GENERAL LEGAL COUNCIL

VACANCY FOR DIRECTOR OF LEGAL EDUCATION

The General Legal Council intends, if a suitable candidate presents himself, to appoint a full-time Director of Legal Education to assume his duties in July, 1970. Candidates must be legally qualified, either as barristers or solicitors and possess recent experience in practice in Ghana or elsewhere in Africa; preference will be given to candidates who also possess experience of teaching. The salary will in any event be not less than N¢7,200 and the Director will be entitled to the usual allowances. UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY, KUMASI—DEPARTMENT OF MECHANICAL ENGINEERING

VACANCIES FOR 2 POSTS OF TEMPORARY TECHNICIANS

Applications are invited for the above posts in the University.

Qualifications.—Either the Final or Advanced Certificate of City and Guilds or such relevant experience or skill as may be judged by the Appointments Committee to be equivalent to the above qualification.

Duties.—Setting out, cutting, turning, finishing, welding, etc. of parts for soil block presses and other metal equipment.

Successful candidates will be offered appointments for an initial period of twelve months, with a probable extension thereafter.

Salary.—N¢1,700 x N¢80-N¢2,280.

(In view of the temporary nature of the work a slightly higher salary will be offered in compensation for lack of Superannuation benefits.)

UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF CAPE COAST
VACANCIES FOR ASSISTANT HERBARIUM KEEPER, SENIOR TECHNICIAN OR
TECHNICIAN (HERBARIUM)

Applications are invited from suitably qualified persons for the following posts in the Department of Botany:—

- (a) (i) Assistant Herbarium Keeper;
Either
(b) (i) Senior Technician (Herbarium) *or*
(ii) Technician (Herbarium).

Qualifications:

For (a) Applicants must have a good knowledge of systematic botany and interest in herbarium and field work. A University degree in Botany is necessary.

For (b) The appointee should have had experience in herbarium work and of collecting botanical specimens in the field. He should be very familiar with the West African flora. He should be prepared to be responsible for looking after the Herbarium of the Department of Botany, and spend a good deal of time on trek, if necessary.

The possession of the appropriate City and Guilds Final Certificate or equivalent qualification is an advantage.

Successful applicant may be appointed to the level of Senior Technician or Technician depending on the nature and length of experience.

Salary scales:

For (a) N¢2,300 x N¢100–N¢2,400 per annum.

For (b) (i) N¢2,320 x N¢100–N¢3,020 per annum.

(ii) N¢1,700 x N¢80–N¢2,280 per annum.

Qualifications.—Applicants must possess the West African School Certificate with a pass in a Science subject or the G.C.E. with at least passes in 5 subjects including a Science subject, plus a pass in the Special Technique Examination; or such relevant experience as may be judged by the Appointments Board to be equivalent to the above qualifications.

Salary scale.—N¢700 x N¢30–N¢880 per annum.
