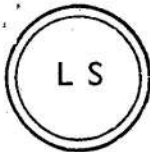

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE FEDERATION

As modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966



By His Excellency Lieutenant-Colonel YAKUBU GOWON, Head of the Federal Military Government, Supreme Commander of the Armed Forces of the Federal Republic of Nigeria.

WHEREAS Gabby Sasore, having been duly convicted of the offences of treasonable felony, conspiracy to commit a felony and conspiracy to effect an unlawful purpose, and sentenced to imprisonment for five, three and two years respectively on all three counts.

AND WHEREAS the said Gabby Sasore, having served a portion of the sentence originally imposed on him in September 1963 :

AND WHEREAS the Supreme Military Council after reviewing his case, is pleased to remit the sentence and to grant him a free pardon.

NOW THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 101 (1) of the Constitution of the Federation and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Supreme Military Council do hereby remit the unexpired portion of the sentence imposed on the aforesaid Gabby Sasore and grant him a free pardon.

GIVEN UNDER my hand and the Public Seal of the Federal Republic of Nigeria at Lagos this 27th day of September, one thousand nine hundred and sixty-six.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE FEDERATION OF NIGERIA

As modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decrees (Nos. 1 to 9)

For the removal of doubt the Supreme Military Council hereby declares that where by any Instrument of Pardon issued by the Supreme Military Council under section 101(1) of the Constitution of the Federation any person has been granted a pardon expressed to be a full pardon, the pardon thereby intended is a free pardon; and every such Instrument shall be construed and have effect accordingly.
