### WARRANT OF REMISSION OF SENTENCE IMPOSED ON KOFI OWUSU BY THE MILITARY TRIBUNAL, ACCRA

WHEREAS on the 29th day of May, 1967 at the Military Tribunal held at the Burma Hall, Accra, Kofi Owusu was convicted and sentenced to 25 years' imprisonment with hard labour for the offence of subversion under s. 1 (1) (j) of the Armed Forces Act (1962) as amended by N.L.C.D. 131 of 1967:

AND WHEREAS by an instrument dated the 15th day of June, 1967 Lt.-General J. A. Ankrah, the then General Officer Commanding Ghana Armed Forces and Commander-in-Chief and Chairman of the National Liberation Council in exercise of the provisions of section 86 of the Armed Forces Act (Act 105) granted the said Kofi Owusu a remission of fifteen years of the said sentence of 25 years' imprisonment imposed on him as aforesaid:

AND WHEREAS the Presidential Commission is desirous of remitting the whole of the unserved portion of the ten-year sentence remaining to be served:

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Presidential Commission by Article 50 (1) (d) of the said Constitution and in compliance with s. 1 (2) of the First Schedule of the said Constitution, the Chairman of the Presidential Commission for and on behalf of the Presidential Commission hereby grants unto the said Kofi Owusu a remission of the whole of the remaining portion of the said remaining sentence of ten years.

AND THESE PRESENTS do authorise and command you the Director of Prisons and the Superintendent of Medium Security Prison at Nsawam to give due effect to the aforesaid reduced sentence of imprisonment and to release forthwith from further custody the said Kofi Owusu, and for so doing these presents shall be your sufficient authority.
