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HIGH ALERT: SCAM WARNING!!!

TO ALL SUPPLIERS AND SERVICE PROVIDERS OF THE GOVERNMENT PRINTING WORKS

It has come to the attention of the GOVERNMENT PRINTING WORKS that there are certain unscrupulous companies and individuals who are defrauding unsuspecting businesses disguised as representatives of the Government Printing Works (GPW).

The scam involves the fraudsters using the letterhead of *GPW* to send out fake tender bids to companies and requests to supply equipment and goods.

Although the contact person's name on the letter may be of an existing official, the contact details on the letter are not the same as the *Government Printing Works*'. When searching on the Internet for the address of the company that has sent the fake tender document, the address does not exist.

The banking details are in a private name and not company name. Government will never ask you to deposit any funds for any business transaction. *GPW* has alerted the relevant law enforcement authorities to investigate this scam to protect legitimate businesses as well as the name of the organisation.

Example of e-mails these fraudsters are using:

PROCUREMENT@GPW-GOV.ORG

Should you suspect that you are a victim of a scam, you must urgently contact the police and inform the *GPW*.

GPW has an official email with the domain as @gpw.gov.za

Government e-mails DO NOT have org in their e-mail addresses. All of these fraudsters also use the same or very similar telephone numbers. Although such number with an area code 012 looks like a landline, it is not fixed to any property.

GPW will never send you an e-mail asking you to supply equipment and goods without a purchase/order number. GPW does not procure goods for another level of Government. The organisation will not be liable for actions that result in companies or individuals being resultant victims of such a scam.

Government Printing Works gives businesses the opportunity to supply goods and services through RFQ / Tendering process. In order to be eligible to bid to provide goods and services, suppliers must be registered on the National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD). To be registered, they must meet all current legislative requirements (e.g. have a valid tax clearance certificate and be in good standing with the South African Revenue Services - SARS).

The tender process is managed through the Supply Chain Management (SCM) system of the department. SCM is highly regulated to minimise the risk of fraud, and to meet objectives which include value for money, open and effective competition, equitability, accountability, fair dealing, transparency and an ethical approach. Relevant legislation, regulations, policies, guidelines and instructions can be found on the tender's website.

Fake Tenders

National Treasury's CSD has launched the Government Order Scam campaign to combat fraudulent requests for quotes (RFQs). Such fraudulent requests have resulted in innocent companies losing money. We work hard at preventing and fighting fraud, but criminal activity is always a risk.

How tender scams work

There are many types of tender scams. Here are some of the more frequent scenarios:

Fraudsters use what appears to be government department stationery with fictitious logos and contact details to send a fake RFQ to a company to invite it to urgently supply goods. Shortly after the company has submitted its quote, it receives notification that it has won the tender. The company delivers the goods to someone who poses as an official or at a fake site. The Department has no idea of this transaction made in its name. The company is then never paid and suffers a loss.

OB

Fraudsters use what appears to be government department stationery with fictitious logos and contact details to send a fake RFQ to Company A to invite it to urgently supply goods. Typically, the tender specification is so unique that only Company B (a fictitious company created by the fraudster) can supply the goods in question.

Shortly after Company A has submitted its quote it receives notification that it has won the tender. Company A orders the goods and pays a deposit to the fictitious Company B. Once Company B receives the money, it disappears. Company A's money is stolen in the process.

Protect yourself from being scammed

- If you are registered on the supplier databases and you receive a request to tender or quote that seems to be from a government department, contact the department to confirm that the request is legitimate. Do not use the contact details on the tender document as these might be fraudulent.
- Compare tender details with those that appear in the Tender Bulletin, available online at www.gpwonline.co.za
- Make sure you familiarise yourself with how government procures goods and services. Visit the tender website for more information on how to tender.
- If you are uncomfortable about the request received, consider visiting the government department and/or the place of delivery and/or the service provider from whom you will be sourcing the goods.
- In the unlikely event that you are asked for a deposit to make a bid, contact the SCM unit of the department in question to ask whether this is in fact correct.

EXTRAORDINARY GAZETTES

3. Extraordinary Gazettes can have only one publication date. If multiple publications of an Extraordinary Gazette are required, a separate Z95/Z95Prov Adobe Forms for each publication date must be submitted.

Notice Submission Process

- 4. Download the latest *Adobe* form, for the relevant notice to be placed, from the **Government Printing Works** website www.gpwonline.co.za.
- 5. The Adobe form needs to be completed electronically using Adobe Acrobat / Acrobat Reader. Only electronically completed Adobe forms will be accepted. No printed, handwritten and/or scanned Adobe forms will be accepted.
- 6. The completed electronic *Adobe* form has to be submitted via email to submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za. The form needs to be submitted in its original electronic *Adobe* format to enable the system to extract the completed information from the form for placement in the publication.
- Every notice submitted must be accompanied by an official GPW quotation. This must be obtained from the eGazette Contact Centre.
- 8. Each notice submission should be sent as a single email. The email **must** contain **all documentation** relating to a particular notice submission.
 - 8.1. Each of the following documents must be attached to the email as a separate attachment:
 - 8.1.1. An electronically completed Adobe form, specific to the type of notice that is to be placed.
 - 8.1.1.1. For National *Government Gazette* or *Provincial Gazette* notices, the notices must be accompanied by an electronic Z95 or Z95Prov *Adobe* form
 - 8.1.1.2. The notice content (body copy) **MUST** be a separate attachment.
 - 8.1.2. A copy of the official **Government Printing Works** quotation you received for your notice. (Please see Quotation section below for further details)
 - 8.1.3. A valid and legible Proof of Payment / Purchase Order: **Government Printing Works** account customer must include a copy of their Purchase Order. **Non-Government Printing Works** account customer needs to submit the proof of payment for the notice
 - 8.1.4. Where separate notice content is applicable (Z95, Z95 Prov and TForm 3, it should **also** be attached as a separate attachment. (*Please see the Copy Section below, for the specifications*).
 - 8.1.5. Any additional notice information if applicable.

- 9. The electronic *Adobe* form will be taken as the primary source for the notice information to be published. Instructions that are on the email body or covering letter that contradicts the notice form content will not be considered. The information submitted on the electronic *Adobe* form will be published as-is.
- To avoid duplicated publication of the same notice and double billing, Please submit your notice ONLY ONCE.
- 11. Notices brought to **GPW** by "walk-in" customers on electronic media can only be submitted in *Adobe* electronic form format. All "walk-in" customers with notices that are not on electronic *Adobe* forms will be routed to the Contact Centre where they will be assisted to complete the forms in the required format.
- 12. Should a customer submit a bulk submission of hard copy notices delivered by a messenger on behalf of any organisation e.g. newspaper publisher, the messenger will be referred back to the sender as the submission does not adhere to the submission rules.

QUOTATIONS

- 13. Quotations are valid until the next tariff change.
 - 13.1. Take note: GPW's annual tariff increase takes place on 1 April therefore any quotations issued, accepted and submitted for publication up to 31 March will keep the old tariff. For notices to be published from 1 April, a quotation must be obtained from GPW with the new tariffs. Where a tariff increase is implemented during the year, GPW endeavours to provide customers with 30 days' notice of such changes.
- 14. Each quotation has a unique number.
- 15. Form Content notices must be emailed to the eGazette Contact Centre for a quotation.
 - 15.1. The *Adobe* form supplied is uploaded by the Contact Centre Agent and the system automatically calculates the cost of your notice based on the layout/format of the content supplied.
 - 15.2. It is critical that these *Adobe* Forms are completed correctly and adhere to the guidelines as stipulated by **GPW**.

16. APPLICABLE ONLY TO GPW ACCOUNT HOLDERS:

- 16.1. GPW Account Customers must provide a valid GPW account number to obtain a quotation.
- 16.2. Accounts for GPW account customers must be active with sufficient credit to transact with GPW to submit notices.
 - 16.2.1. If you are unsure about or need to resolve the status of your account, please contact the GPW Finance Department prior to submitting your notices. (If the account status is not resolved prior to submission of your notice, the notice will be failed during the process).

17. APPLICABLE ONLY TO CASH CUSTOMERS:

- 17.1. Cash customers doing **bulk payments** must use a **single email address** in order to use the **same proof of payment** for submitting multiple notices.
- 18. The responsibility lies with you, the customer, to ensure that the payment made for your notice(s) to be published is sufficient to cover the cost of the notice(s).
- 19. Each quotation will be associated with one proof of payment / purchase order / cash receipt.
 - 19.1. This means that the quotation number can only be used once to make a payment.

COPY (SEPARATE NOTICE CONTENT DOCUMENT)

- 20. Where the copy is part of a separate attachment document for Z95, Z95Prov and TForm03
 - 20.1. Copy of notices must be supplied in a separate document and may not constitute part of any covering letter, purchase order, proof of payment or other attached documents.

The content document should contain only one notice. (You may include the different translations of the same notice in the same document).

20.2. The notice should be set on an A4 page, with margins and fonts set as follows:

Page size = A4 Portrait with page margins: Top = 40mm, LH/RH = 16mm, Bottom = 40mm; Use font size: Arial or Helvetica 10pt with 11pt line spacing;

Page size = A4 Landscape with page margins: Top = 16mm, LH/RH = 40mm, Bottom = 16mm; Use font size: Arial or Helvetica 10pt with 11pt line spacing;

CANCELLATIONS

- 21. Cancellation of notice submissions are accepted by GPW according to the deadlines stated in the table above in point 2. Non-compliance to these deadlines will result in your request being failed. Please pay special attention to the different deadlines for each gazette. Please note that any notices cancelled after the cancellation deadline will be published and charged at full cost.
- 22. Requests for cancellation must be sent by the original sender of the notice and must accompanied by the relevant notice reference number (N-) in the email body.

AMENDMENTS TO NOTICES

23. With effect from 01 October 2015, **GPW** will not longer accept amendments to notices. The cancellation process will need to be followed according to the deadline and a new notice submitted thereafter for the next available publication date.

REJECTIONS

- 24. All notices not meeting the submission rules will be rejected to the customer to be corrected and resubmitted. Assistance will be available through the Contact Centre should help be required when completing the forms. (012-748 6200 or email info.egazette@gpw.gov.za). Reasons for rejections include the following:
 - 24.1. Incorrectly completed forms and notices submitted in the wrong format, will be rejected.
 - 24.2. Any notice submissions not on the correct Adobe electronic form, will be rejected.
 - 24.3. Any notice submissions not accompanied by the proof of payment / purchase order will be rejected and the notice will not be processed.
 - 24.4. Any submissions or re-submissions that miss the submission cut-off times will be rejected to the customer. The Notice needs to be re-submitted with a new publication date.

APPROVAL OF NOTICES

- 25. Any notices other than legal notices are subject to the approval of the Government Printer, who may refuse acceptance or further publication of any notice.
- 26. No amendments will be accepted in respect to separate notice content that was sent with a Z95 or Z95Prov notice submissions. The copy of notice in layout format (previously known as proof-out) is only provided where requested, for Advertiser to see the notice in final Gazette layout. Should they find that the information submitted was incorrect, they should request for a notice cancellation and resubmit the corrected notice, subject to standard submission deadlines. The cancellation is also subject to the stages in the publishing process, i.e. If cancellation is received when production (printing process) has commenced, then the notice cannot be cancelled.



Where a gloss is needed for the GFETQSF this is provided in the following glossary, and where a term is not defined in either the Act or the NQF Pedia, its usage in this policy document bears the meaning given below.

Access	Means the opportunity to pursue education and training, including relevant qualifications, part-qualifications, professional designations, opportunities in the workplace and career progression.

3. Preamble

- 3.1 Umalusi's Policy and Criteria for Credit Accumulation and Transfer (CAT) provides for the implementation of CAT in the General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Sub-framework (GFETQSF) within the context of the NQF Act No. 67 of 2008.
- 3.2 This Policy should be read together with the Level Descriptors for the South African NQF, SAQA's National Policy and Criteria for the Implementation of RPL (as amended) and Umalusi Policy for the Implementation of RPL in the GFETQSF. Where supplementary work or assessment is needed to address gaps found in the CAT processes, the relevant recognised provider may conduct an RPL process to assess the informal and non-formal knowledge and skills of the applicant that may address the gap, and award credits in terms of the RPL policy and rules.
- 3.3 CAT provides for the recognition of credits previously obtained through meeting the relevant credit requirements towards a qualification or part-qualification registered on the NQF. These credits accumulated towards a qualification or part-qualification may be recognised as meeting part of the requirements towards another qualification or part-qualification. Decisions regarding the transfer of credit are made by fully recognised providers of education and training, in line with this CAT Policy and Criteria and the aligned Umalusi policy for CAT, once the necessary evaluations have been completed {section 5 of the SAQA Policy and CAT within the NQF (As amended, 2021)}.
- 3.4 In implementing this CAT Policy and Criteria, SAQA and Umalusi seek to achieve the objectives of the NQF by:
 - a. developing, fostering and maintaining an integrated and transparent national framework for the recognition of learning achievements;
 - b. ensuring that South African qualifications meet appropriate criteria, determined by the Minister as contemplated in section 8 of the NQF Act No. 67 of 2008, and are internationally comparable; and
 - c. ensuring that South African qualifications are of an acceptable quality.

4. Background

- 4.1 The NQF is a single integrated system that comprises three qualifications subframeworks, coordinated by SAQA, as follows:
 - a. the HEQSF overseen by the CHE,
 - b. the GFETQSF overseen by Umalusi, and
 - c. the OQSF overseen by QCTO.

The NQF structure recognises the distinctions and relations between various knowledge and skills domains in the basic, higher, vocational and occupational NQF sub-framework contexts.

- 4.2 The GFETQSF is constituted as a register of qualification types (general and vocational), some with designated variants, and each consisting of combinations of various subjects, each of which is supported by a prescribed curriculum and is subject to external national assessment. Umalusi sets and maintains standards through the quality assurance of the intended, enacted and assessed curricula. These standards relate to domains of knowledge and associated skills, and to the curriculum and assessment practices through which they are achieved.
- 4.3 Umalusi's Policy for the General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Sub-framework (2014) outlines the nature and extent of the qualifications on the GFETQSF and supports the building of a common understanding of the relationships between qualifications. Through related policy, parameters for the design of national qualifications in the GFETQSF context are established. These parameters facilitate the general comparability of qualifications across the national system thus allowing for greater ease of access.
- 4.4 The GFETQSF comprises qualifications offered in formal education contexts.
- 4.5 All qualifications on the GFETQSF require the mastery of a body of (disciplinary) knowledge and related skills.
- 4.6 Quality assurance of the delivery of GFETQSF qualifications forms an intrinsic part of the development of the system of basic education as a whole, and of the GFETQSF specifically. Consequently, Umalusi monitors the implementation and quality assures those qualifications that it has registered on the GFETQSF. Umalusi certifies qualifications it has quality assured in accordance with the applicable policies.

5. Legislative context

- 5.1 In terms of the NQF Act (Act 67 of 2008), Umalusi is the Quality Council (QC) for General and Further Education and Training as provided for in the GENFETQA Act (Act 58 of 2001) (as amended in 2008). It was established under the SAQA Act (Act 58 of 1995). It continues under the NQF Act (Act 67 of 2008), which came into effect on 1 June 2009.
- 5.2 In terms of the GENFETQA Act, Umalusi Council is responsible for the GFETQSF of the NQF. Section 27 of the NQF Act outlines the functions of the QC. To achieve the objectives of the NQF regarding the qualifications within the GFETQSF, section 27(h)(ii) states that Umalusi must develop and implement policy and criteria for assessment, recognition of prior learning and credit accumulation and transfer for the qualifications within the GFETQSF.

6. Scope and application of this policy

- 6.1 This Policy and Criteria gives effect in part to the requirements of section 27(h)(ii) of the NQF Act. The policy refers to Credit Accumulation and Transfer (CAT) as well as to exemptions.
- 6.2 This policy must be read in conjunction with the following policies:
 - a) Umalusi's Policy for the GFETQSF
 - b) Umalusi's Policy for the management of qualifications in the GFETQSF
 - c) Umalusi's Policy and Criteria for the development, registration and publication of qualifications for the GFETQSF
 - d) SAQA's Policy and Criteria for CAT within the NQF
 - e) SAQA's Policy and Criteria for the Implementation of RPL
 - f) SAQA's Policy and Criteria for Designing and Implementing Assessment for NQF Qualifications and Part-Qualifications and Professional Designations in South Africa and
 - g) DHET Articulation Policy.
- 6.3 This policy applies to:
 - a) All qualifications and part-qualifications registered on the GFETQSF
 - b) The specific policy for each qualification or part-qualification referred to in

 (a) above, which must be interpreted in relation to this policy
 All public and all accredited private institutions of education and training that offer qualifications and part-qualifications registered on the GFETQSF.
- 6.4 This Policy and Criteria addresses responsibilities associated with credit accumulation and transfer in existing qualifications and with the development of new qualifications on the GFETQSF.

7. Purpose

- 7.1 The Policy and Criteria for CAT is intended to promote learners' articulation/learning pathways and lifelong learning, their access to new learning and the avoidance, where possible, of the repetition of learning they have already acquired.
- 7.2 The purpose of the policy for CAT outlined in this document is to provide guidelines for the General and Further Education and Training sector regarding the development of institutional RPL, CAT and assessment policies in the context of the national policies developed by SAQA and within the GFETQSF.
- 7.3 The Policy and Criteria for CAT strengthens the implementation of the NQF objectives, especially to:
 - a. facilitate access to, and mobility and progression within education and training and career paths (section 5 (1)(b) of the NQF Act); and
 - accelerate the redress of past unfair discrimination in education, training, and employment opportunities (section 5 (1) (d) of the NQF Act).

7.4 This CAT policy and Criteria:

- a. facilitates the development of credible, efficient and transparent processes for CAT within and between the sub-frameworks of the NQF;
 and
- b. intends to benefit individuals seeking to progress between qualifications and part-qualifications and the world of work.

8. Articulation within the General and Further Education and Training Qualifications Sub-framework

- 8.1 Articulation is the process of forming systemic, specific and individual possibilities of connection between qualifications and/or part-qualifications to allow for the horizontal, vertical and diagonal movement of learners through the formal education and training system and its linkages with the world of work. These connections may allow access to another qualification, the exemption of some prerequisites or minimum admission requirements for a qualification, or the acceptance of resulted learning from one qualification for the purposes of another qualification, i.e. the granting of credit. Articulation needs to simultaneously at place systemic, (institutional/programme), and individual learner levels – and failing to address one of these levels could jeopardise the whole articulation opportunity.
- 8.2 In the context of the GFETQSF, articulation is horizontal/lateral in that it is within and between NQF sub-frameworks on the same NQF level. The intention is to promote learners' learning pathways and lifelong learning, their access to new learning and the avoidance, where possible, of the repetition of learning they have already acquired.
- 8.3 CAT and RPL are important mechanisms within the national education and training system that facilitate articulation. CAT is the practice of accumulating credits from one or more cognate learning programmes from a provider and transferring these credits for recognition for a qualification/part-qualification offered by the same or a different provider. Credits previously obtained may be recognised as meeting the requirements for a different qualification and, subject to identified limits, credits achieved towards one qualification may be recognised as meeting part of the requirements for another qualification. Credits have a direct relationship with notional hours in terms of learning required for a qualification or part-qualification in that one (1) credit is equated to ten (10) notional hours of learning. In addition, credit accumulation will mean the sum of the relevant credits required to complete a qualification or part-qualification.

- 8.4 The relationship between qualifications gained by means of CAT is determined by research that establishes the degree of overlap and/or equivalence of related curricula in the respective qualifications that would allow for credit transfer. Qualifications that allow for CAT may be on the same or a different sub-framework.
- 8.5 Credit accumulation relates to the process of achieving subject statements/certificates progressively (i.e. not in a single academic year) towards a qualification. Provided that the subjects achieved over the extended period conform to the rules of combination for the qualification, the full qualification may be awarded upon request.
- 8.6 In the case of some qualifications, the maximum number of years in which to complete the qualification may be stipulated.
- 8.7 Not all subjects will be automatically considered for recognition or credit accumulation and transfer. Acceptance is determined by the nature and structure of the desired qualification and is established by an evaluation of equivalence at curriculum level.

9. Articulation across NQF Sub-frameworks

- 9.1 In the case of large-scale, national qualifications such as those on the GFETQSF, the regulation of articulation options between qualifications is possible, desirable and necessary. The articulation between a national qualification and others such as an NSC, a bachelor's degree, diploma or higher certificate on the HEQSF is possible because criteria for qualification purpose, curriculum, uniform quality assurance, and assessment are explicitly taken into account in determining the degree of comparability. In the same way, the articulation between a national qualification and others such as a GEC or an elementary, intermediate or national occupational certificate in the OQSF is also possible.
- 9.2 The processes used to make connections and enable CAT between qualifications in different NQF sub-frameworks include but are not limited to:
 - a. the identification of access possibilities in a qualification policy;
 - b. the regulation of formal relationships between qualifications;
 - c. research that highlights the extent and nature of the overlap that can be used for articulation purposes; and
 - d. the active re-working of curricula and assessment across qualifications to create a functional and recognised bridge between one qualification and another.

10. Principles Governing the Implementation of the Policy for Credit Accumulation and Transfer

- **10.1 Mutual trust:** In the case of a qualification on the sub-framework, the recognition of credits offered by another system is dependent on the development of a relationship of mutual respect and trust, based on the nature and extent of the quality assurance regimes.
- 10.2 Research-based: For the purpose of CAT in the GFETQSF, the relationship between qualifications in the GFETQSF context and qualifications in other NQF sub-framework contexts is determined by research that establishes the degree of overlap or equivalence between related curricula in the respective qualifications that would allow for recognition of learning and/or credit transfer.
- **10.3 Specificity:** The recognition of credits for the purpose of *transfer from one* qualification to another is determined by the nature of the qualifications, the relationship between them, the nature, complexity, and extent of the curricula associated with the subjects for which exemption and/or inclusion is required, and the nature of the assessment used.
- **10.4 Explicitness:** Umalusi will publish regulations that govern credit transfer.
- **10.5 Bilaterality:** Ideally, the recognition of some portion of the qualifications involved (generally subjects) should be bilateral, but there may be conditions in which the recognition occurs in one direction only. Such decisions are best made by an analysis of the portions to be transferred.
- **10.6** *Transparency:* Rules, regulations, and any register of precedents that informs, influences, or governs decisions taken in respect to CAT must be:
 - a. valid, fair, reliable and transparent; and
 - b. publicly available and made known to learners prior to enrolment.
- **10.7 Articulation by design:** Possibilities for articulation pathways, including within and between NQF sub-frameworks, and between NQF sub-frameworks and the world of work, must be included in the design and purposes of new qualifications and part-qualifications.
- 10.8 Access to CAT: To recognise and transfer credit, the recognition of credit in a CAT process may only be considered for credits previously awarded towards a qualification or part-qualification registered on the NQF and offered by a recognised provider in South Africa.

- **10.9 Appeals regarding CAT decisions:** A recognised provider may appeal CAT decisions when credits linked to their NQF-registered qualifications/part-qualifications are not recognised by the providers to which learners seek to transfer.
- **10.10 Supplementarity:** Where the CAT comparison process finds overlaps of less than 80% between the content and outcomes for which credits have been awarded and the modules/subjects for which CAT is sought, the relevant recognised provider:
 - a. may choose not to recognise any accumulated credit and must provide advice and guidance on other learning pathway possibilities for the candidate; or
 - b. may conduct an RPL process to assess the informal and non-formal knowledge and skills of the applicant that may address the gap and award credits in terms of the RPL policy and rules; or
 - c. may require the learner to complete supplementary assessment before credits are recognised in terms of certification policy and regulations.
- **10.11** Parity of esteem is an entrenched principle: Parity of esteem among institutions requires the ability and commitment to communicate diplomatically, offering constructive suggestions, avoiding the dictating of terms, and providing justification where articulation cannot happen.

11. Criteria for CAT Implementation in the GFETQSF

- 11.1 The principles will be achieved through the criteria for CAT implementation as explained below:
 - a. Criteria for research-based quality comparison
 - b. Criteria for transparency
 - c. Criteria for currency of credit
 - d. Criteria for articulation by design
 - e. Criteria for supplementary work
 - f. Criteria for parity of esteem
 - g. Criteria for appeals regarding CAT decisions

11.2 Criteria for research-based quality comparison

- a. Quality comparison that is based on research must establish the relationship between qualifications and the degree of overlap or equivalence between related curricula in respect of qualifications that would allow for recognition of learning and/or credit transfer.
- b. The degree of similarity or overlap in the content being compared must ensure that learners have the necessary knowledge, skills and background to be successful in more advanced learning.

- c. Quality comparison must also consider the purpose of the learning concerned as well as its broader application.
- d. The comparison of curriculum content for which credit has been achieved must be based on credible methods of research that determine the extent to which Exit Level Outcomes and their curricular properties match, as guided by the NQF Level Descriptors.

11.3 Criteria for transparency in CAT

- a. Recognised providers must develop institutional rules for CAT that are aligned to *Umalusi's Policy and Criteria for CAT* and that also take into account precedents, and:
 - i. Are valid, fair, reliable and transparent; and
 - ii. Are available via the recognised provider's website, career advice office and other relevant and readily accessible public spaces as applicable, prior to student enrolment.
- b. Information about fees for CAT, where fees are charged, must be included in the general information supplied.

11.4 Criteria for articulation by design

- a. Credit transfer may be used towards:
 - The same qualification or part-qualification in a different institution;
 or
 - ii. A different cognate qualification or part-qualification in the same or different institution.
- b. Credit transfer can take place:
 - i. On the same NQF level or across NQF levels;
 - ii. In the same NQF sub-framework or across departments and different institutions; and
 - iii. Within a learning programme or across learning programmes, as applicable.

11.5 Criteria for supplementary work when requirements are not met

- a. In cases where learners do not meet the requirements for CAT, the relevant recognised provider should provide clear practical advice to guide learners to diverse learning pathway possibilities to enable their progression in efficient ways; or
- Supplementary work must be determined in a fair, consistent and transparent manner by recognised providers of education and training using credible methods;
- c. Supplementary work can be prescribed for the candidate for the recognition of the credits sought;
- d. An arrangement for supplementary work is established between entities; this arrangement must be governed by a formal agreement between the entity

- at which the credit will be accepted and the entity that provides the supplementary learning; and
- e. Guidance for, and access to, the supplementary work must be provided for the students involved.

11.6 Criteria for parity of esteem

Parity of esteem is an entrenched principle: Parity of esteem among institutions requires the ability and commitment to communicate diplomatically, offering constructive suggestions, avoiding the dictating of terms, and providing justification where articulation cannot happen. Credit transfer is provided for transitioning:

- a. within a school
- b. from school to school
- c. from school to TVET college
- d. from schools to CETC
- e. across NQF sub-frameworks
- f. from learning programme to learning programme.

11.7 Criteria for currency of credits

Credits are transferred through CAT processes. These credits are limited to the structure of the qualification and the rules of combination of that qualification.

11.8 Criteria for appeals regarding CAT decisions

- a. There must be an appeal process. Learners, institutions or departments may appeal against decisions taken by providers on the transfer of credits. The appeals should comply with processes agreed to by Umalusi.
- b. If the learner is seeking CAT at the provider of choice and CAT is not approved, the learner will have to approach the provider where the qualification was awarded to lodge an application for appeal.
- c. The provider to which the learner is seeking access must consider and address the appeal via Umalusi.
- d. Each provider will need to have a specific 'Provider CAT Appeals' or 'Student CAT Appeals' process and formal structures in place, with Umalusi providing guidelines.
- e. The appeals procedure must be decided by Umalusi and be made known to the education and training entities and learners.
- f. The notice of an appeal must state the grounds on which the applicant is seeking the appeal.
- g. In appeals against CAT decisions when credits linked to their NQF-registered qualifications and part-qualifications are not recognised by the entity to which a learner is seeking to transfer:

- both of the education and training entities involved must be recognised providers and where applicable, registered with the DHET, in order to lodge or accept an appeal;
- ii. the entity at which the learner obtained the original credits has the right to lodge an appeal;
- iii. the entity the learner is seeking to access must consider and address the appeal;
- iv. the CAT comparisons that led to the decision not to accept credits must be shared with and explained to the entity lodging the appeal;
 and
- v. failing acceptance of this process and/or failing to reach agreement, both entities must together consult SAQA and the relevant Quality Council for a final opinion.
- h. Where an appeal/complaint cannot be addressed to the satisfaction of all parties concerned, including the learner, the matter must be referred to Umalusi. Umalusi will decide what recourse is required to settle the matter, and Umalusi's decision is regarded as conclusive.

12 Responsibilities for the Implementation of Credit Accumulation and Transfer

12.1 As stated in the SAQA Policy and Criteria for Credit Accumulation and Transfer within the National Qualifications Framework (As amended), the development and implementation of CAT is the joint responsibility of the DHET, the DBE, SAQA, the QCs, education institutions and skills development providers, assessment bodies, recognised professional bodies and workplaces. The specific responsibilities of each contributor are outlined below.

a. Responsibilities of the DBE and the DHET

- i. Provide enabling legislative and planning environments for CAT;
- ii. Ensure that CAT principles and criteria are considered when designing and developing qualifications; and
- iii. Ensure the development and implementation at institutional level of policy and criteria for CAT.

b. Responsibilities of Umalusi

- Ensure effective alignment of CAT policies and principles within and between SAQA and other quality councils and institutional providers across the NQF;
- ii. Ensure that CAT principles and opportunities are considered when qualifications are designed and developed in the GFETQSF context;

- Develop, promote and publish general and specific CAT regulations and guidelines for all large-scale national qualifications offered within and between sub-frameworks;
- iv. Collaborate with the CHE and the QCTO to ensure that effective CAT takes place;
- Determine the maximum number of years allowed to complete a
 qualification (it is hoped that most qualifications would allow as many
 years as necessary for adults, bearing in mind that many mature
 students have difficult life circumstances);
- vi. Work with recognised entities in the GFETQSF context to ensure that CAT is implemented consistently, and to ensure that the capacity to do so is developed;
- vii. Monitor the CAT practices of recognised providers in the GFETQSF contexts.
- viii. Undertake systematic work on the development of credit matrixes for the GFETQSF;
- ix. Initiate and oversee projects within the GFETQSF to strengthen the conceptual understanding of CAT, to build capacity in the use of credit, and to promote good practices where necessary;
- x. As and where applicable, to develop links for articulation and progression to promote CAT within the GFETQSF and between the GFETQSF and the other two NQF sub-frameworks by facilitating and encouraging formal articulation agreements between institutions and coordinated quality assurance systems;
- xi. Promote the collaborative development of curricula and qualification pathways between various types of providers to promote and enable successful CAT;
- xii. Provide a mechanism in the policies for quality partners for assessment and accredited skills development providers in the GFETQSF context to deal with unfair CAT practices;
- xiii. Collaborate in the national monitoring and mediation processes to advise and alert skills development providers in the GFETQSF context regarding potential and actual transgressions of Umalusi's CAT policy; and
- xiv. Report annually to SAQA, in the format prescribed by SAQA, on CAT implementation in GFETQSF contexts.

c. Responsibilities of assessment bodies

- i. Adhere to the principles and responsibilities as outlined in this policy;
- ii. Develop and implement a policy on CAT in accordance with the principles and responsibilities outlined in this policy; and
- iii. Report annually to Umalusi on the implementation of CAT across the GFETQSF.

d. Responsibilities of education institutions and skills development providers

- i. Adhere to the principles and responsibilities as outlined in this policy;
- ii. Develop, promote and implement an institutional CAT policy that is aligned to this policy, SAQA Policy and Criteria for Credit Accumulation and Transfer within the National Qualifications Framework (As amended, 2021, and The Articulation Policy for the Post-School Education and Training System of South Africa;
- iii. Demonstrate through internal and external quality reviews that institutional CAT practices are in keeping with the policies noted in (ii) above;
- iv. Provide career advice services on career pathways and articulation routes:
- v. Establish appropriate appeal mechanisms that include areas that need to be appealed against such as exclusion and noncompliance to CAT;
- vi. Avoid unfair exclusionary practices related to CAT and establish mechanisms to monitor and deter these;
- vii. Address the bridging of theory and/or practice components that are identified as weaknesses during admission processes, including through RPL:
- viii. Assist learners who seek to transition to the certifying institution as well as those who need to transition from the institution by making the necessary information available in a manner that enables the learner and does not harm the entity; a balance must be found in providing this information;
- ix. Develop and maintain information management systems that are compatible with the National Learners' Records Database (NLRD) and other relevant government information management systems and submit the relevant data to SAQA using effective existing systems; and
- x. Report annually to Umalusi on the implementation of CAT across the GFETQSF.

13 Conclusion

13.1 A powerful and constructive Credit Accumulation and Transfer system is essential to deal with the realities facing thousands of South Africans who, having dropped out of school, failed matric or fared poorly in their final examinations, may need to start from scratch. As a QC responsible for the GFETQSF, Umalusi strives to foster credit accumulation and transfer as a means of enhancing access and promoting lifelong learning.

14. Implementation and Review

- 14.1 This Policy and Criteria for Credit Accumulation and Transfer (As Amended, 2022):
 - a. comes into effect on the date of its publication for implementation in the Government Gazette; and
 - b. will be reviewed procedurally after five years or earlier, or when necessary.

Location:

The full Production Right (PR) application area encompasses 224 farm portions and a total area of approximately 134 155 ha. The PR and the EA application area falls within the Lephalale Local Municipality and Waterberg District Municipality, Limpopo Province. The EA Application area (Phase 1 and 2 of the Production) is situated approximately 14km to the northwest of Lephalale town, 5km north of Marapong, and approximately 11km north west of Onverwacht.

Activity:

The applicant aims to extract the coal-bed methane (CBM) resource from the PR area in a phased manner. At present a total of 4 phases are expected to reach the conceptual full field production which spans a total surface area of approximately 134 155 hectares (ha). The first production phases which are the subject of this EA application, namely Phase 1 and 2, comprise of 9 wells and 305 wells respectively which will be connected via a gas gathering network to a centralised gas processing facility. In addition, the existing 10 wells, constructed during the exploration phase (referred to as the original 5-spotand second 5-Spot) will also be connected to the gas processing facility.
