### APPOINTMENT OF A TEAM TO INQUIRE INTO THE AFFAIRS OF THE KENYA RAILWAYS CORPORATION

to inquire into the affairs of the Kenya Railways Corporation.

The following are the terms of reference of the team of inquiry:

- (a) To examine the causes of the recent train accidents and to recommend appropriate remedial measures.
- (b) To examine technical, managerial, financial and socio-political constraints which may have contributed to inefficiency in the operations of the Kenya Railways Corporation and to recommend the appropriate framework to enhance the efficient and effective operations of the system.

- (c) To examine the terms and conditions of service of all railways employees with particular reference to the qualifications, training, motivation and commitment to work and to recommend appropriate welfare schemes, training and staffing requirements in order to improve productivity.
- (d) To examine the technical efficiency, appropriateness and suitability of existing plant and equipment and to recommend appropriate measures to enhance effective operations.
- (e) To assess resource utilization and to recommend the necessary measures to make the Corporation self-sustaining.
- (f) To evaluate the railways security system, including existing safety and precautionary measures in force, the Railway Police support system, signals and communications systems and recommend appropriate measures to strengthen them.
- (g) To investigate, report and recommend on the procurement, utility and disposal of supplies and stores.
- (h) To look into any other matters that members of the Commission may deem appropriate for the requirements of the Corporation and national interests.
