Explanatory Memorandum to National and Provincial Allocations set out in the Schedules

This *Gazette* is published in terms of the Division of Revenue Act, 2020 (Act No. 4 of 2020), as amended, and provides information on adjustments to existing allocations to the national department of Basic Education and provinces in the 2020/21 financial year.

This is necessitated by the need to convert funds in terms of Section 21 of the Division of Revenue Act, 2020, as amended, and the need to re-allocate the converted funds to four provinces, as approved in terms of Section 20 of the Division of Revenue Act, 2020, as amended.

This *Gazette* therefore updates information that was published in the Division of Revenue Amendment Act, 2020.

This notice affects the Schools Infrastructure Backlogs Grant and the Education Infrastructure Grant

- a) In compliance with Section 21 of the Division of Revenue Act, 2020, as amended, the national Department of Basic Education converts R628 million from the School Infrastructure Backlogs Grant to the Education Infrastructure Grant
- b) In compliance with Section 20 of the Division of Revenue Act, 2020, as amended, the national Department of Basic Education allocates funds to Eastern Cape (R60.32 million), Free State (R50.55 million), KwaZulu-Natal (R413.63 million) and Northern Cape (R103.5 million), following revised allocations by the national Department of Basic Education.
