**Importation and Exportation by Land and Inland Waters
(Amendment) Regulations, 1966**

Commencement : 1st October 1965

In exercise of the powers conferred by sections 16 (1), 24 (4), 34 (1) and 53 (1) of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1958, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the President has made the following Regulations:

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Importation and Exportation by Land and Inland Waters (Amendment) Regulations 1966. Citation.
2. The Schedule to the Importation and Exportation by Land and Inland Waters Regulations 1959, as amended, is further amended as follows:—
 - (a) By the deletion of the word "frontier" wherever it occurs in the Schedule and the substitution therefor of the word "border";
 - (b) In paragraph (a) of Part I of the Schedule by the addition under the Columns headed "Approved Route" and "Customs Stations" respectively of the expressions "(vii) Chikanda" "(vii) Chikanda."
 - (c) In paragraph (b) of Part I of the Schedule:—
 - (i) by the deletion under the Column headed "Customs Station" of the word "Kano" and the substitution therefor of the word "Babban Mutum."
 - (ii) by the addition under the Columns headed "Approved Route" and "Customs Station" respectively of the expressions "(vii) Zango" "(vii) Zango."Amendment to Schedule to Regulation L.N. 75 of 1959.
