THE MINING ORDINANCE, 1912.

REGULATIONS.

IN EXERCISE of the powers so conferred by the Mining Ordinance, 1912, Section 73, and by the General Revision Ordinance, 1924, Section 27, His Excellency the Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as “The Mining Regulations, 1924,” and shall be read as one with the Mining Regulations, 1912, (hereinafter called the “Principal Regulations”) and all amendments thereof.

2. Regulation 37 of the Principal Regulations is hereby cancelled and the following Regulation substituted therefor :—

“37. (a) The Commissioner of Mines may, on written application and payment Shg. 1/- and for any reason appearing sufficient to him, allow the owner of a claim to suspend or partly to suspend mining operations thereon for such period as he may deem fit. Such application shall be made by the owner or some person duly

authorised by him on that behalf, and shall give the reasons for which such suspension is required. The Commissioner of Mines, if satisfied that such reasons are sufficient, shall thereupon cause to be published in the Gazette a statement of the claim and the particulars thereof in respect of which suspension of work has been permitted by him.

(b) On publication of such statement, an entry relating to such suspension of work shall be made by the Officer concerned in the appropriate place on the Register of Claims kept by him under Regulation 14 of the Principal Regulations.

3. In Schedule B of the Principal Regulations the following General Fees shall be cancelled:—

Registration of suspension of claim	...	Rs. 2/-
Certificate of suspension of claim	...	Rs. 5/-
