The National Council for Higher Education (N.C.H.E.) invites applications from suitably qualified Ghanaians for appointment to the following positions:—

Qualifications and Experience.—An honours degree preferably with a Second degree from a recognized University with considerable administrative experience. A knowledge of Universities and the way they operate will be an advantage.

Duties

1. Secretary:

The selected candidate will be responsible to the Chairman for the general administration of the Council and its Secretariat.

2. Deputy Secretary:

To assist the Secretary in administering the Secretariat and to act for him during his absence.

VACANCY FOR ASSISTANT PUBLICATIONS OFFICER (AKUAPEM-TWI)

Applications are invited from suitably qualified candidates for the post of Assistant Publications Officer (Akuapem-Twi) in the Bureau of Ghana Languages.

Duties.—To assist in the preparation of manuscripts for school textbooks and books for general reading, and in the translation of Literature in Akuapem-Twi.

Qualifications.—Candidates must possess—

- (i) the Teachers' Certificate "A" or the West African School Certificate with credit in Akuapem-Twi or its equivalent; and
- (ii) have at least 8 years' post-qualifying experience in Literary and/or editorial work.

Candidates will be required to pass a written test in English, Akuapem-Twi and an interview.

Salary Scale.—R.45, 50 (¢1,968-¢2,640).

Application forms are obtainable from the Secretary, Public Services Commission, P.O. Box 1618, Accra, to whom they should be returned not later than 31st January, 1975. Copies only of supporting documents should be forwarded. Public Servants should apply through their Heads of Departments. Candidates under bond to serve in a specific capacity are ineligible.
