THE WEST AFRICAN EXAMINATIONS COUNCIL

COMBINED EXAMINATION FOR ENTRY TO FOUR-YEAR TEACHER TRAINING COLLEGES AND FOR PUPIL TEACHERS' SELECTION, 1971

The above examination will be held in the second week of February, 1971. Applicants for entry forms will be required to pay an amount of two new cedis and thirty new pesewas (N¢2.30) before they are issued with the forms. This amount, which includes both the entry fee and the price of the entry form, must be paid by Postal or Money Order, Crossed and made payable to "THE WEST AFRICAN EXAMINATIONS COUNCIL". In their own interest, applicants must write their name and address at the back of the postal or money order. The Council accepts no responsibility for the loss of postal orders which are not completed in accordance with these instructions. Stamps, cash and cheques are not accepted.

2. Once the entry fee is paid, there will not be any refund. A candidate who decides at a later stage to withdraw his entry or whose entry is cancelled because he fails to complete the form according to the instructions, will *not* have the fee refunded to him. Therefore, before applying for entry forms, applicants should make sure that they are eligible for the examination, and that they do not intend to withdraw at a later stage. They must also make sure that the entry forms are completed strictly in accordance with the instructions and returned to the Deputy Registrar as quickly as possible.

3. Persons applying for forms by post must enclose an envelope 6" x 3½" to which a four new pesewa (4Np) stamp has been affixed and which bears the candidate's full name and correct postal address in bold capitals. The candidate's Region must be stated in the address.

4. *Eligibility.*—Candidates eligible to enter for this examination are:

- (a) Holders of the Middle School Leaving Certificate;
- (b) Pupils who have completed a minimum of two years' attendance in an approved secondary school or three years in a private secondary school;
- (c) Middle School Leavers who are awaiting the results of the Middle School Leaving Certificate Examination held in August, 1970;
- (d) Pupils who are due to take the Middle School Leaving Certificate Examination in August, 1971.

5. *Method of Entry*

(a) In the Northern and Upper Regions candidates should apply to their respective District Education Officers for forms.

(b) In all other Regions applicants may:

either apply for entry forms by post direct to the Deputy Registrar (ENT.) enclosing the amount of N¢2.30 in crossed Postal/Money Order and the envelope (6" x 3½") bearing a four new pesewa (4Np) stamp and the applicant's full name and correct postal address,

or apply for entry forms personally at (a) the Council's office in Accra, (b) the West African Examinations Council Hall, Unicorn House, Kumasi, (c) Workers' College, Takoradi, and (d) the Regional Education Office, Koforidua, Ho, Cape Coast or Sunyani.

6. In all correspondence with the Council, candidates must quote the correct title of the examination.

7. Applications for forms will *not* be accepted after 25th October, 1970.

8. Completed forms must be dispatched by ordinary post to reach the Deputy Registrar (ENT.), West African Examinations Council, P.O. Box 917, Accra, by 31st October, 1970.

MINISTRY OF HEALTH

VACANCIES FOR PUPIL LABORATORY TECHNICIANS (CHEMICAL LABORATORY)

Applications are invited for scholarship awards for training leading to the appointment in the Ministry of Health as Laboratory Technicians (Chemical Laboratory).

2. The qualifications and duties are as follows:—

(a) *Qualifications.*—Candidates, who must be citizens of Ghana, must—

- (i) possess the G.C.E. "O" Level or its equivalent with passes in Chemistry, one other Science subject, Mathematics, English Language and a fifth subject;
- (ii) not have attained their 30th birthday. Candidates who sat for the G.C.E. "O" Level Examination in June, 1970 and are awaiting results may apply. The selection will, however, depend on their passing the examination.

(b) *Duties.*—The Chemical Laboratory Technician (Technical Officer) is required to perform chemical analysis, etc.

3. Selected candidates will be bonded to complete the course and to serve Government for a period of 5 years after satisfactory completion of the course.

4. The period of training will be three years during which candidates will have formal and on-the-job training at the Government Chemical Laboratory, Accra. During the period of training candidates will receive training allowance of N¢510 per annum rising by annual increment of N¢30 to N¢570 per annum in the final year. Candidates who possess the G.C.E. Advanced Level in two Science subjects will receive allowance at the flat rate of N¢700 per annum. Failure to pass the final examination at the third attempt will result in the termination of the award.

5. Candidates who satisfactorily complete the course, will be considered for appointment to the grade of Laboratory Technicians (Technical Officer) on salary ranges 29, 35, 40 (i.e. N¢792-N¢1,428). Laboratory Technicians (Technical Officer) have prospects of promotion to the grade of Laboratory Superintendent (Senior Technical Officer).

- (i) possess the G.C.E. "O" Level or its equivalent with passes in two Science subjects, Mathematics, English Language and one other subject;
- (ii) not have attained their 30th birthday. Candidates who sat for the G.C.E. "O" Level Examination in June, 1970 and are awaiting results may apply. Their selection will, however, depend on their passing the examination.

(b) *Duties.*—The Laboratory Technician (Technical Officer) is required to carry out Laboratory tests, etc.

3. Selected candidates will be bonded to complete the course and to serve Government for a period of five years after satisfactory completion of the course.

4. The period of training will be three years during which candidates will have formal and on-the-job training at the Health Laboratory Services School, Accra. During the period of training candidates will receive training allowance of N¢510 per annum rising by annual increment of N¢30 to N¢570 per annum in the final year. Candidates who possess the G.C.E. Advanced Level in two Science subjects will receive allowance at the flat rate of N¢700 per annum. Failure to pass the final examination at the third attempt will result in the termination of the award.

CAPITAL INVESTMENTS BOARD

Applications are invited from suitably qualified persons for the following appointments:—

Qualifications.—Applicants should hold a good honours degree in Economics, Economic Statistics, Engineering or Business Administration with concentration in accounting and finance.

Applicants for posts (2) and (3) should have suitable post-qualification experience in economic research, project analysis, economic and industrial consulting service, industry or business. Flair for writing will be an added advantage for posts (3) and (4).

Duties:

- (a) Posts (1) and (2)

A Projects Officer of the Board is responsible mainly for the evaluation of investment projects, appraisal of operating companies, carrying out of feasibility studies and conducting research into production conditions in industry.

- (b) Posts (3) and (4)

The Investment Promotion Officer of the Board is responsible for the seeking out of investors on behalf of the Board and assisting with the establishment of projects. This officer is also responsible for assembling and disseminating information on economic conditions, rules and regulations and such matters as are of special interest to investors.

He is also responsible for the Board's publicity, liaison with other agencies and the general co-ordinating activities of the Board.

Salaries.—Salaries to be negotiated in accordance with experience and qualifications.

VACANCIES FOR DOMESTIC BURSAR AND DOMESTIC ASSISTANT

Applications are invited from suitably qualified candidates for the following posts in the University:—

1. DOMESTIC BURSAR

Qualifications.—Candidates must possess:

- (a) The I.M.A. Diploma or such other Certificate as may be considered equivalent to this qualification and must have had a minimum of two years' practical experience in Institutional or Hotel Management.
- (b) The I.M.A. Certificate and six years' practical experience in Institutional or Hotel Management. A candidate holding the General Catering Diploma shall be considered for the award of up to four incremental credits on appointment.

Duties.—Directly responsible to the Hall Bursar for the organisation, efficient control and economical operation of all Hall catering and accommodation.

Salary Scale.—N¢1,700 x N¢80–N¢2,280 per annum.

2. DOMESTIC ASSISTANT

Qualifications.—Candidates must possess the City and Guilds Certificate 151, or the I.M.A. Certificate with such relevant practical experience as may be considered necessary by the Interviewing Board, or such other Certificate as may be considered equivalent to this qualification.

A candidate who holds the City and Guilds Certificate 151 may, at the discretion of the Interviewing Board, be considered for the award of up to two incremental credits on appointment. The City and Guilds Certificate 150 with a minimum of two years' practical experience in Institutional or Hotel Catering may be deemed, at the discretion of the Interviewing Board, to be a requisite qualification.

Duties.—The Domestic Assistant will normally work directly with the Senior Domestic Assistant and deputise in her absence. Her duties will include:—

- (a) Planning of simple accounting;
- (b) Maintenance and operational efficiency of kitchen equipment hygiene;
- (c) House-keeping—proper care, cleanliness and custody of all bedding, linen, cutlery, crockery and glass; etc., and the maintenance of proper stock cards for such items.
- (d) Proper attention to all residential accommodation including toilets, bathrooms and ensuring that a standard of scrupulous cleanliness is maintained at all times.

Salary Scales.—N¢1,060 x N¢40–N¢1,300 per annum.
