Motor vehicles of motor vehicle dealers as described in section 10(1) of the Order 175.00
NOTE:—

- (i) Should a motor vehicle be used for purpose of more than one class, the premium for the highest rated class to be charged.
- (ii) Minimum premium—Insurances for less than one year to be calculated pro rata, subject to a minimum premium of E5.00.
- (iii) Duplicate tokens—Fee for the issue of each such duplicate token, 50 cents.
- (iv) Articulated Vehicles—"Articulated vehicle" means a single operative motor vehicle consisting of a power unit (tractor) coupled with and partly bearing a detachable goods or passenger carrying unit or combination thereof having no front axle (semi-trailer). Each unit of an articulated vehicle is rated and insured separately in respect of the tractor unit under group reference 8 and in respect of the semi-trailer unit according to the purpose for which such unit is designed or used, i.e. under group references 2A 2B 2C, 3A, 3B, 3C, as the case may be.
- (v) Station wagons and similar type vehicles if used for the carrying of trade goods the vehicle must be rated under group references 2A, 2B or 2C.
