured in Gigajoules, delivered by importers and producers to the inlet flanges of transmission and distribution pipelines. This levy will be paid by the person holding the title to the gas at the inlet flange. The levy shall be payable to NERSA as from 1 April 2020 to 31 March 2021, by persons concerned.

The proposed levy was determined based on an estimated volume of 181.3 million Gj per annum and the 2020/21 Annual Performance Plan and Budget requirement for the regulation of the piped-gas industry of R77,964,905 against the expenditure of R85,234,615, as indicated above.

### Proposed petroleum pipelines levy 2020/21

The proposed levy to be imposed on the petroleum pipelines industry is **0.39734** c/litre (2019/20: 0.39734 c/litre) in respect of the amount of petroleum, measured in litres, delivered by importers, refiners and producers to the inlet flanges of petroleum pipelines. This levy will be paid by the person holding the title to the petroleum immediately after it has entered the inlet flange. The levy shall be payable to NERSA as from 1 April 2020 to 31 March 2021, by persons concerned.

The proposed levy was determined based on an estimated volume of 17.8 billion litres per annum and the 2020/21 Annual Performance Plan and Budget requirement for the regulation of the petroleum pipelines industry of R70,638,400 against the expenditure of R77,468,256, as indicated above.

### SCHEDULE

#### **DEFINITIONS**

1. In these Regulations 'the Regulations' means the National Greenhouse Gas Emission Reporting Regulations, 2016 published under Government Notice 275 in the Government Gazette 40762 of 3 April 2017.

### Amendment of regulation 1 of the Regulations

- 2. Regulation 1 of the Regulations is hereby amended—
- (a) by the substitution for the definition of 'boiler' of the following definition:
  - "boiler" means a combustion installation designated to heat water. In terms of these regulations, a boiler is referred to as a stationery combustion installation.
- (b) by the substitution for the definition of 'competent authority' of the following definition:
  - "competent authority" means the National Inventory Unit in the Chief Directorate: Climate Change Monitoring and Evaluation at the Department of Environmental Affairs."
- (c) by the substitution of the definition of 'data provider' of the following definition:
  - "data provider" means any natural or juristic person conducting any activity listed in Annexure 1 to these Regulations, including—
    - (a) its holding company or corporation or legal entity, registered in South Africa in accordance with the legislation of the Republic of South Africa;
    - (b) all its subsidiaries and legally held operations, including joint ventures and partnerships where it has a controlling interest, or is nominated as the responsible entity for the purpose of reporting under these Regulations; and
    - (c) all facilities generally over which it has operational control, which are not part of another data provider for these Regulations.
- (d) by the substitution of the definition of 'greenhouse gas' of the following definition:
  - "greenhouse gas" means any one of the following gases: Carbon dioxide (C02), Methane (CH4), Nitrous oxide (N20) Sulphur hexafluoride (SF6), Perfluorocarbons (PFCs), Hydro fluorocarbons (HFCs); including any additional greenhouse gas that may be identified by the Minister;

- (e) by the insertion after the definition of 'Global Warming Potential (GWP)' of the following definition:
  - ""independent assessor" means a natural or juristic person not having either a real or an apparent conflict of interest and not being part of, or under the control of, the organization to which the internal audit activity belongs.".
- (f) by the insertion after the definition of 'operational control' of the following definition:
  - ""parameter" means any other input variable, other than activity data,, required in terms of the methodologies prescribed in the Technical Guidelines for Monitoring, Reporting, Verification, and Validation of Greenhouse Gas Emissions by industry."
- (g) by the insertion after the definition of 'South African Air Quality Information System' or 'SAAQIS' of the following definition:
  - "Stationery Combustion Installation" means an installation with design capacity rated in terms of thermal heat input per unit".
- (h) by the substitution for the definition of 'verification' of the following definition:
  - ""verification" refers to the collection of activities and procedures that can be followed during the planning and development, of after completion of reported greenhouse gas emissions data through the NAEIS or submitted manually, that can help to establish its reliability for the intended applications of that inventory."

### Amendment of regulation 2 of the Regulations

- 3. Regulation 2 of the Regulations is hereby amended by the substitution for paragraph (b) of the following paragraph:
  - "(b) for the Republic of South Africa to meet its international reporting obligations under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and instrument treaties to which it is bound; and".

### Substitution of regulation 4 of the Regulations

- **4.** The following regulation is hereby substituted for regulation 10 of these Regulations:
  - (1) For the purposes of these Regulations, a data provider is classified as any natural or juristic person in operational control of, or conducting any activity, that meets capacity threshold, listed in Annexure 1 to these Regulations.

(2) Notwithstanding subregulation (1), the Minister may by notice in the Gazette, identify additional greenhouse gases, sources and associated data providers and, in writing, require such data providers to register and submit data for their emissions within a specified period to the competent authority."

### Amendment of regulation 5 of the Regulations

- 5. Regulation 5 of the Regulation is hereby amended—
- (a) by the substitution for subregulation (1) of the following subregulation:
  - "(1) A person classified as a data provider in terms of regulation 4(1) of these Regulations must register all facilities where it conducts activities listed in Annexure 1 by providing the relevant information as listed in Annexure 2 to these Regulations, within 30 days after the commencement of these Regulations or within 30 days after commencing such an activity after the commencement of these Regulations."
- (b) by the insertion after subregulation (1) of the following subregulations:
  - "(1A) Whilst reporting shall be done at facility level and also aggregated at data provider level, the threshold to trigger registration is applicable at data provider level.
  - (1B) In a case where there are similar installations across a number of IPCC emission sources, the thresholds shall be considered across IPCC emission sources listed in Annexure 1 to these Regulations."
  - (c) by the substitution for paragraph (a) of subregulation (3) of the following paragraph:
    - "(a) on the greenhouse gas emissions reporting module within the NAEIS;".
- (d) by the addition after subregulation (4) of the following subregulation:
  - "(4) In cases where subregulation (3) (b) apply, the Minister must issue a directive or instruction by way of notice in the *Gazette*, to call for manual registration.".

### Amendment of regulation 6 of the Regulations

- 6. Regulation 6 of the Regulation is hereby amended—
- (a) by the substitution for subregulation (1) of the following subregulation:

- "(1) a data provider must, notify the competent authority, in writing, of any change in respect of the data provider's registration details as listed in Annexure 2 to these Regulations within 30 days from the date the data provider became aware of such change occurring."
- (b) by the substitution for subregulation (3) of the following subregulation:
  - "(3) A person to whom ownership or operational control of a facility or activity is transferred as contemplated in subregulation (2) must, within 30 days after taking ownership or operational control of the facility, register as a data provider, in terms of subregulation 5(1A) of these Regulations.
- (c) by the substitution for subregulation (4) of the following subregulation:
  - "(4) Registration of a data provider in terms of regulation 5(1A) is deemed withdrawn once the competent authority has, within 30 days, acknowledged receipt of notification, in writing, provided by a data provider in terms of subregulation (2)."

### Amendment of regulation 7 of the Regulations

- 7. Regulation 7 of the Regulations is hereby amended—
- (a) by the substitution for subregulation (1) of the following subregulation:
  - "(1) A data provider must submit IPCC emission sources as specified in Annexure 1 to these Regulations, for each of its facilities and in accordance with the data and format requirements specified in Annexure 3 to these Regulations, for the preceding calendar year, to the competent authority by 31 March of each year."
- (b) by the substitution for subregulation (2) of the following subregulation:
  - "(2) A data provider must submit the greenhouse gas emissions and activity data, as set out in Annexure 1 to these Regulations, for each of the relevant greenhouse gases, and in accordance with the data and format requirements specified in Annexure 3 to these Regulations, for the preceding calendar year, to the competent authority by 31 March of each year.

- (c) by the substitution for subregulation (3) of the following subregulation:
- "(3) Reporting in terms of subregulations (1) and (2) must be done at data provider level and at facility level.".
- (d) by the substitution for subregulation (4) of the following subregulation:
- "(4) Where 31 March falls on a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday, the submission deadline is the next working day."
- (e) by the addition after subregulation (5) of the following subregulations:
  - "(5) The reporting contemplated in subregulations (2) and (3) must be done:
  - (a) on the greenhouse gas emissions reporting module within the NAEIS: or".
  - (b) in cases where the NAEIS is unable to meet the reporting requirements, by submitting the information specified in Annexure 3 to these Regulations in an electronic format to the competent authority.".
- "(6) In cases where subregulation (3) (b) applies, the Minister must issue a directive or instruction by way of notice in the *Gazette* to call for manual reporting."

### Amendment of regulation 8 of the Regulations

- 8. Regulation 8 of the Regulations is hereby amended—
- (a) by the substitution for subregulation (1) of the following subregulation:
  - "(1) A data provider must define its reporting boundaries based on operational control.
- (b) by the substitution for subregulation (2) of the following subregulation:
  - "(2) A data provider must include greenhouse gas emissions from normal operating conditions and upset conditions, including start-up and shut-down and emergency situations, over the reporting period."

### Substitution of regulation 9 of the Regulations

9. The following regulation is hereby substituted for regulation 9 of the Regulations:

### "Completeness

9. A data provider's monitoring and reporting must be complete and cover ail process, fugitive and combustion emissions from all greenhouse gas emission sources and source streams belonging to activities listed in Annexure 1 of these

Regulations, taking into account the capacity thresholds specific to the different activities, as listed in Annexure 1 to these Regulations."

### Amendment of regulation 10 of the Regulations

- 10. Regulation 10 of the Regulations is hereby amended—
- (a) by the substitution for subregulation (1) of the following regulation:
  - "(1) A data provider must determine the specific emissions to be reported on, as contemplated in regulation 7 of these Regulations, according to the tiers specified for the relevant categories in Annexure 1 to these Regulations, using the methods set out in the *Technical Guidelines for Monitoring, Reporting, Verification and Validation of Greenhouse Gas Emissions by Industry.*".
- (b) by the substitution for subregulation (2) of the following subregulation:
  - "(2) Where a data provider reasonably believes that an emission factor referred to in the *Technical Guidelines for Monitoring, Reporting, Verification and Validation of Greenhouse Gas Emissions by Industry* for a particular activity is not appropriate under the specific conditions of greenhouse gas emission, such a data provider must make a submission to the competent authority, by providing the information set out in Annexure 4 to these Regulations, requesting a review of the applicable emission factor."
  - (c) by the substitution for paragraph (a) of subregulation (3) for the following paragraph:
    - "(a) approved by the competent authority, the accepted method will be included in the Technical guidelines for Monitoring, Reporting, Verification and Validation of Greenhouse Gas Emissions by Industry; or
  - (d) by the substitution for paragraph (b) of subregulation (3) of the following paragraph:
    - "(b) not approved, the data provider must submit the emissions and related data, using a method from the Technical Guidelines for Monitoring, Reporting, Verification and Validation of Greenhouse Gas Emissions by Industry, compliant with subregulation (1)."

### Substitution of regulation 11 of the Regulations

11. The following regulation is hereby substituted for regulation 11 of the Regulations:

### "11. Verification and validation of information

- (1) The competent authority must assess, in accordance with the assessment procedures in the Technical Guidelines for Monitoring, Reporting, Verification and Validation of Greenhouse Gas Emissions by Industry, the data submitted by a data provider within 60 days after the submission date."
  - (2) The assessment contemplated in subregulation (1) may include:
    - (a) methods defined in the Technical Guidelines for Monitoring, Reporting, Verification and Validation of Greenhouse Gas Emissions by Industry,
      - (b) earlier submissions,
      - (c) submissions from similar facilities; and
      - (d) other independent data."
- (3) A data provider's submission contemplated in regulation 7 of these Regulations is deemed accepted if the competent authority does not respond to the data provider with questions for clarification or corrections within 60 days from the date of the data provider's submission."
- (4) If, after the assessment in terms of subregulation (1), the competent authority reasonably believes that the information submitted in terms of these Regulations:
  - (a) may be of complex nature to assess, or
  - (b) may not be transparent, complete, or accurate;

the competent authority must instruct, in writing, the data provider to verify and validate the information submitted, and to provide the supporting information required to substantiate the submission within 60 days after receiving the written instruction from the competent authority. "

- (5) Where a data provider fails to provide information, or where the data provider provides insufficient information in terms of regulation 7(2) and 7(3), for the purposes of validation and verification, in terms of subregulation (4), the competent authority must undertake one or any combination of the following:
  - (a) Conduct an on-site facility or installation specific verification and validation of emissions estimated using the methods as set out in the *Technical Guidelines for Monitoring, Reporting, Verification and Validation of Greenhouse Gas Emissions by Industry* by data providers at its discretion; or"

- (b) Require the data provider's submission to be subject to verification and validation by an independent assessor in accordance with the mandatory GHG Emissions Verification and Validation Guidelines.
- (6) A data provider is liable for all costs incurred in compliance with subregulations (4) and (5)."

### Amendment of regulation 12 of the Regulations

- 12. Regulation 12 of the Regulations is hereby amended——
- (a) by the substitution for paragraph (a) of the subregulation (1) of the following paragraph:
  - "(a) the information is disclosed in compliance with the provisions of any law of the Republic of South Africa;"
- (b) by the substitution for paragraph (b) of subregulation (1) of the following paragraph:
  - "(b) the person is ordered to disclose the information by a court of law of the Republic of South Africa; or".

### Amendment of regulation 13 of the Regulations

- 13. Regulation 13 is hereby amended—
- (a) by the substitution for the heading of the following heading:

### "Record keeping by data provider"

- (b) by the substitution for subregulation (1) of the following subregulation:
- "(1) A data provider must ensure transparency of submissions, by archiving all data, measurement reports, algorithms, procedures and technical references used to estimate greenhouse gas emissions."

### Substitution of regulation 15 of the Regulations

14. The following regulation is hereby substituted for regulation 10 of these Regulations:

### "TRANSITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS

15. (1) A data provider may, for a transitional period of up to five years from the date of commencement of the National

Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reporting Regulations,2016 published under General Notice 275 in the Government *Gazette* 40762 of 3 April 2017, apply either tier 1, tier 2 or tier 3 methodology to the activities listed in Annexure 1 to these Regulations and the supporting Technical Guidelines for Monitoring, Reporting, Verification and Validation of Greenhouse Gas Emissions by Industry.

(2) At the end of the transitional period, a data provider must, after the expiry of a transitional period, use tier methods prescribed to the activities listed in Annexure 1 to these Regulations and the supporting Technical Guidelines for Monitoring, Reporting, Verification and Validation of Greenhouse Gas Emissions by Industry.

### Substitution of regulation 16 of the Regulations

**15.** The following regulation is hereby substituted for regulation 16 of the Regulations:

### "OFFENCES

- **16.** A natural or juristic person commits an offence if that person—
- (a) provides false or misleading information to the competent authority; or
- (b) fails to comply with regulations 4(2), 5(1), 6(1), 6(2), 6(3), 7(1), 7(2), 8(1), 8(2), 9, 10(1), 10(3) b, 11(4), 13 or 15."

### Amendment of Table of content of the Regulations

- **16.** The Table of content of the Regulations is hereby amended by the substitution for item 13 of the following item:
  - "13. Record keeping by data provider"

The table below lists all activities, as defined in the 2006 IPCC Guidelines for National Greenhouse Gas Inventories' source categories, where data providers must report greenhouse gas emissions and related activity data. The IPCC Guidelines for National Greenhouse Gas Inventories may be accessed on the IPCC website - www.ipcc.ch.

A data provider shall report the relevant greenhouse gases and associated activity data for all IPCC source categories where their capacity is equal or above the threshold indicated, using the methods indicated in column 3 of the table below. The *Technical Guidelines for Monitoring, Reporting, Verification and Validation of Greenhouse Gas Emissions by Industry* stipulates the greenhouse gases relevant for each IPCC code.

#### **Definition**

**1.** In this Schedule "the Regulations" means Regulations for Child and Youth Care Workers, Auxiliary Child and Youth Care Workers and Student Child and Youth Care Workers published under General Notice No. 38135 of 2014 (GNR 838 OF 31 October 2014).

#### 2. Amendment of regulation 4 of the Regulations

Regulation 4 of the Regulations is hereby amended by-

- (a) the substitution of sub-regulation 4(2)(b) of the following sub-regulation:
  - "(b) written proof by the accredited training provider confirming that the student is registered with the said training provider as a student child and youth care worker;";
- (b) by the addition after sub regulation 2 of the following sub-regulation:
  - "2A The Registrar may as and when required request an applicant to submit a certified copy of the applicant's original academic record at the accredited training provider, indicating the subjects, modules and number of years, courses passed in each subject as well as those for which the applicant is enrolled.".

#### 3. Amendment of regulation 16 of the Regulation

Regulation 16 of the Regulations is hereby amended by-

- (a) the substitution of sub-regulation 16(1)(b) of the following sub-regulation:
  - "(b) A B:Tech degree in Child and Youth Development at NQF Level 7 or such other level as SAQA may determine [:Provided that the applicant submits a portfolio of evidence, which must include as assessment proving that the applicant meets the outcomes reflected in the degree referred to in sub-regulation 16(1)(a)];".

#### 4. Amendment of Regulation 17

Regulation 17(3) of the Regulations is hereby amended by-

- (a) the substitution in sub-regulation (3) for the following words preceding paragraph (a) of the following words:
  - "(3) A person who, on the date of the commencement of these regulations, does not meet the requirements for registration as a child and youth care worker within the auxiliary category of registration as contemplated in section 1(a) and (b), must apply for such registration if he or she provides the following:";
- (b) the substitution in sub-regulation (3) for paragraph (a) of the following paragraph:
  - "(a) Documentary proof acceptable to the Council that he or she [was] is practising or employed as a child and youth care worker [on the date of commencement of these regulations];"
- (c) the substitution in sub-regulation (4) of the following sub-regulation:
  - "(4) A person who has been registered in terms of sub-regulation 3(a) and (b) must, within a period of 4 years from the date registration, obtain a qualification as contemplated in regulation 17 (1) (a), failing which his/her registration shall lapse."

#### 5. Short title and commencement

These Regulations are called the Amendment Regulations for Child and Youth Care Workers, Auxiliary Child and Youth Care Workers and Student Child and Youth Care Workers, 2018 and shall come into operation upon publication in the Gazette.

The South African Council for the Project and Construction Management Professions has, under Section 34(2) of the Project and Construction Management Profession Act, 2000 (Act No. 48 of 2000) determined the guideline scope of services and tariff of fees in the Schedule.

Any amount mentioned in or fee calculated in terms of this Schedule is exclusive of Value Added Tax.

The commencement date of these Rules shall be September 2019

#### SCHEDULE

#### **Guideline Scope of Services and Tariff of Fees**

for

#### **Construction Health and Safety Registered Professionals**

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#### GENERAL PROVISIONS

#### 1. **DEFINITIONS**

Where the words and phrases are highlighted in the text of this Tariff of Fees they shall bear the meaning assigned to them in clause 1 and where such words and phrases are not highlighted they shall bear the meaning consistent with the context:

- "Built Environment" refers to the functional area in which registered persons practice. The Built Environment includes all structures that are planned and/or erected above or underground, as well as the land utilized for the purpose and supporting infrastructure.
- "Construction Health and Safety Management" is the management of project health and safety processes and duties within the Built Environment from conception to completion. The Construction Health and Safety Agent is the one point of responsibility in this regard.
- "Construction Management" is the management of the *physical construction process* within the Built Environment and includes the co-ordination, administration, and management of resources. The Construction Manager is the one point of responsibility in this regard.
- "Construction Project Management" is the management of projects within the Built Environment from conception to completion, including management of related professional services. The Construction Project Manager is the one point of responsibility in this regard.
- "Construction Health and Safety Agent" means any competent person who acts as a representative for a client in managing health and safety on a construction project for the client and who has satisfied the registration criteria of the SACPCMP to perform the required functions.
- "Construction Health and Safety Manager" means a person who is appointed by an employer to manage the planning and implementation of construction health and safety systems and who has satisfied the registration criteria of the SACPCMP to perform the prescribed functions.
- "Construction Health and Safety Officer" means a person who is appointed by an employer to assist site management with the planning, implementation and management of construction health and safety systems and who has satisfied the registration criteria of the SACPCMP to perform the prescribed functions.
- "Project" means the total development envisaged by the client, including the professional services.
- "Works" means all work executed or intended to be executed in accordance with the construction contracts.
- "Principal Agent" means the person or entity appointed by the client and who has full authority and obligation to act in terms of the construction contracts.
- "Principal Consultant" means the person or entity appointed by the client to manage and administer the services of all other consultants.
- "Cost Consultant" means the person or entity appointed by the client to establish and agree all budgets and implement and manage the necessary cost control on the project.
- "Contractor" means any person or legal entity entering into contract with the client for the execution of the works or part thereof.
- "Nominated Subcontractors" are specialists and other subcontractors executing work or supplying and fixing any goods who may be nominated by the Principal Consultant.
- "Selected Subcontractors" are specialists and other subcontractors executing work or supplying and fixing any goods and who are selected by the contractor in consultation with the Principal Consultant.
- "Domestic Subcontractors" are specialists and other subcontractors executing work or supplying and fixing any goods and who are selected by the contractor.

- "Direct Contractors" are contractors appointed by the client to execute work other than the works.
- "Suppliers" mean a person or entity appointed by the client to supply goods and products for incorporating into the works.
- "Construction Programme" is the programme for the works indicating the logic sequence and duration of all activities to be completed by the contractors, subcontractors, and suppliers, in appropriate detail, for the monitoring of progress of the works.
- "Contract programme" is the construction programme for the works agreed between the contractor and the Principal Agent.
- "Procurement Programme" is the programme indicating the timeous purchasing requirements for the project, including, but not limited to, the services of consultants, contractors, subcontractors, and suppliers required for the execution of the project programme.
- "Project Initiation programme" is the programme devised by the Principal Consultant in consultation with the client and other consultants for all the work necessary to be completed prior to commencement of work by the contractors.
- "Documentation programme" is schedule prepared by the Principal Consultant and agreed to by other consultants indicating the timeous provision of all necessary design documentation required by the contractors and subcontractors for the construction of the works.
- "The South African Council for the Project and Construction Management Professions' means the South African Council for the Project and Construction Management Professions established by section 2 of the Project and Construction Management Professions Act, 2000 (Act No. 48 of 2000), and "SACPCMP" has the same meaning.
- "Project and Construction Management Professions Act" means the Project and Construction Management Professions Act, 2000 (Act No. 48 of 2000).
- "Construction Project Management Work" means the work identified under section 4 of this document
- "Construction Management Work" means the work identified under section 4 of the Identification of Work document for Construction Managers
- "Improper Conduct" as contemplated in section 27(3) of the Project and Construction Management Professions Act, means failure to comply with the code of conduct for registered persons.
- "Public" means any person or group of persons who is, or whose environment is, either directly or indirectly affected by any project and construction management activity, or by a product, outcome or influence of a project and construction management activity, which may impact on the health, safety and interest of such person or group of persons.
- "Substantially Practise" means regularly and consistently carry out project and construction health and safety work identified in clause 3 of this document and charging a professional fee for such work and accruing professional responsibility to a client or an employer for the performance of such functions.
- 'The Council' means the Council for the Built Environment established under section 2 of the Council for the Built Environment Act, 2000 (Act No 43 of 2000)

#### 2. SHORT TITLE

This Schedule is called *The Scope of Services and Recommended Guideline Tariff of Fees for Registered Construction Health and Safety Professional, Rev 2019.*

#### 3. STANDARD SERVICES

Construction Health and Safety Professionals shall perform the following standard services under the following stages:

#### 3.1 STAGE 1 – PROJECT INITIATION AND BRIEFING

#### Definition

Agreeing client requirements and preferences, assessing user needs and options, appointment of necessary consultants in establishing project brief, objections, priorities, constraints, assumptions and strategies in consultation with the client.

- 1.1. Demonstrate the Construction Health and Safety Professional competency and resource.
- 1.2. Define the Construction Health and Safety Professional scope of work and services.
- 1.3. Conclude the terms of the agreement with the client.
- 1.4. Assist in developing a clear construction project health and safety brief.
- 1.5. Advise on the necessary surveys, analyses, tests and site or other investigations where such information will be required for the next stage of the project.
- 1.6. Advise the client on the adequacy of health and safety competency and resources of the other consultants.
- 1.7. Identify construction project health and safety risk profile.
- 1.8. Attend the construction project initiation meetings.
- 1.9. Provide necessary information within the agreed scope of the construction project to the other consultants.

- 2.2. Agree the format and procedures for health, safety and hygiene construction project control.
- 2.3. Agree the documentation programme with the principal consultant and other consultants.
- 2.4. Review and evaluate design concepts and advise on construction project health and safety in conjunction with the other consultants.
- 2.5. Review, update and agree the construction project health and safety risk profile and prepare the construction health and safety policy for the construction project.
- 2.6. Prepare draft construction project baseline risk assessment.
- 2.7. Prepare the draft construction project health and safety specification.
- 2.8. Advise on preliminary cost estimates/budgets for construction project health and safety.
- 2.9. Assist the client and principal consultant in the procurement of the necessary and appropriate specialists, including a clear definition of their roles, responsibilities and liabilities.
- 2.10. Advise the client on the adequacy of the health and safety competency and resources of the appropriate specialists.
- 2.11. Assess and approve the appropriate specialist's health and safety plans.
- 2.12. Monitor the implementation of the appropriate specialist's health and safety plans, including periodic audits.
- 2.13. Attend design and consultants' meetings.

#### 3.3 STAGE 3 - DESIGN DEVELOPMENT

#### **Definition**

Manage, coordinate and integrate the detail design development process within the project scope, time, cost and quality parameters.

- 3.1. Advise designers of their health and safety legal liabilities and responsibilities for constructability, maintainability and operationability of the structure.
- 3.2. Agree on a format for the health and safety file.
- 3.3. Review the documentation programme with the principal consultant and the other consultants.
- 3.4. Manage, co-ordinate, integrate and record the design risk management process with the other consultants in a sequence to suit the documentation programme.
- 3.5. Finalise the construction project health and safety risk profile.
- 3.6. Monitor the integration of health and safety aspects for constructability, maintainability and operationability of the structure during the design process and finalise the construction project baseline risk assessment.
- 3.7. Identify and implement precautions necessary for construction project health and safety control and update the construction project tender health and safety specifications.
- 3.8. Assist the cost consultant with detailed information for initial construction project health and safety cost estimates/budgets.
- 3.9. Assess and approve necessary construction project health and safety plans for early works.
- 3.10. Monitor the implementation of necessary construction health and safety plans, including periodic audits for early works.
- 3.11. Attend design and consultants' meetings.
- 3.12. Liaise, co-operate and provide necessary construction project health and safety information to the client, principal consultant and the other consultants.

The process of establishing and implementing procurement strategies and procedures, including the preparation of necessary documentation for effective and timeous execution of the project.

- 4.1. Provide and record construction project health, safety, hygiene and design risk information to the principal consultant and other consultants.
- 4.2. Assist in developing a clear construction project health and safety procurement process.
- 4.3. Assess samples, mock-ups and products for construction project, structural maintainability and operability health and safety compliance.
- 4.4. Finalise construction project tender health and safety specifications and integrate with procurement documentation.
- 4.5. Prepare project specific health and safety documentation for distribution to contractors for inclusion into their tender / bid submissions.
- 4.6. Assist the cost consultant in the finalisation of the construction project health and safety cost estimate/budget.
- 4.7. Prepare construction project health and safety mobilisation and access plans for the construction work.
- 4.8. Participate in construction project tender clarification meetings.
- 4.9. Assist with the evaluation of tenders and verify the contractor's competencies, knowledge and resources to carry out the construction works in a safe and healthy manner.
- 4.10. Attend design and consultant meetings.
- 4.11. Assist with the preparation of contract documentation for signature.
- 4.12. Prepare construction project health and safety documentation for submission to authorities.

- Records of construction project health and safety procurement process
- Construction project health and safety tender evaluation and records
- Finalised schedule of construction project health and safety cost estimate/budget
- Construction project health and safety contract documentation

#### 3.5 STAGE 5 - CONSTRUCTION DOCUMENTATION AND MANAGEMENT

#### **Definition**

The management and administration of the construction contracts and processes, including the preparation and coordination of the necessary documentation to facilitate effective execution of the works.

- 5.1. Assess, discuss, negotiate and approve the contractor(s) construction project health and safety plans.
- 5.2. Submit necessary construction health and safety documentation to authorities and facilitate permits that may be required to commence the construction work.
- 5.3. Attend site handover meetings and lead construction project health and safety mobilisation and access plans.
- 5.4. Ensure that health and safety communication structures and systems are established and maintained, including distribution of health and safety specific documents and site safety inductions to contractors.
- 5.5. Attend regular site, technical and progress meetings.
- 5.6. Monitor design risk management.
- 5.7. Prepare revised construction project health and safety risk profile, specifications and cost estimates/budgets where there is scope of work changes.
- 5.8. Monitor the implementation, review and update of the construction project health and safety plans in accordance with the construction project health and safety specification and further scope of work changes.
- 5.9. Audit compliance with the construction project health and safety plans and brief the project management team and contractor(s) following site audits.
- 5.10. Ensure the identification of the hazards and risks relevant to the construction project through regular coordinated site inspections.
- 5.11. Recommend stop work orders where necessary.
- 5.12. Ensure that project specific emergency response and preparedness plans are compiled and tested.
- 5.13. Conduct construction health and safety management system audits.
- 5.14. Use of trends analysis to identify system deficiencies and incident trends, outline relevant improvements.
- 5.15. Facilitate construction health and safety system and plans reviews and ensure changes are incorporated for continual improvement.
- 5.16. Development of technical reports in relation to health and safety issues and communicate through presentations to diverse groups of decision makers.
- 5.17. Perform incident and accident investigations where necessary.
- 5.18. Monitor the compilation of the construction project health and safety file(s) by the contractor(s).
- 5.19. Prepare and maintain the consolidated health and safety file.

5.20. Prepare the structure commissioning health and safety plans.

#### Construction Project Health and Safety Deliverables

- Approved contractor(s) construction project health and safety plans, including all construction health and safety appointments
- Permits to commence construction work
- Record of meetings, including all construction health and safety matters to be actioned
- Record of revised changes to the construction project health and safety risk profiles

- Record of revised changes and commissioning of the construction project health and safety plans
- Record of revised construction project health and safety cost estimate/budget

#### 3.6 STAGE 6 – PROJECT CLOSE OUT

#### **Definition**

The process of managing and administering the project close-out, including preparation and coordination of the necessary documentation to facilitate the effective operation of the project.

#### Standard Services

- 6.1. Review, discuss and approve the health and safety file with the contractor(s) and manage the construction project health and safety during the defects liability period.
- 6.2. Cancel all construction project health and safety legal appointments.
- 6.3. Prepare the health and safety operations and maintenance report.
- 6.4. Prepare the consolidated construction project health and safety close-out report.

#### Construction Project Health and Safety Deliverables

- Record of audits during the defects liability period
- Record of construction health and safety risk communication
- Report on approved health and safety file
- Health and safety operations and maintenance report
- Consolidated construction project health and safety close-out report

#### **General Notes**

- As these stages might overlap, the Standard Services stated hereunder may be required to be undertaken during any one of the Project Work Stages
- The order of the Standard Services does not necessarily reflect the actual sequence of implementation

#### 4. ADDITIONAL RELATED SERVICES

- Provide advice to the Client on health and safety competence and resources of proposed designers prior to arrangements being made for design work to begin.
- Prepare additional copies of the health and safety file.
- Prepare copies of abstracts of the health and safety file for delivery to tenants by the Client/Owner's (The contents of the abstracts to be determined in consultation with the Client/Owner's legal advisors).
- Seek the co operation of and co operate with anyone else involved in a construction project at an adjoining site so far as necessary to enable them to perform their duties under the Construction Regulations.
- Facilitate co operation and co ordination in relation to duty holders on adjoining construction sites as it may affect the project; ensuring that suitable arrangements are made and implemented for the co ordination of health and safety measures during planning and preparation for the construction phase.
- Keep a record of the health and safety file.
- Convert the health and safety files on other projects to match Client/ Owner's electronic format.
- Carry out necessary inspections at the appropriate stages to verify that the construction of the relevant structure is carried out in accordance with the design.
- To stop any contractor from executing any construction work that is not in accordance with the relevant design's health and safety aspects.
- Assist in the development of maintenance schedules for the Client/Owners completed structure.
- Inspect the structure on behalf of the Client/Owner once every six (6) months for the first two (2) years on completion of the structure and then yearly thereafter, to ensure the structure remains safe for continued use and records are kept of such in the structure's health and safety file

#### 5. COMMISSION TERMINATION

- 5.1 Should a commission be terminated the fee for the services completed shall be calculated in accordance with the Tariff of Fees and the fee for services partially completed shall be determined *pro rata* to the complete service
- 5.2 Should a commission be terminated by the client / employer after the commencement of the commission then, in addition to the fee calculated in accordance with 5.1, a surcharge of 10 percent shall be payable on the difference between the full fee calculated in accordance with the Tariff of Fees for the services commissioned and the fee calculated in accordance with 5.1.
- 5.3 For purposes of 5.1 and 5.2, a commission shall be deemed to be terminated where the services are deferred or suspended for a period of more than 90 calendar days in the aggregate, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the parties.

#### RECOMMENDED GUIDELINES TARIFF OF FEES

#### 6. APPLICATION OF TARIFF OF FEES

- 6.1 The guideline tariff of fees contained in this Schedule applies in respect of normal services
- 6.2 The client should remunerate the Construction Health and Safety Professional, for the normal services rendered, on the basis of clauses 6 to 8. In cases where the client and Construction Health and Safety Professional have agreed that clauses 6 to 8 are not applicable, payment should be on the basis of clause 9 or as agreed according to clause 6(4)
- 6.3 The client shall reimburse the Construction Health and Safety Professional for all expenses and costs incurred in terms of clause 10 in performing his services, irrespective of whether fees are charged in terms of clauses 6 to 8, as well as for all costs incurred on behalf, and with the approval, of the client.

- 6.4 Should the tariff of fees contained in this Schedule be found to be inappropriate to any project, works, services or part thereof, the client and Construction Health and Safety Professional may agree, in writing, a fee deemed more appropriate, prior to the commencement of the works. Contributing factors to be taken into account, although not limited to, may include all or any of the following:
  - 6.4.1 *Complexity:* Where the works call for the application of new, unusual or untried techniques or designs or application of complex project delivery, systems or processes or excessive complexity of the whole or part of the works
  - 6.4.2 *Small projects*: Where projects are small in monetary value and the tariff of fees for normal projects does not compensate the Construction Health and Safety Professional reasonably for the normal services to be rendered
  - 6.4.3 *Cost of the works*: Where the cost of the works is abnormally low relative to the normal services required from the Construction Health and Safety Professional.
  - 6.4.4 *Time duration:* Where the works are executed over an appreciably shorter or longer than normal or realistic time periods during any of the stages defined in clause 3, or where the client orders suspension of the services between stages for periods in excess of 21 calendar days in the aggregate for any stage.
  - 6.4.5 Level of responsibility, liability and risk: Where unusually high demands in respect of these factors are expected to be carried by the Construction Health and Safety Professional.
- 6.5 Agreement on any adjustment of or special fees should be reached in writing at the time of the engagement of the Construction Health and Safety Professional and be concluded prior to the construction project manager rendering services which may be affected.
- 6.6 Where at the instance and with the consent of the client the works are undertaken on separate non-contiguous sites, continuity is interrupted or are unusually fragmented or are constructed as separately documented phases or sections, the fee for *normal services* is:
  - 6.6.1 the sum of the fees calculated separately for each site, contract, phase or section as if they were separate works; or
  - the fee agreed to, in writing, between the client and the Construction Health and Safety Professional, prior to the commencement of the works, and which fee lies between the fee calculated on the total cost of the works and the sum of the fees contemplated in clause 6(6)(1).
- 6.7 The following fees may be claimed after each stage of services or monthly or as agreed between the construction project manager and the client:
  - 6.7.1 Percentage fees determined on the basis of the cost of the works prevailing at the time of the fee calculation and pro-rata to the completed normal services
  - 6.7.2 Time based fees as specifically agreed on in writing by the client, applicable when additional services were rendered
- 6.8 Disbursements as set out in clause 10 may be claimed monthly.

#### 7. FEES AND RATES FOR STANDARD CONSTRUCTION HEALTH AND SAFETY SERVICES

#### 7.1 CONSTRUCTION HEALTH AND SAFETY SERVICES PERTAINING TO BUILDING PROJECTS

The basic rates for normal services in the Profession of Construction Health and Safety, pertaining to building projects, is calculated at the salary bands contained in following table:

The fees for additional / supplementary services contemplated in clause 4 are to be agreed to, in writing, between the client or employer and the Construction Health and Safety Professional, prior to the commencement of the works.

#### 9. TIME BASED FEES

- 9.1 Time based fees are all-inclusive fees, including allowances for overhead charges incurred by the Construction Health and Safety Professional as part of normal business operations, including the cost of management, as well as payments to administrative, clerical and secretarial staff used to support professional and technical staff in general and not on a specific project only.
- 9.2 The time based fee rates and any applicable annual increase to rates are to be agreed to by the parties at the start of the commission, failing which applicable reasonable market related or gazetted rates shall be applied.
- 9.3 For the purposes of this clause, the total annual cost of employment of a person means the total amount borne by an employer in respect of the employment of such a person per year, calculated at the amounts applicable to such a person at the time of appointment of such staff to the project, including -
  - 9.3.1 Basic salary, or a nominal market related salary, excluding profit share and asset growth
  - 9.3.2 benefits not reflected in the basic salary, including:
    - 9.3.2.1 normal annual bonus;
    - 9.3.2.2 contribution to medical aid;
    - 9.3.2.3 group life insurance premiums borne by the employer;
    - 9.3.2.4 contribution to a pension or provident fund; and
    - 9.3.2.5 all other benefits or allowances payable in terms of a letter of appointment, including any transportation allowance or company vehicle benefit, telephone and/or computer allowances, etc; and

- 9.3.3 Amounts payable in terms of an Act, including:
  - 9.3.3.1 contributions to the Compensation Fund in terms of the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act;
  - 9.3.3.2 contributions to unemployment insurance in terms of the Unemployment Insurance Fund Act; and
  - 9.3.3.3 recoverable levies to all spheres of government
- 9.4 The applicable Hourly Fee Rates shall be the *Hourly Fee Rates For Consultants as* published by the Department of Public of Public Works (DPW) and having consideration for the Hourly Fee Rates For Consultants published by the National Department of Public Service and Administration. The latest Fee Rates are available at <a href="https://www.dpw.gov.za">www.dpw.gov.za</a>. The SACPCMP hereby makes it known that the Rates set out therein are recommended guidelines.

#### 10. EXPENSES AND COSTS

- 10.1 For disbursements and for reasonable travelling and subsistence expenses additional payment shall be claimed over and above the fee payable under any other provision of this Tariff of Fees
- 10.2 Recoverable expenses include:
  - 10.2.1 Travelling expenses for the conveyance of the Construction Health and Safety Professional or a member of the Construction Health and Safety Professional's staff by means of:
    - 10.2.1.1 private motor transport, including any parking charges, toll fees and related expenses;
    - 10.2.1.2 a scheduled airline or a train, bus, taxi or hired car; or
    - 10.2.1.3 non-scheduled or privately-owned air transport
  - 10.2.2 Travelling time on the basis of the rate set out in clause 9, for all time spent in travelling by the Construction Health and Safety Professional or members of his or her staff shall be as follows:
    - 10.2.2.1 when fees are paid on a time basis, all hours spent on travelling are reimbursable
    - 10.2.2.2 when fees are paid on a percentage basis, reimbursement for travelling time shall be for all time spent in travelling minus the first hour per return journey
  - 10.2.3 Reasonable accommodation and subsistence expenses incurred by the Construction Health and Safety Professional or a member of his or her staff;
  - 10.2.4 Agreed costs of typing, production, copying and binding of contract documents, pre-qualification documents, feasibility reports, preliminary design reports, final reports and manuals, excluding general correspondence, minor reports, contractual reports, progress reports, etc.
  - 10.2.5 Expenses on special reproductions, copying, printing, artwork, binding and photography, etc. requested by the client
  - 10.2.6 Alternatively, a lump sum or percentage of the total fees payable to the Construction Health and Safety Professional may be determined and agreed between the Construction Health and Safety Professional and the client to cater for all or any of the above

#### 11. FEE FOR ALTERATIONS AND ADDITIONS

A premium of 25% of the applicable fee shall be added to take cognizance of the additional work required for alterations and additions.

# **Guideline Scope of Services and Tariff of Fees for Registered Persons**

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#### **GENERAL PROVISIONS**

#### 1. **DEFINITIONS**

Where the words and phrases are highlighted in the text of this Tariff of Fees they shall bear the meaning assigned to them in clause 1 and where such words and phrases are not highlighted they shall bear the meaning consistent with the context:

- "Built Environment" refers to the functional area in which registered persons practice. The Built Environment includes all structures that are planned and/or erected above or underground, as well as the land utilized for the purpose and supporting infrastructure.
- "Construction Management" is the management of the *physical construction* process within the Built Environment and includes the co-ordination, administration, and management of resources. The Construction Manager is the one point of responsibility in this regard.
- "Construction Project Management" is the management of projects within the Built Environment from conception to completion, including management of related professional services. The Construction Project Manager is the one point of responsibility in this regard.
- "Project" means the total development envisaged by the client, including the professional services.
- "Works" means all work executed or intended to be executed in accordance with the construction contracts.
- **'Principal Agent'** means the person or entity appointed by the client and who has full authority and obligation to act in terms of the construction contracts.
- "Principal Consultant" means the person or entity appointed by the client to manage and administer the services of all other consultants.
- "Cost Consultant" means the person or entity appointed by the client to establish and agree all budgets and implement and manage the necessary cost control on the project.
- "Contractor" means any person or legal entity entering into contract with the client for the execution of the works or part thereof.
- "Nominated Subcontractors" are specialists and other subcontractors executing work or supplying and fixing any goods who may be nominated by the Principal Consultant.
- "Selected Subcontractors" are specialists and other subcontractors executing work or supplying and fixing any goods and who are selected by the contractor in consultation with the Principal Consultant.
- "Domestic Subcontractors" are specialists and other subcontractors executing work or supplying and fixing any goods and who are selected by the contractor.
- "Direct Contractors" are contractors appointed by the client to execute work other than the works.
- "Suppliers" mean a person or entity appointed by the client to supply goods and products for incorporating into the works.
- "Construction Programme" is the programme for the works indicating the logic sequence and duration of all activities to be completed by the contractors, subcontractors, and suppliers, in appropriate detail, for the monitoring of progress of the works.
- "Contract programme" is the construction programme for the works agreed between the contractor and the Principal Agent.

"Procurement Programme" is the programme indicating the timeous purchasing requirements for the project, including, but not limited to, the services of consultants, contractors, subcontractors, and suppliers required for the execution of the project programme.

"Project Initiation programme" is the programme devised by the Principal Consultant in consultation with the client and other consultants for all the work necessary to be completed prior to commencement of work by the contractors.

"Documentation programme" is schedule prepared by the Principal Consultant and agreed to by other consultants indicating the timeous provision of all necessary design documentation required by the contractors and subcontractors for the construction of the works.

**'The South African Council for the Project and Construction Management Professions'** means the South African Council for the Project and Construction Management Professions established by section 2 of the Project and Construction Management Professions Act, 2000 (Act No. 48 of 2000), and **"SACPCMP"** has the same meaning.

"Project and Construction Management Professions Act" means the Project and Construction Management Professions Act, 2000 (Act No. 48 of 2000).

"Construction Project Management Work" means the work identified under section 4 of this document

"Construction Management Work" means the work identified under section 4 of the Identification of Work document for Construction Managers

"Improper Conduct" as contemplated in section 27(3) of the Project and Construction Management Professions Act, means failure to comply with the code of conduct for registered persons.

"Public" means any person or group of persons who is, or whose environment is, either directly or indirectly affected by any project and construction management activity, or by a product, outcome or influence of a project and construction management activity, which may impact on the health, safety and interest of such person or group of persons.

**"Substantially Practise"** means regularly and consistently carry out project and construction management work identified in section 4 of this document, and charging a professional fee for such work and accruing professional responsibility to a client or an employer for the performance of such functions.

**The Council"** means the Council for the Built Environment established under section 2 of the Council for the Built Environment Act, 2000 (Act No 43 of 2000)

- 3.5.16 Establish the construction information distribution procedures.

- 3.5.22 Monitor, review, approve and certify monthly progress payments.
- 3.5.23 Receive, review and adjudicate any contractual claims.
- 3.5.24 Monitor the preparation the preparation of monthly cost reports by the cost consultants.
- 3.5.25 Monitor long lead items and off-site production by the contractors and suppliers.
- 3.5.26 Prepare monthly project reports including submission to the client
- 3.5.27 Manage, co-ordinate and monitor all necessary testing and commissioning by consultants and contractors.
- 3.5.28 Co-ordinate, monitor and issue the Practical Completion Lists and the Certificate of Practical Completion.
- 3.5.29 Co-ordinate and monitor the preparation and issue of the Works Completion List by the consultants to the contractors.
- 3.5.30 Monitor the execution by the contractors of the defect items to achieve Works Completion.

- 3.6.4 Manage and expedite the procurement of all statutory compliance certificates and documentation.
- 3.6.5 Manage the finalization of the Health and Safety File for submission to the Client.
- 3.6.6 Co-ordinate, monitor and manage the rectification of defects during the Defects Liability Period.
- 3.6.7 Manage, co-ordinate and expedite the preparation and agreement of the final account by the cost consultants with the relevant contractors.

#### 4.1 Development Management Services

The Project Construction Manager may, by prior mutual consent, provide the following supplementary services. This will require agreement of both the Client and Project Construction Manager on the adjustment of the fees and disbursements.

- a. Facilitate the opportunity realisation process
- b. Procuring of land and finance
- c. Procuring of tenants, tenant co-ordination and tenant installations
- d. Drafting of appointment contracts for other members of the professional team
- e. Project management services in relation to direct contractors engaged by the client, such as those engaged for furniture, fittings and equipment
- f. Mediation, arbitration proceedings and similar services. Such services will commence upon the notification of a dispute or the initiation of such proceedings
- g. All work arising out of the failure of any consultant, contractors, suppliers or other external party to perform its obligations
- Services required in respect of damage to or destruction of the works, insurance matters, postponement or cancellation of agreements
- Additional services resulting from changes by the client to previously issued instructions
- j. Any other services not specifically incorporated in the identified scope of services mentioned in this document

#### 4.2 Supplementary Services Pertaining to all Stages of the Project

The following services are additional to the normal services provided by the construction project manager, and shall be performed by agreement between the construction project manager and the client. The agreement on scope of additional services and remuneration shall be in writing and should, if at all possible, be concluded before such additional services are rendered

- a. Appointment as agent in accordance with Regulation 4.(5) of the Construction Regulations 2003, issued in terms of the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act 85 of 1993), to specifically ensure compliance in terms thereof
- b. Procuring of land and finance
- c. Procuring of tenants, tenant co-ordination and tenant installations
- d. Drafting of non-standard contracts
- e. Project management services in relation to direct contractors engaged by the client, such as those engaged for furniture, fittings and equipment
- f. Mediation, arbitration and litigation proceedings and similar services.
- g. Where the client requires the construction project manager to, on his behalf, perform the services listed hereunder or similar work, the extent

- h. thereof and remuneration therefore is subject to agreement between the client and the construction project manager:
  - i. Dealing with matters of law, obtaining parliamentary or other statutory approval, licenses or permits
  - ii. Assisting with or participating in contemplated or actual mediation, arbitration or litigation proceedings
  - Officiating at or Attending courts and commissions of enquiry, select committees and similar bodies convened by statute, regulation or decree
- i. All work arising out of failure of any consultant, contractor, supplier or other external party to perform its obligations, provided that such failure is not due to default by the Construction Project Manager
- j. Services resulting from damages to or destruction of the works, insurance matters, postponement or cancellation of agreement
- k. Additional services resulting from the client changing previously issued instructions
- k. Construction management
- 1. Calculation and certification of professional fees applicable to other professionals engaged by the client on the project
- Any other services not specifically incorporated in this Guideline Scope of Services and Tariff of Fees for Registered Persons

#### 5. COMMISSION TERMINATION

- 5.1 Should a commission be terminated the fee for the services completed shall be calculated in accordance with the Tariff of Fees and the fee for services partially completed shall be determined *pro rata* to the complete service
- 5.2 Should a commission be terminated by the client after the commencement of the commission then, in addition to the fee calculated in accordance with 5.1, a surcharge of 10 percent shall be payable on the difference between the full fee calculated in accordance with the Tariff of Fees for the services commissioned and the fee calculated in accordance with 5.1.
- 5.3 For purposes of 5.1 and 5.2, a commission shall be deemed to be terminated where the services are deferred or suspended for a period of more than 90 calendar days in the aggregate, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the parties.

#### RECOMMENDED GUIDELINES TARIFF OF FEES

#### 6. APPLICATION OF TARIFF OF FEES

- 6.1 The guideline tariff of fees contained in this Schedule applies in respect of normal services
- 6.2 The client should remunerate the construction project manager, for the normal services rendered, on the basis of clauses 6 to 9. In cases where the client and construction project manager have agreed that clauses 6 to 9 are not applicable, payment should be on the basis of clause 10 or as agreed according to clause 6(4)
- 6.3 The client shall reimburse the construction project manager for all expenses and costs incurred in terms of clause 11 in performing his services, irrespective of whether fees are charged in terms of clauses 6 to 9, as well as for all costs incurred on behalf, and with the approval, of the client.
- 6.4 Should the tariff of fees contained in this Schedule be found to be inappropriate to any project, works, services or part thereof, the client and construction project manager may agree, in writing, a fee deemed more appropriate, prior to the commencement of the works. Contributing factors to be taken into account, although not limited to, may include all or any of the following:
  - a. Complexity: Where the works call for the application of new, unusual or untried techniques or designs or application of complex project delivery, systems or processes or excessive complexity of the whole or part of the works
  - b. *Small projects*: Where projects are small in monetary value and the tariff of fees for normal projects does not compensate the construction project manager reasonably for the normal services to be rendered
  - c. *Cost of the works:* Where the cost of the works is abnormally low relative to the normal services required from the construction project manager
  - d. *Time duration:* Where the works are executed over an appreciably shorter or longer than normal or realistic time periods during any of the stages defined in clause 3, or where the client orders suspension of the services between stages for periods in excess of 21 calendar days in the aggregate for any stage.
  - e. Level of responsibility, liability and risk: Where unusually high demands in respect of these factors are expected to be carried by the construction project manager
- 6.5 Agreement on any adjustment of or special fees should be reached in writing at the time of the engagement of the construction project manager and be concluded prior to the construction project manager rendering services which may be affected.
- Where at the instance and with the consent of the client the works are undertaken on separate non-contiguous sites, continuity is interrupted or are unusually fragmented or are constructed as separately documented phases or sections, the fee for *normal services* is:
  - a. the sum of the fees calculated separately for each site, contract, phase or section as if they were separate works; or
  - b. the fee agreed to, in writing, between the client and the construction project manager, prior to the commencement of the works, and which fee lies between the fee calculated on the total cost of the works and the sum of the fees contemplated in clause 6(6)(1).

- 6.7 The following fees may be claimed after each stage of services or monthly or as agreed between the construction project manager and the client:
  - a. Percentage fees determined on the basis of the cost of the works prevailing at the time of the fee calculation and pro-rata to the completed normal services
  - b. Time based fees as specifically agreed on in writing by the client, applicable when additional services were rendered
- 6.8 Disbursements as set out in clause 11 may be claimed monthly

#### 7. FEES FOR STANDARD SERVICES

Construction project management services pertaining to building projects

The basic fee for normal services in the field of construction project management, pertaining to building projects, is calculated at the percentage mentioned against the cost of the works contained in following table:

#### 8. SERVICES PROVIDED PARTIALLY OR IN STAGES

The following table shall be used for proportioning the basic fee for standard services over the various stages of the services:

#### 9. FEES FOR ADDITIONAL/SUPPLEMENTARY SERVICES

The fees for additional/ supplementary services contemplated in clause 4 are to be agreed to, in writing, between the client and the construction project manager, prior to the commencement of the works.

#### 10. TIME BASED FEES

- 10.1 Time based fees are all-inclusive fees, including allowances for overhead charges incurred by the construction project manager as part of normal business operations, including the cost of management, as well as payments to administrative, clerical and secretarial staff used to support professional and technical staff in general and not on a specific project only.
- 10.1 The time based fee rates and any applicable annual increase to rates are to be agreed to by the parties at the start of the commission, failing which applicable reasonable market related or gazetted rates shall be applied.
- 10.2 For the purposes of this clause, the total annual cost of employment of a person means the total amount borne by an employer in respect of the employment of such a person per year, calculated at the amounts applicable to such a person at the time of appointment of such staff to the project, including
  - a. Basic salary, or a nominal market related salary, excluding profit share and asset growth
  - b. benefits not reflected in the basic salary, including:
    - i. normal annual bonus;
    - ii. contribution to medical aid;
    - iii. group life insurance premiums borne by the employer;
    - iv. contribution to a pension or provident fund; and
    - v. all other benefits or allowances payable in terms of a letter of appointment, including any transportation allowance or company vehicle benefit, telephone and/or computer allowances, etc; and

- c. Amounts payable in terms of a Act, including:
  - contributions to the Compensation Fund in terms of the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act;
  - ii. contributions to unemployment insurance in terms of the Unemployment Insurance Fund Act; and
  - iii. recoverable levies to all spheres of government
- 10.3 The applicable Hourly Fee Rates shall be the *Hourly Fee Rates For Consultants as* published by the Department of Public of Public Works (DPW). The latest Fee Rates are available at <a href="https://www.dpw.gov.za">www.dpw.gov.za</a>. The SACPCMP hereby makes it known that the Rates set out therein are recommended guidelines.

#### 11. EXPENSES AND COSTS

- 11.1 For disbursements and for reasonable travelling and subsistence expenses additional payment shall be claimed over and above the fee payable under any other provision of this Tariff of Fees
- 11.2 Recoverable expenses include;
  - a. Travelling expenses for the conveyance of the construction project manager or a member of the construction project manager's staff by means of:
    - private motor transport, including any parking charges, toll fees and related expenses;
    - ii. a scheduled air line or a train, bus, taxi or hired car; or
    - iii. non-scheduled or privately owned air transport
  - b. Travelling time on the basis of the rate set out in clause 10, for all time spent in travelling by the construction project manager or members of his staff shall be as follows:
    - i. when fees are paid on a time basis, all hours spent on travelling are reimbursable
    - ii. when fees are paid on a percentage basis, reimbursement for travelling time shall be for all time spent in travelling minus the first hour per return journey
  - Reasonable accommodation and subsistence expenses incurred by the construction project manager or a member of his staff;
  - d. Agreed costs of typing, production, copying and binding of contract documents, pre-qualification documents, feasibility reports, preliminary design reports, final reports and manuals, excluding general correspondence, minor reports, contractual reports, progress reports, etc.
  - e. Expenses on special reproductions, copying, printing, artwork, binding and photography, etc. requested by the client
  - f. Alternatively, a lump sum or percentage of the total fees payable to the construction project manager may be determined and agreed between the construction project manager and the client to cater for all or any of the above

#### 12. FEE FOR ALTERATIONS AND ADDITIONS

A premium of 25% of the applicable fee shall be added to take cognizance of the additional work required for alterations and additions
