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HIGH ALERT: SCAM WARNING!!!

TO ALL SUPPLIERS AND SERVICE PROVIDERS OF THE GOVERNMENT PRINTING WORKS

It has come to the attention of the GOVERNMENT PRINTING WORKS that there are certain unscrupulous companies and individuals who are defrauding unsuspecting businesses disguised as representatives of the Government Printing Works (GPW).

The scam involves the fraudsters using the letterhead of *GPW* to send out fake tender bids to companies and requests to supply equipment and goods.

Although the contact person's name on the letter may be of an existing official, the contact details on the letter are not the same as the *Government Printing Works*'. When searching on the Internet for the address of the company that has sent the fake tender document, the address does not exist.

The banking details are in a private name and not company name. Government will never ask you to deposit any funds for any business transaction. *GPW* has alerted the relevant law enforcement authorities to investigate this scam to protect legitimate businesses as well as the name of the organisation.

Example of e-mails these fraudsters are using:

PROCUREMENT@GPW-GOV.ORG

Should you suspect that you are a victim of a scam, you must urgently contact the police and inform the *GPW*.

GPW has an official email with the domain as @gpw.gov.za

Government e-mails DO NOT have org in their e-mail addresses. All of these fraudsters also use the same or very similar telephone numbers. Although such number with an area code 012 looks like a landline, it is not fixed to any property.

GPW will never send you an e-mail asking you to supply equipment and goods without a purchase/order number. GPW does not procure goods for another level of Government. The organisation will not be liable for actions that result in companies or individuals being resultant victims of such a scam.

Government Printing Works gives businesses the opportunity to supply goods and services through RFQ / Tendering process. In order to be eligible to bid to provide goods and services, suppliers must be registered on the National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD). To be registered, they must meet all current legislative requirements (e.g. have a valid tax clearance certificate and be in good standing with the South African Revenue Services - SARS).

The tender process is managed through the Supply Chain Management (SCM) system of the department. SCM is highly regulated to minimise the risk of fraud, and to meet objectives which include value for money, open and effective competition, equitability, accountability, fair dealing, transparency and an ethical approach. Relevant legislation, regulations, policies, guidelines and instructions can be found on the tender's website.

Fake Tenders

National Treasury's CSD has launched the Government Order Scam campaign to combat fraudulent requests for quotes (RFQs). Such fraudulent requests have resulted in innocent companies losing money. We work hard at preventing and fighting fraud, but criminal activity is always a risk.

How tender scams work

There are many types of tender scams. Here are some of the more frequent scenarios:

Fraudsters use what appears to be government department stationery with fictitious logos and contact details to send a fake RFQ to a company to invite it to urgently supply goods. Shortly after the company has submitted its quote, it receives notification that it has won the tender. The company delivers the goods to someone who poses as an official or at a fake site. The Department has no idea of this transaction made in its name. The company is then never paid and suffers a loss.

OB

Fraudsters use what appears to be government department stationery with fictitious logos and contact details to send a fake RFQ to Company A to invite it to urgently supply goods. Typically, the tender specification is so unique that only Company B (a fictitious company created by the fraudster) can supply the goods in question.

Shortly after Company A has submitted its quote it receives notification that it has won the tender. Company A orders the goods and pays a deposit to the fictitious Company B. Once Company B receives the money, it disappears. Company A's money is stolen in the process.

Protect yourself from being scammed

- If you are registered on the supplier databases and you receive a request to tender or quote that seems to be from a government department, contact the department to confirm that the request is legitimate. Do not use the contact details on the tender document as these might be fraudulent.
- Compare tender details with those that appear in the Tender Bulletin, available online at www.gpwonline.co.za
- Make sure you familiarise yourself with how government procures goods and services. Visit the tender website for more information on how to tender.
- If you are uncomfortable about the request received, consider visiting the government department and/or the place of delivery and/or the service provider from whom you will be sourcing the goods.
- In the unlikely event that you are asked for a deposit to make a bid, contact the SCM unit of the department in question to ask whether this is in fact correct.

- The Government Gazette and Government Tender Bulletin are weekly publications that are published on Fridays and the closing time for the acceptance of notices is strictly applied according to the scheduled time for each gazette.

EXTRAORDINARY GAZETTES

3. Extraordinary Gazettes can have only one publication date. If multiple publications of an Extraordinary Gazette are required, a separate Z95/Z95Prov Adobe Forms for each publication date must be submitted.

Notice Submission Process

- 4. Download the latest *Adobe* form, for the relevant notice to be placed, from the **Government Printing Works** website www.gpwonline.co.za.
- 5. The Adobe form needs to be completed electronically using Adobe Acrobat / Acrobat Reader. Only electronically completed Adobe forms will be accepted. No printed, handwritten and/or scanned Adobe forms will be accepted.
- 6. The completed electronic *Adobe* form has to be submitted via email to submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za. The form needs to be submitted in its original electronic *Adobe* format to enable the system to extract the completed information from the form for placement in the publication.
- Every notice submitted must be accompanied by an official GPW quotation. This must be obtained from the eGazette Contact Centre.
- 8. Each notice submission should be sent as a single email. The email **must** contain **all documentation** relating to a particular notice submission.
 - 8.1. Each of the following documents must be attached to the email as a separate attachment:
 - 8.1.1. An electronically completed Adobe form, specific to the type of notice that is to be placed.
 - 8.1.1.1. For National *Government Gazette* or *Provincial Gazette* notices, the notices must be accompanied by an electronic Z95 or Z95Prov *Adobe* form
 - 8.1.1.2. The notice content (body copy) **MUST** be a separate attachment.
 - 8.1.2. A copy of the official **Government Printing Works** quotation you received for your notice. (Please see Quotation section below for further details)
 - 8.1.3. A valid and legible Proof of Payment / Purchase Order: **Government Printing Works** account customer must include a copy of their Purchase Order. **Non-Government Printing Works** account customer needs to submit the proof of payment for the notice
 - 8.1.4. Where separate notice content is applicable (Z95, Z95 Prov and TForm 3, it should **also** be attached as a separate attachment. (*Please see the Copy Section below, for the specifications*).
 - 8.1.5. Any additional notice information if applicable.

- 9. The electronic *Adobe* form will be taken as the primary source for the notice information to be published. Instructions that are on the email body or covering letter that contradicts the notice form content will not be considered. The information submitted on the electronic *Adobe* form will be published as-is.
- To avoid duplicated publication of the same notice and double billing, Please submit your notice ONLY ONCE.
- 11. Notices brought to **GPW** by "walk-in" customers on electronic media can only be submitted in *Adobe* electronic form format. All "walk-in" customers with notices that are not on electronic *Adobe* forms will be routed to the Contact Centre where they will be assisted to complete the forms in the required format.
- 12. Should a customer submit a bulk submission of hard copy notices delivered by a messenger on behalf of any organisation e.g. newspaper publisher, the messenger will be referred back to the sender as the submission does not adhere to the submission rules.

QUOTATIONS

- 13. Quotations are valid until the next tariff change.
 - 13.1. Take note: GPW's annual tariff increase takes place on 1 April therefore any quotations issued, accepted and submitted for publication up to 31 March will keep the old tariff. For notices to be published from 1 April, a quotation must be obtained from GPW with the new tariffs. Where a tariff increase is implemented during the year, GPW endeavours to provide customers with 30 days' notice of such changes.
- 14. Each quotation has a unique number.
- 15. Form Content notices must be emailed to the eGazette Contact Centre for a quotation.
 - 15.1. The *Adobe* form supplied is uploaded by the Contact Centre Agent and the system automatically calculates the cost of your notice based on the layout/format of the content supplied.
 - 15.2. It is critical that these *Adobe* Forms are completed correctly and adhere to the guidelines as stipulated by **GPW**.

16. APPLICABLE ONLY TO GPW ACCOUNT HOLDERS:

- 16.1. GPW Account Customers must provide a valid GPW account number to obtain a quotation.
- 16.2. Accounts for GPW account customers must be active with sufficient credit to transact with GPW to submit notices.
 - 16.2.1. If you are unsure about or need to resolve the status of your account, please contact the GPW Finance Department prior to submitting your notices. (If the account status is not resolved prior to submission of your notice, the notice will be failed during the process).

17. APPLICABLE ONLY TO CASH CUSTOMERS:

- 17.1. Cash customers doing **bulk payments** must use a **single email address** in order to use the **same proof of payment** for submitting multiple notices.
- 18. The responsibility lies with you, the customer, to ensure that the payment made for your notice(s) to be published is sufficient to cover the cost of the notice(s).
- 19. Each quotation will be associated with one proof of payment / purchase order / cash receipt.
 - 19.1. This means that the quotation number can only be used once to make a payment.

COPY (SEPARATE NOTICE CONTENT DOCUMENT)

- 20. Where the copy is part of a separate attachment document for Z95, Z95Prov and TForm03
 - 20.1. Copy of notices must be supplied in a separate document and may not constitute part of any covering letter, purchase order, proof of payment or other attached documents.

The content document should contain only one notice. (You may include the different translations of the same notice in the same document).

20.2. The notice should be set on an A4 page, with margins and fonts set as follows:

Page size = A4 Portrait with page margins: Top = 40mm, LH/RH = 16mm, Bottom = 40mm; Use font size: Arial or Helvetica 10pt with 11pt line spacing;

Page size = A4 Landscape with page margins: Top = 16mm, LH/RH = 40mm, Bottom = 16mm; Use font size: Arial or Helvetica 10pt with 11pt line spacing;

CANCELLATIONS

- 21. Cancellation of notice submissions are accepted by GPW according to the deadlines stated in the table above in point 2. Non-compliance to these deadlines will result in your request being failed. Please pay special attention to the different deadlines for each gazette. Please note that any notices cancelled after the cancellation deadline will be published and charged at full cost.
- 22. Requests for cancellation must be sent by the original sender of the notice and must accompanied by the relevant notice reference number (N-) in the email body.

AMENDMENTS TO NOTICES

23. With effect from 01 October 2015, **GPW** will not longer accept amendments to notices. The cancellation process will need to be followed according to the deadline and a new notice submitted thereafter for the next available publication date.

REJECTIONS

- 24. All notices not meeting the submission rules will be rejected to the customer to be corrected and resubmitted. Assistance will be available through the Contact Centre should help be required when completing the forms. (012-748 6200 or email info.egazette@gpw.gov.za). Reasons for rejections include the following:
 - 24.1. Incorrectly completed forms and notices submitted in the wrong format, will be rejected.
 - 24.2. Any notice submissions not on the correct Adobe electronic form, will be rejected.
 - 24.3. Any notice submissions not accompanied by the proof of payment / purchase order will be rejected and the notice will not be processed.
 - 24.4. Any submissions or re-submissions that miss the submission cut-off times will be rejected to the customer. The Notice needs to be re-submitted with a new publication date.

APPROVAL OF NOTICES

- 25. Any notices other than legal notices are subject to the approval of the Government Printer, who may refuse acceptance or further publication of any notice.
- 26. No amendments will be accepted in respect to separate notice content that was sent with a Z95 or Z95Prov notice submissions. The copy of notice in layout format (previously known as proof-out) is only provided where requested, for Advertiser to see the notice in final Gazette layout. Should they find that the information submitted was incorrect, they should request for a notice cancellation and resubmit the corrected notice, subject to standard submission deadlines. The cancellation is also subject to the stages in the publishing process, i.e. If cancellation is received when production (printing process) has commenced, then the notice cannot be cancelled.

GOVERNMENT PRINTER INDEMNIFIED AGAINST LIABILITY

- 27. The Government Printer will assume no liability in respect of—
 - 27.1. any delay in the publication of a notice or publication of such notice on any date other than that stipulated by the advertiser;
 - 27.2. erroneous classification of a notice, or the placement of such notice in any section or under any heading other than the section or heading stipulated by the advertiser;
 - 27.3. any editing, revision, omission, typographical errors or errors resulting from faint or indistinct copy.

LIABILITY OF ADVERTISER

28. Advertisers will be held liable for any compensation and costs arising from any action which may be instituted against the Government Printer in consequence of the publication of any notice.

CUSTOMER INQUIRIES

- 29. Requests for information, quotations and inquiries must be sent to the Contact Centre ONLY.
- 30. Requests for Quotations (RFQs) should be received by the Contact Centre at least **2 working days** before the submission deadline for that specific publication.

PAYMENT OF COST

- 31. The Request for Quotation for placement of the notice should be sent to the Gazette Contact Centre as indicated above, prior to submission of notice for advertising.
- 32. Payment should then be made, or Purchase Order prepared based on the received quotation, prior to the submission of the notice for advertising as these documents i.e. proof of payment or Purchase order will be required as part of the notice submission, as indicated earlier.
- 33. Every proof of payment must have a valid **GPW** quotation number as a reference on the proof of payment document.
- 34. REGULATIONS RELATING TO ESTABLISHMENTS, VARIETIES, PLANTS AND PROPAGATING MATERIAL: AMENDMENT

I, Angela Thokozile Didiza, Minister of Agriculture, Land Reform and Rural Development, acting under section 34 of the Plant Improvement Act, 1976 (Act No. 53 of 1976), hereby further amend the Regulations published under Government Notice No. R. 1064 of 23 May 1980, as amended, to the extent set out in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

Definition

Amendment of Definitions

"hemp" means low THC plants or parts of plants of *Cannabis sativa* L. cultivated for agricultural or industrial purposes, of which the leaves and flowering heads do not contain more than 0.2% THC:

"Medicines Act" means the Medicines and Related Substances Act, 1965 (Act No. 101 of 1965) as amended;

PLANT IMPROVEMENT ACT, 1976 (Act 53 of 1976)

APPLICATION OF ACT: AMENDMENT

I, Angela Thokozile Didiza, Minister of Agriculture, Land Reform and Rural Development, acting under section 2 of the Plant Improvement Act, 1976 (Act No. 53 of 1976), hereby further amend Government Notice No. R. 1901 of 12 September 1986 to the extent set out in the schedule.

MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE, LAND REFORM AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT

SCHEDULE

Definitions

In this Schedule "the Notice" means the Notice published by Government Notice No. R. 1901 of 12 September 1986, as amended by Government Notices Nos. R. 1387 of 26 June 1987, R. 2503 of 9 December 1988, and R. 1639 of 12 July 1991 (as corrected by R. 1970 of 16 August 1991), R. 2619 of 18 September 1992, R. 1592 of 27 August 1993, R. 2056 of 29 October 1993, R. 512 of 18 March 1994, R. 1464 of 26 August 1994, R. 96 of 24 January 1997, R. 54 of 1 February 2013 and R. 797 of 4 September 2015 and any word or expression in this Schedule to which a meaning has been assigned in the Act and the regulations shall have that meaning and, unless the context otherwise indicates —

"grain" refers to harvested material that is intended for consumption, not for cultivation;

"hemp" means low THC plants or parts of plants of *Cannabis sativa* L. cultivated for agricultural or industrial purposes, of which the leaves and flowering heads do not contain more than 0.2% THC;

"Hemp Permit" means the permit issued by the Registrar In accordance with clause 4(2) to a person who intends to perform an activity with low THC Cannabis (hemp) specified in this clause;

"hemp seed" means seed that is certified in an approved manner as having been produced from hemp for agricultural or industrial purposes or when cultivated, will produce hemp in compliance with the prescribed THC level not exceeding 0.2%;

"Medicines Act" means the Medicines and Related Substances Act, 1965 (Act No. 101 of 1965) as amended;

"THC" means (-)-transdelta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol that occurs in plants and parts of plants of Cannabis sativa L.;

"the Act" means the Plant Improvement Act, 1976 (Act 53 of 1976); and

"the Regulations" means the regulations made under the Act.

Amendment of paragraph (d)A of the Notice

2. The Notice is hereby amended by deletion of the expression "and" at the end of paragraph (d)A.

Insertion of paragraph (d)B in the Notice

- 3. The Notice is hereby amended by insertion of the following after paragraph (d)A:
 - "(d)B (1) Hereby declare that all the provisions of the said Act shall apply to the plants and seed of Cannabis sativa L. (hemp)."
 - (2) In addition to the provisions of subclause (1), the following activities relating to hemp shall only be conducted by a person who is in possession of a valid Hemp Permit issued by the Registrar of the Act:
 - (a) import of plants or propagating material for breeding, research or cultivation;
 - (b) propagation of plants by a breeder or researcher in relation to a breeding or research programme to develop new or improved hemp varieties;
 - (c) sale of hemp seed, seedlings, plants or cuttings;
 - (d) cultivation of hemp for -
 - (i) seed production;
 - (ii) seedling production;
 - (iii) production of grain or material for industrial purposes;
 - (e) cleaning and/or conditioning seed for cultivation; and
 - export of plants or propagating material for cultivation purposes.
 - (3) Any person who intends to engage in any one or more of the activities stipulated in subclause (2) must lodge an application for a Hemp Permit on the form obtainable from the Registrar and pay such fees as prescribed.
 - (4) A Hemp Permit issued in terms of subclause (3) is valid for a period of 2 years and is not transferable to another person.
 - (5) The Hemp Permit must at a minimum contain the following information and conditions:
 - (a) permit number;
 - (b) period of validity;
 - (c) name and postal address of the permit holder;
 - (d) the activity authorized by the permit, the physical address as well as the GPS coordinates of the premises where the activity will be conducted;
 - (e) the name of the person responsible for or supervising the activity on the premises, if different from the holder of the permit; and
 - (f) conditions relating to the activity that are not limited to, but at least require submission of an annual report stating amongst others details of the hemp varieties, amount and type of material received and/or sold, amounts and type of material produced, planting and harvesting dates, as applicable.

- (6) The permit holder must notify the Registrar of any change with regard to information in the permit after issuance thereof, within 30 days of the occurrence of the change or becoming aware of the change:
 - (a) change in the contact details of the permit holder, including postal address;
 - (b) change in the name of the business or premises;
 - (c) change in the physical address where the authorized activity is to be conducted;
 - (d) change in the person responsible for or supervising the activity on the premises; and
 - (e) change in the ownership of the premises where the authorized activity is to be conducted, if the permit holder is not the owner.
- (7) A Hemp Permit is revoked if the permit holder -
 - (a) requests revocation thereof in writing;
 - (b) stops the activities for which the permit was required;
 - (c) has failed to notify the Registrar of any change of information as stipulated in subclause (6);
 - (d) perform any activity not authorized on the Hemp Permit and
 - (e) infringes any of the provisions of the Act.
- (8) A notice of planting must be submitted to the Registrar on a form obtainable from the Registrar by the holder of a Hemp Permit for cultivation within 30 days from planting and a copy thereof must be submitted to each of the nearest SAPS and DALRRD Inspection Services office.

EXEMPTION FROM REGISTRATION: AMENDMENT

I, Angela Thokozile Didiza, Minister of Agriculture, Land Reform and Rural Development, acting under section 10 of the Plant Improvement Act, 1976 (Act No. 53 of 1976), hereby further amend Government Notice No. R. 1388 of 26 June 1987 to the extent set out in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

Definition

1. Any word or expression in this Schedule to which a meaning has been assigned in the Act and the regulations shall have that meaning and, unless the context otherwise indicates –

"THC" means (-)-transdelta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol that occurs in plants and parts of plants of Cannabis sativa L.;

"the Act" means the Plant improvement Act, 1976 (Act 53 of 1976); and

"the Regulations" means the regulations made under the Act.

Amendment of the Notice

- 2. The Notice is hereby amended by insertion of clauses 3 and 4 after clause 2:
 - "3. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 2, exemption from registration of premises in terms of section 6 of the Act shall not apply to premises that conduct any type of business as defined in the Act in respect of Cannabis setiva L. (hemp).
 - 4. Any test laboratory that provides analytical services with regard to THC in plant-material, is exempted from registration in terms of this Act; provided it is accredited and/or registered in terms of the Medicines Act or applicable legislation or accreditation system in another country; a copy of the registration/accreditation certificate of such laboratory must accompany the analytical reports issued by it."

IMPORT OF PLANTS AND PROPAGATING MATERIAL

- I, Angela Thokozile Didiza, Minister of Agriculture, Land Reform and Rural Development, acting under Section 26 of the Plant Improvement Act, 1976 (Act No. 53 of 1976), hereby -
- (a) determine that plants and propagating material of Cannabis sativa L. (hemp) shall only be imported with the written permission of the Registrar on the conditions stipulated in the Schedule in addition to the conditions stipulated in section 26(1) of the Act and such other conditions as may be stipulated in the permission.

 - (b) in the case of germplasm or material for breeding and/or research, by the material transfer agreement (MTA) from the owner of the material;
 - (c) an analytical report confirming the THC content of the plants from which the plants or propagating material is derived; and
 - (d) In case where the THC content of the plants or propagating material exceed 0.2%, a valid permit issued in terms of the Medicines Act.

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(2) The analytical report referred to in subclause (1)(c) must have been issued by a compete accredited or registered laboratory and a copy of the registration certificate of such laboratory me accompany the analytical report.	ent ust

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CHAPTER 1

1. Definitions

In this document, any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the National Qualifications Framework Act, Act No. 67 of 2008, as amended, and the General and Further Education and Training Quality Assurance Act, Act No. 58 of 2001, as amended, has the same meaning when used in this document, unless the context otherwise indicates.

Accreditation means the outcome of a quality assurance process of evaluating-

- a) a private assessment body, to determine whether its capacity, systems, processes and products are of the appropriate quality to deliver valid, reliable, fair and credible assessments and examinations; and
- b) an independent school / private college, to determine whether it has, in accordance with the policy and criteria for quality assurance as set out in the policy/regulations, the capacity to offer a qualification or programmes leading to a qualification on the General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Subframework.

Articulation means the process of forming systemic, specific and individual possibilities of connection between qualifications and/or part-qualifications to allow for the horizontal/lateral, vertical and diagonal movement of learners through the formal education and training system and its linkages with the world of work:

- a) Horizontal articulation is articulation within and between NQF Sub-frameworks, on the same NQF level;
- b) Vertical articulation is articulation across NQF levels within an NQF Sub-framework;
- c) Diagonal articulation is articulation across NQF levels and across NQF Sub-frameworks;
- d) Systemic articulation is a 'joined up' system including qualifications, professional designations, policies and various other official elements that support learning and work pathways;
- e) Specific articulation means aligning qualifications through inter- or intra-institutional agreements such as memoranda of understanding, credit accumulation and transfer and other mechanisms:
- f) Individual articulation refers to learners being supported in their learning and work pathways through flexible admission, curriculum, learning and teaching, and learner

support systems such as the quality of qualifications and learning, career development services, and other mechanisms.

Assessment means the process to identify, gather and interpret information against the required competencies in a qualification or part-qualification in order to make a judgement about a learner's achievement in order to-

- i. assist the learner's development and improve the process of learning and teaching; and
- ii. evaluate and certify competence in order to ensure qualification credibility.

Assessment body means a juristic body accredited by Umalusi Council to quality assure internal assessment and conduct external examinations, and includes a department of education.

Assessment Criteria means the standards used to guide learning and assess learner achievement and/or to evaluate and certify competence.

Council means Umalusi, the Quality Council for General and Further Education and Training; as contemplated in the National Qualifications Framework Act (Act No. 67 of 2008) and the General and Further Education and Training Quality Assurance Act, (Act No. 58 of 2001).

Certification means the formal recognition of a qualification or part-qualification awarded to a successful learner.

Credit means a measure of the volume of learning required for a qualification or part-qualification, quantified as the number of notional study hours required for achieving the learning outcomes specified.

Credit Accumulation and Transfer means an arrangement whereby the diverse features of both credit accumulation and credit transfer are combined to facilitate lifelong learning and access to the workplace.

Credit transfer means the vertical, horizontal or diagonal relocation of credits towards a qualification or part-qualification registered on the same or different Sub-framework for the qualification or part-qualification. One (1) credit is equated to ten (10) notional hours of learning.

Curriculum means a statement of the training structure and expected methods of learning and teaching that underpin a qualification or part-qualification to facilitate a more general understanding of its implementation in an education system. The curriculum encompasses three components:

- a) The intended curriculum: the documented curriculum for a qualification that provides a more detailed description in terms of the depth, breadth and level of difficulty and cognitive demand of what is required for the purpose of the qualification to be fulfilled. Syllabi for the necessary subjects form an integral part of the curriculum.
- b) The enacted curriculum: the delivery of the curriculum in an institution which includes leadership and management, the ethos and values, teaching and learning, extracurricular activities, learner support, institutional performance and the management of quality towards improvement.
- c) The assessed curriculum: the internal assessment and the external examination of the intended curriculum.

The curriculum policy and its syllabi provide the information necessary for the enactment of the curriculum in the institution and the necessary framework for assessment.

Exit Level Outcomes means the knowledge, skills and attitudes that a learner should have obtained or mastered on completion of a qualification or part-qualification and against which the learner is assessed for competence.

Exit point means a point in General and Further Education and Training at which a learner is required to demonstrate competence with a view to obtaining documentary proof of proficiency.

External assessment means any assessment conducted by an assessment body, the outcomes of which count towards the achievement of a qualification.

General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Sub-framework means the Sub-framework of qualifications developed and managed by Umalusi, the Quality Council for NQF Levels 1-4 as envisioned in sections 4 – 7 of the National Qualifications Framework Act, 2008 (Act No. 67 of 2008)

International comparability means an outcome of an analysis of how a qualification compares with- and relates to- similar international qualifications offered by accredited institutions or

organisations in other parts of the world. This includes best practices or standards in other parts of the world.

Level descriptors a statement describing learning achievement at a particular level of the NQF that provides a broad indication of the types of learning outcomes and assessment criteria that are appropriate to a qualification at that level.

Lifelong learning means learning that takes place in all contexts in life from a life-wide, life deep and lifelong perspective. It includes learning behaviours and obtaining knowledge, understanding, attitudes, values and competences for personal growth, social and economic well-being, democratic citizenship, cultural identity and employability.

National Qualifications Framework means the South African ten-level framework provided for the registration of national qualifications.

Notional hours means the agreed estimate of the learning time that it would take an average learner to meet the defined outcomes, it includes consideration of contact time, research, completion of assignments, time spent in structured learning in the workplace, individual learning. Ten (10) notional hours equate to one (1) credit.

Part-qualification means an assessed unit of learning that is registered as part of a qualification.

Programme means the same as curriculum.

Provider means a legally established institution (public or private) that has been recognised, usually for a particular period of time, by a Quality Council (QC) or its appointed agent, as having the capacity or provisional capacity to offer a qualification or part-qualification registered on the NQF at the required standard.

Qualification means a registered national qualification.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) means the principles and processes through which the prior knowledge and skills of a person are made visible, mediated and assessed for the purposes of alternative access and admission, recognition and certification, or further learning and development.

Registered means a qualification registered on the National Qualifications Framework by SAQA in

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terms of section 13(1)(h) of the National Qualifications Framework Act, 2008 (Act No. 67 of 2008).

Outcomes means the contextually demonstrated end-products of specific learning processes, which include knowledge, skills and values. Outcomes could be generic or specific.

South African Qualifications Authority means the statutory authority established in terms of the SAQA Act (Act No. 58 of 1995) and continuing in terms of the NQF Act (Act No. 67 of 2008), which oversees the further development and implementation of the NQF, the achievement of the objectives of the NQF, and the co-ordination of the three Sub-frameworks.

Standard means a statement of the level of proficiency or attainment required.

Umalusi means the Council for Quality Assurance in General and Further Education and Training established in terms of Section 4 of the General and Further Education and Training Quality Assurance Act No.58 of 2001.

CHAPTER 2

3. Legislative context

- In 2001 Umalusi, the Council for Quality Assurance in General and Further Education and Training was mandated by Parliament, in its founding Act, the General and Further Education and Training Quality Assurance (GENFETQA) Act, [Act No. 58 of 2001], as amended, as the quality assurance body for Levels 1 4 of the National Qualifications Framework (NQF). In terms of the 2008 amendment of the GENFETQA Act, and further explicated in Council policy, Umalusi's responsibilities are identified as the development and management of a Sub-framework of qualifications, quality assurance of assessment (both internal and external) at exit points, certification of learner achievements, the accreditation of private assessment bodies and the monitoring of public assessment bodies, as well as the quality assurance of education institutions that offer qualifications on the General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Sub-framework (GFETQSF).
- (2) The National Qualifications Framework (NQF) Act [Act No. 67 of 2008], constituted Umalusi as the Quality Council for GFETQSF, as provided for in the GENFETQA Act. Umalusi now serves as one of three Quality Councils (QCs), alongside the Council on Higher Education (CHE) and the Quality Council for Trades and Occupations (QCTO) and is required to collaborate with the South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA) and the other QCs. In terms of Section 27 (a)-(k) of the NQF Act, each QC is responsible for the development and management of its Sub-framework.

4. Legislative and regulatory framework

- (1) This policy framework must be read in conjunction with the following legislation:
 - (a) Constitution of the Republic of South Africa
 - (b) The National Education Policy Act, [Act no 27 of 199])
 - (c) The National Qualifications Framework, Act [Act No. 67 of 2008], as amended
 - (d) The General and Further Education and Training Quality Assurance Act, [Act No. 58 of 2001], as amended.

- (e) Skills Development Act [Act No. 97 of 1998].
- (f) Continuing Education and Training Act [Act No.16 of 2006].
- (g) The South African Schools Act [Act No. 84 of 1996].
- (h) Higher Education Act [Act No. 101 of 1997], as amended.
- (2) In addition to the various Acts already cited, this policy should be read in conjunction with the following documents:
 - (a) Ministerial Articulation Policy for the Post-School Education and Training System of South Africa
 - (b) National Policy and Criteria for Designing and Implementing Assessment for NQF Qualifications and Part-Qualifications and Professional Designations in South Africa
 - (c) National Policy and Criteria for the Implementation of Recognition of Prior Learning [as amended, 2018]
 - (d) SAQA Policy for Credit Accumulation and Transfer within the National Qualifications Framework
 - (e) SAQA Policy and Criteria for the Registration of Qualifications and Partqualifications on the NQF [as amended, 2020]
 - (f) Level Descriptors for the South African National Qualifications Framework
 - (g) The Policy for the General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Subframework [2014]
 - (h) Policy pertaining to standards, standard setting and quality assurance of qualifications on the General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Sub-framework
 - (i) Any other relevant policies and directives issued by Umalusi Council.

5. Purpose

(1) This policy provides direction to Umalusi and its stakeholders in respect of the responsibilities associated with the development, registration and publication of

qualifications for the GFETQSF. This is in keeping with Umalusi mandate to ensure the development of qualifications for its Sub-framework as laid out in Section 27(h) of the NQFAct.

(2) This policy addresses responsibilities associated with the development of new, and the review of existing qualifications and their associated curricula for the GFETQSF.

6. Objective

(1) The objective of this policy is to determine the criteria for the development, registration and publication of qualifications on the GFETQSF, taking into account the relevant legislation, policy and criteria as contemplated in the NQF Act.

7. Scope and application

(1) This policy applies to Umalusi, the Department of Basic Education, the Department of Higher Education and Training, the SAQA, the CHE and the QCTO, assessment bodies, institutions that are accredited and those seeking accreditation, and other stakeholders with an interest in qualifications in the GFETQSF context.

CHAPTER 3

8. Development of qualifications

- (1) In accordance with the requirements laid out in the Policy for the General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Sub-framework, Umalusi oversees and quality-assures the development of qualifications and recommends qualifications to the SAQA for registration on the NQF.
- (2) New qualifications developed for the GFETQSF need to align with one of four levels of the NQF (viz. Levels 1 4) and must be named in accordance with the qualification type associated with the NQF Level:

Level 4: National Certificate

Level 3: Intermediate Certificate

Level 2: Elementary Certificate

Level 1: General Certificate

- (3) The appropriate NQF Level of the qualification is determined by:
 - (a) Using the NQF Level Descriptors published by the SAQA,
 - (b) Umalusi's own standard-setting requirements, which include an analysis of the qualification structure and design, and
 - (c) other qualification-related documents such as curricula and assessment requirements.
- (4) A new qualification is one which has not existed before, or one which has, during a review process, been significantly changed in terms of its purpose and/or target group and/or institutional location and design.
- (5) The qualification under development needs to be a new variant at the NQF Level. In other words, the proposed qualification needs to have a purpose distinct from the variants already on the Sub-framework, and that distinctiveness may well be reflected in a novel qualification structure.

9. Criteria for the development of qualifications

- (1) The Departments of Education accredited private assessment bodies and private education providers are eligible to propose the development of new qualifications for the GFETQSF. The party proposing the development of a new qualification must submit a written proposal to the Chair of Umalusi Council for consideration. The submission must include at least the following information:
 - (a) Details of the proposer and those persons selected by it to assist with the development of the proposed new qualification.
 - (b) The unique purpose to be served by the new qualification, and a motivation for its establishment in the form of a completed feasibility study.
 - (c) The feasibility study is required to provide information on at least the following:
 - i. Justifiable need for the development of a new qualification
 - ii. Mapping that has been done against existing qualifications on the GFETQSF, and if need be, on both/either of the other Higher Education Qualifications Subframework [HEQSF] and the Occupational Qualifications Subframework [OQSF], which will provide information on the purpose of the proposed qualification; how the purpose of the proposed qualification differs from those of existing qualifications, and how the proposed qualification would articulate with other qualifications on the GFETQSF (and/or qualifications in the HEQSF and the OQSF), and its relationship to existing qualifications on the GFETQSF;
 - iii. The number of learners who are likely to enroll for the qualification annually and their institutional location (schools, colleges, community learning centres, etc.)
 - iv. A draft implementation plan for the qualification proposed, and
 - v. If the proposer is not a Department of Education, the accredited assessment body that will assess the proposed qualification.
- (2) In addition, the proposer is required to submit the qualification of detailed information of the following:
 - (a) The qualification title
 - (b) NQF level of the qualification (the SAQA published NQF Level Descriptors must be used to determine the level of the qualification)

- (c) Its credits (the credits must be calculated on the basis of one (1) credit is equal to ten (10) notional hours of learning)
- (d) The Sub-framework into which it fits
- (e) Overview of the qualification
- (f) The purpose of the qualification
- (g) The rationale (need) for the qualification
- (h) Target group identity
- (i) Duration, general enrolment and registration requirements
- (j) Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)
- (k) Exit level outcomes (ELOs) and Associated Assessment Criteria (AACs)
- (I) Specific post qualification articulation as approved by the Quality Council overseeing the NQF Sub-framework in which the post-qualifications lie
- (m) Qualification structure and design
- (n) Qualification requirements, including rules of combination and provisos
- (o) Concessions
- (p) Promotion and certification requirements
- (q) Curriculum review
- (r) Assessment structure
- (s) Recording and reporting
- (t) Rating scale
- (u) Minimum accreditation requirements for offering the qualification
- (v) Critical Cross-Field Outcomes
- (w) Transitional arrangements
- (x) A statement indicating international comparability.
- (3) Umalusi Council approves or rejects qualifications for recommendation to the SAQA for registration in line with the SAQA Policy and Criteria for the registration of qualifications and part-qualifications on the NQF. Umalusi's approval of a qualification is dependent on the qualification providing an educational opportunity distinct from those provided by existing qualifications on the GFETQSF. Such a distinction should be

evident from the purpose, structure and design of the qualification and the curricula associated with the qualification.

- (4) In fulfilling its mandate in respect of the development and maintenance of the GFETQSF, Council is required to advise the relevant Minister(s) of Education of its intention to amend the GFETQSF by introducing a new qualification, and/or its intention no longer to quality assure an existing qualification when Umalusi considers the qualification to be too poorly served by the assessment body/-ies.
- (5) Qualifications included on the GFETQSF will have an inception date, which will coincide with the date that the qualification is placed on the NQF by being included in the SAQA's National Learners' Records Database (NLRD). The inception date of the qualification precedes the implementation date.
- (6) Qualifications placed on the GFEQTSF will not have an expiry date unless transitional arrangements for the cessation of a qualification have been determined.
- (7) Even qualifications which have ceased to be offered remain on the GFETQSF as a part of the historical record, since the value of the qualification remains even if the qualification is no longer offered.
- (8) In order to advise and assist the process of qualification development, Umalusi appoints a Qualifications Reference Group (QRG) under the auspices of the Qualifications Standards Committee (QSC), a committee of the Umalusi Council that advises Council with respect to the development and maintenance of the GFETQSF. Such a reference group will be appointed taking into consideration both the expertise of the members and the need for a wide range of possible stakeholder representation in the group.
- (9) Qualifications proposed by bodies other than the Departments of Education for inclusion on the GFETQSF must be submitted in accordance with the requirements laid down in this policy. These requirements will form the basis for the appraisal of the qualification being submitted.
- (10) The Ministers of Education provide for norms and standards for education offered in South Africa and could therefore direct or initiate the development of a new qualification or introduction of a new curriculum in the education system as deemed necessary. The proposal for the introduction of new qualification or curriculum must

always be done in consultation with Umalusi and follow the prescribed criteria outlined in this policy.

CHAPTER 4

10. Criteria for the registration of qualifications on the NQF

- (1) In terms of Section 13 (1) h (ii) of the NQF Act, the registration of qualifications on the Sub-frameworks of the NQF is a SAQA function, and to that end the Quality Councils cooperate in the formulation of the policy and criteria for the registration of qualifications as required.
- (2) The purpose of registering a qualification serves as a formal recognition on the NQF of South Africa.
- (3) Qualifications recommended to the SAQA for registration are required to comply with the SAQA Policy and Criteria for the registration of qualifications and part-qualifications on the National Qualifications Framework, and the requirements of the Policy for the General and Further and Training Qualifications Sub-framework.
- (4) Council must consider that one of the requirements of the NQF is that the qualifications registered on the NQF will be subject to the quality assurance processes of the relevant Quality Council.
- (5) All qualifications on the GFETQSF are audited and reviewed every three (3) years for re-registration with the SAQA on the NQF to ensure their uptake and currency.
- (6) A qualification cannot be offered until it is registered on the NQF.

11. Criteria for the recommendation of qualifications for registration to SAQA

- (1) In approving the proposed qualification for registration on the NQF, Umalusi must consider whether the qualification fulfills the requirements and criteria established for qualifications on the GFETQSF, as laid out in this policy.
- (2) In approving a qualification for registration, Council must satisfy itself that:

- (a) Umalusi has consulted widely before submitting a qualification for approval for registration;
- (b) The qualification conforms to the requirements of this policy, and Chapter 3 (9)(2) in particular;
- (c) The qualification is necessary for and complementary to the overall functioning of the national education and training system;
- (d) The qualification does not have the potential to prejudice the value of existing registered qualifications;
- (e) Its articulation with other qualifications, within and across the NQF Sub-frameworks, has been identified and established in principle;
- (f) The qualification meets or exceeds the legislated minimum standards for comparable qualifications on the Sub-framework;
- (g) The qualification will be offered in public and/or accredited private education institutions and assessed by a recognized assessment body/ies.
- (h) The qualification is sustainable, flexible and caters for diverse modes of delivery.
- (3) Council is not obliged to recommend a proposed qualification as additional to the existing qualifications registered on the Sub-framework if, in its judgement, the registration of such a qualification has the potential to impact negatively on the existing qualifications it quality assures and certifies.
- (4) After Umalusi approval of a qualification, the qualification is:
 - (a) submitted to the SEIAS for vetting and compliance,
 - (b) gazetted for public comment,
 - (c) submitted to the legal services of the relevant Department of Education or the proposer to scrutinise the policy for constitutionality, legality and conflict with existing legislation,
 - (d) submitted as advice to the relevant Minister and
 - (e) recommended to the SAQA for registration on the NQF.
- (5) Where a qualification approved by Council is required to have effect in law, Umalusi advises the relevant Minister that it has approved the qualification. Once approved, the qualification is enacted through a government gazette as national policy.

CHAPTER 5

12. Criteria for inclusion of qualifications on the GFETQSF

- (1) Umalusi must consider qualifications submitted to it for possible inclusion on the Subframework.
- (2) Council is required to consider the request for approval of a new qualification, the fairness of the processes of evaluation and recommendations of the QSC, and then decide whether the request of the proposed qualification is:
 - (a) in the interests of the education system as a whole, and does not have the potential to devalue existing qualifications or contribute to the proliferation of qualifications on the GFETQSF,
 - (b) in the interests of a group or groups of learners whose needs are not serviced by existing qualifications and
 - (c) designed to meet the specific needs of the sector for which it is established.
- (3) Any qualification submitted to Umalusi for inclusion on the GFETQSF must conform to the requirements expressed in the *Policy for the GFETQSF*, and further explicated in this policy.
- (4) The submission of a request for the inclusion of a qualification is undertaken on the understanding that one of the requirements of the NQF Act, set out in section 27 (h) (i)-(iii), is that the Quality Council is required to ensure that such quality assurance as is necessary for the Sub-framework is undertaken.
- (5) Should the qualification so submitted be considered as potentially in accordance with the requirements set out in this policy, the proposer may need to demonstrate, at their cost and to the satisfaction of Umalusi, that:

- (a) The qualification meets or exceeds the legislated minimum standards of a qualification (or qualifications) to be regarded as comparable, and
- (b) Articulation relationships, as set out in the *Ministerial Policy on Articulation*, have been (or are being) established, for example, through negotiation with Universities South Africa (USAf) and/or the relevant QC.
- (6) The proposer of such a qualification would need to be willing to work with (or establish) an accredited assessment body capable of offering assessment in accordance with Umalusi's quality assurance expectations and the necessary directives, guidelines and requirements that would need to be developed for the proposed qualification, and any other relevant policies.
- (7) The proposer would also need to be able to identify or establish accredited education institutions prepared to offer the qualification.
- (8) Should the qualification and its supporting documents not fulfill the necessary criteria, the qualification may be returned to the proposer for amendment or rejected.
- (9) The costs of considering a qualification for inclusion on the Sub-framework shall be borne by the proposer. Council annually determines tariffs based on the processes required for this work.

13. Review process

- (1) Should Council decide that a qualification presented for its consideration should not be included on the Sub-framework, it informs the proposer within thirty (30) calendar days of its decision.
- (2) The proposer, in turn, has thirty (30) days in which to request for a review in writing to Umalusi Council.
- (3) Council will submit the request for a review to the relevant structures for adjudication and pronounce on the outcome.
- (4) The Council's decision will be regarded as final.

14. Criteria for the publication of qualifications on the National Qualifications Framework

- (1) The publication of qualifications on the NQF is recognized as a SAQA function and is governed by the SAQA's *Policy and Criteria for registration of qualifications and part-qualifications on the NQF*. Quality Councils are led by, and collaborate with the SAQA in this qualification registration and publication process.
- (2) The purpose of publication serves as public acknowledgement of the acceptance of a qualification as an integral part of the NQF.
- (3) Once the qualification is registered by the SAQA, the qualification will be published on the SAQA website as part of the NQF and on the Umalusi website.
- (4) A qualification registered on the NQF is a national qualification and can be offered by anyone with the right credentials in accordance with applicable legislation, policies and directives.
- (5) Umalusi is the custodian of all qualifications on the GFETQSF; hence, no qualification may be amended or terminated without Umalusi's recommendation.

CHAPTER 6

15. Criteria for introducing a new subject within a qualification and reviewing existing curriculum for qualifications on the GFETQSF

- (1) All qualifications on the GFETQSF are specified at the level of a curriculum for the subjects within each qualification. The design specifications of the qualification, as well as the quality of its supporting curriculum, and the nature of its assessment (site-based assessment and examinations) provide insight into the standard of education required.
- (2) The development of a new qualification for consideration by Umalusi must be followed by the development of its underpinning curricula.
- (3) A Department of Education (DBE or DHET) or any assessment body or organization or member of the public, may propose the introduction of a new subject or a review of an existing subject for a qualification on the GFETQSF.
- (4) The proposer of a new subject must apply to Umalusi in writing, to introduce a new subject or to review an existing subject. The development of a new curriculum for an existing qualification may occur if there is a need to include another subject into the national curriculum.
- (5) The proposer shall provide a motivation for its proposal in the form of a completed feasibility study. The motivation must include the level and credit and its impact on the credits of the qualification. Consideration should be made on its impact on the Exit Level Outcomes (ELOs) and Associated Assessment Criteria (AACs).
- (6) The feasibility study is required to provide information on at least the following:
 - (a) Justifiable need for the development of a new curriculum or review of an existing curriculum.
 - (b) The gap that the new curriculum or the revised curriculum will fill in the system.
 - (c) A mapping that has been done against existing curricula (on the sub-framework, and if need be, on both/either of the other two sub-frameworks), which will provide information on:

- i. the purpose of the proposed curriculum,
- ii. how the purpose of the proposed curriculum differs from those of existing curricula,
- iii. fitness for purpose and the relevance of the proposed curriculum in relation to the envisaged learner group,
- iv. how the curriculum will articulate with other qualifications on the GFETQSF and/or the QCTO and CHE, and its relationship to existing curricula on the Subframework,
- v. the reasons existing curricula cannot fulfil the purpose of the proposed curriculum.
- (d) The type of education institution that is envisaged to provide the curriculum,
- (e) The number of learners that are likely to take the curriculum annually, and their institutional location (schools/colleges/ community learning centres)
- (f) A draft comprehensive and coherent implementation plan for the proposed curriculum
- (g) If the proposer is not one of the Departments of Education, the assessment body that will assess the proposed curriculum must be identified.
- (7) Umalusi will evaluate the proposal and inform the proposer, within six months, of the acceptance or rejection of the proposal to introduce a curriculum for a new subject or to review an existing subject underpinning a qualification on the GFETQSF.
- (8) Should the proposal be accepted, the proposer will be advised to proceed with the development of the proposed curriculum or with the review of existing one.
- (9) Umalusi will give guidance to curriculum developers or reviewers on curriculum dimensions to be considered during the evaluation process.

16. Roles and responsibilities associated with the introduction of a new curriculum or a review of an existing curriculum

(1) Proposer's responsibilities

- (a) The proposer takes responsibility for submitting the intended curriculum documents to Umalusi for appraisal in line with this policy and its criteria. Umalusi may request additional documents where needed.
- (b) The proposer accepts financial responsibility for the appraisal of the curriculum.
- (c) Where recommendations for strengthening the curriculum are needed, it is the responsibility of the proposer to resubmit the curriculum with necessary refinements required.
- (d) The evaluation process for the refined aspects will fall outside the eighteen (18) month period referred to in **Section (2)(d)** below.
- (e) It is the responsibility of the proposer to ensure that the curriculum is not implemented until the appraisal process has been completed and the Minister responsible has gazetted it. The gazette will include the implementation date.

(2) Umalusi's responsibilities

- (a) Umalusi is responsible for informing the proposer, in writing, within six (6) months, of the acceptance or rejection of the proposal to introduce a new subject.
- (b) In the event that the proposal is rejected, Umalusi must provide reasons for the rejection.
- (c) In the event that the proposal is accepted, Umalusi's response must include the financial implications of the intended appraisal.
- (d) On a written acceptance of the financial implications by the proposer, and submission of curriculum documents, Umalusi must complete the appraisal within eighteen (18) months.

(e) Umalusi must submit the curriculum to the relevant Minister as advice.

(3) The Minister's responsibilities

- (a) The relevant Minister determines the implementation date.
- (b) The relevant Minister will regulate the new curriculum through a gazette.

17. Short Title

This Policy may be cited as the **Policy and Criteria for the development, registration and publication of qualifications for the General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Sub-framework** and will commence on the day of its promulgation in the Government Gazette.

Annexure A

Criteria for the development and format of qualifications registered on the General and Further Education Training Qualifications Sub-framework

1) The title of the qualification

The qualification has a title which accords with the qualification type at the level on which the qualification is to be registered. So, for example, a qualification to be registered at Level 1 on the Sub-framework will be a General Certificate, while one on Level 4 will be named a National Certificate. (It should be noted, however, that there are some historical anomalies in the naming conventions: the NC(V) Levels 2 and 3 are cases in point. These names are recognized as not conforming, but have been allowed to remain.)

- Is the proposed qualification named in accordance with the qualification type for the level at which it is to be registered?
- Is the proposed name distinctive, and therefore not to be confused with other qualifications on the Sub-framework?

2) The NQF Level of the qualification on the Sub-framework

The level of the qualification is informed by the level descriptors.

The qualification type selected for the development of the qualification determines its level. Qualifications submitted for consideration for inclusion on the Sub-framework must, by law, conform to the qualification type identified at that level for the particular Sub-framework.

The level on the General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Sub-framework at which the qualification will be located is determined by establishing (or investigating) its standing relative to other qualifications on the Sub-framework at the NQF Level in question. An explanation should be provided for the location of the qualification at the level where it is (to be) registered. Thus, while the position of the qualification on a specific NQF Level is determined in part with reference to the level descriptors developed by the SAQA, it is primarily established with reference to Umalusi's own quality assurance requirements.

- From the information available, does the qualification accord with the requirements of the qualification type associated with the identified level on the Sub-framework?
- Is the qualification policy accompanied by an account of the relationship to existing qualifications at the same NQF Level which demonstrates its comparability to the other qualifications in terms of the NQF Level, curriculum- and assessment requirements?

3) The number of credits

All qualifications registered on the Sub-framework have a minimum of 120 credits, but may be registered with more than 120 credits. SAQA registers a qualification according to the minimum credits for the qualification type. The rules of combination will indicate the total credits for the qualification.

 Does the policy identify the number of credits allocated to the qualification and to the component subjects which constitute the qualification? Does the policy conform to the required minimum for a qualification on the Sub-framework?

4) The policy framework into which the qualification fits

All existing legislative policies that have an effect on the new qualification need to be acknowledged. Both internal Umalusi policies and externally developed policies, for example, by the relevant department of education or an accredited assessment body may have reference.

- Has the qualification policy identified all the existing legislation that has a bearing on its formulation, implementation, quality assurance and certification?
- Has the qualification policy identified and considered the necessary Umalusi policies that have a bearing on the development and delivery of the qualification?

5) Qualification overview

This section provides a brief description of the whole qualification in order to locate the subsequent descriptions of aspects of the qualification meaningfully.

Has the policy provided a succinct overview of the proposed qualification that illuminates the nature of the qualification in simple language? Is this overview useful in interpreting the subsequent description of the qualification?

6) The rationale for the qualification

The qualification policy must provide a rationale for its contribution to the education and training environment, and hence its proposed presence on the Subframework. The rationale for the qualification is distinct from its purpose, and is considered in terms of how well the existence of and need for the qualification is motivated. In order to be considered for registration, the qualification needs to be able to serve sufficient learners to be sustainable. A qualification for small numbers of learners is not able to support the costs associated with quality assuring, assessing and certifying the qualification, and cannot therefore be considered for approval.

- Does the rationale offered for the proposed qualification identify its role as distinctive in the education and training system?
- Does the rationale motivate for a long term, sustainable role for the qualification, one that fulfils a specific national need?
- Does the motivation for the presence of the proposed qualification argue for servicing a particular need/set of needs and/or a particular group of learners not serviced otherwise?
- Is the rationale serviced by the structure and design of the proposed qualification?

7) The stated qualification purpose

The stated purpose of the qualification is explained in terms of what its intent is in respect of learner achievement. The purpose makes reference to the highest level outcomes envisaged for successful achievement of the qualification as a whole. The purpose is evaluated in terms of its description of what possible career and

employment opportunities may become available on successful completion of the qualification, as well as its indication of the prospects of a candidate who has successfully completed the qualification in terms of progressing to further education or higher education. The high leveloutcomes will influence the structure and design of the qualification, guiding the combinations and choices of subjects on offer in the particular qualification.

- Is the purpose for the proposed qualification identifiably different from that of other qualifications on the Sub-framework? (Qualifications that serve an almost identical function to existing qualifications on the Sub-framework, and which may compete with existing national qualifications, are regarded as problematic.)
- Is the purpose for the qualification in keeping with the nature of the qualifications registered on the Sub-framework?
- Is the purpose of the qualification supported by its structure and design?

8) The Exit Level Outcomes and Associated Assessment Criteria

The Exit Level Outcomes (ELOs) and the Associated Assessment Criteria (AAC) express the intent which informs the teaching, learning and assessment for all the constituent elements of the qualification. They represent, in generic form, the capacities, skills and competencies to be developed and acquired by successful candidates in the course of their learning. The success of a qualification is measured against the extent to which qualifying candidates have internalized and are able to express the capacities expressed in the ELOs and AAC.

This section of the qualification policy also provides an explanation of horizontal and post-qualification articulation possibilities. The articulation possibilities must relate meaningfully to the exit level achievements associated with the qualification being described. The qualification should be designed to facilitate horizontal, vertical and diagonal progression of credits and qualifications into another qualification or related qualification within the Sub-framework and across different Sub-frameworks if learners meet the minimum admission requirements.

- Do the ELOs and AAC identified for the qualification conform in general terms with the requirements of the relevant NQF level descriptor?
- Are the ELOs and AAC linked to competencies and skills to be acquired and comparable with but distinct from those expressed in the qualifications most proximate to the proposed qualifications?
- Does the policy identify both horizontal and post-qualification articulation possibilities with corresponding articulation pathway maps?

9) The entry requirements and entry articulation options

The qualification policy must explain and briefly motivate for the minimum learning requirements, if any, that allow candidates to enroll for the qualification. The requirements for prospective candidates must have been considered both in terms of inclusion in, and exclusion from, study. A description of the articulation of other qualifications on the NQF which could provide access—both horizontally and vertically—to the qualification under consideration, is included.

- Has the proposed qualification identified and explained the minimum entry requirements, where such exist?
- Does the policy identify other qualifications on the NQF that would provide access to the new qualification? Are these access routes proposed reasonable, considering the receiving qualification?

10. The identity of the particular target group for the qualification

The policy requires a generic description the identity of the group of candidates for whom this qualification is intended. This identity should be clearly explained in general terms such as typical age cohort, previous educational experience and future educational and/or employment expectations. In addition, for an established qualification, its uptake in the education system is considered in terms of learner numbers that have previously been and /or are currently registered for the qualification.

- Is the identity of the learner group targeted for the qualification well explained in terms of age, previous educational experience, current learning needs and future prospects?
- What other qualifications on the Sub-framework (and the NQF as a whole) are seen also to target this particular learning group? Is there a potential for conflict or confusion as a result of the possible introduction of this new qualification?

11) The duration of the qualification

In terms of this criterion, the qualification is considered in terms of:

- a. how the minimum and the maximum lengths of time required for completion are compatible with the characteristics of the targeted learner group;
- b. whether the time constraints (if any) may cause a learner not to complete the qualification in the maximum set duration; and finally,
- c. the chances of the target learner group completing the qualification within the determined minimum and maximum duration of the qualification.
- Is the duration proposed for learning for the qualification reasonable? If not, how should the duration be re-considered?
- What purpose is served by the identification of a duration?

12) The qualification structure and design

In terms of this criterion, the qualification describes how its credit value is assigned to its component parts, and, in doing so, identifies the size and nature of the units of learning/subjects in the qualification itself. These decisions will influence the duration of learning required for the various components which comprise the qualification.

- Does the qualification structure and design accord with critical other elements in the qualification such as rationale, purpose, ELOs, target group?
- Is the structure and design of the qualification laid out in such a way that prevents ambiguity?
- Given the structure and design of the qualification, is the time-frame identified a reasonable one?

13) The rules of combination

The rules of combination identify the subjects/areas of learning that are offered to fulfill the requirements for the qualification. Where applicable, the rules identify which subjects are compulsory to the structure, and which subjects – or combinations of subjects – are a matter of candidate choice. In assessing the usefulness of the new proposed qualification, the categories and rules are evaluated in terms of how useful these are in the qualification design.

- Are the rules of combination which identify the requirements for the fulfilment of the qualification clearly explained?
- Is there clarity about compulsory vs optional subjects? About possible provisos?

14) The certification requirements

The certification requirements explain the various achievement levels determined for the award of the qualification, and are evaluated in terms of how suitable these requirements are in terms of the stated purpose of the qualification and its ELOs.

- Does the policy fully explain the conditions under which the qualification is (not) awarded?
- Do these certification requirements align well with the purpose of the qualifications and the ELOs identified?

15) Curriculum overview

This criterion determines whether any curriculum summaries/ frameworks have been submitted with the qualification. Information regarding the curriculum framework, the approach to the development and implementation of the curricula needs to have been developed by the time the qualification is submitted for registration. Such a document is used to guide subsequent curriculum development, the protocols for assessment, advocacy for the qualification, planning for teacher development, support funding proposals and influence the development of the systems required to implement the qualification etc. Such material does not need to be submitted for registration, but needs to have been developed by that time.

- Has the proposer provided supplementary information regarding the nature of the curricula associated with the subjects identified in the structure and design of the qualification?
- Is the information regarding curriculum consonant with the approach Umalusi takes as articulated in Chapter 2 of this policy?

16) Assessment

This requirement stipulates the mandatory weighting requirements and descriptions for external and internal assessments for the proposed qualification.

In terms of Umalusi requirements, the external component of assessment should comprise no less than 50% of the total marks awarded. The weighting for mandatory practical/workplace assessment requirements for vocational qualifications learning areas/ subjects with a practical component should be specified where applicable. Both summative and formative assessment should make provision for the development of a range of cognitive abilities.

- Does the qualification fulfil the requirement that at least 50% of the final marks awarded to the candidate are derived from external assessments that are duly monitored by the relevant assessment body and moderated and/or verified by Umalusi?
- Is explicit guidance provided that supports a sufficiently demanding assessment, whether this is a written or a practical examination? If not, how should this guidance be strengthened?
- Is the assessment guidance available and useful to examiners, moderators and to teachers? Will it be?

17) Recording and reporting

The qualification outlines the requirements around recording and reporting achievement within the qualification.

 Does the proposed qualification policy provide suitable guidance regarding the recording and reporting of learner performance?

18) The minimum accreditation requirements for offering the qualification

Information pertaining to the requirements for provision of the qualification must be provided. These requirements are evaluated when the educational institution or assessment body undergoes the accreditation process in order to offer the qualification.

Have minimum accreditation requirements been identified for the offering of the qualification? Do these synergise with Umalusi's established approach to accreditation. These requirements must especially be spelled out for subjects (and programmes) which have a strong practical element.

19) Critical Cross-field Outcomes (CCFOs)

In terms of this criterion, the development (or evaluation) of the qualification considers the relationship between the CCFOs and the type of knowledge and skills to be mastered by the candidate upon successful completion of the qualification.

 Is there evidence in the construction of the qualification and in the curriculum overview that the CCFOs have been considered as an element in the development of the qualification?

20) Transitional arrangements

Where required, a qualification policy must indicate the necessary transitional

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arrangements, providing information about special measures needed for the implementation of the qualification.

Considering the context into which the proposed qualification is to be inserted, has
thought been given to the measures needed to introduce and implement the
qualification and, if need be to phase out one or more existing qualifications.

21) International Comparability

- This section of the policy provides information on how the qualification compares with and relates to similar international qualifications offered by accredited institutions or organizations in other parts of the world. This description will not necessarily be an in-depth comparison but provides sufficient information to highlight similarities and differences in approach to qualifications with similar purposes and on comparable levels of learning. The comparability should include a paragraph that summarizes the lessons drawn from the study of the selected countries and a conclusion that states why a particular approach/model should be followed or applied.
 - Has some form of preliminary comparison been attempted during the development of the qualification?
 - Is this information such that a benchmarking activity could be undertaken once the qualification has been implemented?

22) The proposer of the qualification

The proposer of the qualification is considered in terms of its interest in the qualification as well as in terms of the assessment body or professional body nominated to conduct and regulate the external assessment for the qualification. The proposer of a qualification may be a department of education, an assessment body or a consortium of interested parties.

Has the proposer identified itself fully as well as its interest in the qualification proposed?
Has the proposer identified all the expertise involved in the development of the proposed qualification?

CHAPTER 1

DEFINITIONS, OBJECTIVES AND APPLICATION

1. Definitions

The purpose of these definitions is to define the terminology used in developing this policy.

In this Policy-

- (a) any word or expression to which meaning has been assigned in the National Qualifications Framework Act, 2008 (Act No. 67 of 2008) and the General and Further Education and Training Quality Assurance Act 2001, (Act No. 58 of 2001) shall have the meaning so assigned to it, unless the context otherwise indicates; and
- (b) the singular shall include the plural and vice versa;

"assessment" - means the process of identifying, gathering and interpreting information about a learner's achievement in order to-

- (a) assist the learner's development and improve the process of learning and teaching; and
- (b) evaluate and certify competence in order to ensure qualification credibility;

"assessment body" – means a juristic body accredited by the Council for Quality Assurance in General and Further Education and Training (Umalusi) to quality assure internal assessment and conduct external examinations, and includes a department of education;

"candidate" – refers to any person receiving tuition at a public or independent school or at a learning institution under an accredited assessment body, who enrolled for an examination;

"certification" – means the formal recognition of a qualification or part qualification awarded to a successful candidate;

"Department of Basic Education" – means the national department responsible for basic education, grades R to 12, which includes general and further education and training;

"Department of Higher Education and Training" – means the national department responsible for further education and training/technical and vocational education in colleges, higher education, and adult education and training;

"General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Sub-framework" – means the sub-framework of qualifications developed and managed by Umalusi for National Qualifications Framework (NQF) levels 1 to 4 as envisioned in Chapter 2 of the NQF Act;

"GENFETQA Act" – means the General and Further Education and Training Quality Assurance Act, 2001 (Act No. 58 of 2001, as amended);

"learning area certificate" – means the certificate issued by Umalusi where a candidate has not met the minimum requirements of the qualification, but has obtained credits towards the qualification;

"Minister" – means the minister responsible for Basic Education or the minister responsible for Higher Education and Training;

"National Qualifications Framework" – means the comprehensive system, approved by the Minister of Higher Education and Training, for the classification, registration, publication and articulation of quality assured national qualifications and part-qualifications. The South African NQF is a single integrated system comprising three coordinated qualifications subframeworks: those for General and Further Education and Training, for Higher Education and Training, and for Trades and Occupations;

"NQF Act" – means the National Qualifications Framework Act, 2008 (Act No 67 of 2008, as amended;

"part qualification" – means an assessed unit of learning (subject or learning area) with a clearly defined purpose that is, or will be, registered as part of a qualification on the NQF;

"qualification" – means a registered national qualification consisting of a planned combination of learning outcomes which has a defined purpose or purposes, intended to provide qualifying learners with applied competence and a basis for further learning and which has been assessed in terms of exit level outcomes, registered on the NQF, and certified and awarded by a recognised body;

"quality assurance" – means the process of measuring, evaluating and reporting on quality against standards, and monitoring for ongoing improvement in the qualification, the curriculum/programme, the assessment, the implementation and delivery of the curriculum, and the capacity of the institution or assessment body to offer and/or assess the qualification;

"replacement certificate" - means a certificate issued-

- (a) to a candidate who has not qualified for a certificate in one examination sitting (change of status);
- (b) when the original is lost, damaged or destroyed (duplicate); and
- (c) post-irregularity when the sanction period has elapsed;

"re-issue of a certificate" – means the re-issuing of a certificate where personal details on the original certificate are not correct or have legally changed;

"subject statement" – means the certificate issued by Umalusi where a candidate has not met the minimum requirements of the qualification, but has obtained credits towards the qualification.

2. Introduction

- (1) Umalusi, as the quality council for the General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Sub-framework (GFETQSF), must, in adherence to section 27(i) of the National Qualifications Framework Act, 2008 (Act No. 67 of 2008) (hereinafter referred to as the NQF Act), develop policy to ensure compliance by both private and public assessment bodies regarding quality assurance of assessment.
- (2) In adherence to the NQF's objectives, as contemplated in the aforementioned sub-paragraph (1), Umalusi is, in accordance with section 17A(6) of the General and Further Education and Training Quality Assurance Act, 2001 (Act No. 58 of 2001) (hereinafter referred to as the GENFETQA Act), responsible for the issuing of certificates to candidates who have achieved qualifications or part-qualifications, respectively.

(3) Certification, as contemplated in sub-paragraph (2) above, is the formal recognition of candidates having successfully completed a qualification or part-qualification. In view of this, Umalusi is mandated to issue such certificates at exit points in general and further education and training.

3. Objectives

- (1) In order to issue certificates as stipulated in section 17A(6) of the GENFETQA Act, 2001), Umalusi maintains the capacity to-
 - (a) develop and maintain policies and directives for certification;
 - (b) maintain acceptable standards for awarding certificates; and
 - (c) maintain a certification system and infrastructure, including appropriate security arrangements.
- (2) In compliance with sub-paragraph (1) above, the following objectives are set; to-
 - (a) determine standards for the certification of qualifications registered on the GFETQSF as certified by Umalusi;
 - (b) ensure that the standards and requirements for certification are established through rigorous quality assurance processes;
 - (c) develop and manage the certification of candidate achievement through an appropriate certification programme;
 - (d) determine the norms and standards for certification through its directives and outline the certification process;
 - (e) advise the assessment bodies on certification matters; and
 - (f) ensure compliance of candidate resulting and certification data with policies and relevant legislation.

4. Application

- (1) This policy applies to certificates issued for the qualifications listed on the GFETQSF and issued by Umalusi-
 - (a) Senior Certificate (Report 550);
 - (b) National Senior Certificate (Schools);
 - (c) National Senior Certificate (reports 190 and 191);
 - (d) National N3 Certificate (reports 190 and 191);
 - (e) National Certificate (Vocational) (NC(V)), levels 2 to 4;
 - (f) Subject Certificate (Report 550 and reports 190 and 191);
 - (g) General Education and Training Certificate: Adult Basic Education and Training (GETC: ABET);
 - (h) Learning Area Certificates (GETC: ABET);
 - (i) Subject Statement (NC(V) and National Senior Certificate (NSC)); and
 - (j) Senior Certificate (as amended).

LEGISLATIVE CONTEXT

5. Underpinning legislation

- (1) This policy is premised on the following acts-
 - (a) The Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996 (Act No. 108 of 1996);
 - (b) The National Qualifications Framework Act, 2008 (Act No. 67 of 2008) (the NQF Act, 2008); and
 - (c) The General and Further Education and Training Quality Assurance Act, 2001 (Act No. 58 of 2001) (the GENFETQA Act, 2001).

6. Mandate and responsibilities of Umalusi regarding certification

- (1) Section 24 of the NQF Act (2008) provides for the establishment of Umalusi as a quality council that is responsible for the development and management of a sub-framework of qualifications at levels 1 to 4 of the NQF and the related quality assurance processes.
- (2) In accordance with section 17A(6) of the GENFETQA Act (2001), Umalusi is responsible for the issuing of certificates to learners who have achieved qualifications or part-qualifications registered on the GFETQSF, as contemplated in paragraph 3(1) above.

(3) In its role as a quality council, Umalusi is committed to issuing candidates with valid and credible certificates that are both nationally and internationally comparable.

7. Supplementary documents

This policy must be read in conjunction with the following documents:

(1) Regulations-

- (a) Regulations for the issuing of certificates by the Council for Quality Assurance in General and Further Education and Training, amendment to the regulations as published in Government Gazette No 25794 of 2 December 2003, Government Gazette No. 38820 of 25 May 2015; and
- (b) Regulations pertaining to the National Curriculum Statement Grades R-12, Government Gazette No 40472 of 2 December 2016.

(2) Policies-

- (a) General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Sub-framework, promulgated in Government Gazette No. 36006 of 14 December 2012, as amended in Government Gazette No. 36803 of 30 August 2013, published on 8 September 2014;
- (b) Conduct, Administration and Management of the National Senior Certificate Examination, Government Gazette No. 30048 of 6 July 2007;
- (c) National Requirements of the National Curriculum Statement Grades R-12, Government Gazette No. 36042 of 28 December 2012;

- (d) The Higher Education and Training Qualifications Subframework, Government Gazette No. 36003 of 14 December 2012; and
- (e) Policy for the Re-issue of National Certificates, Government Gazette No 41738 of 29 August 2018.
- (3) Directives for certification-
 - (a) Directives for Certification National Senior Certificate (Schools);
 - (b) Directives for Certification National Certificate (Vocational) Levels 2–4;
 - (c) Directives for Certification Senior Certificate, as amended;
 - (d) Directives for Certification of the General Education and Training Certificate; and
 - (e) Directives for Certification by Umalusi. Senior Certificate, National Senior Certificate (FET Colleges), N3 Certificate, General Education and Training Certificate (ABET Level 4).

ENUNCIATION OF UMALUSI'S PROCESSES AND PROCEDURES TO DEVELOP AND MANAGE AN APPROPRIATE SYSTEM FOR THE CERTIFICATION OF CANDIDATE ACHIEVEMENTS

8. Purpose

- (1) The purpose of this policy is to provide direction to assessment bodies and Umalusi for the responsibilities associated with the certification of learner achievements as stipulated in section 17A(6) of the GENFETQA Act, 2001. This policy addresses responsibilities associated with the certification of existing qualifications, as well as with the certification of new qualifications developed for the GFETQSF managed by Umalusi.
- (2) The policy provides a common understanding of the responsibility and requirement stipulated in the GENFETQA Act, 2001.
- (3) The policy directs assessment bodies to request certification for candidates who satisfied the requirements of certificates listed in paragraph 4(1).

Processes and procedures for the development and management of an appropriate certification system

In pursuance of its aim, namely, to issue credible certificates to successful candidates which are nationally and internationally comparable, Umalusi has to develop processes and procedures for the development of such a certification system, as set out in paragraph 9(1). In the event of

discrepancies that may occur during the certification process, special provision has been made to cater for these discrepancies in paragraph 9(3).

- (1) Processes and procedures-
 - (a) The resulting data must be approved after an examination was conducted by the assessment bodies;
 - (b) Requests for the certification of candidate achievements must only be done after the results have been approved by Umalusi;
 - (c) All applications and requests for certification must be submitted to Umalusi by an assessment body within three months of the release of the results;
 - (d) Certification for candidates who did not apply for a re-mark or re-checking or a supplementary examination must be submitted within 10 days after the closing date for applications for re-marks, re-checks or supplementary examinations;
 - (e) A signed declaration to confirm the accuracy and authenticity of the examination data must be submitted to Umalusi with the request for the bulk certification;
 - (f) Rules of combination and pass requirements may change from year to year and therefore care must be taken to ensure that evaluation and resulting for a specific year is done in terms of the rules that apply to that examination, irrespective of what the future rules may be. In view of this, the rules applicable are those that applied at the date of the last examination that is included in the examination:
 - (g) The directives for certification, as published by Umalusi, must be adhered to for the certification of candidate records; and

- (h) Amendments to certificates may be requested, provided such amendments comply with the *Policy for the Re-issue of National Certificates*.
- (2) Financial management-
 - (a) The following financial principles must be applied-
 - (i) Certification tariffs for private assessment bodies and private institutions are revised and set by Umalusi;
 - (ii) Private assessment bodies must be advised well in advance of changes to the tariffs to allow for budgeting;
 - (iii) New tariffs must be implemented on 1 April of each year;
 - (iv) Private assessment bodies must ensure that these tariffs are shared with their relevant stakeholders;
 - (v) Once a data set has been approved for certification, an invoice is generated for the attention of the private assessment body or private institution;
 - (vi) Certificates are released to the private assessment body or the college/school – as the case may be – if the invoices are paid; and
 - (vii) The certificates of private colleges with accounts in arrears for more than 90 days will be withheld until payment is received.
 - (3) The occurrence of discrepancies in the certification process-
 - (a) Discrepancy between the date for credit accumulation and the date of the enactment of the current certification requirements-
 - (i) A candidate is certified when the minimum requirements have been met for a specific qualification or

- subject/learning area, as stipulated in policy/regulations and directives that were in place and effective in the qualifying year;
- (ii) If the date for obtaining the minimum requirements differs from the enactment date of the certification requirements, e.g. the final examination was completed in 1996, but the application for certification was in 2007, the qualification will be awarded in terms of the rules that applied in 1996, and the candidate will be resulted and issued with a certificate according to the rules effective in 1996. The current, i.e. 2007, rules do not apply in this case. In other words, the rules for the qualifying year will be applied; and
- (iii) The application of different certification requirements, as contemplated in sub-paragraph (3)(a)(ii) above, is subject to a verification process by Umalusi to establish whether the differences in dates of meeting the minimum qualification requirements and the certification requirements are valid.
- (b) Recognition of credits previously obtained-
 - (i) In the case that a candidate obtains credits towards a national qualification assessed by any of the education departments prior to 1992, i.e. the Senior Certificate, National Senior Certificate, National Technical Education (NATED) Certificate 190/191 or N3 Certificate, such credits may be recognised for the award of the Senior Certificate, National Senior Certificate, NATED 190/191 or N3 Certificate, subject to the compliance of

- the candidate with all the requirements for the award of the qualification; and
- (ii) Changes to any of the qualifications, as contemplated in sub-paragraph (2)(b)(i) above, may affect the ruling as contemplated in the set sub-paragraph, should different transitional arrangements be determined.

(c) Review of qualifications-

- (i) Following the review of a qualification, it may need to be amended or even regarded as no longer serving a need in the system. In such a case, Umalusi and the relevant ministry of education jointly determine a date after which the offering of a qualification on the GFETQSF ceases;
- (ii) Transitional arrangements must be regulated, and the South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA) must be advised accordingly. Both parties determine and put into effect the transitional arrangements simultaneously; and
- (iii) Institutions offering qualifications registered on the GFETQSF (public and private schools, public and private technical and vocational education and training (TVET)/community education and training (CET) colleges, and public and private adult learning/education centres) must be fully advised by means of a circular of amendments to a qualification, or of the transitional arrangements for a qualification that ceases to be offered.

- (d) Completion of outstanding requirements in order to meet certification requirements-
 - (i) The certification of a qualification, as contemplated in sub-paragraph (3)(c)(i), nevertheless remains a possibility. Should Umalusi establish whether the rules of combination prescribed in the policy document have met its approval, it could grant approval to a candidate for the completion of the outstanding requirements by offering a subject/s from an existing qualification;
 - (ii) Subject to Umalusi's decision in such a case, as contemplated in sub-paragraph (3)(d)(i), the qualification will be awarded, and the certificate issued will be effective in the month following the offering of the last subject.
- (e) Phased-out qualifications-
 - (i) A qualification that is no longer offered is nevertheless retained on the GFETQSF and remains valid.

10. Responsibilities of the assessment bodies for the development and management of an appropriate certification system

(1) Assessment bodies must adhere to the regulations pertaining to the conduct, administration and management of the national examinations.

The following sections from the regulations are of importance to the certification system-

(a) Registration of candidates;

- (b) Management of irregularities;
- (c) Registration and accreditation of independent schools as examination centres;
- (d) Access to certification information; and
- (e) Minimum requirements for an examination computer system.
- (2) Assessment bodies must adhere to Umalusi's requirements for standardisation, statistical moderation and resulting, and must submit all candidate records to Umalusi for the approval of the examination results.
- (3) Only candidates' records that were approved during the resulting process must be submitted to Umalusi for certification.
- (4) The certification data submitted to Umalusi must comply with the directives for certification as published by Umalusi for the qualifications registered on the GFETQSF.
- (5) Assessment bodies are responsible for preparing and submitting certification data to Umalusi in terms of first issues, re-issues and replacement certificates for candidates from September 1992 for qualifications on the GFETQSF.
- (6) Assessment bodies must submit a signed declaration with the submission of the examination and resulting data for certification to Umalusi for bulk certification.
- (7) Assessment bodies must ensure that all candidates' records are submitted for certification and are certified by Umalusi.

- (8) Assessment bodies must ensure that candidates that are enrolled at private institutions are registered at an examination centre that is accredited by Umalusi.
- (9) The resulting and certification computer system must also support the automatic combination of academic records (subject statements) into a certificate and be able to process replacements (duplicates) or re-issues of certificates.
- (10) Assessment bodies must ensure and apply stringent security measures during the processing of queries, the combination of results and the verification of results.
- (11) Assessment bodies must ensure that there are backup copies of the electronic certification records and that data is securely saved.
- (12) Assessment bodies are responsible for the collection of the certificates from Umalusi and distribution thereof to certificate holders.

11. Responsibilities of Umalusi for the development and management of an appropriate certification system

(1) Umalusi must ensure that policy and regulations governing the qualifications are translated into directives for certification for implementation on the certification processes and system.

- (2) Umalusi is responsible for ensuring that, through rigorous quality assurance processes, the certificate it issues meets the minimum requirements for the qualification.
- (3) Umalusi must approve the resulting data during the standardisation and resulting processes and provide feedback on non-approved transactions.
- (4) Umalusi must process requests for certification and ensure that all candidates who qualified for a certificate are issued with a certificate.
- (5) Umalusi must ensure that all datasets are processed, records are certified and certificates are issued by ensuring the certification of candidate records and the issuing of certificates to candidates who have achieved a part or full qualification.
- (6) To certify qualifications, Umalusi must verify that the computer system used by the assessment body complies with the qualification policy and requirements and that the data submitted for certification is reliable and valid.
- (7) Umalusi manages the certification of candidate records through developing and managing a certification and verification system that complies with policy requirements and Umalusi's directives for certification, and which verifies and approves data for candidate certification submitted by accredited assessment bodies.
- (8) Umalusi develops and manages suitable systems, processes and procedures for both the certification and verification of qualifications.

- (9) Umalusi maintains an updated database of all certificates issued, and keeps an audit trail on transactions executed by users on the system.
- (10) Umalusi controls access to the system and trains users to undertake the processing of information for candidate certification.
- (11) Umalusi verifies candidate records on request.
- (12) Umalusi must ensure that National Learners' Records Database (NLRD) data is submitted 30 days after quality assurance processes are completed.
- (13) Candidates from unaccredited institutions will not be certified by Umalusi.

SECURITY OF THE CERTIFICATION SYSTEM AND THE SAFEKEEPING OF HISTORICAL CERTIFICATE RECORDS

12. Creation of a credible and secure certification environment

(1) Principles for ensuring security-

The following safety measures must be adhered to-

- (a) Users with controlled access to the system must sign a declaration of confidentiality;
- (b) All activities on the system must leave an audit trail;
- (c) Accountable officers such as the system administrators must maintain and manage user access to the system;
- (d) A modular approach for easy management of the system must be followed;
- (e) Storage and printing of certificates must take place in a secure environment;
- (f) A record of all certificates issued must be maintained;
- (g) Credible certificate background paper, which has security features that are regularly enhanced, must be used; and
- (h) Backup and storage of data must be maintained.
- (2) Security features of the certificate-

Umalusi must ensure that the format for the certificate background paper includes various security features, and must improve these security features frequently by introducing the latest developments in the field of security printing, with the aim of avoiding the possibility of fraudulent certificates being produced.

(3) Monitoring of the security system-

Umalusi must-

- (a) Monitor whether its printers comply with security policy; and
- (b) Manage the printing and storage of certificates issued to candidates.

13. Unclaimed certificates

- All unclaimed certificates should be shredded after a period of five
 years. All unclaimed certificates should be kept as follows at a venue or storage before shredding can take place-
 - (a) School: one (1) year;
 - (b) District or circuit: two (2) years; and
 - (c) Assessment body (Head Office): two (2) years.
- (2) After five (5) years, the assessment body should shred all unclaimed certificates during the sixth year.
- (3) Records for all shredded certificates should be captured and stored on the electronic certification system of the assessment body and that of Umalusi.

14. Access to certificate information and systems

(1) Only registered users must have access to the certification system.

- (2) Users who are inactive for a period of six months must be removed.
- (3) External users may only be granted viewing rights if approved by Umalusi.

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CERTIFICATION OF CANDIDATE ACHIEVEMENT

15. Underlying principles for the certification of qualifications registered on the GFETQSF

- (1) Each qualification that is registered on the GFETQSF is underpinned by-
 - (a) its own policy, which determines the candidate registration and certification requirements; and
 - (b) the necessary supporting documentation that allows for the implementation of the qualification.
- (2) All policy and directives for the certification of qualifications are informed by the following, and are explicated in the relevant directives for certification-
 - (a) The Policy for Further Education and Training Qualifications Subframework, Government Gazette No 38029 of 29 September 2014; and
 - (b) The individual qualification requirements, derived from the qualification policy.

16. Procedure for the issuing of certificates by means of public or private accredited assessment bodies

(1) Umalusi is responsible for the registration of qualifications on the GFETQSF of the NQF at SAQA to serve as a formal recognition of a qualification on the NQF.

- (2) Prior to the issuing of a certificate for a qualification, Umalusi must satisfy itself that the results are verified as being of the required standard. Only after such approval of results by Umalusi, may a request from an assessment body for the issuing of a certificate be considered.
- (3) The qualification submitted to Umalusi to be certified must comply with the following-
 - (a) Rules of combination;
 - (b) Council requirements for certification in terms of the GENFETQA Act, 2001;
 - (c) The policy governing the specific qualification; and
 - (d) The directives for certification.
- (4) Umalusi must determine the following-
 - (a) Format of the certificate;
 - (b) Printed information on the certificate; and
 - (c) The way in which certificates are replaced.
- (5) The final certificate to be issued must be signed by the CEO of Umalusi.
- (6) The issuing of subject statements is optional and will be issued on request from the assessment body.
- (7) A certification fee must be paid by private colleges and private assessment bodies for the issuing of certificates.

(8) Candidates from colleges that are suspended from receiving certificates due to fees not being paid may apply at Umalusi for the issuing of their individual certificates. The certificates will be printed upon receipt of proof of payment. The certification fee for this category will be reviewed annually.

17. Certification of foreign qualifications and jointly quality assured qualifications

- (1) Umalusi may consider the certification of qualifications that are jointly quality assured with other quality councils.
- (2) Should Umalusi agree to certify a qualification (or a variant of a registered qualification) in terms of an inter-governmental agreement, Umalusi will advise the relevant minister of education regarding the role and responsibilities it is able to undertake in respect of the agreement, and will issue directives for certification in this regard.
- (3) Where it has been agreed among the parties that Umalusi will serve as the certification body on behalf of the ministry of education of another state, or will recognise subjects from a foreign qualification as part of a registered South African qualification, such a body will have to adhere to the quality assurance and certification requirements determined by Umalusi.

18. The management of certified data

(1) Umalusi is the custodian of all certified data and is therefore responsible for verifying certified data for qualifications registered on the GFETQSF.

- (2) Certified data is available for research purposes, but must always be stored in a secured environment to protect the data of individual candidates.
- (3) Certified data for research purposes, as contemplated in subparagraph (2) above, may only be used-
 - (a) within the parameters determined by Umalusi's Ethics Policy and adherence to public laws;
 - (b) subject to the approval of the CEO in the case of third-party requests for certified data from Umalusi for research purposes only, provided the request has been done in good faith; and
 - (c) if the necessary authority is exercised in compliance with applicable laws relating to protection of information.
- (4) In the event of an assessment body being de-accredited or closes down-
 - (a) A written agreement with regard to the finalisation of assessment data for certification between Umalusi and the outgoing assessment body must be put in place;
 - (b) All assessment data and examination administration information from the de-accredited assessment body must be handed over to Umalusi for safekeeping; and
 - (c) Candidates from the affected assessment bodies may apply for their lost certificates at Umalusi after the assessment body has been de-accredited.
- (5) If an assessment body is no longer accredited by Umalusi, the certification data of candidates must be available as reliable and

valid certification data in order to allow a candidate to request a replacement certificate.

- (6) In the event of an assessment body no longer being accredited by Umalusi, as contemplated in sub-paragraph (5), Umalusi, who is the custodian of the certified data, may approach another accredited assessment body or a department of education to host the examination and resulting data for certification purposes.
- (7) The candidates registered at the assessment body no longer accredited by Umalusi, as contemplated in sub-paragraph (6), will be allowed to request a replacement certificate through the nominated hosted assessment body contemplated in sub-paragraph (6). No changes to data of candidates on certificates issued in such case will be accommodated; only a replacement of a certificate must be issued.

19. Concessions

(1) If a candidate has not complied with the minimum entrance requirements for a qualification, an assessment body may request the minister of education to provide a special concession, after consultation with Umalusi, and the relevant policy must be updated according to the decision taken.

REGULATIONS

20. Development of regulations

- (1) In terms of section 27 of the GENFETQA Act, 2001, the Minister of Basic Education may make regulations regarding any matter that may or must be prescribed by regulation in terms of the said Act.
- (2) Umalusi may, in terms of Section 27 of the GENFETQA Act, as contemplated in sub-paragraph (1) above, request the Minister of Basic Education to develop regulations with regard to the issuing of certificates for qualifications registered on the GFETQSF.

TRANSITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS AND SHORT TITLE

21. Transitional arrangements

Until such time as the Minister has promulgated the Policy for the Certification of Candidate Records on the General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Sub-framework (External) in the Government Gazette, the said policy will be implemented as directives for a transitional period, commencing on the date of approval by the Umalusi Council.

22. Short title

This policy may be cited as the Policy for the Certification of Candidate Records on the General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Sub-framework (External) and will commence on the day of its promulgation in the Government Gazette.

DEFINITIONS, OBJECTIVES AND APPLICATION

1. Definitions

The purpose of these definitions is to define the terminology used in developing this policy.

In this policy -

- (a) any word or expression to which meaning has been assigned in the National Qualifications Framework Act, 2008 (Act No. 67 of 2008) and the General and Further Education and Training Quality Assurance Act, 2001 (Act No. 58 of 2001) shall have the meaning so assigned to it, unless the context otherwise indicates;
- (b) the singular shall include the plural and vice versa.
- "assessment" means the process of identifying, gathering and interpreting information about a learner's achievement, to -
- (a) assist the learner's development and improve the process of learning and teaching; and
- (b) evaluate and certify competence to ensure qualification credibility. Assessment includes national examinations, end-ofterm and/or once-off, end-of-year examinations, to ensure a national standard across providers;

"assessment body" - means a juristic body accredited by Umalusi Council to quality assure internal assessment and conduct external examinations, and includes a department of education;

"candidate" - means any person who has registered for and written an examination through an accredited assessment body and who has achieved a subject credit in a qualification, or the full qualification;

"certification" - means the formal recognition by Umalusi Council of a qualification or part qualifications awarded to a candidate who has successfully completed the qualification registered on the GFETQSF;

"Council" - refers to Umalusi, the Quality Council for General and Further Education and Training; as contemplated in the National Qualifications Framework, 2008 (Act No. 67 of 2008) and the General and Further Education and Training Quality Assurance Act, 2001 (Act No. 58 of 2001);

"curriculum" - means a statement which encompasses three components: intended curriculum, enacted curriculum and assessed curriculum;

"Department of Basic Education" - means the national department responsible for education and training that takes place in primary and secondary schools, as well as in adult education and training centres;

"Department of Higher Education and Training - means the national department responsible for further education and training in colleges, higher education institutions and adult education and training centres;

"Further Education and Training" - means all learning and training programmes leading to qualifications from Levels 2–4 of the National Qualifications Framework (NQF), which levels are above general education and training but below higher education;

"General Education and Training" - means all learning and training programmes leading to a qualification on Level 1 of the NQF, which level is below further education and training;

"General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Sub-framework" (GFETQSF) - means the sub-framework of the NQF for

general and further education and training that is developed and managed by Umalusi;

- <u>"Head of Examinations"</u> means the head of an examination unit responsible for examinations and assessment in a province or of the assessment body;
- <u>"Internal Certification Committee"</u> means an internal Umalusi committee, chaired by an Executive manager, that approves and oversees the applications for the re-issuing of national certificates;
- "Minister" means the Minister of Basic Education; and Minister of Higher Education, Science, Technology and Innovation;
- "moderation" means a process that ensures that assessment of the outcomes described in the NQF standards or qualifications is fair, valid and reliable; this applies to both external and internal moderation;
- "National Senior Certificate" as contemplated in the National Policy pertaining to the Programme and Promotion Requirements of the National Curriculum Statement, Grades R-12, published in Government Gazette No. 34600 of 12 September 2011;
- "National Qualification Framework" (NQF) means the national qualifications framework contemplated in the National Qualifications Framework Act, 2008 (Act No. 67 of 2008);
- "part qualification" means an assessed unit of learning with a clearly defined purpose that is, or will be, registered as part of a qualification on the NQF:
- "qualification" means qualification types and variants as defined on the GFETQSF as contemplated in the National Qualifications Framework Act, 2008 (Act No. 67 of 2008);

"quality assurance" - means the process of measuring, evaluating and reporting on quality against standards; monitoring for ongoing improvement in the qualification, the curriculum/programme, the assessment; the implementation and delivery of the curriculum/programme; and the capacity of the institution or assessment body to offer and/or assess the qualification;

"Quality Council (QC)" - means a quality council contemplated in sections 24–27 of the National Qualifications Framework Act, 2008;

"registered qualification" - means a qualification registered on the NQF by the South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA) in terms of section 13(1)(h) of the National Qualifications Framework Act, 2008 (Act No. 67 of 2008);

"Subject statement/certificate" - means the certificate issued by Umalusi to a candidate who has not met the minimum requirements of the qualification but has obtained credits towards the qualification;

"Umalusi" – is the Quality Council for General and Further Education and Training established by the General and Further Education and Training Quality Assurance Act, 2001 (Act No. 58 of 2001). In terms of the National Qualifications Framework Act, it is tasked to support the achievement of the objectives of the NQF and to develop and manage the GFETQSF.

2. Objectives

- (1) The objective of this <u>policy</u> [document] is to determine standards for the certification of candidates where the information reflected on the original certificate issued by Umalusi requires amendment by -
 - (a) determining the norms and standards for certification of this special group of certification requests;

- (b) directing assessment bodies in the submission of data for certification as required by Umalusi in respect of changes to information on certificates already issued by Umalusi;
- (c) ensuring compliance of candidate and certification data with policies and relevant legislation; and
- (d) evaluating submitted requests and documentation for changes to information on certificates previously issued by Umalusi.

3. Application

- (1) This policy applies to candidates who were registered at public institutions, Technical Vocational Education and Training Colleges, Community Education and Training Colleges and accredited independent schools and private colleges, [or independent schools, or Technical and Vocational Education and Training Colleges, or Community Colleges and Private Colleges] which offer qualifications registered on the GFETQSF.
- (2) In the event of a conflict between the National Qualifications Framework Act, 2008 (Act No. 67 of 2008), the Higher Education Act, 1997 (Act No. 101 of 1997), the Skills Development Act, 1998 (Act No. 97 of 1998) and the General and Further Education and Training Quality Assurance Act, 2001 (Act No. 58 of 2001), the National Qualifications Framework Act, 2008, must be given preference.

PURPOSE AND SCOPE

4. Purpose

- (1) The purpose of **[the document]** this policy is to provide **[guidelines]** directives for the re-issuing of a certificate where the information on the original certificate requires amendment.
- (2) This policy specifies the required documents or <u>evidence</u>, <u>which</u> <u>must be submitted</u> [for re-issues] within the specified timeframes.
- (3) The policy also ascribes responsibility to the requesting assessment body to ensure full compliance with each request before submission to Umalusi for consideration.

5. Scope

- (1) The changing of personal particulars on a certificate opens the possibility of a qualification being allocated fraudulently to another person. Such an eventuality must be stringently guarded against.
- (2) The focus of this particular policy is to govern the re-issue of previously issued certificates.
- (3) A request for a re-issue will be considered only where there is sufficient proof that one or more details on a certificate are incorrect and such details do not correspond with the valid and true facts.

- (4) Umalusi issues certificates for the following qualifications and part-qualifications registered on the [General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Sub-framework] GFETQSF:
 - (a) Senior Certificate (Report 550);
 - (b) Senior Certificate (Report 550) as amended;
 - (c) National Senior Certificate (Reports 190 and 191);
 - (d) National N3 Certificate (Reports 190 and 191);
 - (e) Subject Certificate (Report 550 and Reports 190 and 191);
 - (f) National Senior Certificate (NSC) (Schools);
 - (g) National Certificate (Vocational) (NC(V)), Levels 2 4;
 - (h) Subject Statement NC(V), NSC and Senior Certificate (as amended);
 - (a) General Education and Training Certificate (GETC): Adult Basic Education and Training; [ABET (GETC: ABET)] and
 - (j) Learning Area Certificate (GETC). [: ABET].

LEGISLATIVE CONTEXT

6. Underpinning legislation

- (1) The policy is **[regulations are]** premised on the following Acts -
 - (a) The Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996 (Act No. 108 of 1996);
 - (b) National Qualifications Framework Act, 2008 (Act No. 67 of 2008) (hereafter referred to as the NQF Act);
 - (c) General and Further Education and Training Quality Assurance Act, 2001 (Act No. 58 of 2001) (hereafter referred to as the GENFETQA Act);
 - (d) South African Schools Act, 1996 (Act No. 84 of 1996); and

Mandate and Responsibilities of Umalusi as the Quality Council of the GFETQSF

- (1) Umalusi's mandate as the Quality Assurance Council for bands 1–4 of the National Qualifications Framework is stipulated in -
 - (a) Section 24 of the NQF Act; and
 - (b) Sections 16(2) and 16(3) of the GENFETQA Act.
- (2) In accordance with section 17A(6) of the [General and Further Education and Training Quality Assurance] GENFETQA Act, the Council must issue certificates to candidates who have achieved qualifications or part qualifications.

8. Guiding Principles

- (1) In terms of the *Promotion of Administrative Justice Act, 2000*, Umalusi is required to have a policy in respect of administrative decisions taken. In terms of the re-issuing of certificates, an administrative decision is taken on each request received for certification.
- (2) This policy for the re-issue of certificates forms the rule-governed basis for each of these administrative decisions.
- (3) This policy defines the basis for the administrative decisions made by Umalusi in respect of changes requested to certificates already issued by Umalusi.

- (xv) Directives published by Umalusi for certification of qualifications registered on the [General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Subframework] GFETQSF.

RE-ISSUING OF CERTIFICATES

10. Underlying principles for requesting a re-issue

- (1) All requests for the correction of information must be accompanied by the return of the original certificate issued by Umalusi.
- (2) In a case where a candidate has applied for and received a replacement certificate in lieu of a [document which has been lost or stolen, the assumption] certificate that has been lost or stolen after receipt by the candidate, the assumption is that the candidate had accepted all information on the original certificate as being correct. In such cases changes to a replacement certificate will not be allowed.
- (3) In the event that there is documentary evidence that the assessment body requested a replacement certificate in lieu of a certificate that had been lost before receipt by the candidate, only then may changes on a replacement certificate be accepted for consideration.

 In this instance, the replacement certificate will have to be returned to Umalusi.
- (4) All documents submitted must be certified copies, and not older than three months.

- (5) Umalusi reserves the right to request additional information and/or to interview the candidate to support such applications.
- (6) An application from a person who is not a South African citizen, or who has received permanent residency, should be dealt with in terms of this policy when changes are made to a document.

11. Re-issue of National Certificates

- (1) Re-issues due to administrative errors -
 - (a) [Administrative errors should be identified and corrected as soon as possible after the candidate received the certificate]. Administrative errors should be prevented by the assessment body and by the candidate. There are [The candidate has] at least three opportunities to correct such errors: during the registration process; upon receipt of the examination timetable; and on receipt of the Statement of Results. However, in the unfortunate situation that administrative errors are identified on a certificate, they should be corrected without any delay.
 - (b) The errors should be distinguished from changes to personal particulars as a result of changes/corrections made by the Department of Home Affairs on the National Population Register, or as a result of a legal process. These changes include, for example, the incorrect spelling of a

name or surname and an error in the capturing of an ID number or date of birth.

- c) Replacing the date of birth on a certificate with an ID number will be allowed only if evidence is provided that the error occurred due to an administrative error.
- (d) The candidates are required to contact the assessment body through which they wrote the examination for assistance and the assessment body <u>must</u> submit the following documentation on their behalf -
 - (i) application form detailing the change requested;
 - (ii) a detailed affidavit by the candidate indicating the change requested, the reason for the request and the reason for the error not having been detected and corrected prior to the issuance of the certificate. Information on the affidavit must include the name, surname, ID number/date of birth and contact details of the person concerned, affirmation that he/she is the rightful owner of the certificate, and the steps taken to correct the error prior to the issuance of the certificate;
 - (iii) certified copy of ID or birth certificate issued prior to the writing of the examination. In the event that the ID was lost after the writing of the examination and a new ID had been issued, a copy of the ID should be accompanied by a letter from the Department of Home Affairs confirming the issue date of the first ID:
 - (iv) original Umalusi certificate;
 - (v) one of the following documents <u>from the primary</u>
 <u>or secondary school the candidate attended</u>,
 reflecting the candidate's [correct] information:
 - school's admission register; or

- preliminary entry schedule signed by the candidate, the parent/guardian and principal; or
- schedule of results; or
- entry schedule obtained from the school's administration IT system (e.g. SA-SAMS or CEMIS).
- (vi) [affidavit] Letter from the Head of Examinations [assessment body] indicating how the error was identified, what steps were taken to address the error and what steps have been taken in an attempt to prevent future occurrences of the same nature.
- (e) An ID or birth certificate issued after the writing of the national examination will not be considered. All copies submitted must be certified and may not be older than three months.
- (e) [Umalusi reserves the right to request additional information and/or to interview the candidate to support such applications.]
- (2) Re-issue due to change of marks -
 - (a) An application must be processed by the assessment body within six (6) months of certification.
 - (b) It is the responsibility of the assessment body to ensure that the marks submitted at the time of certification have

been verified and all **[mopping-up]** <u>outstanding marks</u> of the examination cycle have been completed.

- (c) The candidate is required to contact the assessment body through which they wrote the examination for assistance and the assessment body must submit the following documentation on behalf of the candidate -
 - (i) application form;
 - (ii) a copy of the mark sheet; or
 - (iii) a copy of the front page of the answer book as proof of the correct mark; or,
 - (iv) a copy of an audit trail, or the electronic record as the system's verification of the candidate's record, indicating the changes effected, in the event number (ii) or (iii) above cannot be submitted. The audit trail will be allowed only for examinations prior to November 2019.
 - [(v) certified copy of ID document or Birth Certificate issued prior to the writing of the examination]
 - (v) original Umalusi certificate; and
 - (vi) a <u>letter</u> [an affidavit] from the [assessment body] Head of Examinations indicating how the error was identified, what steps were taken to correct the error and what steps have been taken in an attempt to prevent future occurrences of the same nature. The <u>letter[affidavit]</u> must also indicate the name, surname, ID number/date of birth and contact information of the individual, the change requested, the reason for the change being requested, and an indication of why the change is being requested after the certificate has been printed.

[(d) All copies submitted must be certified and not older than three months]

- (d) If the application is for a re-issue due to a change in marks and this is not submitted within six (6) months after certification, a letter signed by the Head of Examinations must be submitted. This letter must indicate how the need for a change in marks was identified and why the request is being submitted more than six months after certification.
- [(e) Umalusi reserves the right to request additional information and/or to interview an assessment body official to support such applications.]
- (3) Re-issues **[resulting from]** <u>due to</u> voluntary changes by the candidate <u>resulting in changes on the National Population</u>
 Register -

[(a) Gender change]

- (i) for applications with regard to gender description,

 [and] gender status, name and/or surname changes, the candidate is required to contact the assessment body through which they wrote the examination for assistance and the assessment body must submit the following documentation on behalf of the candidate:
- (ii) a completed application form indicating the change requested;
- (iii) a detailed affidavit by the candidate indicating the change requested and the reason for the request. Information in the affidavit should include the name, surname, ID number/date of birth and

- contact details of the applicant, and affirmation that he/she is the rightful owner of the certificate;
- [(cc) A certified copy of an ID document or Birth Certificate or valid Passport issued prior to the writing of the examination.]
- (iv) a certified copy of the <u>new</u> ID indicating the new[ID number, and names] <u>personal details</u>;
- (v) a letter from the Department of Home Affairs confirming that it has, on behalf of the person in question, acted in terms of section 27(A) of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1992, and has effected the changes to the population register; and
- (vi) the original certificate.
- [(ii) All certified copies should be no more than three months old.]
- [(iii) Umalusi reserves the right to request additional information and/or to interview the candidate to support such applications.]
- [(b) Change of name and/or surname

For applications with regard to name or/and surname changes, the following documentation is required-

- (i) Certified copies of the candidate's old and new IDs;
- (ii) A detailed sworn statement (affidavit) by the candidate;
- (iii) The original certificate; and
- (iv) A letter from the Department of Home Affairs confirming that it has, on behalf of the person in question, acted in terms of Section 27(A) of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1992, and has effected the changes to the population register.]

- (4) Re-issues due to corrections on the National Population Register resulting in changed names, ID numbers and dates of birth -
 - (a) These errors should be distinguished from changes to personal particulars as a result of errors made by an assessment body (spelling or typographical errors, referred to as administrative errors).
 - (b) The candidate must bring the amendments to the population register to the attention of Umalusi by making a request for the changes to personal particulars through an assessment body.
 - (c) The candidate is required to contact the assessment body through which they wrote the examination for assistance and the assessment body must submit the following documentation on behalf of the candidate -
 - (i) application form detailing the change requested;
 - (ii) a detailed affidavit by the candidate indicating the change requested, the reason for the request and including the name, surname, ID number/date of birth and contact details of the person concerned, and affirmation that he/she is the rightful owner of the certificate;
 - [(iii) a certified copy of an ID document or Birth

 Certificate or valid Passport issued prior to the

 writing of the examination;]
 - (iii) a certified copy of the <u>new</u> ID indicating the **[new]** <u>changed</u> ID number and names;
 - (iv) a certified copy of the legal document issued by the Department of Home Affairs confirming the changes effected to the population register; and
 - (v) original Umalusi certificate.

- (d) All copies submitted must be certified and not older than three months.
- [(e) Umalusi reserves the right to request additional information and/or to interview the candidate to support such applications.]

12. Internal Certification Committee

- (1) All applications <u>for the re-issue of certificates</u> will be assessed by the Internal Certification Committee.
- (2) Any request that does not comply with the specified timeframe and/or requisite documentation will not be considered, and the documentation will be returned to the requesting assessment body for return to the candidate.

13. Umalusi processes and procedures

- (1) The following procedure is required in an application for a re-issue -
 - (a) the request for a re-issue must be made through an assessment body;
 - (b) the original certificate must be returned; and
 - (c) all required supporting documents and evidence must be provided.
- (2) A verification process for each of the documents submitted must be undertaken, along with the changes made, so that the computerised system used for certification is able to recognise the reasons for re-issue to

- ensure that fraudulent certificates do not go into circulation.
- (3) A change to an original certificate will not be considered unless the original certificate (not a replacement certificate) is returned.
- (4) Supporting documentation with regard to re-issues should reach Umalusi within seven working days after Umalusi has requested the documentation from the assessment body.
- (5) A change in surname due to marriage, <u>as per the</u>

 <u>Marriage Act, 1961 (Act No. 25 of 1961) (as amended)</u>, will not be considered.
- (6) Candidates will be allowed to replace a date of birth with an ID number on a certificate if the ID number was issued by the Department of Home Affairs after the examination date provided that the date of birth on the certificate corresponds with the ID number.

14. Appeals Procedure

- (1) An institution, assessment body or person may lodge an appeal to the Council of Umalusi.
- (2) The assessment body determines the **[veracity]**appropriateness of the appeal request and completeness of supporting documentation.
- (3) If the assessment body determines that such appeal falls outside the scope of this policy, the candidate should be advised appropriately on further steps to be taken.
- (4) If the assessment body determines that the appeal warrants submission to Umalusi, the request is registered on their IT system.

- (5) The appeal is electronically submitted to Umalusi on a dataset.
- (6) Umalusi uploads and processes the dataset on the Umalusi IT system, within seven working days of receipt of the dataset.
- (7) Supporting documentation requested from the assessment body must be submitted to Umalusi within seven working days of its request for such submission.
- (8) The certification officers assess the supporting documentation submitted as evidence according to the policy and submit it to the Internal Certification Committee.
- (9) If the supporting documentation provides sufficient proof and evidence as required, the application is approved and the certificate is printed and sent to the requesting assessment body.
- (10) If the application is unsuccessful, the documentation is returned to the assessment body for return to the candidate.
- [(10) An institution, assessment body or person may lodge an appeal to the office of Umalusi CEO within ten (10) working days of the date of receipt of the response.]
- (11) The appeal process shall be in line with the Promotion of Administrative Justice Act, 2000 (Act 3 of 2000).

TRANSITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS AND SHORT TITLE

15. Transitional Arrangements

Until such time as the Minister has promulgated the *Policy for the Reissuing of National Certificates*, the existing *Directives on the Re-issuing of National Certificates* will apply to candidates who were registered at public or independent schools, or Technical and Vocational Education and Training Colleges, or Community Colleges and Private Colleges, which offer qualifications registered on the GFETQSF. This policy will be applied retrospectively.

16. Short Title

This policy may be cited as the *Policy for the Re-issue of National Certificates*, and will commence on the day of its promulgation in the *Government Gazette*.

SCHEDULE

1. Definitions

For the purpose of calculating fees:

"activity" means the activities undertaken by operators on a railway network;

"annual passengers" means the total number of passengers transported aboard railway operator's passenger or commuter rolling stock between two points (i.e. a station of boarding and of disembarkation) with the exception of a train operator's personnel, over the period of an operator's most recently completed financial year;

"annual tons" means the total sum of the mass of dangerous or general goods loaded onto a locomotive by a train operator in the preceding financial year, and transported along the portion of a rail network for which the train operator has a permit to traverse;

"cape gauge" means a type of railway track where the distance between the two rails of the track is 1,067 millimetres in length;

"general freight or passenger operators" means network, train or station operators (or a combination thereof) whose operations include the transportation of passengers and freight that excludes dangerous or mining goods;

"mine operations" means the operations undertaken above surface by train, network, and station operators to support mining activities;

"non-rail related revenue" means revenue generated by Train Operators, Network Operators or Station Operators whose railway operation is incidental to its main business;

"passengers" means people transported by a train between two points (i.e. a station of boarding and of disembarkation) with the exception of a train operator's personnel;

"rail-related revenue" means the gross inflow of cash arising from all rail operating activities of an operator;

"relevant risk-based fee rate" means the rand value equivalent of the risks attributable to rail activities. The units of measurement include R/Kilometres (for network operations), R/number of stations (for station operator), R/passenger kilometres (for passenger operations), and R/ton kilometre (for freight operations);

"standard gauge" railway track where the distance between the two rails of the railway track is 1,435 millimetres in length; and

"tourist passengers" means passengers transported aboard railway operator's rolling stock between two points (i.e. a station of boarding and of disembarkation) for recreational purposes, with the exception of a train operator's personnel and commuter passengers.

2. Application Fees

A non-refundable application fee must accompany an application for a safety permit. The fees specified in the categories **Operator category and amount** column of the Schedule shall be payable in respect of the corresponding application fees for general safety permit that is applied for as specified in the first column of the Schedule indicated as follows:

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO INTRODUCE A PRIVATE MEMBER'S BILL AND INVITATION FOR COMMENT ON THE DRAFT BILL, NAMELY THE INTERIM REGISTRATION OF MUSLIM MARRIAGES BILL, 2021

Mr. Mogamad Ganief Ebrahim Hendricks, MP, acting in accordance with section 73(2) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996 ("Constitution"), intends to introduce the Interim Registration of Muslim Marriages Bill, 2021 ("the draft Bill), in the National Assembly of Parliament. An explanatory summary of the member's Bill is hereby published in accordance with Rule 276(1)(c) of the Rules of the National Assembly of Parliament (the 9th Edition).

In the Republic of South Africa, Muslim marriages that have only been solemnised in terms of the tenets of Islamic Rulings have never been recognised as valid marriages in law capable of being registered with the Department of Home Affairs. Even in the current constitutional dispensation, the state has failed to enact any legislation recognising and regulating any aspect in relation to Muslim marriages. The failure to recognise and regulate valid Muslim marriages has created a great deal of legal uncertainty resulting in an inability even on the part of legal practitioners to advise their Muslim clients with any reasonable degree of certainty what their rights and obligations are or what remedies are available to them in the circumstances. This causes many Muslim women and men to not pursue any legal action enforcing their rights. The failure to recognise Muslim marriages is an indignity by the state to the entire Muslim faith and the failure to regulate and provide for the registration of Muslim marriages undermines and insults the very foundations on which Islam is built. The failure to recognise the existence of a Muslim marriage is tantamount to not recognising the existence of Muslim people, their religion, customs, traditions and culture. The effect of this continuous gross human rights violations by the state is significant. It is essentially impossible for a person to attend to his or her affairs if one lives in a society where you are not even able to establish the proprietary consequences of a person's marriage upon the conclusion or at the dissolution thereof. There are no mechanisms to safeguard the welfare of minor or dependent children of Muslim marriages at the time of the now informal dissolution of these marriages.

During December 2020, the Supreme Court of Appeal ("the SCA"), in *President of the RSA and Another v Women's Legal Centre Trust and Others; Minister of Justice and Constitutional Development v Faro and Others; and Minister of Justice and Constitutional Development v Esau and Others* 2021 (2) SA 381 (SCA), declared specified sections of the Marriage Act, 1961 (Act No. 25 of

1961) and the Divorce Act, 1979 (Act No. 70 of 1979) inconsistent with the Constitution in so far as these statutes fail to recognise Muslim marriages as valid and lawful marriages capable of being registered with the Department of Home Affairs. On 18 December 2020, the SCA ordered the President and his Cabinet, together with Parliament to remedy this untenable state of affairs by either amending existing legislation, or adopting new legislation, within 24 months from the granting of the court order, in order to recognise Muslim marriages as valid marriages for all purposes in South African law and to regulate the consequences arising from such recognition in our law. This order of invalidity or unconstitutionality of certain parts of existing marital and divorce legislation in so far as it does not make provision for the recognition and registration of Muslim marriages was again argued before the Constitutional Court during August 2021.

In anticipation of there being different schools of thought regarding various aspects in Islamic family law, this draft Bill is designed to identify the minimum elements of a Muslim marriage and to, at the very least, provide an interim and purely temporary resolution to the great indignity caused by the inability to register a Muslim marriage with the Department of Home Affairs, pending the finalisation of a more comprehensive and detailed Act of Parliament to be promulgated (or substantive amendments to existing legislation). This draft Bill is therefore an interim and minimalist Bill designed to provide for the registration of valid Muslim marriages and to regulate some ancillary aspects associated with the registration of these marriages. The draft Bill will lapse upon a far more comprehensive Act coming into operation and that will be accompanied with relevant regulations to be promulgated by both the Minister of Justice and Correctional Services and Minister of Home Affairs. The draft Bill for instance does not deal with divorces separate to that of any other divorce action and does not address the question of polygamous marriages. The reason for this is because history has now taught us that these topics are the contentious issues that will delay the enactment of this crucial Bill – this is something that should be avoided, as any delay in the enactment of this "interim and minimalist Bill' would defeat its entire objective.

The draft Bill therefore, *inter alia*, seeks to provide for the following:

- (a) the registration of Muslim marriages, in the interim, as valid marriages for all purposes in the Republic of South Africa;
- (b) regulating some of the consequences arising from the recognition of Muslim marriages;
- (c) acknowledging the application of other existing domestic legislation to Muslim marriages in specified circumstances;
- (d) interim processes and procedures to be determined by the relevant Minister by promulgating relevant regulations from time to time to be complied with in order to register the conclusion and dissolution of Muslim marriages with the Department of Home Affairs;
- (e) the requirements of a valid Muslim marriage;

- (f) regulating some of the proprietary consequences of Muslim marriages by providing that all Muslim marriages concluded after the commencement of this draft Bill, shall be out of community of property without the operation of the accrual system as the default position, unless the parties agree otherwise;
- (g) the status and legal capacity of spouses in a Muslim marriage by providing that spouses in a Muslim marriage are equal, each with full legal capacity and unhindered status; and
- (h) regulating certain aspects of the dissolution of Muslim marriages in accordance with Islamic rulings.

The intentional failure to address the question of polygamous marriages in this draft Bill does not preclude provision being made for this in the contemplated final and permanent Act of Parliament recognising Muslim marriages. The draft Bill will also not have the effect of prohibiting the conclusion of such customary marriages due to the mere fact that no provision is made for such marriages in this interim draft Bill.

BOARD NOTICE 129 OF 2021

THE SOUTH AFRICAN COUNCIL FOR THE ARCHITECTURAL PROFESSION

Requirements for recognition and maintenance of recognition of a Voluntary Association in terms of section 25, read with section 14(d), of the Architectural Profession Act 44 of 2000) (The act)

Notice is hereby given that the South African Council for the Architectural Profession has in terms of section 14(d) read with section 25 of the Act published rules for the recognition and the maintenance of recognition of Voluntary Associations in the architectural profession.

1. Definitions

In these Rules, unless the context indicates otherwise, any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Act shall bear the same meaning.

"The Act" means the Architectural Profession Act 44 of 2000.

"Association" means an association of natural persons which has:

- (i) an identity separate from its individual members;
- (ii) as the majority of its members who are registered in one of the categories provided for in section 18 (1) of the Act;
- (iii) majority shall mean 51% of members who are registered in any of the categories provided for in section 18(1) of the Act;
- (iv) as the majority of its members who are in good standing and who are certified annually by the association; and
- (v) as its objects the promotion of transformation and diversity in the architectural profession.
- (vi) as its objects the promotion of professional interests of its members.

"Registered person" means a person who is registered in one of the categories set out in section 18 (1) of the Act;

"Rules" shall mean the requirements with which a Voluntary Association must comply with to qualify for recognition by the Council.

"Voluntary Association" shall mean a Voluntary Association recognized by the Council in terms of Section 25, read with section 14(d) of the Act.

2. Requirements for recognition as a Voluntary Association

A Voluntary Association shall have a Constitution that provides for:

- a) a management structure, nomination procedure, and requirements with which members nominated for office shall comply;
- b) the association's powers in general and for the enrolment of members, termination of membership and associated matters;
- c) the requirements for membership in different categories and rules for cancellation and reinstatement thereof; and
- d) a Code of Conduct for its members which aligns with the Council's Code of Conduct as per Board Notice 7 of 2021, or such other Notice as may be applicable from time to time, and which provides for disciplinary procedures which observe the rules of natural justice and which provide for appropriate sanctions for contraventions of the Code of Conduct;
- e) the submission to the Council of all validated Continuing Professional Development (CPD) activities to enable SACAP to upload the information on the SACAP website.
- f) a Voluntary Association that complies with the requirements for recognition and maintenance of recognition which shall be issued with it, a certificate of recognition as provided for in section 25 (3) of the Act.

3. Failure to satisfy all requirements for recognition

- 3.1 If, after consideration of an application for recognition, the Council is not satisfied that a Voluntary Association meets the relevant requirements for recognition as set out in these rules, the Council must formally notify such Voluntary Association and furnish reasons why it does not meet the relevant requirements for recognition as set out in these rules.
- 3.2 The Council shall grant the association a period of 30 days to rectify the application for recognition and re-submit the application for assessment and decision.
- 3.3 If an association does not satisfy the relevant requirements for recognition as set out in these rules despite the Council communication on rule 3.2 above, the Council shall notify the Voluntary Association about its refusal to recognize it and provide reasons thereof.
- 3.4 The Council shall notify the association about its right to appeal against the decision to the Council for the Built Environment in terms of the Act.

4. Annual reporting to maintain recognition

The annual reporting to the Council shall comprise of the following information:

a) Continuing compliance with the conditions of recognition for Voluntary Associations in terms of these Rules:

- Records of attendance of persons who have attended any validated CPD activities or any other activities offered under the auspices of the association and which are intended to count towards compliance with CPD requirements of persons registered in terms of section 19 of the Act;
- c) An evaluation report detailing the relevance, quality and accessibility of the CPD activities offered under the association's auspices.
- d) Information about the annual paid-up members of the association shall include statistics of gender, demographics and age.
- e) Activities that promote diversity, equality and inclusion in the architectural profession.
- f) An annual report detailing all activities of the Voluntary Association to Council by no later than 31 March each year in order to maintain the validity of its certificate of recognition.

5. Authority to audit information

The Council shall have the authority to audit the information submitted to it by Voluntary Associations.

6. Renewal and lapsing of recognition

- 6.1 A certificate of recognition of a Voluntary Association shall be valid for a period of five years from the date of issue, as provided for in section 25 (4) of the Act.
- 6.2 The recognition of a Voluntary Association shall remain valid for a period of 5 years after recognition provided that a Voluntary Association shall at all times remain in compliance with the requirements for recognition and maintenance of recognition.
- 6.3 A Voluntary Association must, at least three months prior to the expiry of its recognition, apply in the prescribed manner to the Council for the renewal as provided for in section 25 (7) of the Act.

Repeal of previous rules

The Rules published under Board Notice 86 of 2016 are hereby repealed.

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
