John Ward Stephenson—Prohibited Immigrants Order 1966

WHEREAS as provided for under section 18 (3) of the Immigration Act 1963, as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966, the Federal Executive Council is satisfied that it is in the public interest that JOHN WARD STEPHENSON should be classed as a prohibited immigrant :

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said section 18 (3) of the Immigration Act, 1963 and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Federal Executive Council has ordered that the said JOHN WARD STEPHENSON be classed as a prohibited immigrant and deported from Nigeria and shall leave on the first available opportunity and remain thereafter out of Nigeria.

Dwain Leavitt Collings—Prohibited Immigrants Order 1966

WHEREAS as provided for under section 18 (3) of the Immigration Act 1963, as modified by the Constitution (Suspension and Modification) Decree 1966, the Federal Executive Council is satisfied that it is in the public interest that DWAIN LEAVITT COLLINGS should be classed as a prohibited immigrant :

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said section 18 (3) of the Immigration Act, 1963 and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Federal Executive Council has ordered that the said DWAIN LEAVITT COLLINGS be classed as a prohibited immigrant and deported from Nigeria and shall leave on the first available opportunity and remain thereafter out of Nigeria.
