A Bill

Intituled

An Ordinance to Amend the Law Relating to Customs.

Whereas in order to facilitate the re-exportation of imported goods it is expedient temporarily to extend the time within which drawback on re-exportation can be claimed. Preamble.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Customs Amendment (Payment of Drawback) Ordinance, 1919," and shall be read and construed as one with the Customs Ordinance, 1910, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and all Ordinances amending the same. Short title.
2. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 156 of the Principal Ordinance providing that an application thereunder for refund of import duty shall be made within 12 calendar months from the date of the payment of import duty it shall be lawful for the Chief of Customs to refund import duties paid on goods imported by land or sea into any Customs port before the 1st day of June, 1918, and re-exported by land or sea from a Customs port within 2 years from such date. Save as herein provided the provisions of Sections 156 and 157 and 158 of the Principal Ordinance shall apply to all applications for and grants of drawback. Provisions re-drawback.
3. This Ordinance shall remain in operation until the 31st day of December, 1920. Duration of Ordinance.
