

STATE SECURITY (DETENTION OF PERSONS)  
(No. 12) DECREE 1966



Decree No. 70.

[24th July 1966]

WHEREAS I, LIEUTENANT-COLONEL YAKUBU GOWON, Head of the Federal Military Government, Supreme Commander of the Armed Forces, am satisfied that the arrest and detention of the person specified in the Schedule hereto as at the date of commencement hereof is in the interest of the security of Nigeria and it is expedient to make this Decree accordingly :

NOW THEREFORE THE FEDERAL MILITARY GOVERNMENT hereby decrees as follows :—

1. The person mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be detained for a period of six months from the date of commencement of this Decree in such place or places as the Head of the Federal Military Government may from time to time direct either generally or specifically, and the person so detained shall be liable to be removed to and be detained there under conditions as to confinement including the like conditions as to maintenance, discipline and punishment for breaches of discipline, as may from time to time be imposed in respect of persons duly convicted of an offence by a court of law.

2. The provisions of sections 2 to 6 of the State Security (Detention of Persons) Decree 1966 (which *inter alia* provide for the making of representations by persons detained, to tribunals specially constituted and for the suspension of certain provisions of the Constitution of the Federation) shall apply to this Decree as they apply to the said Decree of 1966, and they shall be construed accordingly.

3.—(1) This Decree may be cited as the State Security (Detention of Persons) (No. 12) Decree 1966 and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 24th July 1966.

(2) This Decree shall apply throughout Nigeria.
