#### COURSE OF TRAINING LEADING TO THE GRADE OF LABORATORY TECHNOLOGIST

Applications are invited for scholarship awards for training at the Algonquin College of Technology, Canada, leading to the acquisition of Diploma in Biochemical Technology.
