GENERAL NOTICE No. 32

INTRODUCTION OF EXCISE STAMPS FOR MANUFACTURED TOBACCO

(Kenya Government Notice No. 1092 of 1945)

AS FROM the 1st January, 1946, excise duty on manufactured tobacco will be paid by manufacturers affixing excise stamps in the approved manner to packets of tobacco before delivery from factory stocks. These stamps show the maximum weight of tobacco to be packed in the container.

The part of the regulations which relates to cigarettes will not be put into operation at present.

The effect of the change in the method of collecting excise duty on manufactured tobacco is that it will be illegal for any person to sell or offer or expose for sale, or have in his possession for sale, any tobacco manufactured in Kenya, Uganda or Tanganyika except in unopened or unbroken containers sealed with the appropriate excise stamps, except that a retailer may have in his possession at any one time one opened container of each brand of tobacco, if the container shall have been sealed with the appropriate excise stamp properly affixed at the time of opening.

Manufactured tobacco delivered from a manufacturer's licensed premises before the 1st January, 1946, may, notwithstanding the above, be sold up to and including 30th April, 1946, without the containers in which it is packed having excise labels affixed thereto.

NAIVASHA DISTRICT COUNCIL

PROPOSED ORDER UNDER THE RESIDENT LABOURERS ORDINANCE, 1937

IT IS proposed by the Naivasha District Council to make an Order under the Resident Labourers Ordinance, 1937, to apply to all farms situate within the jurisdiction of the Council, by which—

- (a) any occupier of a farm may apply to the Council, in the form set forth in the First Schedule, for a permit to engage resident labourers;
- (b) no native shall be engaged as a resident labourer, and no resident labourer shall continue to reside on any farm, except in accordance with a permit issued to the occupier by the Council in the form set forth in the Second Schedule;
- (c) a permit shall be valid for one year, and the fee payable on application for a permit shall vary according to the number of resident labourers allowed in the permit, with a minimum fee of Sh. 20 for less than 21 resident labourers;
- (d) after the date of the publication of confirmation of the Order, the number of resident labourers engaged on any one farm shall be limited in accordance with the number stated in the permit for that farm;
- (e) any person, who is dissatisfied with the number of resident labourers allowed on his farm by a permit, may within 30 days of the date of the permit make an application to the Council to vary such permit.

The First Schedule is the form of application for a permit; it requires the applicant to submit a statement of his cultivated acreage, number of stock, number of labourers employed, and number of resident labourers for which application is made.

The Second Schedule is the form of permit, in which must be entered the details of any resident labourer who may be attested under the Order.

A copy of the proposed Order is open for inspection at the office of the Naivasha District Council, Naivasha.

Any objection to the Order must be lodged with the Clerk to the Council within 28 days after the date of publication of this notice.
