Group unaudited profits before tax but after transfers to internal reserves of Zimbabwe Banking Corporation Limited for the six months ended 31st March, 1984, amounted to \$4 957 000, representing a decrease of 9 per cent. over the record level of \$5 448 000 achieved for the same period last year. After providing for tax of \$2 592 000 and after deducting minority interest, Group unaudited profits attributable to shareholders for the six months ended 31st March, 1984, amounted to \$2 310 000 compared to \$2 570 000 last year—a decrease of 10 per cent. Earnings per share, allowing for the increase in capital of \$500 000 in respect of the Zimbabank Group Staff Trust scheme, declined from 20,04 cents to 17,87 cents.

In his statement last November, the chairman reported on the quite exceptional performance of the group for the year ended 30th September, 1983. The sluggish economy and conditions of monetary restraints, also in the foreign exchange field, that have characterised the last six months, have resulted in an inevitable drop in profits. Whilst total group revenue from all sources has increased, costs generally have risen at a faster rate and the reduced profits are not surprising in these circumstances. Nevertheless the results for the first half-year are the second highest ever achieved and in the generally difficult economic scenario through which Zimbabwe is passing, the board consider the results are commendable.

On 27th March, 1984, the Minister of Finance, Economic Planning and Development, Dr. Bernard Chidzero, announced a series of financial measures designed to conserve foreign exchange and improve Zimbabwe's balance of payments. The effects of these measures will be far-reaching and it is too early to predict the final outcome. Traditionally the latter six months of the financial year produce higher profits and, although the banking industry without doubt is entering a new period of monetary uncertainty, your directors are confident that group results for the full financial year ending 30th September, 1984, will continue at a satisfactory level.

## Dividend announcement

A conservative view of the interim dividend is obviously prudent in the light of the decline in profits, and the directors have therefore decided to declare an interim dividend in respect of the six months ended 31st March, 1984, of 8,5 cents per share (1983—9,82 cents per share after adjustment to account for the 500 000 shares issued at par on 19.1.84 to Zimbabank Group Staff Trust) payable to shareholders registered in the books of the company at the close of business on Wednesday, 2nd May, 1984.

The transfer books and register of members will be closed between 3rd May, 1984, and 6th May, 1984, both dates inclusive. Dividend cheques will be posted to shareholders on or about 16th May, 1984. Shareholders' tax will be deducted at the rate of 20 per cent., where applicable.

- the Instructions Relating to the Drafting and Typing of Legislation (Attorney-General's Circular 1 of 1978); and
- the Manual of Style for the Drafting and Preparation of Copy, published by the Department of Printing and Stationery;

which two booklets are intended for complementary use.

In these conditions, other than where a particular kind of copy is specified, "copy" means copy for all matter contained in the *Gazette* itself and for subsidiary legislation issued as supplements to the *Gazette*.



1. (1) Other than by prior arrangement, only original typing is accepted.

(2) Carbon-copies are not normally acceptable, other than in cases where the original typing has to be legally retained elsewhere, as, for example, in the case of a proclamation.

(3) Computer print-outs are not accepted automatically, as discussion may be necessary with regard to the extra time and costs involved.

2. (1) All copy must be clear and legible, and there must be double or one and a half spacing between the lines.

(2) Any corrections or alterations made by the originator must be clearly effected in blue or black ink:

Provided that any copy containing extensive alterations will be rejected.

3. (1) Copy must appear on one side only of each sheet of paper.

(2) Except as is provided in subsection (2) of section 8, paper must not exceed 210 millimetres in width.

(3) If copy comprises two or more sheets of paper, all sheets must be numbered consecutively, in arabic figures, preferably in the top right-hand corner.

(4) Where any matter is added after the copy has been prepared, and such additional matter results in one or more sheets being inserted between those already numbered, all sheets must be renumbered from there onwards — not, for instance, 7, 7a, 7b, 8, et cetera.

4. Photographic copy or copy produced on a duplicating-machine may be accepted if it is abundantly clear.

5. (1) Should any copy—

(a) exceed 10 pages of double-spaced typing on size A4 paper; or

(b) contain tabular or other matter which involves complicated setting;
